LEGISLATIVE ISSUES

Governor's Vetoes and Legislative Overrides -

Although there were 53 bills on the Governor's list, only 41 were actually vetoed. Several bills were enacted with her signature. The Legislature convened on July 8 for one day to override 13. See the chart on page 4 for veto/override action.

Gov. Lingle Releases Funds for Area Projects

The Governor released \$100,000 towards construction of the Food Complex and Skilled Nursing Facility at Palolo Home. The Red Cross will receive \$125,000 for HQ renovations. Total cost of the project is \$4.8 million of which the Legislature authorized \$2 million in 2007. The City awarded the Red Cross \$775,000 and another \$1.3 million came from donations. The Red Cross plans to raise an additional \$600,000 from private sources.
