	Breakout Sessions – Round 2* Seminar # 2A – Issues and problems relating to UBIT and GET – Allen Arakaki The criteria for defining unrelated trade or business is that it must be (1) a trade or business, (2) regularly carried on, and (3) not substantially related to the organization's exempt purpose. There are specific exclusions derived from certain types of activities and modifications which exempt certain items of income and related deductions. Are you reporting UBIT correctly? Discussion will also delve into Hawaii's general excise tax and address questions such as have your clients obtained an exemption for general excise tax (Form G-6)? Are they filing the required G-45 and G-49 forms on a timely basis? So you think you are tax exempt? Two tax burdens nonprofits may not be in
