NIGHT FLIGHT FROM MOSCOW aka *Le Serpent* (1973-France/Italy/West Germany) 113m *** D: Henri Verneuil (THE SICILIAN CLAN). Yul Brynner, Henry Fonda, Dirk Bogarde, Philippe Noiret, Michel Bouquet, Véra Lisi. KGB officer Col Vlassov (Brynner) lands in Paris and offers CIA operative Allan Davies (Fonda) a list of Kremlin moles working in Western Europe in exchange for asylum in the US. But before Davies can get the double agents into custody, they start dying off under mysterious circumstances. Rated PG.

GORBACIOF (2010-Italy) 81m *** D: Stefano Incerti. Toni Servillo (THE GREAT BEAUTY), Mi Yang, Geppy Gleijeses, Hal Yamanouchi. The brilliant Toni Servillo stars as Marino 'Gorbaciof' Pacileo, a Neapolitan prison cashier whose birthmark earns him the nickname of the former Soviet leader. Gorbaciof thinks nothing of pinching a little cash from the till to support his gambling habit; but even more tempting is the pretty daughter (Yang) of a fellow gambler. This inventive drama won an award. Suitable for ages 15 and older.

SONG FOR A RAGGY BOY (2003-Ireland/UK/Denmark/Spain) 100m *** ½ D: Aisling Walsh. Aidan Quinn, Iain Glen, Marc Warren, Dudley Sutton, Alan Devlin. New teacher William Franklin (Quinn) arrives at an Irish reformatory school in 1939, and is told by harsh disciplinarian Brother John (Glen) to address the boys by their numbers, and not to "confuse (them) with intelligent human beings". Mr. Franklin, however, believes in literacy, and fights against the dehumanizing practices of the school. This riveting drama based on Patrick Galvin's autobiography won 14 awards. For ages 15 and older.

SONGCATCHER (2000-US) 109m *** ½ D: Maggie Greenwald (THE BALLAD OF LITTLE JO). Janet McTeer, Aidan Quinn, Jane Adams, Taj Mahal, Emmy Rossum. After being denied a promotion, musicologist Lily Penleric (McTeer) journeys alone to Appalachia in 1907 lugging primitive recording equipment to "catch" the undocumented folk tunes of the region. Based on the experiences of Olive Dame Campbell, a real "songcatcher" who traveled to Appalachia in 1908, this fascinating film flows with enchanting old ballads of Scotland and Ireland sung by luminaries such as Emmylou Harris, Rosanne Cash and Iris DeMent. Winner of 5 awards including Sundance's Special Jury Prize. PG-13.

THE GIANT BUDDHAS (2005-Switzerland) 95m *** D: Christian Frei. In 2001, Mullah Mohammed Omar ordered the Taliban to destroy the Buddhas of Bamiyan, two monumental statues dating from the 6th century carved into the cliff in central Afghanistan. This documentary investigates and commemorates the statues and their demise from 5 different views: a resident cliff-dweller, an al-Jazeera journalist, an Afghani expat, an archaeologist, and the Swiss director, Christian Frei. Winner of one award and nominated for the Grand Jury Prize at Sundance. For ages 12 and older.

THE HEDGEHOG aka *Le hérisson* (2009-France/Italy) 98m *** ½ D: Mona Achache. Josiane Balasko, Garance Le Guillermic, Togo Igawa, Anne Brochet. Paloma (Le Guillermic) is an 11-year-old critic of the affluent lifestyle. Profoundly bored, Paloma has decided to kill herself on her 12th birthday. But there are two people who live in the same building that might change her mind: the frumpy concierge Renée (Balasko) and the elegant gourmand Mr. Ozu (Igawa). This wonderfully literate life and art embracing tale won 7 international film awards. Rated PG.

STILL MINE (2012-Canada) 102m *** D: Michael McGowan (SAINT RALPH). James Cromwell (THE QUEEN), Genevieve Bujold (KING OF HEARTS), Campbell Scott, Chuck Shamata. All farmer Craig (Cromwell) wants to do is build a little house on his plot of land in New Brunswick, Canada. He wants a more navigable home for his beloved wife, Irene (Bujold), who's beginning to show signs of dementia, but he keeps running into roadblock after roadblock. This uplifting tribute to marital devotion won 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

LOST IN THAILAND aka *Ren zai jiong tu: Tai jiong* (2012-China) 105m *** D: Zheng Xu. Zheng Xu, Baoqiang Wang, Bo Huang, Bingbing Fan. In this uproarious comedy, corporate executive Xu Lang (Xu) has developed a revolutionary gas additive he's sure his boss would approve. The problem is—his boss in on a Buddhist retreat in Thailand, and Xu has gotten lost amongst the thousands of temples in Chiang Mai. If that's not bad enough, a meddlesome doofus he met on the plane, Wang Bao (Wang), keeps tagging along. LOST IN THAILAND is China's biggest moneymaker, second only to AVATAR. Winner of 4 awards. For ages 12 and older.

AUGUST: OSAGE COUNTY (2013-US) 121m *** ½ D: John Wells (THE COMPANY MEN). Meryl Streep, Julia Roberts, Chris Cooper, Ewan McGregor, Sam Shepard, Dermot Mulroney, Juliette Lewis, Benedict Cumberbatch, Abigail Breslin. This brilliant adaptation of Tracy Letts's play (screen-written by Tracy Letts) concerns an Oklahoma family brought back together by a crisis. Powerhouse actress Meryl Streep stirs up a storm of rage and humor as acerbic, pill-popping matriarch Violet Weston. Winner of 7 awards and nominated for 2 Oscars. Rated R.

THE HOBBIT: THE DESOLATION OF SMAUG (2013-US/New Zealand) 161m *** ½ D: Peter Jackson (THE LORD OF THE RINGS). Ian McKellen, Martin Freeman, Richard Armitage, Benedict Cumberbatch, Orlando Bloom. The hobbit is Bilbo Baggins (Freeman), an ordinary fellow who's hired by the dwarf king in exile, Thorin (Armitage), to steal the fabulous Arkenstone to restore his kingdom. It's a heist caper set in Middle Earth—with woodland elves, a wizard (McKellen), and a magnificent dragon who delights in taunting his victims (Cumberbatch). What can be more fun? It's a big improvement over part one. Winner of 3 awards and nominated for 3 Oscars. Rated PG-13.

DREAM OF LIGHT aka *El sol del membrillo* (1992-Spain) 134m **** D: Víctor Erice (THE SPIRIT OF THE BEEHIVE). In this exquisitely beautiful documentary, artist Antonio López paints a picture of the quince tree in his Madrid back yard. But rather than standing far away to view the tree, López stands intimately close to observe the subtle changes each day as leaves unfurl, the fruit ripen, filling the air with their fragrance; and the sun sparkles through the leaves. This serene meditation on art and nature won 7 awards, including 2 from Cannes and 1 from Chicago. For all ages.

SPARROW aka *Storia di una capinera* (1993-Italy/Japan) 101m *** ½ D: Franco Zeffirelli (ROMEO AND JULIET). Angela Bettis, Johnathon Schaech. It is 1854 in Catania, Sicily. A cholera epidemic has caused Maria (Bettis), a 16-year-old novice, to leave her convent and return home to avoid contamination. As she is a future "bride of God", her family won't permit her the usual freedoms of a teenager, but she nonetheless attracts her handsome neighbor Nino (Schaech), who's studying to become a lawyer. Before giving up her earthly life to devote herself to God, Maria experiences different facets of Love. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

LOST ISLANDS (2008-Israel) 103m *** ½ D: Reshef Levi (HUNTING ELEPHANTS). Oshri Cohen, Michael Moshonov, Shmil Ben Ari, Yuval Scharf. In this comedy-drama set in early 1980s Israel, twin brothers Erez (Moshonov) and Ofer (Cohen) fall in love with the same girl and set off a family crisis. This thoughtful and moving tale about family loyalty won 4 awards at the Israeli Film Academy. For ages 12 and older.

LOST EMBRACE aka *El abrazo partido* (2004-Argentina/France/Italy/Spain) 100m *** ½ D: Daniel Burman (FAMILY LAW). Daniel Hendler, Adriana Aizemberg, Jorge D'Elia, Sergio Boris. Ariel (Hendler) is pushing 30 and restless. He's anxious to leave the shopping mall in Buenos Aires's Jewish community where he helps his mother (Aizemberg) run a lingerie shop. Money is tight, but he and his mom get by—the friendly folks who run the neighboring shops all nosh on Ariel's mother's lekach (honey cake). But as Ariel makes plans for Europe, his long lost father comes calling... This gentle comedy won 10 awards, including one at Berlin. For ages 15 and older.

DEAREST aka *Anata e* (2012-Japan) 111m *** ½ D: Yasuo Furuhashi (RAILROAD MAN). Ken Takakura (RIDING ALONE FOR THOUSANDS OF MILES), Yūko Tanaka, Kōichi Satō, Takeshi Kitano, Tadanobu Asano. Recently widowed prison officer Eiji Shimakura (Takakura) travels from Toyama to Hirado, Kyushu to scatter his late wife's ashes in the sea per her request. Shimakura, a diffident man of few words, encounters people on his 750 mile journey who help him reflect on his marriage. With letters from his wife to guide and comfort him, Shimakura embarks on a new chapter of his life. This beautifully photographed HIFF favorite won 4 awards. For ages 12 and older.

BENDA BILILI! (2010-The Democratic Republic of Congo/France) 85m *** ½ D: Renaud Barret, Florent de La Tullaye. On the tough streets of Kinshasa a band formed of five paraplegics and one able-bodied teenager rose above all odds to become "Benda Bilili!" to play propulsive, foot-tapping music to rapturous audiences in Europe. Their name in Lingala means "look beyond appearances". Their story of triumph over poverty, polio and pre-conceived ideas will move you—to the point of making you dance. Winner of an Étoile d'Or for Best Documentary and nominated for a César. For ages 12 and older.

PHILOMENA (2013-UK/US/France) 98m **** D: Stephen Frears (THE QUEEN). Judi Dench (SKYFALL), Steve Coogan (THE PAROLE OFFICER). Philomena Lee (Dench) was forced to give up her son 50 years ago at an Irish Catholic convent for unwed mothers. When Philomena's grown daughter meets journalist Martin Sixsmith (Coogan) at a party, she asks him to investigate the whereabouts of Philomena's son. Skeptical at first, the cynical and firmly atheist Martin agrees to travel with the sweet and devotedly Catholic Philomena to unravel her mystery. This inspiring true story won 20 awards and was nominated for 4 Oscars. Rated PG-13.

GREAT EXPECTATIONS (2012-UK/US) 128m *** D: Mike Newell (FOUR WEDDINGS AND A FUNERAL). Toby Irvine, Jason Flemyng, Jeremy Irvine, Helena Bonham Carter, Holliday Grainger, Ralph Fiennes. Charles Dickens's immortal tale centers on orphan Pip (Toby Irvine as a boy, Jeremy Irvine as a man) who becomes a gentleman thanks to a mysterious benefactor. Pip's change in social status opens his eyes to what matters most in human happiness. This handsomely mounted production won an award for Carter's portrayal of Miss Havisham, and was nominated for a BAFTA. Rated PG-13.

CRADLE SONG aka *Canción de cuna* (1994-Spain) 101m *** ½ D: José Luis Garci. Dolores Aguado, Fiorella Faltoyano, José Luis Garci, Maribel Verdú, Carmelo Gómez. Set within the cloisters of a convent near a small Spanish town in the late 19th century, this serenely joyous story concerns a group of nuns who raise a newborn baby found at their door. Each nun is spiritually enriched by the task of preparing the little girl to become a woman in the secular world. Suffused with golden light and sepia shadow, this beautifully lensed adaptation of Gregorio Martínez Sierra's play won 14 international film awards, including 4 Goyas. For all ages.

ALLEZ, EDDY! (2012-Belgium) 100m *** D: Gert Embrechts (feature debut). Jelte Blommaert, Peter Van den Begin, Barbara Sarafian. Because of his digestive disorder, young Freddy's (Blommaert) parents keep him from going out, thinking they're saving him from embarrassment. So Freddy spends a lot of time riding on a bicycle suspended on ropes, dreaming of racing alongside his hero, Eddy Merckx. Changes are taking place in his little Belgian village—it is 1975 after all—the first supermarket is sponsoring a bicycle race to celebrate its grand opening, and (even though his family's against it) Freddy will compete! This charmer won 3 awards. For ages 10 and older.

BRIDES aka *Nyfes* (2004-Greece/US/France) 128m *** ½ D: Pantelis Voulgaris. Damian Lewis (Homeland), Victoria Haralabidou, Andréa Ferréol, Evi Saoulidou, Steven Berkoff. This engrossing romance set aboard the SS King Alexander in 1922 concerns unhappily married American photographer Norman Harris (Lewis) and Greek picture bride Niki Douka (Haralabidou), who's on her way to Chicago to marry a tailor. Their futures uncertain, the two try hard not to fall in love. On a ship that carries 700 brides to wed strangers in America, human destinies are about to dramatically change. Winner of 5 awards at the Thessaloniki Film Festival. For ages 12 and older.

THE INQUIRY aka *L'inchiesta* (1986-Italy/Spain/Tunisia) 103m *** D: Damiano Damiani. Keith Carradine, Harvey Keitel, Phyllis Logan, Lina Sastri. Titus Valerius Taurus (Carradine) is sent by the Emperor Tiberius Caesar to investigate the mysterious disappearance of the body of an executed criminal: a man called Jesus of Nazareth. In Palestine Taurus meets with Roman prefect Pontius Pilate (Keitel), who is keen to put an end to the investigation, fearing it may prove harmful to his career. This engrossing and intriguing political drama won 4 awards. For ages 12 and older.
