PEOPLE OF A FEATHER (2011-Canada) 90m **** D: Joel Heath (debut). Filmed over seven winters in the Belcher Island Inuit community of Canada's Hudson Bay, this strikingly beautiful documentary explores the unique relationship of Inuit and eider duck. The source of the warmest feather in the world, the eider occupies an ecological niche currently threatened by climate change. With humor, creativity and love of nature, mankind's challenge is to keep this relationship strong. Winner of 8 awards. For all ages.

WESTWIND (2011-Germany) 89m *** D: Robert Thalheim (AND ALONG COME TOURISTS). Friederike Becht, Luise Heyer, Franz Dinda. In 1988, a year before the fall of the Berlin Wall, East German teenage sororal twins Doreen (Becht) and Isabel (Heyer) train for a sculling championship at a summer camp in Hungary. When Doreen falls for Arne (Dinda), a West German boy, the girls face tough challenges to their relationship and cultural identity. Nominated for an award at the Zurich Film Festival. For ages 10 and older.

12 YEARS A SLAVE (2013-US/UK) 134m **** D: Steve McQueen (SHAME). Chiwetel Ejiofor (DIRTY PRETTY THINGS), Michael Fassbender, Lupita Nyong'o, Brad Pitt, Benedict Cumberbatch, Alfre Woodard. This powerful true story of a man's triumph over the abuses of racism centers on Solomon Northup (Ejiofor), a free Northern black American who is abducted into Southern captivity in 1841. Nominated for 9 Oscars as of this writing, and winner of 118 awards so far. Rated R.

HIGH TIDE (1987-Australia) 101m *** ½ D: Gillian Armstrong (MY BRILLIANT CAREER). Judy Davis, Jan Adele, Claudia Karvan, Frankie J. Holden. Backup singer Lillie (Davis) has spent the last 16 years drinking and drifting when she arrives in a dingy coastal Australian town and discovers the daughter she abandoned (Karvan) living in a trailer with Lillie's mother (Adele). This poignant drama won 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

LITTLE SOLDIER aka Lille soldat (2008-Denmark) 100m *** D: Annette K. Olesen (MINOR MISHAPS). Trine Dyrholm (THE CELEBRATION), Lorna Brown. Lotte (Dyrholm) returns to Denmark from her deployment in Afghanistan emotionally numb. She tries to reach out to her father, who employs her as a driver for the prostitutes he traffics in his escort business. Lotte befriends Lily (Brown), one of the prostitutes, in an attempt to save someone—and perhaps save herself. Winner of 3 awards, including one at Berlin. For ages 15 and older.

THE RUNWAY (2010-Ireland/Luxembourg) 101m *** D: Ian Power. Demian Bichir (A BETTER LIFE), Kerry Condon, Jamie Kierans. Nine-year-old Paco (Kierans) thinks nothing happens in Drumalee in County Cork, so imagine Paco's excitement when Columbian pilot Ernesto (Bichir) crashes his plane in a nearby field. Paco's the only one in the village who has studied Spanish, as his pretty single mom (Condon) says his Dad is a Spaniard. Paco enlists the entire village to aid the handsome stranger. This charming comedy won 4 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE PAROLE OFFICER (2001-UK) 93m *** D: John Duigan (THE YEAR MY VOICE BROKE). Steve Coogan (PHILOMENA), Lena Headey, Stephen Dillane, Om Puri. British comic Steve Coogan stars as Simon Garden, an untalented parole officer who is framed for a murder committed by a crooked cop (Dillane). The evidence Simon needs is locked in a bank vault—so he gathers a gang of ex-criminals to steal it in order to clear his name! This hilarious caper was nominated for 2 awards. Rated R.

OUT OF THE FURNACE (2013-US/UK) 116m *** ½ D: Scott Cooper (CRAZY HEART). Christian Bale, Casey Affleck, Woody Harrelson, Zoe Saldana, Sam Shepard, Willem Dafoe. In this explosive crime thriller set in 2008 in economically depressed Braddock, Pennsylvania, Russell (Bale) and his younger brother Rodney (Affleck) struggle to make a living. When Rodney disappears after getting embroiled in a dangerous New Jersey crime ring, Russell risks everything to seek justice. Winner of one award. Rated R.

INSIDE LLEWYN DAVIS (2013-US/UK/France) 104m *** ½ D: Ethan Coen, Joel Coen (FARGO). Oscar Isaac (BALIBO), Carey Mulligan. Musician Llewyn Davis (Isaac) had his 15 minutes of fame and is struggling to get back in the spotlight in the unforgiving Greenwich Village folk scene in 1961. Hunkering against the cold, Llewyn hauls his battered guitar and equally battered ego from friends' sofas to seedy bars trying to get a gig. This blackly humorous tale is loosely based on the memoir of Dave van Ronk—but this might be Bob Dylan's story in an alternate universe. Dig those cool cats! Nominated for 2 Oscars and winner of 31 awards. Rated R.

THE GRANDMASTER (2013-Hong Kong/China) 130m *** ½ D: Wong Kar Wai (IN THE MOOD FOR LOVE). Tony Leung (HERO), Zhang Ziyi (HOUSE OF FLYING DAGGERS), Wang Qingxiang. When reigning kung fu master Gong Yutian (Wang) loses a duel to Ip Man (Leung), Gong's daughter (Zhang) challenges Ip Man to defend her family's honor. The two consummate artists fall in love while in battle, both striving for perfection. This film is a showcase of martial arts styles gorgeously lensed by Oscar nominee Philippe Le Sourd. Winner of 19 awards. Rated PG-13.

PARKED (2010-Ireland/Finland) 94m *** D: Darragh Byrne (feature debut). Colm Meaney (THE SNAPPER), Colin Morgan, Milka Ahlroth. After some years wandering around England doing odd jobs, 50-something Fred (Meaney) returns to Ireland with nowhere to live but his car. When pothead 21-year-old Cathal (Morgan) parks nearby, Fred's lonely world begins to open to new experiences. This frequently funny Irish drama won 5 awards. For ages 15 and older.

HIS & HERS (2009-Ireland) 80m *** ½ D: Ken Wardrop (feature debut). This heartwarming documentary tells a collective story of a life's journey with the opposite sex. Inspired by his mother, director Ken Wardrop interviews 70 Irish Midland females from baby to pensioner on the most important men in their lives. Lovingly candid comments about fathers, boyfriends, husbands and sons weave a tapestry of human relationships, all with the special Irish flair for storytelling. Winner of 6 awards including one at Sundance. For ages 12 and older.

THE BOOK THIEF (2013-US/Germany) 131m *** ½ D: Brian Percival (Downton Abbey). Sophie Nélisse, Geoffrey Rush, Emily Watson, Ben Schnetzer. In this deeply moving adaptation of Markus Zusak's novel set in World War II Germany, Mr. and Mrs. Hubermann (Rush and Watson) adopt illiterate young Liesel (Nélisse) and love her as their own daughter. They risk their lives sheltering teenage Jewish boy Max (Schnetzer). As she learns to read, Liesel's passion for words helps secluded Max keep his sanity. Nominated for an Oscar and winner of 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

SAVING MR. BANKS (2013-US/UK/Australia) 125m *** ½ D: John Lee Hancock (THE BLIND SIDE). Emma Thompson, Tom Hanks, Colin Farrell, Paul Giamatti. It took Walt Disney (Hanks) 20 years to secure the rights to P.L. Travers' (Thompson) *Mary Poppins* so he could make the beloved children's film in 1964. In this delightful biopic we are witness to the battle between the sunny, folksy charmer Disney and the relentlessly snippy and uncompromising Travers. Acted with great humor and heart, SAVING MR. BANKS won 9 awards and is nominated for an Oscar. Rated PG-13.

THIRD STAR (2010-UK) 92m *** D: Hattie Dalton (debut). Benedict Cumberbatch (*Sherlock*), Tom Burke, JJ Feild, Hugh Bonneville (*Downton Abbey*), Rupert Frazer. Four male friends in their 30s take a holiday in Wales. One of them, Dave (Cumberbatch) is gravely ill with cancer and is wheelchair-bound. As the guys relax away from their usual routine, questions and revelations long kept quiet begin to surface. This deceptively clever comedy-drama was nominated for 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

RUN IF YOU CAN aka Renn, wenn Du kannst (2010-Germany) 112m *** ½ D: Dietrich Brüggemann (STATIONS OF THE CROSS). Robert Gwisdek, Jacob Matschenz, Anna Brüggemann. In industrial Duisburg, Germany, prickly paraplegic Ben (Gwisdek) is finishing his master's thesis while making life difficult for his caregivers. When Ben is assigned medical student Christian (Matschenz) as an assistant, he finds a friend. Their friendship is tested, however, when both get besotted by klutzy cellist Annika (Brüggemann). This comedy-drama was nominated for an award. For ages 15 and older.

AMERICAN HUSTLE (2013-US) 138m **** D: David O. Russell (SILVER LININGS PLAYBOOK). Christian Bale, Bradley Cooper, Amy Adams, Jeremy Renner, Jennifer Lawrence, Michael Peña, Robert De Niro. Con man Irving Rosenfeld (Bale) and his seductive partner Sydney Prosser (Adams) are forced to work for hot shot FBI agent Richie DiMaso (Cooper) in a scam designed to incriminate the top political brass in 1980s New Jersey. The stakes grow higher as the bribes grow bigger and the mobsters deadlier, but scariest of all is Irving's volatile wife Rosalyn (Lawrence). As of this writing, this powerhouse crime comedy is nominated for 10 Oscars and winner of 49 awards. Rated R.

FROZEN (2013-US) 102m **** D: Chris Buck (THE LITTLE MERMAID), Jennifer Lee (WRECK-IT RALPH). Voiced by Kristen Bell, Idina Menzel, Jonathan Groff, Josh Gad. In this inspired animation adapted from Hans Christian Andersen's *The Snow Queen*, Princess Elsa (Menzel) summons ice and snow with a flick of her hand—a power so uncontrollable that her kingdom becomes trapped in eternal winter. Fearful of the harm she can cause, Elsa exiles herself. Her plucky younger sister Anna (Bell) sets out to rescue her with a mountain man, his faithful reindeer and a lovable snowman (Gad). Nominated for 2 Oscars, and winner of 33 awards. Rated PG.

THE WOLF OF WALL STREET (2013-US) 180m ***½ D: Martin Scorsese (GOODFELLAS). Leonardo DiCaprio, Jonah Hill, Matthew McConaughey, Jean Dujardin, Margot Robbie, Kyle Chandler. This is the (somewhat) elaborated true tale of Jordan Belfort (DiCaprio) and his band of merry rogue traders who steal from the rich to give to themselves. A wildly decadent, over-the-top exercise in outrage, this comedy-drama is nominated for 5 Oscars and winner of 17 awards. Rated R.

FOR 80 DAYS aka 80 egunean (2010-Spain) 104m *** ½ D: Jon Garaño, Jose Mari Goenaga. Itziar Aizpuru, Mariasun Pagoaga. After 50 years, Basque piano teacher Maite (Pagoaga) returns to San Sebastian to retire. While visiting her brother at the hospital, she runs into her best friend from high school, Axun (Aizpuru), who has been living on a farm with her husband. Long suppressed feelings come to the surface as their attraction to each other rekindles. Will they dare follow their hearts? This extraordinary Basque-language drama won 6 awards. For ages 15 and older.

BEGIN THE BEGUINE aka Volver a empezar (1982-Spain) 87m *** D: José Luis Garci. Antonio Ferrandis, Encarna Paso. Professor Albajara (Ferrandis) of UC Berkeley has just won a Nobel Prize for literature, and is celebrating with a trip home to Gijón, Spain. He hasn't returned since the late 1930s when he was exiled because of the Spanish Civil War. Revisiting the scenes of his youth, bittersweet memories entwine with poetry and music to weave nostalgic magic. Winner of the Best Foreign Language Film Oscar and 3 more awards. Rated PG.

GIRL ON A BICYCLE (2013-US/Germany) 101m *** D: Jeremy Leven (DON JUAN DE MARCO). Vincenzo Amato, Nora Tschirner (RABBIT WITHOUT EARS), Paddy Considine, Louise Monot. In this breezy romantic comedy set in Paris, Italian tour bus driver Paolo (Amato) has just proposed to his German girlfriend (Tschirner) when French beauty Cécile (Monot) coasts by on her bicycle—and turns Paolo's life upside down. Rated R.
