MR. COCONUT *aka Hap ga foon* (1989-Hong Kong) 100m *** D: Clifton Ko (CHICKEN AND DUCK TALK). Michael Hui, Bak-Ming Wong, Ricky Hui, Maria Cordero. Celebrated comic actor Michael Hui stars as Mr. Coconut, upstanding citizen of rural Hainan, who travels to flashy 1980s Hong Kong to visit his sister. The unsophisticated Mr. Coconut unwittingly makes life miserable for his upwardly mobile brother-in-law (Bak-ming Wong). This delightful and hilarious comedy is a Chinese New Year classic. For all ages.

THE WOMAN KNIGHT OF MIRROR LAKE *aka Jian hu nu xia Qiu Jin* (2011-Hong Kong) 115m *** D: Herman Yau (THE LEGEND IS BORN: IP MAN). Crystal Yi Huang, Anthony Wong (INFERNAL AFFAIRS), Dennis To. Born to a privileged family, Qiu Jin (Huang), unlike other girls of the Qing Dynasty, has unbound feet, studies alongside her brother and practices martial arts. No wonder she grows up to be a butt-kicking feminist and an early leader of the Chinese Revolution. This colorful martial-arts biopic celebrates her unconquerable spirit. Rated PG.

MOTHER OF GEORGE (2013-Nigeria/US) 107m *** D: Andrew Dosunmu. Isaach De Bankolé (CASINO ROYALE), Danai Gurira, Yaya Alafia, Bukky Ajayi, Angélique Kidjo. Set to the rhythms and textures of Brooklyn's Yoruba community, this bewitching melodrama concerns a young bride's (Gurira) infertility and the complications that ripple throughout her family and community as a consequence. One of the National Board of Review's Top 10 Independent Films, and winner at Sundance for Bradford Young's exquisite cinematography. Rated R.

LONG LIFE, HAPPINESS & PROSPERITY (2002-Canada) 90m *** D: Mina Shum (DOUBLE HAPPINESS). Sandra Oh (SIDEWAYS), Valerie Tian, Ric Young, Tseng Chang, Russell Yuen. To help her overworked single mom Kin (Oh), 12-year-old Mindy (Tian) dabbles in Taoist magic spells. They work (powerfully!), but not quite in the way Mindy intends. This charming comedy set in Vancouver's vibrant Chinese community won 2 awards at the Vancouver International Film Festival. For ages 12 and older.

DALLAS BUYERS CLUB (2013-US) 117m **** D: Jean-Marc Vallée (C.R.A.Z.Y.). Matthew McConaughey (MUD), Jennifer Garner, Jared Leto, Denis O'Hare, Griffin Dunne. Matthew McConaughey delivers an electrifying performance as Ron Woodroof, a hard-living Texan redneck who is diagnosed with HIV in 1985. His response "There ain't nothin' out there kin kill Ron Woodroof in 30 days!" propels him into illegal action that will help him, and many others, survive. This true story won 36 awards and is nominated for 6 Oscars, including Best Picture. Rated R.

LAST VEGAS (2013-US) 105m *** D: Jon Turteltaub (NATIONAL TREASURE). Michael Douglas, Robert De Niro, Morgan Freeman, Kevin Kline, Mary Steenburgen. Four 60-somethings who have been lifelong friends get together in Las Vegas to celebrate the upcoming wedding of Billy (Douglas), the one bachelor of their group. Escaping their daily routines, Archie (Freeman), Paddy (De Niro) and Sam (Kline) get themselves into a good deal of hilarious trouble. Rated PG-13.

PUPPE, ICKE & DER DICKE *aka Doll, the Fatso and Me* (2012-Germany) 87m *** D: Felix Stienz (feature debut). Stéphanie Capetanidés, Tobi B., Matthias Scheuring. Bomber (Tobi B.), a cantankerous dwarf from Berlin, has just lost his job and all his money in Paris. Bruno (Scheuring), an enormous mute, offers Bomber beer and gets him to agree to drive him to Berlin. On the way, they are joined by blind and pregnant beauty Europe (Capetanidés), who hopes to find the father of her baby. This rollicking road comedy won 2 awards. For ages 17 and older.

YOUNG DETECTIVE DEE: RISE OF THE SEA DRAGON *aka Di Renjie: Shen du long wang* (2013-China) 134m *** D: Tsui Hark. Mark Chao, Angelababy, Kun Chen, Shaofeng Feng. This prequel to the mega-hit DETECTIVE DEE: MYSTERY OF THE PHANTOM FLAME concerns Tang Dynasty sleuth Detective Dee's (Chao) first case. Soon after a massive sea dragon decimates the imperial navy, a strange reptilian man terrorizes the capital. This martial arts spectacle has mystery, action, humor and even a magic horse! For ages 12 and older.

HOUSE OF 72 TENANTS *aka Chat sup yee ga fong hak* (1973-Hong Kong) 98m *** D: Chu Yuan. Hu Chin, Lydia Shum, Ching Li, Yueh Hua, Tien Ching, Ricky Hui. This landmark of Hong Kong film history broke box office records in 1973 and forever changed perceptions of Cantonese-language films. Set in a run-down tenement slum ruled by tough landlady Pak Ku (Hu Chin), this comedy celebrates the downtrodden pulling together against a corrupt system. Produced by the late Sir Run Run Shaw (23 November 1907 – 7 January 2014). Note: *The Movie Museum's Jaynie Chong, an early '70s employee at the Shaw Brothers' Singapore studio, will present this film and answer questions.* For ages 10 and older.

THE BEST MAN HOLIDAY (2013-US) 123m *** D: Malcolm D. Lee (THE BEST MAN). Monica Calhoun, Morris Chestnut, Melissa De Sousa, Taye Diggs, Nia Long, Terrence Howard, Sanaa Lathan, Regina Hall. Four friends reunite after 14 years for Christmas, only to discover hatchets aren't as buried as hoped. This vibrant and superior sequel to THE BEST MAN will make you laugh and cry, sometimes both at the same time. Nominated for 10 awards. Rated R.

ABOUT TIME (2013-UK) 123m *** D: Richard Curtis (NOTTING HILL). Domhnall Gleeson (ANNA KARENINA), Rachel McAdams (THE VOW), Bill Nighy, Lydia Wilson. Twenty one-year-old Tim (Gleeson) learns from his father (Nighy) that the men in their family are able to time travel. Tim decides to use this special gift to find a girlfriend, which turns out not to be all that easy. This charming and wise romantic comedy won one award. Rated R.

ALL IS LOST (2013-US) 106m *** 1/2 D: J. C. Chandor (MARGIN CALL). Robert Redford. A man (Redford) sailing solo on the Indian Ocean finds himself in a desperate situation after his yacht collides with a free-floating shipping container. Winner of 3 awards and nominated for a Sound Editing Oscar. Many think Redford should have been Oscar nominated for his extraordinary performance. Rated PG-13.

ON THE JOB (2013-Philippines) 121m *** 1/2 D: Erik Matti. Joel Torre, Gerald Anderson, Piolo Pascual, Joey Marquez. In this crime thriller inspired by real events, a pair of prison inmates (Torre and Anderson) is temporarily released from prison to assassinate the rivals of high-ranking government officials in Manila. The inmates are being tailed by a pair of honest cops (Pascual and Marquez), and the four will soon collide. This compelling drama won 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE ARTIST AND THE MODEL *aka El artista y la modelo* (2012-Spain/France) 105m *** 1/2 D: Fernando Trueba (BELLE ÉPOQUE). Jean Rochefort (TELL NO ONE), Aida Folch, Claudia Cardinale. Artist Marc (Rochefort) lives a peaceful but isolated life with his wife Lea (Cardinale) in the south of France, far from the ravages of World War II. When Lea decides to shelter young Spanish refugee Mercè (Folch), Marc's passion for life and art is re-awakened. Winner of 3 awards. Rated R.

DEPARTURES *aka Okuribito* (2008-Japan) 130m **** D: Yōjirō Takita. Masahiro Motoki, Tsutomu Yamazaki, Ryoko Hirose. Unemployed cellist Daigo (Motoki) decides to return with his wife Mika (Hirose) to his childhood home in the north of Japan. While looking for work, he finds an ad for "Departures". Intrigued, Daigo decides to take the job, placing him on the rocky path to emotional and spiritual growth. This extremely moving drama won the first Japanese Oscar for Best Foreign Language Film and another 31 international film awards. Rated PG-13. *Bon voyage, Beverly (5/23/1922 – 1/27/2014), to the movies we'd go!*

CUTIE AND THE BOXER (2013-US) 82m *** 1/2 D: Zachary Heinzerling (debut). Ushio Shinohara dips his boxing gloves in paint and hurls himself against the canvas. Colors explode in vivid patterns as he creates his art. In this extraordinary documentary, Ushio and his wife Noriko struggle for commercial success and negotiate the tricky balancing act of marriage as Noriko pursues her own artistic vision. Winner of 4 awards including Best Documentary at Sundance, and nominated for a Best Documentary Oscar (but up against 20 FEET FROM STARDOM!). Rated R.

THE INEVITABLE DEFEAT OF MISTER & PETE (2013-US) 108m *** D: George Tillman Jr. (MEN OF HONOR). Skyland Brooks, Ethan Dizon, Jennifer Hudson, Jeffrey Wright, Jordyn Sparks. When their drug-addicted mothers both go AWOL, 13-year-old Mister (Brooks) and his 11-year-old neighbor Pete (Dizon) fend for themselves for a summer in the Brooklyn projects. This tale of friendship and survival won at Sundance. Rated R.

18 MEALS *aka 18 comidas* (2010-Spain/Argentina) 107m *** D: Jorge Coira (feature debut). Luis Tosar, Federico Pérez Rey, Víctor Fábregas, Esperanza Pedreño. The preparation and consumption of 18 meals chronicle a series of intimate stories set in the picturesque Spanish town of Santiago de Compostela. A lonely housewife cooks for a street musician; a couple wakes up from a one-night-stand; a straight brother and a gay brother reunite; a man prepares a gourmet meal for the woman he desires. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 12 and older.

A QUIET LIFE *aka Una Vita Tranquilla* (2010-Italy) 105m *** 1/2 D: Claudio Cupellini. Toni Servillo (THE GREAT BEAUTY), Marco D'Amore, Francesco Di Leva, Juliane Köhler. Italian criminal Rosario Russo (Servillo) is enjoying a new life in Germany. His work as a chef is rewarding and he's happily married to Renate (Köhler). To his horror, Rosario's estranged Italian son (D'Amore), now in his early 20s, arrives at his door. This compelling thriller won three awards. For ages 15 and older.

GRAVITY (2013-US/UK) 91m **** D: Alfonso Cuarón (CHILDREN OF MEN). Sandra Bullock, George Clooney, Ed Harris. Disaster strikes on a routine spacewalk, marooning medical engineer Dr. Stone (Bullock) and veteran astronaut Matt Kowalsky (Clooney) in space. This brilliant sci-fi parable won 78(!) awards and is nominated for 10 Oscars. Rated PG-13.

NEBRASKA (2013-US) 115m **** D: Alexander Payne (THE DESCENDANTS). Bruce Dern, Will Forte, June Squibb, Bob Odenkirk, Stacy Keach. A crotchety old man (Dern), convinced he's won a million dollars, takes a road trip with his soft-hearted son (Forte) from Billings, Montana to Lincoln, Nebraska to collect his prize. Rich with humor and human understanding, this black and white comedy-drama is a showcase of acting virtuosity. Winner of 22 awards and nominated for 6 Oscars, including Dern for Best Actor. Rated R.

THE CONSEQUENCES OF LOVE (2004-Italy) 100m **** D: Paolo Sorrentino (THE GREAT BEAUTY), nominated for a 2014 Best Foreign Film Oscar). Toni Servillo (IL DIVO), Olivia Magnani. Titta di Girolamo (Servillo) has spent the last eight years in a soulless Swiss hotel. Each week he goes to the bank with a suitcase full of money, and his only distraction is his weekly heroin shot. When he falls for the hotel barmaid (Olivia Magnani), granddaughter of the celebrated Anna, he re-examines his life. This stylish, absorbing mystery with a black sense of humor won five David di Donatello awards. Suitable for ages 15 and older.
