Principal's Message

Dear Parents & Guardians,

Safety is always our first priority. We have made some changes in our morning drop off procedures. Please read the following guidelines carefully as **Health and Safety** is our first priority. We appreciate the cooperation of all of our families as we work together to keep our children safe.

- Practice **ALOHA!** Be respectful to the adults charged with monitoring and controlling morning student drop off. Obey the loading and student drop off rules or move from a No Parking area, please do so with aloha children need to see that even adults need to obey rules and procedures.
- Have your child ready to disembark when you come to a complete stop. It is very important that your children are on the passenger side of your vehicle with their belongings packed and ready to go.
- Pay Attention to everything. Children are unpredictable. Avoid using cell phones and other distracting activities when driving.
- We highly encourage for more parents to drop off their children at the Waialae Ave. gate (Across the street from Hawaii USA and 3660 on the Rise). Students are also to be dropped off and picked up at the 13th Avenue and Mahina Street pedestrian gates. These gates are JPO (Junior Police Officer) manned in the mornings and afternoons.
- The Mahina Street and Koko Head Avenue staff parking lots are only for staff and employees with parking passes displayed on their dashboards. Any cars parked in these lots without a pass will be warned at first. Towing information is posted and visible in both staff parking lots.
- Public parking is available in the Kaimuki municipal parking lots and at metered stalls near the school.
- For safety sake, there is absolutely no student allowed walking through the parking lots to enter the campus unless accompanied by an adult.


