Winner of three 2007 David di Donatello Awards and a winner at the Venice Film Festival 2006, this magical and visually arresting film turns the classic tale of early 20th century American immigration into a wondrous experience. Salvatore, a widower from a desolate Sicilian village, is driven by dreams of a better life and embarks on an epic odyssey in search of a new world. While on a perilous journey from Sicily to New York, he encounters a mysterious English woman, who has been denied entry to America once before, and the Old and New World literally collide.

This film, which premiered at Cannes and received a Golden Globe Foreign Press award for Best First Film, is seen through the eyes of an eleven-year-old boy, Tommi, who lives with his sister Viola, a merciless bully, and his father Renato, a seemingly harsh and unjust disciplinarian. The family finally establishes a peaceful routine when Stefania, Renato's estranged wife and mother of his two children, re-appears just as recklessly as she had departed three years ago, upsetting the precarious equilibrium again.

A. O. Scott, film critic for *The New York Times*, enthused that this lovingly restored film "is a revealing portrait of Italian society and an utter blast, happily blending low comedy, high sentiment, neo-realism and farce—almost a film festival unto itself." Alberto Sordi—best known for his roles in early Fellini films—gives one of his finest performances as Antonio, a factory supervisor at a Fiat factory. Antonio is the perfect middle manager: a master of organization, time management, and precision. When Nino has accrued enough vacation time to take his blond, Northern wife and two young daughters back home to meet the family, his promise of a "beautiful Sicily: hospitable and joyous!" turns out to be a bit more complicated.

Two young men from Bologna, Gianni, an upper middle class saxophone player, and Nick, a working class trombone player, meet at an audition in Umbria. Both have dreams of becoming professional musicians and form

the Joy Spring Quintet together, which becomes a springboard for Nick's natural talent and catapults his career as a musician. Gianca believes his passion for music cannot make up for his lack of talent and abandons his musical ambitions. Then, after several years, the two men reunite and together they compose a musical that becomes a special hit. This film is winner of a 2005 David di Donatello award.

Nominated for 12 David di Donatello Awards, this hilarious comedy chronicles the four phases of love: Tommaso and Giulia go through the pleasures and surprises of "falling in love." Barbara and Marco are

experiencing a "crisis" in their long-term relationship—will a child help them overcome it? Traffic cop Ornella is shattered by a dramatic "betrayal" which she is determined to overcome by focusing on her fight against the enemy of all women—men! Goffredo comes to grips with "abandonment" by his wife, something he is absolutely unprepared to face. In desperation, he turns to a self-help audio book reassuringly entitled "Manual of Love."
