ANTHONY ZIMMER (2005-France) 89m * D:** Jérôme Salle. Sophie Marceau (FEMALE AGENTS), Yvan Attal (BON VOYAGE), Sami Frey, Gilles Lellouche, Daniel Olbrychski. Money launderer Anthony Zimmer is on the run in Nice, and the international police and the Russian Mafia both want to nab him. As Zimmer has had extensive plastic surgery, no one knows what he looks like. All eyes are on his lover Chiara (a volcanically hot Sophie Marceau), who sets up innocent tourist François (Attal) as a decoy for Zimmer's pursuers. This actioner, which was nominated for a César, is superior to its Hollywood remake, *THE TOURIST*. For ages 12 and older.

HUGH AND HEKE (2010-New Zealand) 87m * D:** Reston Griffiths. Geoff Dolan, Pete Smith, Sarah McLeod, Michelle Hou-Pere. Ordered by his doctor to rest, pakaha (haole) Hugh (Dolan) and his family arrive at a deserted North Island beach for a quiet holiday. The calm is broken by the arrival of Maori Heke (Smith) and his family who park next to Hugh's family. The two men squabble while the rest of their families try to become friends. Things start to heat up when Hugh and Heke battle over the same fish. Nominated for 5 awards. For ages 12 and older.

FAR FROM THE MADDING CROWD (2015-UK/US) 119m * ½ D:** Thomas Vinterberg (*THE HUNT*). Carey Mulligan (AN EDUCATION), Matthias Schoenaerts, Michael Sheen, Juno Temple, Tom Sturridge, Bradley Hall. This stately adaptation of Thomas Hardy's romantic novel stars Carey Mulligan as the plucky, independent Bathsheba Everdene. An orphan with education but no fortune, Bathsheba is determined to steer her own course. Three men want to win her hand: sheep farmer Oak (Schoenaerts), rich neighbor Boldwood (Sheen) and handsome, arrogant, Sgt. Troy (Sturridge). Which suitor will she choose? Rated PG-13.

DREAMS FOR SALE aka *Yume uru futari* (2012-Japan) 134m * D:** Miwa Nishikawa (*DEAR DOCTOR*). Takako Matsu, Sadao Abe (*KAMIKAZE GIRLS*), Rena Tanaka. When their izakaya burns to the ground, chef Kanya (Abe) and his wife Satoko (Matsu) are left with nothing. To raise funds, Satoko decides to have her charming husband promise marriage to lonely women to bilk them of their money. But the closer they get to achieving their financial aims, the bigger the strain on their marriage. This well-directed drama is often quite funny. For ages 15 and older.

EDO CASTLE REBELLION aka *Edo jo tairan* (1991-Japan) 113m * ½ D:** Toshio Masuda. Tomokazu Miura, Hiroki Matsukata, Yukiyo Toake, Tetsurō Tanba. In 1680, Tokugawa Shogun Ietsuna is gravely ill. Ietsuna's *tairō* (chief advisor) Sakai Tadakiyo (Matsukata) is put in charge of choosing a successor. When Ietsuna's brother Tsunayoshi declines to become shogun, covert intrigues and a fierce battle for succession ensue. Tsunayoshi's powerful mother, Lady Keishōin (Toake) joins the Lord of Bichū, Hotta Masatoshi (Miura) in promoting her playboy son as the fifth shogun. This action-packed samurai epic won a Mainichi Concours Award for Tomokazu Miura. For ages 12 and older.

ABOUT HER BROTHER aka *Otōto* (2010-Japan) 126m * ½ D:** Yōji Yamada (*TORA SAN* Series, *TWILIGHT SAMURAI*). Sayuri Yoshinaga, Tsurube Shōfukutei, Yū Aoi. Pharmacist Ginko (Yoshinaga) and her daughter Koharu's (Aoi) peaceful life in Tokyo is interrupted when Ginko's unruly younger brother Tetsuro (Shōfukutei) barges in on Koharu's wedding reception. Tetsuro has always been an embarrassment to the family, and though her other siblings want to disown Tetsuro, Ginko struggles to find a place for him. This touching drama won an award. For ages 12 and older.

PEACE (2010-US/Japan/South Korea) 75m * ½ D:** Kazuhiro Sōda (*MENTAL*). This strikingly original documentary follows the day to day life of cat lover Toshio Kashiwagi and his wife Hiroko in Okayama, Japan. Toshio provides transportation for the disabled and the elderly, while Hiroko works as a caregiver. One of people in their care is 91-year-old Shiro Hashimoto, a World War II vet dying of lung cancer who defiantly smokes Peace cigarettes. They make a pittance, but Toshio and Hiroko do all they can to help the weak and isolated participate fully in society. Funny and unexpectedly profound, this documentary won 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

ALA MALA (2015-Mexico) 99m * D:** Pedro Pablo Ibarra (*PULLING STRINGS*). Aislinn Derbez, Mauricio Ochmann, Papile Aurora, Luis Arrieta, Daniela Schmidt. In this delightful rom-com, strutting actress Maria Laura Medina (Derbez) is asked by her friend Kika (Aurora) to flirt with her boyfriend to test his fidelity. Soon "Mala" (Spanish for "cruel") is hired by suspicious women all over Mexico City, providing Medina much needed cash. When she aces an audition for a TV series, Maria hopes she can finally quit her sideline, but producer Patricia (Schmidt) asks her for just one more gig: seduce and dump Patricia's ex-boyfriend Santiago (Ochmann). Rated PG-13.

POLICE (1985-France) 113m * D:** Maurice Pialat (*À NOS AMOURS*). Sophie Marceau, Gérard Depardieu, Richard Anconina, Sandrine Bonnaire, Jonathan Léina. This inventive and eccentric crime thriller concerns jaded Parisian detective Mangin (Depardieu), who, while arresting Arab drug dealer Simon (Léina), falls for Simon's girlfriend, Noria (Marceau). Soon, Mangin and Noria are playing a dangerous game involving a bagful of heroin and 200 grand in cash. Depardieu won the Best Actor award at Venice for this role. Script by Catherine Breillat. For ages 15 and older.

LOL (LAUGHNG OUT LOUD)® (2008-France) 103m * D:** Lisa Azuelos. Sophie Marceau, Christa Théret, Jérémy Kapone, Marion Chabassol, Félix Moati. When Parisian teenager Lola (Théret) finds out her boyfriend Arthur (Moati) cheated on her during summer vacation, she decides to retaliate by flirting with his best friend Maël (Kapone). But as their high school class prepares for an excursion to London, their relationship heats up. This comedy plays like an updated version of *LA BOUM* (1980), whose star, Sophie Marceau, acts in this film as Lola's sexy and irresponsible mother. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

5 FLIGHTS UP (2014-US) 92m * D:** Richard Loncraine (*MY HOUSE IN UMBRIA*). Morgan Freeman, Diane Keaton, Cynthia Nixon. Married for 40 years, Alex (Freeman) and Ruth (Keaton) have seen their Brooklyn apartment rise in value from \$5000 to a cool million. Tired of walking up 5 floors each day, they decide to put their beloved home on the market through Ruth's real estate broker niece (Nixon). Alex and Ruth's once peaceful home turns into a battleground of offers, counteroffers and people there just for the wine and cheese. This engaging New York tale has terrific performances by the ever charming Freeman and Keaton. Rated PG-13.

OLO: THE BOY FROM TIBET (2012-Japan) 108m * D:** Hisaya Iwasa. This playful experimental documentary concerns a 10-year-old Tibetan boy Olo who escaped his home country alone when he was six. Now living in Dharamsala, India, Olo tries hard to hold on to memories of his life in Tibet. As documentarist Iwasa travels with Olo to Nepal to visit another refugee community one wonders, what is a country? What is a nationality? This moving documentary was featured at Tibet House US, a cultural center founded by His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama Tenzin Gyatso. For ages 10 and older.

POODLE SPRINGS (1998-US) 100m * D:** Bob Rafelson. James Caan, Dina Meyer, Brian Cox, Joe Don Baker. Tom Stoppard's adaptation of Raymond Chandler's last novel (completed by Robert B. Parker) is set in 1963, with detective Philip Marlowe (Caan) closing in on his sixth decade. Marlowe has married trophy wife Laura (Meyer), who wants to move to Poodle Springs, a ritzy new community bordering Nevada. But Marlowe's not cut out to be a rich girl's poodle, and he proudly begins wallowing among the criminal element to solve a crime or two. Our gumshoe hits upon a biggie, with surprising consequences. This crime drama won an award. For ages 15 and up.

JOSÉE, THE TIGER AND THE FISH aka *Joze to tora to sakana tachi* (2003-Japan) 116m * ½ D:** Isshin Inudō (*LA MAISON DE HIMIKO*). Satoshi Tsumabuki, Chizuru Ikekawi, Juri Ueno, Hirofumi Arai. College student Tsuneo (Tsumabuki) sees an enormous baby buggy careening out of control and runs to stop it. Inside, instead of a baby, is a young woman who calls herself Josée (Ikekawi). Josée, who has cerebral palsy, lives with her grandmother who keeps Josée hidden from society. Now that she's met Tsuneo, this will all change. This unusual romance won 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

WOMAN IN GOLD (2015-US/UK) 109m * ½ D:** Simon Curtis (*MY WEEK WITH MARILYN*). Helen Mirren, Ryan Reynolds, Daniel Brühl, Katie Holmes, Charles Dance, Moritz Bleibtreu. In this classily-told true story, Maria Altmann (Mirren) takes on the Austrian government to recover a portrait of her aunt stolen by the Nazis. The painting in question is a masterpiece by Gustav Klimt (Bleibtreu), so famous its image adorns fridge magnets. Dame Helen Mirren is brilliant as the funny, feisty and utterly determined octogenarian heroine. Rated PG-13.

EX MACHINA (2015-UK) 108m * ½ D:** Alex Garland (feature debut). Domhnall Gleeson, Oscar Isaac, Alicia Vikander (PURE), Corey Johnson, Sonoya Mizuno. Caleb (Gleeson), a young coder at a Google-like internet search company, wins a competition to spend a week with the founder of the company (Isaac) in his lavish mansion in the Alaskan wilderness. This turns out not to be a vacation, but a Turing Test—Caleb is asked to spend seven sessions with alluring robot Ava (Vikander) to determine if Ava's artificial intelligence is indistinguishable from a human's. This unsettling cat-and-mouse sci-fi thriller won an award. Rated R.

FIRELIGHT (1997-UK/US) 103m * ½ D:** William Nicholson (writer *SHADOWLANDS*). Sophie Marceau, Stephen Dillane, Dominique Belcourt, Kevin Anderson. In this lushly romantic drama set in 1838, Swiss governess Elisabeth (Marceau) agrees to secretly bear the child of English landowner Charles (Dillane) in order to pay off her father's debt. Can a business transaction turn into the bonding of two souls? Winner of 2 awards. Rated R.

BUNNY DROP aka *Usagi doroppu* (2011-Japan) 114m * ½ D:** SABU (*UNLUCKY MONKEY*). Ken'chi Matsuyama, Karina, Mana Ashida, Mirei Kiritani. In this movie adaptation of the hit manga *Usagi Doroppu*, 27-year-old salary man Daikichi (Matsuyama) attends his grandfather's funeral. There he meets his grandfather's 6-year-old illegitimate daughter (!) Rin (Ashida), who's rejected by Daikichi's conservative family. Without knowing anything about caring for a child, Daikichi adopts Rin and plunges into a new adventure. This charming comedy won an award. For ages 10 and older.

THE GLORY OF TEAM BATISTA aka *Chūmu bachistuta no eikō* (2008-Japan) 120m * D:** Yoshihiro Nakamura. Yūko Takeuchi, Hiroshi Abe (*THERMAE ROMAE*), Kōji Yūki. Brilliant heart surgeon Dr. Kiryu (Kikkawa) saved 26 consecutive lives performing the risky Batista procedure. But after 3 recent failures, Dr. Kiryu decides to investigate what's going wrong. Mousy Dr. Taguchi (Takeuchi) is chosen to head the investigation, a task for which she feels underequipped. But though she may lack surgical knowledge, she is exceptionally perceptive about people. This clever mystery/comedy/drama was a hit in Japan. For ages 12 and older.

THE TRIUMPHANT RETURN OF GENERAL ROUGE aka *Jeneraru rūju no gaisen* (2009-Japan) 123m * D:** Yoshihiro Nakamura. Yūko Takeuchi, Hiroshi Abe, Masato Sakai, Michiko Hada, Sei Hiraizumi, Jun Kunimura. In this sequel to *THE GLORY OF TEAM BATISTA*, Dr. Taguchi (Takeuchi) is promoted (despite her protests) to the chair of the Ethics Committee. When she receives an anonymous letter accusing Dr. Hayami (Sakai) of colluding with a medical supplier, she discovers that the eccentric Hayami (aka General Rouge) has made many enemies... for wanting to cure too many people. This fascinating comedy drama on medical politics was nominated for an award. For ages 12 and older.

HAPPINESS NEVER COMES ALONE aka *Un bonheur n'arrive jamais seul* (2012-France) 110m * D:** James Huth. Gad Elmaleh (*THE VALET*), Sophie Marceau (*ANTHONY ZIMMER*), François Berléand. Musician Sacha (Elmaleh) loves to party and hates kids. When Charlotte (Marceau) literally falls at his feet, Sacha's life changes forever. This sunny romantic comedy creatively combines music, art and rambunctious children. For ages 12 and older.

WELCOME TO THE SOUTH aka *Benvenuti al sud* (2010-Italy/Germany) 102m * D:** Luca Miniero. Claudio Bisio, Alessandro Siani, Valentina Lodovini, Angela Finocchiaro. This delightful Italian remake of the French *WELCOME TO THE STICKS* has herbal-tea sipping postal supervisor Alberto (Bisio), a northerner, banished to work in Naples by his boss. Alberto and his family are up in arms (*The poverty! The crime! The trash!*) but go he must. Once he's there, he finds it's not bad—but overflowing with love for her man, Alberto's wife Silvia (Finocchiaro) decides to come too! Prepare for a crescendo of laughs. Winner of 7 awards. For ages 12 and older.
