RUN & JUMP (2013-Ireland/Germany) 106m *** D: Steph Green. Will Forte (NEBRASKA), Maxine Peake, Edward MacLiam. American doctor Ted (Forte) travels to Ireland to study 33-year old Conor Casey (MacLiam), who has suffered a rare type of stroke that has changed his personality. Though Ted's research grant provides much needed financial aid to the Casey family, it places Conor's spirited and dynamic wife Vanetia (Peake) under huge pressure. This funny and touching drama won three awards. For ages 15 and older.

LONG DISTANCE LOVE (2009-Sweden) 77m *** D: Magus Gertten, Elin Jonsson. In this fascinating documentary filmed in Osh, Kyrgyzstan, Alisher and Dildora are in love. Soon they are happily married and have a baby on the way, but now Alisher is struggling to provide for his family. The only option for Alisher is to leave his young bride and find work in Moscow. The young couple is now beset by challenges more difficult than distance alone. For ages 12 and older.

WHAT THE DAY OWES THE NIGHT *aka Ce que le jour doit à la nuit* (2012-France) 155m *** D: Alexandre Arcady. Nora Arnezeder, Fu'ad Aït Aattou, Mohamed Fellag, Anne Parillaud, Vincent Perez. This rapturously beautiful love story adapted from Yasmina Khadra's best seller concerns an Algerian farmer's son, Younès, who as a child in 1939 is sent to live with his affluent Uncle Mohamed (Fellag) in Oran. Younès, renamed Jonas (Aït Aattou), lives a westernized life with a diverse assortment of friends, whose friendship is threatened during the Algerian War. Among his friends is Émilie (Arnezeder), the source of Jonas's heartache. For ages 12 and older.

THE ALBANIAN *aka Der Albaner* (2010-Germany/Albania) 105m *** ½ D: Johannes Naber (feature debut). Nik Xhelilaj, Amos Zaharia, Xhejilane Terbunja, Ivan Shvedoff. Albanian villager Arben (Xhelilaj) wants to marry his pregnant sweetheart Etleva (Terbunja), but she's been promised by her father to another man who's willing to pay a 10,000 Euro bride price. Arben decides to travel to Berlin to make money without papers or work experience. As the baby's due date looms, Arben's quest for money becomes desperate, pushing him deeper into Berlin's netherworld. This gripping drama won 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

PARTITION (2007-Canada/South Africa/UK) 116m *** ½ D: Vic Sarin. Jimi Mistry, Kristin Kreuk, Neve Campbell, Irfan Khan (THE LUNCHBOX), Madhur Jaffrey (SHAKESPEARE WALLAH). In 1947 during the tumultuous Partition that separated Islamic Pakistan from secular India, Sikh soldier Gian (Mistry), sickened of the senseless violence, rescues beautiful young Naseem (Kreuk), a Muslim woman, from fellow Sikhs. This romantic melodrama won 2 awards. Rated R.

SIMON & MALOU *aka No Time for Love* (2009-Denmark) 90m *** D: Theis Mølstrøm Christensen (feature debut), Lasse Spang Olsen. Tuva Novotny (JALLA! JALLA!), Dejan Cukic, Robert Hansen. Carefree Danish novelist Simon ends up having to share his Copenhagen flat with career-minded Swedish female lawyer Malou. You know what they say about opposites... This delightful romantic comedy was nominated for 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

KUMA (2012-Austria) 93m *** ½ D: Umut Dag. Nihal G. Koldas, Begüm Akkaya, Vedat Erincin, Murathan Muslu. Beautiful 19-year-old Ayse (Akkaya), a country girl from Turkey, is married with great ceremony to handsome 21-year-old Hasan (Muslu). But upon arriving at Hasan's home in Austria, it becomes clear that the wedding is a sham, and Ayse is to be *kuma* (second wife) to Hasan's father, Mustafa (Erincin). Unable to speak German and culturally isolated, Ayse nonetheless works to unify her new family and find her niche in a new land. Winner of 9 awards from around the world. For ages 12 and older.

25 CARAT (2008-Spain) 86m *** D: Patxi Amezcua. Francesc Garrido, Aida Folch (THE ARTIST AND THE MODEL), Manuel Morón. Small-time crooks Abel (Garrido) and Kay (Folch) are barely scraping by on their wits alone. When they meet by chance the two become partners in love and crime—hatching a plan that will either help them go straight... or cost them their lives. This stylish, critically acclaimed thriller set in a wintry Barcelona won 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

DEPARTURES *aka Okuribito* (2008-Japan) 130m **** D: Yôjirô Takita. Masahiro Motoki, Tsutomu Yamazaki, Ryoko Hirose. Unemployed cellist Daigo (Motoki) decides to return with his wife Mika (Hirose) to his childhood home in the north of Japan. While looking for work, he finds an ad for "Departures". Intrigued, Daigo decides to take the job, placing him on the rocky path to emotional and spiritual growth. This extremely moving drama won the first Japanese Oscar for Best Foreign Language Film and another 31 international film awards. Rated PG-13.

NON-STOP (2014-UK/France/US) 106m *** D: Jaume Collet-Serra (UNKNOWN). Liam Neeson (TAKEN), Julianne Moore, Michelle Dockery, Lupita Nyong'o. Former cop Bill Marks (Neeson) is air marshal on the non-stop from London to New York. Midflight, Marks receives a text (which hacked a secure line) stating that unless \$150 million is deposited to an off-shore account, someone will die every 20 minutes. This crackling action-mystery was nominated for an award. Rated PG-13.

ABOUT ELLY *aka Darbareye Elly* (2009-Iran/France) 119m **** D: Asghar Farhadi (A SEPARATION). Golshifteh Farahani, Shahab Hosseini (A SEPARATION), Taraneh Alidoosti, Merila Zare'i. A group of friends travel from Tehran to the coast for the weekend. Sepideh (Farahani) has invited Elly (Alidoosti), her young daughter's school teacher, to join in the fun. Elly doesn't realize Sepideh has an ulterior motive—she intends to matchmake Elly with her recently divorced friend Ahmad (Hosseini). This seemingly innocent deception leads to disaster in this keenly observed drama. Winner of 13 awards, including the Silver Berlin Bear. For ages 10 and older.

THE GRAND BUDAPEST HOTEL (2014-US/Germany) 100m **** D: Wes Anderson (MOONRISE KINGDOM). Ralph Fiennes (IN BRUGES), F. Murray Abraham, Mathieu Amalric (JIMMY P.), Tilda Swinton, Adrien Brody, Willem Dafoe. In 1932, in a great big pink wedding cake of a hotel perched on a middle-European mountain, meticulous concierge Gustave (Fiennes, screamingly funny) is embroiled in the contested will of an eminent guest, Mme. Céline Villeneuve Desgoffe und Taxis (Swinton). It's Ernst Lubitsch-esque farce and Wes Anderson whimsy all rolled into one fabulous confection. Winner of the Grand Jury Prize at Berlin. Rated R.

LOVE TO LOVE *aka Liever verliefd* (2003-Netherlands) 87m *** D: Pim van Hove. Miryanna van Reeden, Chris Zegers, Romijn Conen, Elle van Rijn. After being unceremoniously dumped again, Anna (van Reeden) decides never to fall in love. But she's proven wrong—she falls in love with TWO guys. What she doesn't know is that Rob (Zegers) and Sander (Conen) are best friends and roommates! This delightful romantic comedy won an award. For ages 15 and older.

JIMMY P. (2013-France/US) 117m *** D: Arnaud Desplechin (KINGS & QUEEN). Benicio Del Toro (TRAFFIC), Mathieu Amalric (THE DIVING BELL AND THE BUTTERFLY). In this absorbing drama set in post-World War II Kansas, Native American war veteran Jimmy Picard (Del Toro) is treated by progressive French psychoanalyst Georges Devereux (Amalric). Their growing friendship helps the men delve deeply into matters of culture and universal human nature while helping Picard cope with his illness. Nominated for 6 awards, including one at Cannes. For ages 12 and older.

THE BACHELOR *aka Mio caro dottor Gräsler* (1990-Italy/Hungary) 105m *** ½ D: Roberto Faenza. Keith Carradine, Miranda Richardson, Kristin Scott Thomas, Sarah-Jane Fenton. Doctor Emil Gräsler (Carradine) has been content with being single his entire adult life, but when his sister Frederica (Richardson) commits suicide, Gräsler seeks the love of a woman to assuage the loss of his close friend. This elegant adaptation of Arthur Schnitzler's novel set in pre-World War I Austro-Hungarian Empire is scored by the great Ennio Morricone. Winner of the Best Cinematography (Giuseppe Rotunno) David di Donatello Award. Rated PG-13.

PARIS-MANHATTAN (2012-France) 77m *** D: Sophie Lellouche (feature debut). Alice Taglioni, Patrick Bruel, Marine Delterme, Michel Aumont, Yannick Soulier. Parisian Pharmacist Alice (Taglioni) adores Woody Allen. She has seen all his films, and even administers Allen DVDs to pharmacy customers to cure what ails them. But all of Woody Allen's wit and wisdom hasn't helped Alice find a boyfriend. Alice's perplexed family sets Alice up with two different men with hopes that a spark might ignite. Will MIGHTY APHRODITE succeed by MIDNIGHT IN PARIS? For ages 12 and older.

ROB THE MOB (2014-US) 104m *** ½ D: Raymond De Felitta (CITY ISLAND). Michael Pitt, Nina Arianda, Andy Garcia, Ray Romano, Burt Young, Griffin Dunne. Tommy (Pitt) and Rosie (Arianda) are young, madly in love and broke in 1990s Queens, NY. Tommy comes up with an audacious plan to improve their financial situation—by robbing the Mafia! This zesty Italian-American comedy has delightful performances by the leads and by Andy Garcia as the big mob boss. Rated R.

THE JEWEL *aka Il gioiellino* (2011-Italy/France) 110m *** ½ D: Andrea Molaioli (THE GIRL BY THE LAKE). Toni Servillo (THE GREAT BEAUTY), Remo Girone, Sarah Felberbaum. The 2003 collapse of Italian dairy giant Parmalat serves as the inspiration for this black comedy/corporate thriller. Amanzio (Girone) is the regal owner of an agribusiness under financial pressure. To ease that pressure, Amanzio's Chief Financial Officer Ernesto (Servillo) does a bit of creative bookkeeping. But as sources of easy money begin to dry up, their "jewel" starts to lose its luster... Gorgeously shot by Luca Bigazzi (IL DIVO), THE JEWEL won 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.
