VILLAGE AT THE END OF THE WORLD (2012-Denmark/UK/Greenland) 82m *** ½ D: Sarah Gavron, David Katznelson. This witty and surprising documentary explores life in the remote Greenlandic village of Nuaqornat: the population is 59 humans, 100 sled dogs. Through interviews of 4 key people: the head of the village, the oldest woman, the outsider who married a local, and the only teenager-- a fascinating picture emerges of a unique community. Winner of 1 award. For ages 10 and older.

CHONMAGE PURIN aka *A Boy and His Samurai* (2010-Japan) 108m *** D: Yoshihiro Nakamura (FISH STORY). Ryô Nishikido, Fuku Suzuki, Rie Tomosaka, Jun Inoue. This time travel tale concerns earnest young samurai Yasube (Nishikido) who lands in present-day Tokyo. The disoriented Yasube is taken in by overworked single mom Hiroko (Tomosaka). Grateful to be off the streets, Yasube takes on Hiroko's housework and care for her adorable son Tomoya (Suzuki). While performing his house-husband duties (sans sex), Yasube develops a passion for baking. **WARNING:** This delightful comedy will make you hungry for dessert. For ages 10 and older.

THE KIYOSU CONFERENCE aka *Kiyosu kaigi* 138m *** ½ D: Kôki Mitani (A GHOST OF A CHANCE). Tadanobu Asano, Kôji Yakusho, Satoshi Tsumabuki, Minosuke Bando, Yô Ôizumi. This political satire, based loosely on the Honnoji Incident of 1582, clothes a modern-style power grab in 16th century kimono. When warlord Oda Nobunaga's forced suicide creates a national power vacuum, two factions vie (hilariously) for supremacy. This historical comedy was a hit at HIFF and was nominated for 7 awards. For ages 12 and older.

CONVERSATIONS WITH MOTHER aka *Conversaciones con mamá* (2004-Argentina/Spain) 86m *** ½ D: Santiago Carlos Oves. China Zorrilla (ELSA Y FRED), Eduardo Blanco, Ulises Dumont. Stressed-out, middle class, middle-aged Argentinean Jaime (Blanco) has lost his job. In order to continue supporting his wife, son and daughter, Jaime decides to have his mother (Zorrilla) move in with his family so he may sell her apartment, which he owns. His mother has reasons for wanting to stay put, so Jaime decides to visit her often to persuade her. In the course of these conversations, Jaime begins to re-discover his humanity. Winner of 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

BOYHOOD (2014-US) 165m **** D: Richard Linklater (BERNIE). Ellar Coltrane, Patricia Arquette, Ethan Hawke, Elijah Smith. Seven-year-old Mason (Coltrane) literally grows up to become a man in this extraordinary movie filmed over 12 years. As Mason grows older, so do his parents (Arquette and Hawke). Changes of season, of politics, of technology—all provide the backdrop of one family's story. Winner of 38 awards, nominated for 5 Golden Globes and sure to be an Oscar contender for Best Picture. Rated R.

ELSA & FRED (2014-US) 97m *** D: Michael Radford (IL POSTINO). Shirley MacLaine, Christopher Plummer, Marcia Gay Harden, Scott Bakula, Chris Noth, George Segal. This American remake of *ELSA Y FRED* benefits by the considerable charisma of its two 80-something leads: the ever-youthful Shirley MacLaine and the appealing Christopher Plummer. Elsa (MacLaine) dreams of re-creating Fellini's Trevi fountain scene in *LA DOLCE VITA*. Will Fred (Plummer) be her Marcello Mastroianni? This delightful celebration of love and life won an award. Rated PG-13.

WAYS TO LIVE FOREVER (2010-Spain/UK) 90m *** D: Gustavo Ron. Ben Chaplin (THE TRUTH ABOUT CATS & DOGS), Emilia Fox, Robbie Kay, Greta Scacchi. Sam (Kay) has a bucket list, and he wants to get to it quickly, as he's dying of cancer. On his list: see a ghost, fly an airship, kiss a girl, smoke a cigarette. Sam is 12-years old. This upbeat and touching film won 4 awards. Rated PG-13.

THE TWO FACES OF JANUARY (2014-UK/France/US) 96m *** D: Hossein Amini (writer of *DRIVE*). Kirsten Dunst, Oscar Isaac, Viggo Mortensen, Daisy Bevan. A splendidly suspenseful Patricia Highsmith adaptation set in 1962 Athens. It begins with the friendship of tour guide Rydal (Isaac) with glamorous jet-setting American couple Chester (Mortensen) and Colette (Dunst). No one is as he or she seems in this complex interplay of erotic tension, jealousy, greed and deception. This stylishly Hitchcockian thriller is rated PG-13.

THE GOOD LIE (2014-Kenya/India/US) 110m *** ½ D: Philippe Falardeau (MONSIEUR LAZAR). Reese Witherspoon (WILD), Arnold Oceng, Ger Duany, Emmanuel Jal. After the destruction of their Sudanese home in the 1980s, and 13 years in a Kenyan refugee camp, Mamere (Oceng), Jeremiah (Duany) and Paul (Jal) land in Kansas City, MO. Bewildered by their new surroundings, the three men cope with culture shock with courage and humor, and are helped by counselor Carrie (Witherspoon). Winner of 1 award. Rated PG-13.

ELSA Y FRED (2005-Argentina/Spain) 108m *** ½ D: Marcos Carnevale. Manuel Alexandre, China Zorrilla (CONVERSATIONS WITH MOTHER), Blanca Portillo. This enchanting love story concerns Fred (Alexandre), a 77-year-old hypochondriac and Elsa (Zorrilla), a recklessly joyous 82-year-old. On the wall of Elsa's apartment is a framed still of Anita Ekberg in the Trevi fountain, taken from *LA DOLCE VITA*. In Elsa's mind, she's Anita, and she refuses to let reality intrude on her dream. This movie about love and movies won 9 awards. Rated PG.

GONE GIRL (2014-US) 149m **** D: David Fincher (THE SOCIAL NETWORK). Ben Affleck, Rosamund Pike, Neil Patrick Harris, Tyler Perry, Carrie Coon. On the morning of his fifth wedding anniversary, Nick's Missouri home is a mess of broken glass and overturned furniture, and his wife Amy (Pike) is missing. Nick, the police's prime suspect, suffers an onslaught of media attention. Did Nick kill Amy? This brilliant mystery, adapted for the screen by novelist Gillian Flynn, won 23 awards and is nominated for 4 Golden Globes. Rated R.

GET ON UP (2014-US/UK) 139m *** ½ D: Tate Taylor (THE HELP). Chadwick Boseman (42), Nelsan Ellis, Dan Aykroyd, Viola Davis, Octavia Spencer. Born in extreme poverty in 1933, James Brown (Boseman) rises to become a rock legend in this electrifying bio-pic. A daring music and dance innovator, Brown created an empire in the face of 1940s and 50s racism. As exhilarating as a first-rate concert (thanks to executive producer Mick Jagger), this film is as vibrant as the man it celebrates. Rated PG-13.

THE GREEN PRINCE (2014-Germany/US/UK/Israel) 101m *** ½ D: Nadav Schirman (IN THE DARK ROOM). This suspenseful spy story, produced by the same team that made *MAN ON WIRE* and *SEARCHING FOR SUGARMAN*, is a thriller that is also a documentary. The "Green Prince" is Israel's domestic security service's (Shin Bet's) code name for its most highly prized recruit, Mosab Hassan Yousef. He is a "prince" because his father, Sheikh Hassan Yousef, was a founder of Hamas. His story is one of politics, espionage and morality. Winner of 4 awards. Rated PG-13.

THE DROP (2014-US) 106m *** ½ D: Michaël R. Roskam (BULLHEAD). Tom Hardy, Noomi Rapace, James Gandolfini, Matthias Schoenaerts. Cousin Marv (Gandolfini, in his last role) manages the Brooklyn bar he used to own—Chechen mobsters have muscled in and made Marv's bar a "drop"—a place where gangsters hide and distribute their ill-gotten cash. Marv's cousin Bob (Hardy), the bartender, finds himself witness to the tavern's robbery, and the consequences will reach far into the neighborhood. This tense, authentic and beautifully acted crime drama won Best Screenplay at the San Sebastián International Film Festival. Rated R.

LUCY (2014-France) 89m *** D: Luc Besson (THE FIFTH ELEMENT). Scarlett Johansson (HER), Morgan Freeman, Min-sik Choi, Amr Waked. It is said humans operate with their brains at 10% capacity. If you've ever wondered what it would be like to have access to 100% of your brainpower, here's a wildly entertaining sci-fi adventure that purports to show you. Dumb blonde exchange student Lucy (Johansson) gets mixed up in a drug deal in Taiwan and ends up an unwitting lab experiment. This funny and inventive action extravaganza won an award. Rated R.

MAY IN THE SUMMER (2013-Jordan/Qatar/US) 99m *** D: Cherien Dabis (AMREEKA). Cherien Dabis, Hiam Abbass, Bill Pullman, Elie Mitri. May Brennan (Dabis) travels home to Amman, Jordan from New York to join her family in preparation for her wedding. May's mom Nadine (Abbass), a devout Christian, is so against May's marrying a Muslim she plans to boycott the wedding. Jolted by the chaos of her family, culture shock and a flirtation with a cute guy (Mitri), May begins to wonder about her life decisions in this comic drama. Nominated for 2 awards. Rated R.

CURTIN (2007-Australia) 84m *** D: Jessica Hobbs. William McInnes, Noni Hazlehurst, Geoff Morrell, Bille Brown, Shingo Usami, Brian Meegan. John Curtin (McInnes) is considered one of Australia's greatest Prime Ministers. This biographical drama set in 1941 details Curtin's first six months in office. He faces the attack on Pearl Harbor, the fall of Singapore and the bombing of Darwin while wrangling with Churchill over the deployment of Australian troops. Criticized for his close friendship with Japanese ambassador Tatsuo Kawai (Usami) and wracked with self-doubt, Curtin struggles to lead his country while upholding his beliefs. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

RUDDERLESS (2014-US) 105m *** ½ D: William H. Macy (directorial debut). Billy Crudup, Anton Yelchin, Felicity Huffman, Laurence Fishburne, Selena Gomez. A grieving father (Crudup) discovers a stash of demo tapes and lyrics by his deceased son and forms a band. But this is NOT a formula weepie—it is a deeply satisfying and emotional journey toward artistic expression. Rocking with original songs by Simon Steadman and Charlton Pettus, this dramedy won an award. Rated R (for language).

THE JUDGE (2014-US) 141m *** ½ D: David Dobkin (WEDDING CRASHERS). Robert Downey Jr., Robert Duvall, Billy Bob Thornton. Arrogant Chicago big-shot attorney Hank Palmer (Downey) returns to his Indiana home town to attend his mother's funeral. Hank can barely stand to be in the same room as his estranged father Joseph (Duvall), who has so much power and influence in town that everyone simply refers to him as "The Judge". The unthinkable occurs when The Judge is accused of murder, and Hank is forced to defend him. This masterfully acted drama won 3 awards and is nominated for a Golden Globe for Duvall's performance. Rated R.

THE BOOK OF LIFE (2014-US) 95m *** ½ D: Jorge R. Gutierrez. Voiced by Diego Luna, Zoe Saldana, Channing Tatum, Ron Perlman, Ice Cube, Kate del Castillo. Produced by Guillermo del Toro, this lavish animated fantasy is based on Mexico's Day of the Dead. Feisty Maria (Saldana) is courted by macho Joaquin (Tatum) and sensitive Manolo (Luna). Xibalba (Perlman), who rules the bleak Land of the Forgotten, makes a bet with La Muerte (del Castillo), ruler of the joyous Land of the Remembered, on which man will win Maria's heart. Who will triumph in this delightful comedy adventure? Nominated for a Golden Globe. Rated PG.

FURY (2014-UK/China/US) 134m *** ½ D: David Ayer (END OF WATCH). Brad Pitt, Shia LaBeouf, Michael Peña, Logan Lerman, Jon Bernthal. Brad Pitt stars as Sergeant 'Wardaddy' Collier, commander of a Sherman tank in Germany in April, 1945. On the tank's 76mm gun is "Fury" daubed in white paint. As the Allies make their final push to Berlin, Wardaddy and his crew of 5 men are out-numbered and out-gunned, and the driver (Lerman) is a former desk clerk with no battle training. This heroic and powerful drama won 4 awards. Rated R.

LIFE'S A BREEZE (2013-Ireland/Sweden) 83m *** D: Lance Daly. Kelly Thornton, Fionnuala Flanagan, Pat Shortt, Eva Birthistle. Nan's (Flanagan) four grown children lure her out of her cluttered home to give it a good cleaning in this charming Irish comedy. The siblings throw out and haul away mountains of old newspapers, mildewed paperback novels and one ancient mattress. This would be fine, except Nan says that one million Euros were stuffed in the mattress. Let the side-splitting search begin! This breezy comedy won 3 awards. Rated R (for language).
