These sessions will primarily be comprised of discussion (media, light, water, fertilizer, etc.) and demonstration regarding basics associated with the culture of single orchid genera. Those interested are encouraged to come a few minutes early (start about 6:45 for 15 – 20 minutes) and bring material to take notes with. Kean Matsumoto's demo this month will address **Cattleya Orchid Culture Basics** .

General Meeting – October, 5, 2010

6:45 pm - Before the official opening of the meeting **Kean Matsumoto** gave a brief talk on about **Dendrobriums**:

Location sunny (if dry and/or windy – water more often).

Medium acc. to environment: dryer areas use bark; wetter areas use rock

Fertilizer 13-2-13; nutri-cote

Pests Use Bayer 3 in 1 for slugs/snails, white moth/caterpillar; thrips (attack buds), aphids (attack leaves); fungus (tiny

black spots) use an oily film (best to use is "saf-t-side" found only in Waimanalo).

Varieties Over 2,500 different varieties – 6 mentioned and shown by Kean were:

1. Jacquelyn Thomas – common var. – easy – full sun - medium: rock

2. Nigorhirsutae – less sun than above – medium: coarse bark

3. Den. Gatton Sunray – full sun – medium: bark

4. Den. Brackteosun – 50% shade – medium: bark

5. Den. Oligophyllum – 50% shade-water every day-mount on wall

6. Den. Jodi-Ann – full sun –medium: rock

General Meeting was opened by President Alan Mai'i at 7:00pm.

Alan asked if there were any guests or new members and there were 2 of each that received a complementary orchid plant.

Alan announced that Beaudine Ma found a spelling error in the newsletter and received a \$10 gift certificate for Kawamoto's nursery.

He indicated that there was a plant sale along with the selling of fertilizer and baskets during the meeting. Alan thanked everyone who participated in the survey and introduced Lisa Abbott to give a brief summary of the results.

Lisa indicated that 61 people filled out the questionnaire and that KOS appear to be on target in that most people want to learn more about orchids from experts at our meetings, they want to buy orchids and meet people with their same interest. It was generally agreed that raising the dues was OK, that KOS appears to have too many giveaways, that having speakers and hands-on demonstrations at meeting was good, we should continue having the banquet, that having AOS judges was appreciated and some people were willing to help and if they could please contact Lisa or Alan about participating.

Alan then indicated that at our last meeting he gave a preliminary accounting of KOS's July show and the final accounting revealed a profit of \$2,400, but this was with the understanding that several items that would normally be expenses ended up as donations otherwise KOS would have come out in the negative category. This is important in that KOS cannot depend on donations in the future and we may have to revise future plans for the show.

Alan announced that it was time to nominate people who would run for the Board at KOS and while several present board members would be willing to continue. if anyone is interested in participating in a board position please let him know.

Guest speaker: Roy Tokunaga



Roy is from H&S Nurseries. He has a BA in education from UH in 1973, majoring in biology. After graduating, he participated in an orchid lab cloning and germinating orchids and eventually opened his H&R Nursery 30 years ago. He has produced several thousand hybrids and has been an AOS judge since 1990.



Roy recommends:

Fertilizer with a very low phosphorous (2-3%) and the best is Michigan State fertilizer, but this is not available in Hawaii yet. So the next best thing is **Island Supreme 13-2-13**. You also need calcium (6-8%) and this can be achieved by using **dolomite** (a white powder) which has calcium and magnesium. 13-2-13 picks up water easily and can become mushy. To avoid this problem keep the majority of it in its original bag and in an air tight container. Then put a little at a time in a freezer bag for regular use.

Pesticide - use "Bayer 3 in 1".

Re-potting







Roy states you want to make the plant think it is still in the same pot and you do not want to damage the roots. Therefore, when re-potting use a larger pot with a minimum of media leaving room around the plant to give it plenty of air and circulation. Tie the plant down in the new pot and put in a few pieces of decorative bark around the plant on the inside of the pot. Then you will have good drainage and plenty of air circulation.

Roy indicated that he is trying to re-vitalize some hybrid orchids that we have almost lost and he gave a brief description of some of his favorites:

- 1. Cattleya Bowringiana blooms 2nd week in Oct.
- 2. My Time blooms in Nov.
- 3. Vanda Sanderiana almost lost; slow growing (7 yrs. to full bloom); does not like being in a pot.
- 4. Christensonia Vietnamica small blooms; does not want to be in a pot similar to a vandal; 1 yr. to blooms.
- 5. Brassavola blooms 1st week in Oct.
- 6. "Little Stars" blooms in beginning of Nov.; fragrant only at dark; nick name "Lady of the Night"
- 7. Dendrobium Digophyllum grow in pots or baskets or mounted; fragrant; blooms most of the year.

Roy very adamantly advocated members to join AOS – American Orchid Society and as part of your membership you will received the magazine "ORCHIDS" which he states is where he has received 90% of his information and will benefit orchid growers at all stages.

Refreshments served.

Roy Tokunaga did the judging and commentary and awards for plants that were displayed.

Interesting Facts from the 1500s:

Most people got married in June because they took their yearly bath in May, and they still smelled pretty good by June. However, since they were starting to smell, brides carried a bouquet of flowers to hide the body odor.

Hence, the custom today of carrying a bouquet when getting Married.

Bread was divided according to status. Workers got the burnt bottom of the loaf, the family got the middle, and guests got the top, or the <u>upper crust</u>.

Houses had thatched roofs-thick straw-piled high, with no wood underneath. It was the only place for animals to get warm, so all the cats and other small animals (mice, bugs) lived in the roof. When it rained it became slippery and sometimes the animals would slip and fall off the roof...Hence the saying "It's raining cats and dogs."

Lead cups were used to drink ale or whiskey. The combination would sometimes knock the imbibers out for a couple of days. Someone walking along the road would take them for dead and prepare them for burial.

They were laid out on the kitchen table for a couple of days and the family would gather around and eat and drink and wait and see if they would wake up. Hence, the custom of <u>holding a wake</u>.

- Commentary


