Announcements:

1. Tips on Orchid Culture for Beginners:

A brief session on beginning orchid culture for various genera will be presented immediately prior to the start of each general meeting. These sessions will primarily be comprised of discussion (media, light, water, fertilizer, etc.) and demonstration regarding basics associated with the culture of a single orchid genera. Those interested are encouraged to come a few minutes early (start about 6:45 for 15 – 20 minutes) and bring material to take notes with. Kean Matsumoto will do the first presentation this month and address dendrobium culture.

2. 1st Vice President for KOS:

Phil Sharp has informed the Board that he will not run for 1st Vice President or any other position on the board next year. General Meeting – September 7th 2010

Meeting was opened by President Alan Mai'i at 7:00 pm.

Alan explained to the membership that a questionnaire would be passed out to all members and asked if they would please read it, answer the questions and they will be collected shortly thereafter. He further explained that it would help the executive board make decisions for the future of KOS.

Alan asked if there were any guests or new members in the audience and there were 3 guests and one new member who he welcomed and they were given an orchid plant.

Announcements made by Alan:

- Poinsettias will be sold by KOS for \$12 and can be picked up at the December meeting.
- Planting mix is for sale for \$5 a bag.
- Thanks to all members for their hard work at the annual KOS show.
- The final financial report for the show is still pending, but is in the positive.

Guest speaker: Dr. Bernie Cagauan

Topic: Culture of Grammatophyllum Orchids

- He spoke of several different species and hybrids that he has grown himself.
- One of the most popular species is the Scriptum Cipirinum which sometimes curls at the top. To avoid the curling when it gets about 6 to 8 inches tall clip off the top and you will avoid the eventual curl.
- Most grammatophyllums grow in areas that are uniform in rainfall and have very little dry periods.
- He states that he does not have many problems with insects or disease because he does not grow his plants too close together and therefore there is room to spray underneath them as well as all around.
- He indicates that problems occur when: 1) you have too much heat; 2) there is a lack of air circulation; 3) you get mites; or 4) there is a potassium deficiency which results in the leaves turning brown & the only remedy is to cut the leaves off.
- His remedy for mites are a mild infestation is soapy water, for a severe problem use 1 tablespoon of mineral oil per gallon of water.
- For fertilizer he uses Nutricote and warns against fertilizer too much because then they will not bloom.
- You need good drainage and do not worry about over watering. During the warm season water everyday especially if they are close together.
- When you divide, do not plant right away, but first let the wound heal and he states you will have a 95% survival rate. For the small plants use peat moss with Perl-lite and for the bigger ones plant in bark and peat moss. You can go from 2" to 4" to 6" pots and then stop. Do not plant in larger pots than 6".
- Direct sun is OK. They will burn at first and then that will stop. If you plant them in deep shade you will not have flowers.


