D50 Project: Great Aloha Run

At the crack of dawn on Monday, (4:30am) February 15, 2010, members of the Hawaii Kai Lions Club, along with 7 members of the Koko Head Lions Club (President Richard Kaneko, Ted Aratani, Selvin Chin-Chance, Stanley Ito, Hiroshi Nishida Philip Sharp, Stanley Torricer), and one CIS (Frances Chin-Chance), joined forces with representatives the Kaimuki Lions Club and from other Leo and Lions Clubs to provide a helping hand to the organizers of the 2010 Great Aloha Run. We convened at the Aloha Stadium which is the official finish line.



Our task was to pass out T-shirts to all the military affiliated participants who successfully finished the run. Over 3,000 military personnel were projected to complete the race.



As volunteers we were part of a cadre of thousands providing a wide range of assistance to run organizers. After reporting to work just before 5:00am we had a quick breakfast and thus fortified with eggs, pancakes, rice, Japanese Miso soup, coffee and tea we trooped off in the darkness to the staging area where the real work started.

Unloading the 3,000 shirts in varying sizes we started to sort and stack them for fast and easy distribution to the military finishers. It's amazing how many different ways people address the simple task of stacking and sorting T-shirts.

After the initial group swept through we began dismantling and cleaning up. By 9:30am it was all over.


