SILENCE (2016-US/Taiwan/Mexico) 161m *** ½ D: Martin Scorsese. Andrew Garfield, Adam Driver, Liam Neeson, Tadanobu Asano, Ciarán Hinds, Issei Ogata. In this blistering adaptation of Shūsaku Endō's novel *Chinmoku*, two Catholic missionary priests, Rodrigues (Garfield) and Garrpe (Driver), travel to Japan to find out why their mentor Father Ferreira (Neeson) left the Church. Set in the mid-17th Century when Tokugawa Japan systematically crushed Roman Catholicism, this powerful drama of faith despite God's silence won 6 awards and was nominated for an Oscar for Best Cinematography. Rated R.

ROGUE ONE: A STAR WARS STORY (2016-US/UK) 133m *** ½ D: Gareth Edwards. Felicity Jones, Diego Luna, Alan Tudyk, Mads Mikkelsen, Forest Whitaker, Donnie Yen, Guy Henry (as Peter Cushing's Tarkin). This thrilling intergalactic adventure is set before the events of the original *STAR WARS* (1977). Raised by outlaw Saw Gerrera (Whitaker), Jyn Erso (Jones) grew up hearing that her scientist father (Mikkelsen) is a traitor. But Jyn knows that her father, creator of the Death Star, designed it with a fatal flaw. The battle against the Empire begins! Winner of 8 awards and nominated for 2 Oscars. Rated PG-13.

20TH CENTURY WOMEN (2016-US) 119m *** ½ D: Mike Mills (BEGINNERS). Annette Bening, Elle Fanning, Greta Gerwig, Billy Crudup, Lucas Jade Zumann. In this funny and thoughtful comedy-drama set in Santa Barbara in the summer of 1979, divorcee Dorothea (Bening) enlists the help of her housemates to raise her 14-year-old son Jamie (Zumann). A nostalgic yet pointed portrait of a time of rapid social change, *20TH CENTURY WOMEN* won 9 awards and was nominated for a Best Screenplay Oscar. Rated R.

PATRIOTS' DAY (2016-US) 133m *** ½ D: Peter Berg. Mark Wahlberg, John Goodman, Kevin Bacon, J.K. Simmons. This rousing tribute to the city and the people of Boston re-enacts the events surrounding the 2013 Boston Marathon terrorist attack. Boston native Mark Wahlberg is police sergeant Jimmy Saunders, whose local knowledge and no-nonsense pragmatism were key in slicing through the panic and bureaucracy during the investigation. Winner of 1 award from the National Board of Review. Rated R.

PATERSON (2016-US/France/Germany) 118m *** D: Jim Jarmusch (DEAD MAN). Adam Driver, Golshifteh Farahani, Rizwan Manji, Nellie (as Marvin, the dog). This film chronicles a week in the life of bus driver Paterson (Driver) of Paterson, New Jersey, who has the five-volume epic poem Paterson on his desk at home. This bus driver is a poet too—he quietly listens to and observes the significant details of his world, such as the efficient beauty of Ohio Blue Tip matches. This delightfully droll and wise movie won 6 awards, including one from Cannes for Nellie. Rated R.

100 DAYS aka Zhen ai 100 tian (2013-Taiwan) 104m *** D: Henry Chan. Sze-Ming 'Johnny' Lu, Tracy Chou, Soda Voyu. After decades, arrogant Taiwanese telecom executive Bo Dan (Lu) returns to his island home town to attend his mother's funeral. There he is brought down a peg or two by his childhood sweetheart Xiao Wei (Chou) in this charming rom com. Filmed in the stunningly gorgeous Matsu Islands. Winner of 1 award. For ages 12 and older.

THE MOST BEAUTIFUL DAY OF MY LIFE aka Il più bel giorno della mia vita (2002-Italy/UK) 102m *** D: Cristina Comencini. Virna Lisi, Margherita Buy, Sandra Ceccarelli, Luigi Lo Cascio. The lively goings-on of a modern Italian family are seen through the eyes (and camera) of a young girl about to receive her first Communion. In the home of their conservative traditionalist grandmother (Lisi), the family's members are compelled to behave themselves, but they chafe on the inside with hidden emotions. This touching family comedy-drama won 7 international awards. For ages 12 and older.

FENCES (2016-US) 139m *** ½ D: Denzel Washington. Denzel Washington, Viola Davis, Stephen Henderson, Jovan Adepo. This highly anticipated adaptation of August Wilson's Pulitzer Prize-winning play concerns a sanitation worker named Troy (Washington) in 1950s Pittsburgh. Usually jolly, Troy conceals decades of hurt and frustration, poisoning his outlook on life and his family. Winner of the Best Supporting Actress Oscar (Viola Davis) and 44 more awards. PG-13.

LION (2016-Australia/US/UK) 118m *** ½ D: Garth Davis (feature debut). Dev Patel, Nicole Kidman, Rooney Mara, Sunny Pawar, David Wenham, Abhishek Bharate. In this remarkable true story, Saroo (Patel), a boy born in a tiny rural village in India, moves to Australia with his adoptive family at age 5, and finds his way back to visit his biological family 25 years later. How Saroo achieves this extraordinary feat is a miracle of love, faith and Google Earth. Nominated for 6 Oscars, and winner of 31 awards. Rated PG-13.

BROKEN SILENCE (1995-Switzerland) 116m *** ½ D: Wolfgang Panzer. Martin Huber, Ameenah Kaplan, Michael Moriarty, Colonel Kappor. A Swiss Carthusian monk (Huber) breaks 25 years of silence in a New York confessional, where he recounts to an impatient, cynical priest (Moriarty) his journey to renew the lease of his order's cloister. En route to Indonesia, the naïve and sheltered monk loses his wallet, but manages to find his way thanks to a young black woman from New York (Kaplan). This witty, wise and delightfully unpredictable road movie won 5 awards. Suitable for ages 12 and older.

COME WHAT MAY aka En mai, fais ce qu'il te plaît (2015-France/Belgium) 114m *** D: Christian Carion (JOYEUX NOËL). August Diehl, Olivier Gourmet, Mathilde Seigner, Matthew Rhys, Joshio Marlon. The peace-loving people of the little village of Pas-de-Calais evacuate their homes when German bombers invade in May of 1940. Among them is 8-year-old Max (Marlon), whose German opposition activist dad Hans (Diehl) is in prison. When Hans is released, he struggles to find his son in the chaos that envelops France. This moving war drama was nominated for 2 awards. Rated R.

THE FACTS OF MURDER aka Un maledetto imbroglio (1959-Italy) 115m *** ½ D: Pietro Germi (DIVORCE ITALIAN STYLE). Pietro Germi, Claudia Cardinale. A robbery takes place in one Roman apartment followed by a murder in an adjacent apartment in this highly entertaining whodunit. At first, the crime appears to be a simple jewelry heist, but when wily detective Ingravallo (Germi) starts questioning the neighbors, a much more complicated story emerges. A mystery and social satire in equal measure, this rarely seen gem won 5 awards. For ages 12 and older.

SOPHIE AND THE RISING SUN (2016-US) 116m *** D: Maggie Greenwald (SONGCATCHER). Julianne Nicholson, Takashi Yamaguchi, Margo Martindale, Diane Ladd, Lorraine Toussaint. This touching drama set in Salty Creek, South Carolina in 1941 concerns lovers Grover Ohta (Yamaguchi) of California and local crabber Sophie Willis (Nicholson). When Japan bombs Pearl Harbor, the community's mistrust of the Japanese-American comes to a boil, causing Sophie, her neighbor Anne (Martindale) and her housekeeper Salome (Toussaint) to risk their lives protecting Grover. A gorgeous, well-acted film. Rated R.

MATTERS OF THE HEART aka Questione di cuore (2009-Italy) 104m *** D: Francesca Archibugi. Antonio Albanese, Kim Rossi Stuart, Micaela Ramazzotti, Francesca Inaudi. Two men meet and become friends in a hospital cardiac ward. Working class auto mechanic Angelo (Stuart) and boastful film industry scripter Alberto (Albanese) can't be more different, but their friendship somehow bridges their worlds. This delightfully funny and touching comedy-drama set in the lively streets and cafes of Rome won 7 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE FOUNDER (2016-US) 115m *** ½ D: John Lee Hancock (SAVING MR. BANKS). Michael Keaton, Nick Offerman, John Carroll Lynch, Laura Dern. Frustrated milkshake-mixer salesman Ray Croc (Keaton) becomes a wildly successful businessman by turning the McDonald brothers' (Offerman and Lynch) innovative burger shop into a global franchise. With a mad twinkle in his eye, Keaton powers this biopic set in 1954 San Bernardino. Winner of 1 award. Rated PG-13.

HIDDEN FIGURES (2016-US) 127m *** ½ D: Theodore Melfi (ST. VINCENT). Taraji P. Henson, Octavia Spencer, Janelle Monáe, Kevin Costner, Kirsten Dunst, Mahershala Ali. In 1962, the space race between the USSR and the United States was fueled by calculations done by human beings, not computers. The astonishing achievement of space travel was accomplished thanks to the work of three African American women mathematicians: Katherine G. Johnson (Henson), Dorothy Vaughan (Spencer) and Mary Jackson (Monáe). Their inspiring story won 29 awards and was nominated for 3 Oscars. Rated PG.

JUNK MAIL aka Budbringeren (1997-Norway) 78m *** D: Pål Sletaune. Robert Skjærstad, Andrine Sæther. This entertaining black comedy concerns unkempt mailman Roy (Skjærstad) who's terrible at his job. He reads other people's letters and dumps bushels of junk mail in a pit near the railroad tracks. But he too needs love. Fascinated with the girl (Sæther) who works at the dry cleaner's, Roy pokes his nose into the intimate details of her life and finds she's in trouble. As scuzzy as he is, Roy is a hero! Winner of 10 awards, including one at Cannes. For ages 15 and older.

IF CATS DISAPPEARED FROM THE WORLD aka Sekai kara neko ga kietanara (2016-Japan) 103m *** D: Akira Nagai. Takeru Satō, Gaku Hamada (FISH STORY), Aoi Miyazaki, Eiji Okuda. A young postman (Satō) is diagnosed with inoperable brain cancer. As he ponders this, his doppelgänger appears at his house, telling him he may live another day if an item (such as the telephone) is erased from existence worldwide. This gently humorous yet poignant fantasy is beautifully lensed in Hakodate and Buenos Aires. For ages 10 and older.

SPLIT (2016-US) 117m *** ½ D: M. Night Shyamalan (THE SIXTH SENSE). James McAvoy, Anya Taylor-Joy, Betty Buckley, Haley Lu Richardson, Jessica Sula. Three high school girls are kidnapped by a man (McAvoy) with 23 personalities in this nail-biter by M. Night Shyamalan. McAvoy is terrifying (and brilliant) as he morphs instantly into different people. In order to fight back, the girls study the different characters inhabiting their captor's body. Nominated for 4 awards. Rated PG-13.

LA LA LAND (2016-US/Hong Kong) 128m **** D: Damien Chazelle (WHIPLASH). Ryan Gosling, Emma Stone, J.K. Simmons, John Legend. In this big, beautiful candy-colored Hollywood musical about Hollywood, jazz musician Seb (Gosling) and aspiring actress Mia (Stone) fall in love. Trying to have their talent recognized while securing a roof over their heads—and without compromising their art—the two have a big challenge keeping their love alive. Winner of 185 awards, including 6 Oscars, among them Best Actress for Stone and Best Director for Chazelle. Rated PG-13.

GUGU THE CAT aka Gū-gū datte neko de aru (2008-Japan/South Korea) 116m *** D: Isshin Inudō (JOSEE, THE TIGER AND THE FISH). Kyōko Koizumi, Juri Ueno, Ryō Kase, Miyuki Ohshima, Marty Friedman. This quirky charmer set in the leafy, arty Tokyo neighborhood of Kichijōji concerns manga writer Asako (Koizumi) and two special cats. Suffering from writer's block, Asako discovers that artistic inspiration can come from the most unexpected sources in this winner of 2 awards. For ages 10 and older.

LISTEN TO MY HEART aka Hikidashi no naka no rabu retā (2009-Japan) 106m *** D: Shin'ichi Miki (feature debut). Takako Tokiwa, Kento Hayashi, Tatsuya Nakadai, Kaoru Yachigusa. Radio presenter Mai (Tokiwa) hosts a call-in program for people who need relationship advice. One day, teenage boy Naoki (Hayashi) calls in with a problem that stumps her. As Mai follows up on Naoki's concerns, she learns how to cope with her own heartache. This sweet and touching movie filmed in Tokyo and picturesque Hakodate won 1 award. For ages 10 and older.
