AFTER THE WEDDING aka *Efter Brylluppet* (2006-Denmark/Sweden) **120m** *** ½ D: Susanne Bier. Mads Mikkelsen (CASINO ROYALE), Rolf Lassgård, Sidse Babbett Knudsen, Stine Fischer Christensen, Christian Tafdrup. Jacob (Mikkelsen) is the dedicated but cash-strapped manager of an orphanage in India, who runs a food aid program and is surrogate father to Pramod, a winsome 8-year-old orphan. When billionaire Jørgen (Lassgård) offers a sum of money that would keep his orphanage afloat, Jacob is forced to return to Denmark to accept the donation, though he'd rather remain in India for Pramod's birthday. In Copenhagen, Jørgen has Jacob attend his daughter's wedding, where Jacob's secret past is revealed, placing him in a painful dilemma. This insightful and touching family drama was nominated for this year's Foreign Language Film Oscar and won seven international film festival awards. Rated R.

STARTER FOR 10 (2006-UK/US) **92m** *** D: Tom Vaughan. James McAvoy (THE LAST KING OF SCOTLAND), Alice Eve, Rebecca Hall, Dominic Cooper, Benedict Cumberbatch, Catherine Tate, James Corden. "Starter for ten" is a catchphrase from popular British TV quiz show "University Challenge". If a contestant got the "starter" right, he/she would get 10 points and be able to answer questions without interruption from other contestants. This quiz show is the backdrop for a rites-of-passage tale about working class Brian (McAvoy) and his first year at Bristol University in the mid-1980s. Eager to make the University Challenge team to show his native smarts, he learns that brains aren't all it takes. A funny yet biting social commentary, this romantic comedy won the Audience Award at the Austin Film Festival and was nominated for a British Independent Film Award and an Empire Award. Rated PG-13.

THE WIND THAT SHAKES THE BARLEY (2006-Ireland/UK/Germany/Italy/Spain/France) **127m** *** ½ D: Ken Loach (RIFF-RAFF). Cillian Murphy (RED EYE), Padraic Delaney, Liam Cunningham, Orla Fitzgerald, Mary O'Riordan, Mary Murphy, Laurence Barry. Damian (Cillian Murphy) and Teddy (Delaney) are brothers in rural Ireland in 1920. Idealistic Damian intends to go to London to study medicine. Pragmatic Teddy is an IRA guerilla. When Damian witnesses the atrocities against his people by the Black and Tans, he joins the armed uprising against the British. A fragile truce is signed, but peace is short-lived as the freedom fighters break into factions, dividing the brothers. This deeply humanistic exploration of what happens when an occupying force withdraws won Loach a Palme D'Or at Cannes. Including the Golden Palm, this masterful was drama won 5 awards and 18 nominations. No MPAA rating. For ages 15 and above.

DESTINY aka *al-Massir* (1997-France/Egypt) **135m** *** D: Youssef Chahine. Nour El-Sherif, Laila Eloui, Mahmoud Hemida, Safia El Emari, Mohamed Mounir, Khaled Nabawy. This lavish historical epic set in Spain illustrates the struggle for free speech, literacy and reason against religious fundamentalism in 12th century Andalusia. Famed Spanish-Arabian philosopher/scholar Averroes (El-Sherif) finds himself imperiled when the Caliph (Hemida) decides his friendship is politically inconvenient. The Caliph must defend his rule against a wealthy sheik who has aligned himself with a fundamentalist movement. Averroes, whose rational philosophy encouraging individual interpretation of the Koran enrages Christian and Muslim zealots alike, risks his life to bring his message of tolerance and reason to the people. This romantic and entertaining swashbuckler was nominated for a Golden Palm at Cannes, and won 3 international film awards. No MPAA Rating: Suitable for family viewing, subtitled in English.

PING PONG (2002-Japan) **114m** *** D: Fumihiko Sori. Yosuke Kubozuka, Arata, Sam Lee, Shido Nakamura, Naoto Takenaka, Mari Natsuki. Dazzling visuals and action take this teen comedy into extreme sport territory. Peco (Kubozuka) is totally nuts about ping pong, and practices obsessively, easily defeating his school mates. His buddy Smile (Arata)—so named because he never does—is a naturally gifted athlete but is uninterested in winning. When Peco suffers a humiliating defeat from fearsome ping pong ninja Dragon (Nakamura), he must re-evaluate his priorities to truly win. BALLS OF FURY is currently in theaters, but this is probably the best ping pong movie to date. Winner of 5 awards and nominated for 7, PING PONG is a thoroughly engaging sports movie. No MPAA rating: suitable for family viewing, subtitled in English.

3:10 TO YUMA (1957) **92m** *** ½ D: Delmer Daves (BROKEN ARROW). Van Heflin (SHANE), Glenn Ford, Felicia Farr, Leora Dana, Henry Jones, Richard Jaeckel, Robert Emhardt. Strapped for cash, farmer Heflin agrees to hold captured outlaw Ford until the 3:10 train arrives. But Ford begins to psychologically challenge Heflin, causing his escort to feel like the prisoner. Considered one of the best films of the 1950s, this gripping western features a memorable theme by George Dunning sung by Frankie Laine ("RAWHIDE"). Nominated for a BAFTA for Best Film from any Source in 1958, Based on an Elmore Leonard short story, this film has been remade with Christian Bale and Russell Crowe, due to open in theaters on September 7, 2007. Good for the whole family.

ONE SIX RIGHT (2005) **73m** **** D: Brian Terwilliger. Hal Fishman, Desiree Horton, Lorenzo Lamas, Sydney Pollack. This exhilarating documentary captures the feeling of flight through thrilling photography and a sweeping original score. The history of Van Nuys Airport in Southern California is told through interviews and recollections, illustrating the beauty and grace of aviation and the passion it inspires in aviators. Thanks to pilot George Read for finding us this doc. Rated G. Good for the whole family.

THE LOOKOUT (2007) **99m** *** D: Scott Frank. Joseph Gordon-Levitt (BRICK), Jeff Daniels (THE SQUID AND THE WHALE), Matthew Goode, Isla Fisher, Carla Gugino, Bruce McGill, Alberta Watson. Chris (Gordon-Levitt) has everything going for him—fame as a high school hockey star, a beautiful girlfriend and wealthy parents—when he almost dies in a car accident. A few years later, he is still recovering, suffering from a faulty memory and disorientation. While working at a bank as a night janitor, Chris runs into old school acquaintance Gary (Goode), who lifts his spirits by introducing him to Luvlee (Fisher). But Gary belongs to a gang that's been casing the local banks, including the one Chris works at. Though Chris badly wants to regain control of his life, he's sorely tempted by ill-gotten gains, and reluctantly agrees to be the lookout for the robbery. This gripping neo-noir has strongly realized characters and wonderful performances to match. Highly recommended. Rated R.

36 QUAI DES ORFÈVRES (2004-France) **110m** *** ½ D: Olivier Marchal. Daniel Auteuil, Gérard Depardieu, André Dussollier, Roschdy Zem, Valeria Golino. Written and directed by an ex-cop, this engaging *policier* takes its inspiration from Alexandre Dumas' *The Count of Monte Cristo* and the experiences of a fellow cop who was jailed for a crime committed while pursuing greater justice. Two of the greatest actors of France, Auteuil and Depardieu, play rival policemen vying for the position of Chief of Police. A compelling French crime thriller nominated for eight Césars including Best Film. Adults only, for violence. A US remake with NYC standing in for Paris is scheduled for release August 2008.

OFFSIDE (2006-Iran) **93m** *** D: Jafar Panahi (CHILDREN OF HEAVEN). Sima Mobarak-Shahi, Shayesteh Irani, Ayda Sadeqi, Golnaz Farmani, Mahnaz Zabihi. Teenage girls, all ardent soccer fans, masquerade as boys to crash the Iran-Bahrain match in this hilarious Iranian comedy of gender inequality. Women are banned from attending male sports events in Iran, and the absurdity of this and other social laws is cleverly illuminated through the girls' fight for the chance to root for their team. Confronted by the girls, male authority figures can't logically justify the male supremacist laws they must uphold. OFFSIDE won a Silver Bear at Berlin and an Amnesty International Film Award at the Ljubljana Film Festival. Rated PG.

KNOCKED UP *Unrated Version* (2006) **133m** *** ½ D: Judd Apatow (THE 40 YEAR OLD VIRGIN). Seth Rogen, Katherine Heigl, Paul Rudd, Leslie Mann, Jason Segel, Jay Baruchel, Jonah Hill, Martin Starr. In this uproarious comedy, Ben (Rogen) is a paunchy layabout 20-something who is happily underemployed and living with a bunch of hopeless stoners. In a parallel universe, blond and beautiful Alison (Heigl) is celebrating her promotion to presenter on the E! channel. The mismatched couple meets at a club, get royally wasted and have a one-night-stand. Eight weeks later, however, Alison finds she's pregnant and the two nervously agree to stay together through the pregnancy. They have nine months to grow up, and in the process they fall in love. Full of laughs yet keenly observant of human nature, this terrific comedy was nominated for 4 teen choice awards.

TEN CANOES (2006-Australia) **90m** *** ½ D: Rolf de Heer (THE TRACKER) and Peter Djigirr. Cruseo Kurddal, Jamie Gulpilil, Richard Birrinbirrin, Peter Djigirr, Peter Minyngululu, Frances Djulibing, Johnny Bunyira, voice of David Gulpilil. Chief Minyngululu leads a group of ten men into the forest to build canoes. Taking the trip for the first time is the chief's younger brother Dayindi (Jamie Gulpilil) who is unmarried and pining for the youngest of Minyngululu's three wives. The chief pacifies Dayindi by telling him a tale of ancient times about his own ancestor Ridgimiril (Kurddal) and his younger brother, who faced the same dilemma. Told with great wit and filmed gorgeously by Ian Jones, this fascinating tale is almost entirely in Ganabingu, an Aboriginal language. A winner of the Un Certain Regard from Cannes and six Australian Film Institute awards including Best Film and seven other major international film awards, TEN CANOES is a stunning cinematic achievement. No MPAA rating: suitable for family viewing, subtitled in English.
