Over 1,000 people and 40 vehicles participated in Hawaii Kai's "Holiday Parade", including a Corvette Club, Classic Car Club, dignitaries, multitudes of beauty pageant winners, boy scouts, girl scouts, cub scouts, brownies, Leo's, several different marching bands – two from the mainland, the US Marine Corps Toys for Tots, and many others. Police officers, emergency response personnel, and Lion parade marshals were also prominent along the parade route.

Two band members from Buena Vista Arizona in heavy wool festooned uniforms were treated for heat stroke at the end of the parade route, but are apparently doing well.

Club Project: Assistance to the Loliana Homeless Shelter:

Ted Aratani, Selvin Chin Chance, Phil Sharp, and Stan Torricer met at Niu Valley Middle school to participate in their annual Christmas celebration for the Loliana Family Shelter. The students from the band and student government, dressed in either their band uniforms or school shirts with red elf caps loaded all of the goodies into one of the two buses and two vans supplied by parents. The goodies included food items (donated by our club) and presents for individual children who reside at the shelter.





According to Gail Kaleopa'a, the building manager at Loliana, there are currently between 80 to 90 children at the shelter. The residents of the shelter gathered in the playground area on the parking lot level. The Niu Valley students lined up all of the gifts, packages, and boxes that were to be delivered. There was much excitement in the air in anticipation of the gifts that would soon be opened.

The gifts were passed out based on name and apartment number. The students lined up before the microphone to call out a child or family name and their apartment number. It took a while, the shelter houses 43 families.



The band played Christmas carols which were accompnied by singing from the families. The were Christmas candies, cookies, and light snacks for everyone. It was really a heart warming experience for all of us.
