SPANISHAFFAIR *aka Ocho apellidos vascos* (2014-Spain) 98m *** D: Emilio Martínez Lázaro. Clara Lago, Dani Rovira, Carmen Machi, Karra Elejalde. In this charming comedy, Basque girl Amaia (Lago) gets jilted by her groom while visiting Seville for her bridal shower. She gets into a fight with Andalusian waiter Rafa (Rovira) when she hears him telling jokes about Basque people. Smitten after a rowdy night together, Rafa pursues Amaia as she goes home to the north. The biggest hit in Spain in 2014, this North vs South romance won 11 awards.

APRON STRINGS (2008-New Zealand) 90m *** D: Sima Urale (O TAMAITI). Laila Rouass, Leela Patel, Nathan Whitaker, Jennifer Ludlam, Scott Wills. In this food-centric drama, estranged sisters Anita (Rouass) and Tara (Patel) are re-united through Indian cuisine, while down the street, baker Lorna (Ludlam) struggles with the homecoming of her unmarried and pregnant daughter. This engrossing tale of families and identity won 4 awards.

PATTES BLANCHES (1949-France) 103m *** ½ D: Jean Grémillon (THE LOVE OF A WOMAN). Suzy Delair (QUAI DES ORFÈVRES), Fernand Ledoux, Paul Bernard, Michel Bouquet (RENOIR), Arlette Thomas. This strikingly original Gothic-film noir set in a small Breton village explosively combines a femme fatale (Delair), a lonely aristocrat (Bernard), the aristocrat's bastard brother (Bouquet), a wealthy fish merchant (Ledoux) and a hunchback girl (Thomas) to create a compelling story that will keep you guessing till the end. Written by the great Jean Anouilh (BECKET). Winner of 1 award. For ages 12 and older. *Newly restored version!*

DEVIL IN THE FLESH *aka Le diable au corps* (1947-France) 117m **** D: Claude Autant-Lara (FOUR BAGS FULL). Gérard Philipe (FANFAN LA TULIPE), Micheline Presle, Denise Grey, Jean Debucourt. This famous, rarely seen World War I romance based on Raymond Radiguet's novel is about an affair between 16-year-old schoolboy François (Philipe) and Marthe (Presle), a woman engaged to a soldier. Philipe and Presle brilliantly portray young lovers torn between their passion for each other and society's expectations. Winner of 2 awards, including one from the National Board of Review. For ages 12 and older. *Newly restored version!*

TRAIN MAN *aka Densha otoko* (2005-Japan) 101m *** D: Shōsuke Murakami. Takayuki Yamada (13 ASSASSINS), Miki Nakatani (RING). When a super-geeky 22-year-old computer nerd (Yamada) saves a pretty girl (Nakatani) from a lecherous creep on the train, she thanks him by sending him an Hermès tea set. Completely befuddled and clueless as to how to talk to her, he asks for online help using the pseudonym "Train-man". Soon Train-man is receiving enough advice for a complete makeover, and is emboldened enough to ask "Hermès" out. Will Train-man find love? This delightful purportedly true story will thrill everyone's inner geek. For ages 12 and older.

SICARIO (2015-US) 121m **** D: Denis Villeneuve (INCENDIES). Emily Blunt, Benicio Del Toro, Josh Brolin, Victor Garber. FBI field agent Kate Macer (Blunt) joins an inter-agency task force to flush out the kingpin of a Mexican drug cartel in this suspenseful action adventure. The mission's shady leader Matt Graver (Brolin) claims to be a Defense Department contractor. On Graver's team is the 'sicario' (hit man) of the title, Alejandro (Del Toro), purportedly a former Mexican prosecutor. Dodging bullets and facing corruption at every turn, can Kate survive long enough to build a prosecutable case? Winner of 7 awards so far. Rated R.

THE WALK (2015-US) 123m *** ½ D: Robert Zemeckis (BACK TO THE FUTURE). Joseph Gordon-Levitt, Ben Kingsley, Charlotte Le Bon. On August 4, 1974, Philippe Petit (Gordon-Levitt) walked on a thin wire spanning the canyon-like space between the tops of the World Trade Center's twin towers. This beautiful, crazy, exhilarating movie captures this "artistic coup" in a visceral way, taking the audience right onto the wire high above New York's cityscape. Winner of 1 award so far. Rated PG.

POPPOYA-RAILROAD MAN (1999-Japan) 112m *** D: Yasuo Furuhashi. Ken Takakura (DEAREST), Shinobu Ōtake, Ryoko Hirose, Hidetaka Yoshioka, Nenji Kobayashi. Ken Takakura stars as aging stationmaster Otomatsu Sato in this touching drama. Sato's train station, which serves a dying Hokkaido mining town, is scheduled to be shut down. Though his friend Sugiura (Kobayashi) is offering him a hotel job, Sato can't bear to part with the station. One day, he meets a young woman (Hirose) with a passion for trains. She bears an uncanny resemblance to his late daughter. Sato's life begins to change in unanticipated ways. Takakura received 6 Best Actor awards for this role, including one from the Montréal World Film Festival. Rated G.

THE MARTIAN (2015-US/UK) 144m **** D: Ridley Scott (BLADE RUNNER). Matt Damon, Jessica Chastain, Kristen Wiig, Jeff Daniels, Michael Peña, Sean Bean, Chiwetel Ejiofor. On a manned mission to Mars, astronaut-botanist Mark Watney (Damon) is caught in a ferocious storm and is presumed dead. Against all odds Watney survives, but finds himself stranded on Mars with meager supplies. Watney will need every bit of his smarts and ingenuity to contact NASA and survive until help arrives. This visually stunning, funny and intelligent film won 10 awards. PG-13.

THE KEEPER: THE LEGEND OF OMAR KHAYYAM (2005-US) 95m *** D: Kayvan Mashayekh. Adam Echahy, Bruno Lastra, Mortiz Bleibtreu, Rade Serbedzija, Vanessa Redgrave. From his Houston hospital bed, Iranian-American Nader tells his 12-year-old brother Kamran the story of their 11th century ancestor, mathematician and poet Omar Khayyam. Kamran is to become their family's Keeper of this story, a tale of romance, adventure and the value of reason. Filmed in Samarkand and Bukhara, Uzbekistan, this epic comes alive in richly evocative settings. For ages 10 and older.

SUNSHINE ON LEITH (2013-Scotland) 96m *** D: Dexter Fletcher. Peter Mullan (WAR HORSE), Jane Horrocks (LITTLE VOICE), George MacKay, Kevin Guthrie, Jason Flemyng, Antonia Thomas, Freya Mavor. Buddies Davy (MacKay) and Ally (Guthrie) return home to Edinburgh after fighting in Afghanistan, looking forward to the embrace of family and friends... and perhaps love. This rousing adaptation of the hit musical by Stephen Greenhorn soars with the music of The Proclaimers. As exhilarating as a shot of single malt, this delightful Scottish gem was nominated for 5 awards. For ages 10 and older.

THE NECESSITIES OF LIFE *aka Ce qu'il faut pour vivre* (2008-Canada) 102m *** ½ D: Benoît Pilon. Natar Ungalaaq (THE FAST RUNNER), Éveline Gélinas, Paul-André Brasseur, Vincent-Guillaume Otis. Inuit hunter Tiivii (Ungalaaq) travels south to Québec City in 1952 to be treated for tuberculosis. Tiivii cannot speak French, and no one at the sanatorium speaks Inuktitut. Isolated in a strange place far from his loved ones, Tiivii becomes despondent. But when nurse Carole (Gélinas) introduces him to young orphan Kaki (Brasseur), Tiivii begins to regain his will to live. Winner of 14 awards. Rated PG.

AN EPISODE IN THE LIFE OF AN IRON PICKER (2013-Bosnia and Herzegovina/France/Slovenia/Italy) 75m *** ½ D: Danis Tanovic. Nazif Mujic, Senada Alimanovic. This naturalistic drama follows a poor Roma family dealing with a medical crisis in a shanty town far from any urban center in Bosnia-Herzegovina. Winner of the Grand Jury Prize from the Berlin International Film Festival, where Nazif Mujic also won a Silver Berlin Bear for his semi-autobiographical role. For ages 12 and older.

FATIMA'S HAND (2006-Germany) 38m *** ½ D: Jens Hoffmann. Base jumper Karina Hollekim travels to Mali to jump off the 2000 foot tall rock formation called the Hand of Fatima. Strawn with sharp rocks and whipped by aggressive winds, this will be the challenge of Karina's life.

JOSÉE, THE TIGER AND THE FISH *aka Joze to tora to sakana tachi* (2003-Japan) 116m *** ½ D: Isshin Inudō (LA MAISON DE HIMIKO). Satoshi Tsumabuki, Chizuru Ikekawi, Juri Ueno. College student Tsuneo (Tsumabuki) sees an enormous baby buggy careening out of control and runs to stop it. Inside, instead of a baby, is a young woman who calls herself Josée (Ikekawi). Josée, who has cerebral palsy, lives with her grandmother who keeps Josée hidden from society. Now that she's met Tsuneo, this will all change. This unusual romance won 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE HANDSOME SUIT *aka Hansamu sūtsu* (2008-Japan) 115m *** D: Tsutomu Hanabusa. Shōsuke Tanihara, Muga Tsukaji, Keiko Kitagawa, Mayumi Sada, Miyuki Ohshima. Porky chef Takuro (Tsukaji) transforms into his ultra-handsome alter ego Annin Hikariyama (Tanihara) whenever he puts on a specially designed miracle suit. Takuro used to be shunned by women, but now he's got Raika (Sada), the hottest supermodel in town, eating out of his hand. Will he get away with it? This sweet and funny comedy won an award. For ages 13 and older.

A DISTANT CRY FROM SPRING *aka Haruka naru yama no yobigoe* (1980-Japan) 123m **** D: Yōji Yamada (TWILIGHT SAMURAI). Ken Takakura (POPPOYA), Chieko Baishō (TORA-SAN series). Young widow Tamiko (Baishō) runs a dairy farm in rural Hokkaido with her 10-year-old son Takeshi. One stormy evening, a mysterious man (Takakura) arrives and helps Tamiko with the birthing of a calf. He offers to work for room and board only—and she, desperately needing help, agrees. As time passes, Tamiko and Takeshi grow to love the strong and silent man, though he is clearly hiding something. This touching love story won 8 awards. For ages 10 and older.

EVEREST (2015-UK/US/Iceland) 121m *** ½ D: Baltasar Kormákur (101 REYKJAVÍK). Jason Clarke, Ang Phula Sherpa, Josh Brolin, John Hawkes, Jake Gyllenhaal, Emily Watson. Based on an Everest expedition in 1996 led by two commercial outfits, the climbers encounter a violent storm that places them in grave danger. Who will survive? Who will die? Will it be the extreme athlete (Gyllenhaal)? The sweet-natured postman (Hawkes)? The millionaire family man (Brolin)? This breathtaking adventure was nominated for 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

FINDING MR. RIGHT (2013-China/Hong Kong) 121m *** D: Xiao Lu Xue (OCEAN HEAVEN). Wei Tang (LUST, CAUTION), Xiubo Wu, Elaine Jin. High-maintenance Beijing JiaJia (Tang) is in Seattle to give birth to the love child of her married Chinese tycoon boyfriend. But when JiaJia's unlimited credit card stops working she has to rely on driver Frank (Wu), who's everything JiaJia *doesn't want* in a man. But is he what she *needs*? This comedy won 9 awards. For ages 15 and older.

MORT D'UN POURRI *aka The Death of a Corrupt Man* (1977-France) 123m *** D: Georges Lautner (LES TONTONS FLINGEURS). Alain Delon, Ornella Muti, Stéphane Audran, Mireille Darc, Maurice Ronet, Klaus Kinski, Michel Aumont. Attorney Xav Maréchal (Delon) is called in the middle of the night by his politician friend Philippe Dubayé (Ronet). Philippe tells Xav he's killed swindler Serrano, whose diary chronicled payoffs and illegal deals involving prominent members of society. After Philippe asks Xav to hide the diary, Xav is thrown into a web of intrigue full of dangerous men and shapely women. This stylish thriller was nominated for 2 awards. Great score by Philippe Sarde featuring cool sax solos by Stan Getz. For ages 12 and older. *Newly restored version!*

SECURITY UNLIMITED *aka Mo Deng Bao Biao* (1981-Hong Kong) 91m *** D: Michael Hui. Michael Hui, Sam Hui, Ricky Hui, Shui-Fan Fung. Michael Hui has been top instructor at his security guard agency for 15 years, and his second in command (Sam) has been itching for an opportunity to take over. When Ricky joins the team (even though he's too short) the three face a change of leadership and must prove their worth. Their showdown with a gang of villains is comedy gold. This is the last film in which all three Hui brothers appear together. Michael Hui won Best Actor in the HK Film Awards.
