THE ROLE OF HER LIFE *aka Le rôle de sa vie* (2004-France) 99m *** D: François Favrat. Agnès Jaoui (THE TASTE OF OTHERS), Karin Viard. Claire (Viard), a mousy freelance writer for a fashion magazine, is thrilled when she gets to meet her idol, actress Elisabeth Becker (Jaoui). But when Elisabeth hires Claire as her personal assistant, Claire's life is turned upside down. This sharply observed character study won 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

UNA FAMIGLIA PERFETTA (2012-Italy) 111m *** D: Paolo Genovese. Sergio Castellitto, Marco Giallini, Claudia Gerini, Carolina Crescentini, Eugenio Franceschini. The elegant entry hall is decked with holiday greenery and delicious smells emanate from the table richly appointed with fine linen and sparkling crystal. It is the perfect Christmas for the perfect family. The women are beautiful, the children well-behaved and every detail is impeccable... or no one gets paid. This clever comedy won 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE DRESSMAKER (2015-Australia) 119m *** D: Jocelyn Moorhouse (PROOF). Kate Winslet, Judy Davis, Liam Hemsworth, Hugo Weaving, Kerry Fox. This deliciously campy adaptation of Rosalie Ham's novel stars Kate Winslet as Tilly Dunnage, a fashionista who returns to her little outback home town in 1951 to settle a score... with style. She's toting her sewing machine, her golf clubs and a killer wardrobe. The community of Dungatar had better watch out. This black comedy won 14 awards. Rated R.

AMERICAN HONEY (2016-UK/US) 163m *** ½ D: Andrea Arnold. Sasha Lane, Shia LaBeouf, Riley Keough. This remarkable film traces an 18-year-old girl's reckless odyssey through America's Midwest selling magazine subscriptions to scrape out a living. Star (Lane) has little to lose—she dumpster-dives to eat. Sensual and visually dazzling, this drama captures the precarious, fiery passions of youth. Winner of 9 awards, including 2 at Cannes. Rated R.

A MAN CALLED OVE *aka En man som heter Ove* (2015-Sweden) 116m *** ½ D: Hannes Holm. Rolf Lassgård, Bahar Pars, Ida Engvoll, Filip Berg. This funny and moving adaptation of Fredrick Backman's Swedish best seller concerns Ove (Lassgård), a crabby but good-hearted widower who wants to commit suicide to join his beloved wife. This black comedy won 12 awards from all over the world. Rated PG-13.

LOVE IS MY PROFESSION *aka En cas de malheur* (1958-France/Italy) 115m *** D: Claude Autant-Lara (A PIG ACROSS PARIS). Jean Gabin, Brigitte Bardot, Edwige Fenech, Franco Interlenghi. Curvaceous young vixen Yvette (Bardot), accused of robbery, convinces respectable attorney André Gobillot (Gabin) to defend her in this well-observed film noir adapted from Georges Simenon's novel. François Truffaut considered Bardot's performance here one of her two very best. See why she remains an icon. For ages 15 and older.

CRIME AND PUNISHMENT *aka Crime et châtiment* (1956-France) 107m *** D: Georges Lampin. Jean Gabin, Robert Hossein, Bernard Blier, Marina Vlady, Ulla Jacobsson, Lino Ventura, Gérard Blain. In this stylish and very French adaptation of Dostoevsky's novel, disillusioned student René (Hossein) is about to do something desperate. His sister Nicole (Jacobsson) is planning to marry corrupt old antiques dealer Monestier (Blier) for his money. René will have to watch his step: police chief Gallet (Gabin) doesn't miss a detail. Great noir-ish cinematography by Claude Renoir. For ages 12 and older.

WHAT NO ONE KNOWS *aka Det som ingen ved* (2008-Denmark/Sweden) 99m *** D: Søren Kragh-Jacobsen. Anders W. Berthelsen, Maria Bonnevie, Sonja Richter, Ghita Nørby. Children's entertainer Thomas's (Berthelsen) life is threatened when his sister Charlotte (Richter) tries to tell him secrets about their late father, an intelligence officer. When Charlotte drowns under suspicious circumstances, Thomas desperately searches for the truth, though he is increasingly aware he is being watched... This atmospheric nail-biter won an award. For ages 12 and older.

A PIG ACROSS PARIS *aka La traversée de Paris* (1956-France/Italy) 80m *** ½ D: Claude Autant-Lara (DEVIL IN THE FLESH). Jean Gabin, Bourvil, Louis de Funès. In Nazi-occupied Paris during World War II, ex-cabbie Martin (Bourvil) persuades ex-painter Grandgil (Gabin) to help him haul four suitcases full of black market pork through the blackout. This hilarious, rarely-seen black comedy pairs timid everyman Martin with belligerent Grandgil in a surprisingly effective partnership braving the dangers of their journey. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

A STRANGER OF MINE *aka Unmei janai hito* (2005-Japan) 98m *** ½ D: Kenji Uchida (KEY OF LIFE). Yasuhi Nakamura, Sô Yamanaka, Reika Kirishima, Yuka Itaya. In this delightful comedy set in Tokyo, private detective Kanda (Yamanaka) tries to matchmake his childhood buddy, unlucky-in-love businessman Miyata (Nakamura), with lonely nurse Maki (Kirishima). In the process, Kanda gets in hilarious trouble with the yakuza. This inventive and cleverly structured tale won 12 awards including 3 from Cannes. For ages 12 and older.

DENIAL (2016-UK/US) 109m *** D: Mick Jackson. Rachel Weisz (THE CONSTANT GARDENER), Tom Wilkinson, Timothy Spall. This powerful courtroom drama concerns the real legal battle between American historian Deborah Lipstadt (Weisz) and English Nazi sympathizer David Irving (Spall). Sued for libel by Irving for labeling him a Holocaust denier in her 1993 book, Lipstadt must prove in an English court of law that the Holocaust did in fact occur. The New York Observer says, "it will make you stand up and cheer". Rated PG-13.

DEEPWATER HORIZON (2016-Hong Kong/US) 107m *** D: Peter Berg (LONE SURVIVOR). Mark Wahlberg, Kurt Russell, John Malkovich. On April 20, 2010, the Deepwater Horizon oil rig suffered a massive structural failure, creating the worst oil spill in US history. This riveting drama focuses on two heroic men who survived this disaster: electrical engineer Mike Williams (Wahlberg) and his boss Jimmy Harrell (Russell), who warned BP executives of the rig's safety issues. This dynamic thriller won an award. Rated PG-13.

UMRIKA (2015-India) 98m *** D: Prashant Nair. Suraj Sharma (LIFE OF PI), Tony Revolori (THE GRAND BUDAPEST HOTEL), Smita Tambe, Pramod Pathak, Prateik Babbar. In this comedy-drama set in mid-1980s India, a young man named Udai (Babbar) sets off from his tiny village to work in Umrka (aka America). The letters to his family from this strange and exotic land are full of wonders, and the entire village looks forward to their arrival. When the letters stop coming, Udai's younger brother Ramakant (Sharma) sets off on a journey to find Udai. This engaging tale won 4 awards, including one at Sundance. For ages 12 and older.

UNINDIAN (2015-Australia) 104m *** D: Anupam Sharma (feature debut). Brett Lee, Tannishtha Chatterjee, Supriya Pathak, Akash Khurana, Maya Sathi, Nicholas Brown. Meera (Chatterjee) is a divorced single mother who is too Aussie to please her dotting parents (Pathak and Khurana) and too Indian to feel comfortable with her attraction to Will (Lee), a tall, blond, cricket-loving English teacher. Mom and dad are keen on matching Meera with arrogant cardiologist Samir (Brown), but Meera's heart won't agree. What to do? This charming romantic comedy won an award. For ages 12 and older.

THE CANDIDATE *aka Kandidaten* (2008-Denmark) 95m *** D: Kasper Barfoed. Nikolaj Lie Kaas, Tuva Novotny, Ulf Pilgaard, Kim Bodnia, Laura Christensen, Henning Jensen. Defense attorney Jonas (Kaas) can't stop wondering about the death of his father (Jensen), who was also an attorney. As Jonas investigates the facts behind his father's "accident", he becomes the target of a group of blackmailers in this taut thriller. Winner of 1 award. For ages 15 and older.

KABUKICHÔ LOVE HOTEL *aka Sayonara Kabukichô* (2014-Japan) 135m *** ½ D: Ryuichi Hiroki. Shôta Somefani, Atsuko Maeda, Eun-woo Lee, Aoba Kawai, Kaho Minami, Yutaka Matsushige. This unexpectedly moving and entertaining comedy-drama consists of stories of the staff and guests in a Tokyo love hotel over the course of one day. The aspirations and heartaches of each character end up being far more stimulating than the film's promise of (non-explicit) sexual encounters. For ages 15 and older.

THE GIRL ON THE TRAIN (2016-US) 112m *** D: Tate Taylor (THE HELP). Emily Blunt, Haley Bennett, Rebecca Ferguson, Justin Theroux, Luke Evans, Allison Janney. In this suspenseful adaptation of Paula Hawkins's novel, drunken divorcée Rachel (Blunt) fantasizes about a happy couple she sees from her train window on her daily commute to New York City. One morning, Rachel sees the woman (Bennett) kiss another man. Deeply upset, Rachel blacks out—and discovers the next morning that the woman has disappeared. Wanting to help, Rachel finds out she might instead be a suspect. This thriller won an award. Rated R.

THE PEOPLE VS. FRITZ BAUER *aka Der Staat gegen Fritz Bauer* (2015-Germany) 105m *** ½ D: Lars Kraume. Burghart Klaußner (BRIDGE OF SPIES), Ronald Zehrfeld, Michael Schenk. Fifteen years after the end of World War II, Hessen District Attorney Fritz Bauer (Klaußner) is still fighting to bring senior Nazi officials to justice. His current aim: hunt down Adolf Eichmann (Schenk). This is the true story of a gay Jewish Holocaust survivor who sought justice through a government that was still full of Hitler supporters. Winner of 8 awards. Rated R.

ROALD DAHL'S ESIO TROT (2015-UK) 88m *** D: Dearbhla Walsh. Dustin Hoffman, Judi Dench, Richard Cordery. In this heartwarming, funny love story adapted from Roald Dahl's book Mr. Hoppy (Hoffman), a shy American man, has difficulty expressing his love for Mrs. Silver (Dench), a fun-loving English widow in the apartment below. Oh, and there are 100 turtles. Winner of 1 award for Hoffman's charming performance. For all ages.

A TIME IN QUCHI *aka Shu jia zuo ye* (2013-Taiwan) 109m *** D: Tso-chi Chang. Liang-yu Yang, Kuan Kuan, Nick Yen, Ming Chuan Hsieh. Ten-year-old Taipei boy Kuan (Yang) is sent by his divorcing parents to spend the summer with his grandfather (Kuan Kuan) in the Quchi countryside. Though he's lost at first without access to high-speed Internet, Kuan begins to make friends and enjoy life's rhythms alongside a picturesque river community. This beautiful and thoughtful coming-of-age film was nominated for 7 awards. For ages 10 and older.

BONKERS *aka Knetter* (2005-Netherlands/Belgium) 81m *** ½ D: Martin Koolhoven. Jesse Rinsma, Tom van Kessel, Carice van Houten (Game of Thrones), Leny Brederveld, Judith Bovenberg. In this delightfully humorous comedy drama set in the Netherlands, Nine-year-old Bonnie lives with her bipolar mom Lis (van Houten) and her sensible grandmother (Breederveld). When grandma passes away, Bonnie does her best to take her place at the head of the family, searching for a suitable mate for Lis while dodging the pesky social worker Jorien (Bovenberg). Winner of 9 awards. For ages 12 and older.

CHICKEN RUN (2000-UK/US/France) 84m *** ½ D: Peter Lord, Nick Park. Voiced by Mel Gibson, Julia Sawalha (Absolutely Fabulous), Miranda Richardson, Timothy Spall. When Rocky the rooster (Gibson) comes flying (flailing and screaming) into Ginger's (Sawalha) farm yard, Ginger thinks just maybe she and her fellow hens could finally escape. It's bad enough that the hens are forced to squeeze out eggs for the terrifying Mrs. Tweedy (Richardson)—Tweedy has just purchased a chicken pie machine to increase revenue. Let the flying lessons begin! This Aardman escape adventure won 23 awards—something to crow about. Happy Year of the Rooster! Rated G.

THE WORLD IS OURS *aka El mundo es nuestro* (2012-Spain) 83m *** D: Alfonso Sánchez (feature debut). Alfonso Sánchez, Alberto López, Alfonso Valenzuela, María Cabrera. El Cabez (Sánchez) and El Culebra (López) are two Seville toughs who plan to rob a bank and escape to Brazil. But once they get to the bank they discover all of Spain is running on empty and everyone is at the end of his or her financial tether. This fast-paced satire of Spain's economy and social divisions won 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.
