# Zone 2 International Youth Camp (IYC) Diamond Head Hike Activity Report

TYPE OF SERVICE PROJECT: Youth

**DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:** The four Region V Zone 2 Clubs: Diamond Head, Hawaii Kai, Kaimuki, and Koko Head, hosted 24 International Youth Campers from seventeen countries: Austria, Belgium, Canada, Czech Republic, Croatia, England, Finland, Germany, Hungary, Israel, Italy, Mongolia, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Slovak Republic, and Switzerland, with the Lion objective to promote international peace and understanding.

The Lions presented a short program about the history of Diamond Head (Le'ahi) Crater and the State Monument, with a bit of Hawaiiana. A talk about safety rules and the hiking trail was also presented. A bottle of cold water was provided for each hiker. Armed with walkie talkies and a first aid kit, Lion escorts guided the youth on the hike, to enjoy the beautiful scenic view at the top. Refreshing fruit ice bars, cold drinks, snacks and Subway sandwich lunches were served after the IYC group returned from the hike. Personalized luggage –nametags were given as gifts to each IYC youth and chaperone.
