

LEGISLATIVE ISSUES

To Veto or Not to Veto - By June 23rd the Governor is required to send a list of bills to the Legislature that are under consideration for veto. By July 8th she is required to veto all, some, or none of these bills. Then, should the Legislature wish to override any of these vetoes, it must do so on July 8th. It takes the affirmative vote of 2/3 of each House for a successful override vote. The number of votes required is 34 yes in the House and 17 yes votes in the Senate. No votes do not count.

Don't Drink and Drive - Beware, Governor Lingle has signed a DUI penalty bill into law. If you are caught driving under the influence you may have an ignition interlock installed in your car. You would have to blow into the device in order to start your car. It registers how much, if any, alcohol may be in your system. And, if it is over a certain limit, the car will not start.
