**ROMUALD ET JULIETTE** *aka Mama, There's a Man in Your Bed* (1989-France) 108m \*\*\* D: Coline Serreau (THREE MEN AND A CRADLE). Daniel Auteuil, Fimrine Richard. Company president Romuald (Auteuil) seems to have all the trappings of success: wealth, power and a beautiful family. But his wife is having an affair, and some devious boardroom rivals have set him up for a fall. The only person who can help him is Juliette (Richard), a penniless West Indian cleaning lady. Luckily for Romuald, she has the answers he needs. This light-hearted romantic comedy was nominated for a BAFTA. PG-13.

**STORK DAY** *aka È già ieri* (2004-Italy/Spain/UK) 90m \*\*\* D: Giulio Manfredonia (WE CAN DO THAT). Antonio Albanese, Goya Toledo, Fabio De Luigi, Asunción Balaguer. In his funny Italian take on GROUNDHOG DAY, arrogant Filippo, a nature program host, is sent to a remote site on the Canary Islands to film storks. Stranded by a storm, Filippo is forced to re-live the same day, August 13, until he learns some valuable lessons. Goya Toledo plays Rita, Filippo's love interest. STORK DAY was nominated for a David di Donatello Award. For ages 13 and older.

**BLACK AND WHITE** *aka Bianco e nero* (2008-Italy) 100m \*\*\* D: Cristina Comencini (THE BEST DAY OF MY LIFE). Fabio Volo, Ambra Angiolini, Aïssa Maïga, Eriq Ebouaney, Anna Bonaiuto. In this delightfully witty comedy, an Italian computer programmer (Volo) falls in love with a Senegalese embassy employee (Maïga) to the dismay of each of their spouses (Angiolini and Ebouaney). This observant movie on race and the battle of the sexes won at the Bastia Film Festival. For ages 13 and older.

**LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE** (2006-US) 101m \*\*\* D: Jonathan Dayton and Valerie Faris. Abigail Breslin, Greg Kinnear, Paul Dano, Alan Arkin, Toni Collette, Steve Carell. Olive Hoover (Breslin) is invited to compete in the Little Miss Sunshine pageant, launching her goofily dysfunctional family on a foolhardy but determined road trip to Redondo Beach. Hilarious setbacks and disasters ensue, forcing the Hoovers to pull together as a family. Arkin makes an Oscar-winning comeback with this film which returned American indies to the forefront. Note: Arkin is nominated for a Best Supporting Actor Oscar for ARGO, which is nominated for 7 Oscars . R.

**SEVEN PSYCHOPATHS** (2012-UK) 110m \*\*\* ½ D: Martin McDonagh. Colin Farrell, Sam Rockwell, Christopher Walken, Woody Harrelson, Tom Waits, Harry Dean Stanton. The title says it all. Since this comedy-crime caper is written and directed by the man who brought us IN BRUGES, and stars the lovably strange Christopher Walken, you know you're in for a treat. Marty (Farrell), who is struggling to write a screenplay, tries to take inspiration from a group of nutcases who kidnap a vicious gangster's (Harrelson) Shih Tzu dog. Winner of 2 awards. R.

**UN ALTRO MONDO** *aka Another World* (2010-Italy) 110m \*\*\* D: Silvio Muccino. Silvio Muccino (MANUAL OF LOVE), Isabella Ragonese, Michael Rainey Jr., Greta Scacchi (THE PLAYER), Maya Sansa. In this family drama, Andrea's (Muccino) carefree life as a wealthy Roman twenty-something is interrupted when he receives a letter from his father, who had abandoned Andrea to live in Kenya 20 years earlier. Andrea's father is dying, and he wishes Andrea to visit him in Africa. There, Andrea discovers a little surprise. This adaptation of Carla Vangelista's novel won a Capri Hollywood Award. For ages 12 and older.

**FIREWORKS** *aka Fuochi d'artificio* (1997-Italy) 100m \*\*\* D: Leonardo Pieraccioni (THE CYCLONE). Leonardo Pieraccioni, Vanessa Lorenzo, Claudia Gerini, Massimo Ceccherini, Luigi Petrucci. This popular Italian comedy is about the frenzied romantic life of Ottone (Pieraccioni) as told to a psychoanalyst (Petrucci) he meets while on holiday in the Maldives. Ottone's lover Mara dumped him for a butcher. Now he's courting rich Luna (Lorenzo), who's just toying with him, and Lorenza (Gerini), the owner of the pet store where Ottone works, wants to run away with him. Nominated for 2 awards. Unrated.

**A SIMPLE LIFE** *aka Tao jie* (2011-Hong Kong) 118m \*\*\* ½ D: Ann Hui. Andy Lau (INFERNAL AFFAIRS), Deannie Yip, Lawrence Ah Mon, Dennis Chan, Sammo Hung Kam-Bo. Hong Kong superstar Andy Lau stars as an ordinary middle-aged man who decides to care for his amah Ah Tao (Yip), who served his family for four generations, when she suffers a stroke. This beautifully understated character study of two good, kind people won 25 film awards from all over the world, 8 of them for Deannie Yip's warmly human portrayal of Ah Tao. For ages 12 and older.

**FLIGHT** (2012-US) 138m \*\*\* ½ D: Robert Zemeckis. Denzel Washington, Bruce Greenwood, Don Cheadle, John Goodman (ARGO), Nadine Velazquez. Pilot Whip Whitaker (Washington) is caught in a near-impossible situation while flying a passenger jet, and manages, out of sheer steely nerve, to land the plane with only six casualties. Whitaker is hailed as a hero, but the investigation of the crash reveals a very troubling fact about him. This absorbing character study won 4 awards and is nominated for 2 Oscars, including one for Washington's powerhouse performance. R.

**THE SESSIONS** (2012-US) 95m \*\*\* ½ D: Ben Lewin. John Hawkes (LINCOLN), Helen Hunt, William H. Macy, Moon Bloodgood, Rhea Perlman. San Francisco journalist Mark (Hawkes) contracted polio at the age of six, and has spent most of his life in an iron lung. At the age of 36, Mark decides to lose his virginity, and hires sex surrogate Cheryl (Hunt), a married soccer mom. This funny, eye-opening story based on a real-life experience won 6 awards and is nominated for an Oscar for Hunt's performance. R.

**HIROSHIMA, MONAMOUR** (1959-France/Japan) 90m \*\*\* D: Alain Resnais. Emmanuelle Riva (AMOUR), Eiji Okada, Stella Dassas, Pierre Barbaud, Bernard Fresson. While making a pacifist film in Hiroshima, a French actress (Riva) embarks on an affair with a married Japanese architect (Okada). He reminds her of her first love: a German soldier in France during the occupation. Open to many interpretations, this gorgeous, evocative film shook the world of cinema and influenced the birth of the French New Wave. (Riva is nominated for a Best Actress Oscar for Michael Haneke's AMOUR, which is also nominated for Picture, Director, Screenplay and Foreign Language Film.) For ages 13 and older.

**THE PERKS OF BEING A WALLFLOWER** (2012-US) 102m \*\*\* ½ D: Stephen Chbosky. Logan Lerman, Emma Watson, Ezra Miller, Mae Whitman, Dylan McDermott. Adapted from director Stephen Chbosky's novel, this refreshingly real-life drama about high school friendships chronicles the freshman year of introverted mental patient Charlie (Lerman) in 1991 Pittsburgh. Luckily for Charlie, he's befriended by two utterly cool seniors, Sam (Watson) and her half-brother Patrick (Miller), who help re-introduce him to society. Winner of 2 awards. PG-13.

**ROBOT AND FRANK** (2012-US) 89m \*\*\* ½ D: Jake Schreier. Frank Langella, Peter Sarsgaard, James Marsden, Liv Tyler, Susan Sarandon. Set in the near future, this imaginative comedy-drama concerns retired cat burglar Frank (Langella), who is just beginning to suffer from dementia. Concerned about his dad, Frank's son Hunter (Marsden) provides him with a robot caregiver. Though Frank is resentful about his new gift at first, he discovers Robot (Sarsgaard) can be surprisingly useful...in ways Hunter might *not* appreciate. Winner of 2 awards, one of them at Sundance. PG-13.

**BEASTS OF THE SOUTHERN WILD** (2012-US) 93m \*\*\* D: Benh Zeitlin (feature debut). Quvenzhané Wallis, Dwight Henry, Levy Easterly, Pamela Harper. Six-year-old Hushpuppy (Wallis) lives on a tiny teardrop of mud called "The Bathtub" in a Louisiana bayou with her father Wink (Henry). When a hurricane threatens to destroy their home, Hushpuppy embarks on a journey in search of her lost mother. This imaginative drama suffused with magical realism won 35 awards and is nominated for 4 Oscars, including one for the ferociously talented Wallis, the youngest person to receive an Academy Award nomination. PG-13.

**THE CROSSING** (2000-US) 89m \*\*\* D: Robert Harmon. Jeff Daniels, Roger Rees, Sebastian Roche, Steven McCarthy, David Ferry. In 1776, less than six months after the Declaration of Independence was signed, the Continental Army is on the brink of defeat. General George Washington's men are sick, wounded, cold and hungry. The mercenary Hessians, hired by the British, have just enjoyed a Christmas celebration camped in the village of Trenton. Washington hatches a mad plan, one that will decide the fate of the colonial rebellion. This Emmy-nominated historical drama, adapted by Howard Fast from his own novel, won a Peabody Award and an American Society of Cinematographers Award for Rene Ohashi. For ages 12 and older.

**THE LAST OF THE MOHICANS** (1992-US) *Rare Original Theatrical Version* 112m \*\*\* ½ D: Michael Mann. Daniel Day-Lewis (LINCOLN), Madeleine Stowe, Russell Means, Wes Studi. A breathtaking adaptation of James Fenimore Cooper's classic set during the French and Indian War. Daniel Day-Lewis is outstanding as Hawkeye. Note: Day-Lewis is nominated to win a Best Actor Oscar for LINCOLN. Steven Spielberg's biopic that has received an astounding 12 Oscar nominations. R.

**RIO** (2011-US) 96m \*\*\* D: Carlos Saldanha. Voiced by Jesse Eisenberg, Leslie Mann, Anne Hathaway, Jamie Foxx. This tuneful animated adventure concerns extremely rare blue macaw Blu (Eisenberg), who travels from Minnesota to Rio de Janeiro to pair with Jewel (Hathaway) to save their species. Note: Anne Hathaway is nominated to win Best Supporting Actress for LES MISERABLES, which is nominated for 8 Oscars in all. Jamie Foxx, who sings in RIO, stars in DJANGO UNCHAINED, a film which is nominated for 4 Oscars. G.

**BILLO THE GRAND DAKHAAR** (2007-Senegal/Italy) 90m \*\*\* D: Laura Muscardin (DAYS). Thierno Thiam, Luisa De Santis, Carmen De Santos, Marco Bonini, Susy Laude. Billo, a tailor, has arrived in Italy to try his luck in the fashion industry. He doesn't have it easy: Billo is an illegal immigrant from Senegal. But he's young, talented and handsome... maybe too handsome. He has pretty girl Laura (Laude) in love with him in Rome, and pretty girl Fatou (De Santos) waiting for him at home. This colorful romantic comedy features the music of Youssou N'Dour. Unrated.

**ANNA KARENINA** (2012-UK) 129m \*\*\* ½ D: Joe Wright. Keira Knightley, Jude Law, Aaron Taylor-Johnson, Matthew Macfadyen, Kelly Macdonald. Leo Tolstoy's great novel is transformed in this glittering adaptation by its venue: a 19th century stage which serves as backdrop and metaphor for Anna Karenina's (Knightley) disintegrating public life. Anna is married to the virtuous government official Vronsky (Law), but is seduced by the dashing Count Vronsky (Taylor-Johnson). This drop-dead gorgeous production won 4 awards and is nominated for 4 Oscars. R.

**MY LAST DAY WITHOUT YOU** (2011-US) 90m \*\*\* D: Stefan C. Schaefer. Nicole Beharie, Ken Duken, Marlene Forte, Laith Nakil, Reg E. Cathey. While on a one-day business trip to New York, young German businessman Niklas (Duken) is whipped into a whirlwind romance with Leticia (Beharie), a black singer-songwriter from Brooklyn. Unexpected and refreshing, this romantic comedy-drama won 3 awards. For ages 13 and older.

**NO COUNTRY FOR OLD MEN** (2007-US) 122m \*\*\*\* D: Ethan and Joel Coen. Tommy Lee Jones (LINCOLN), Javier Bardem (SKYFALL), Josh Brolin, Woody Harrelson, Kelly Macdonald. This brilliantly scripted black comedy adapted from Cormac McCarthy's novel is set in the borderlands of Texas. Tommy Lee Jones is terrific as the soon-to-be-retired lawman pursuing a psychopathic killer (Bardem). This masterpiece won four Oscars. Note: Jones is nominated to win Best Supporting Actor for LINCOLN. R.

**THE MASTER** (2012-US) 144m \*\*\*\* D: Paul Thomas Anderson (THERE WILL BLOOD). Joaquin Phoenix, Philip Seymour Hoffman, Amy Adams, Laura Dern, Jesse Plemons. This powerful drama concerns a 1950s cult leader, Lancaster Dodd (Hoffman), who mentors emotionally disturbed World War II vet Freddie Quell (Phoenix). The volatile relationship between the two men becomes a dangerous dance of loyalty and betrayal, threatening everyone in its path. Winner of 20 awards, THE MASTER received Oscar nominations for actors Phoenix, Hoffman and Adams. R.

**WINTER'S BONE** (2010-US) 100m \*\*\*\* D: Debra Granik. Jennifer Lawrence (THE HUNGER GAMES), John Hawkes (THE SESSIONS), Garret Dillahunt, Kevin Breznahan. In this gripping crime thriller set in a dirt-poor community in the Ozarks, the local sheriff tells 17-year-old Ree (Lawrence) that unless her drug-dealing father shows up for his trial her family could get thrown out of their home.
