THE PRICE OF FORGIVENESS *aka Ndeyaan* (2001-Senegal/France) 90m *** ½ D: Mansour Sora Wade. Hubert Koundé (LA HAINE), Rokhaya Niang, Gora Seck, Alioune Ndiaye. This gorgeous mythical story set in a fishing village on the south coast of Senegal concerns two young men, Yatma (Koundé) and Mbanik (Seck), who are in love with the beautiful and flirtatious Maxoye (Niang). When a thick fog prevents the fishermen from working, the village faces a crisis. Yatma and Mbanik compete to win Maxoye's heart by finding a way to save their community. Winner of 7 awards from around the world. For ages 13 and older.

NOTHING BUT THE BEST (1964-UK) 99m *** D: Clive Donner (STEALING HEAVEN). Alan Bates (KING OF HEARTS), Denholm Elliott (A ROOM WITH A VIEW), Harry Andrews, Millicent Martin. Handsome and talented but working class Jimmy Brewster (Bates) can't seem to get anywhere in his job. But when he befriends upper class sot Charles Prince (Elliott), Jimmy finds there's more than one way to the top! This witty black comedy won an award for Best British Comedy Screenplay (Frederic Raphael) and was nominated for a BAFTA for Nicolas Roeg's color cinematography. For ages 13 and older.

MY OLD LADY (2014-UK/France/US) 107m *** D: Israel Horovitz. Kevin Kline, Maggie Smith, Kristin Scott Thomas, Dominique Pinon. Mathias (Kline), a down-on-his-luck American, has arrived in Paris to sell a valuable apartment in the Marais district his wealthy father has left him. He's astonished to find it occupied by elderly Mathilde (Smith). The apartment was purchased under a *viager* contract, in which the seller, Mathilde, may occupy the property until death. Not only that, Mathias owes her 2400 euros per month. Adapting his own play, director Horovitz creates a compelling comedy drama with terrific acting and unexpected depth. Rated PG-13.

HECTOR AND THE SEARCH FOR HAPPINESS (2014-Germany/Canada/UK/South Africa) 114m *** D: Peter Chelsom (HEAR MY SONG). Simon Pegg, Rosamund Pike (Oscar nominated for GONE GIRL), Jean Reno, Christopher Plummer, Stellan Skarsgård, Toni Collette. This humorous adaptation of French psychiatrist François Lelord's novel stars Simon Pegg as a man who counsels others in finding happiness but can't attain it himself. Psychiatrist Hector (Pegg) leaves his comfortable home and loving girlfriend (Pike) to find what it means to be happy in Asia, Africa and the wilds of Los Angeles. Winner of a Golden Trailer Award. Rated R.

FELONY (2013-Australia/US) 105m *** D: Matthew Saville (NOISE). Jai Courtney, Joel Edgerton, Tom Wilkinson, Melissa George. Three male detectives (Courtney, Edgerton and Wilkinson) in Sydney, Australia are embroiled in a moral struggle when a tragic accident leaves a boy in a coma. One causes it, the second tries to cover it up, and the third attempts to expose it. Each cop is trying to do the right thing, but their ideas of justice put them in conflict. This intense drama was nominated for 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE RETRIEVAL (2013-US) 92m *** ½ D: Chris Eska (AUGUST EVENING). Ashton Sanders, Tishuan Scott, Keston John, Bill Oberst Jr. In this Civil War drama set in 1864, 13-year-old Will (Sanders) is black, free and employed to a gang of bounty hunters led by Burrell (Oberst). Burrell sends Will and his Uncle Marcus (John) up across battle lines to the Union north to retrieve Nate (Scott), an ex-slave with a price on his head. Will struggles with his conscience, but he knows Burrell will kill him if he doesn't complete this assignment. This drama won 9 awards. Rated R.

LAGGIES (2014-US) 99m *** D: Lynn Shelton (YOUR SISTER'S SISTER). Keira Knightley, Chloë Grace Moretz, Sam Rockwell, Mark Webber. Terrified by the onset of adulthood, Megan (Knightley), who's pushing 30, panics when her boyfriend proposes marriage. She hides out at the home of her new 16-year-old friend Annika (Moretz). This humorous commentary about the "right" path to success is nominated for a London Critics Circle Film Award. Rated R.

FORCE MAJEURE (2014-Sweden/France/Norway) 120m *** ½ D: Ruben Östlund. Johannes Kuhnke, Lisa Lovén Kongsli, Kristofer Hivju. Ebba (Kongsli), her husband Tomas (Kuhnke) and their two children are on a ski vacation in the French Alps. While they enjoy lunch on an outdoor terrace, a cannon releases a controlled avalanche, which quickly escalates to a terrifying tsunami of snow. When Ebba quickly grabs her children to flee, she sees Tomas abandoning his family to save his own life. This disaster movie (of another kind) won 17 awards including one at Cannes. Rated R.

NIGHTCRAWLER (2014-US) 117m **** D: Dan Gilroy (directorial debut). Jake Gyllenhaal (DONNIE DARKO), Bill Paxton, Rene Russo. Jake Gyllenhaal stars as Lou Bloom, a man desperate for work in this biting satire of Los Angeles crime journalism. After being rejected while searching for a job in a more conventional manner, Lou decides to gather news his own way. Viciously funny, this black comedy won 30 awards and is nominated for the Best Original Screenplay Oscar for first time director Dan Gilroy. Rated R.

BOYHOOD (2014-US) 165m **** D: Richard Linklater (BERNIE). Ellar Coltrane, Patricia Arquette, Ethan Hawke, Elijah Smith, Lorelei Linklater. Seven-year-old Mason (Coltrane) literally grows up to become a man in this extraordinary movie filmed over 12 years. As Mason grows older, so do his parents (Arquette and Hawke). Changes of season, of politics, of technology—all provide the backdrop of one family's story. Winner of 125 awards including 3 Golden Globes. Nominated for 6 Oscars including Best Picture. Rated R.

IDA (2013-Poland/Denmark/France/UK) 82m **** D: Pawel Pawlikowski (LAST RESORT). Agata Trzebuchowska, Agata Kulesza, Dawid Ogrodnik, Jerzy Trela. In muted shades of grey, this exquisite black and white tone poem recounts the tale of orphaned novice nun Anna (Trzebuchowska) in 1962 Poland. Before taking her vows as a nun, Anna is encouraged by her Mother Superior to meet her only living relative, her aunt Wanda (Kulesza). Wanda and Anna investigate what happened to their family in World War II. This powerful film won 55 awards and is nominated for Best Foreign Language Film and Best Cinematography Oscars. Rated PG-13.

DRAGON GIRLS *aka Drachenmädchen* (2012-Germany/China) 90m *** ½ D: Inigo Westmeier. This eye-opening documentary concerns six very different Chinese girls who train at the Shaolin Tagou Kung Fu School, home to 35,000 students, teachers and trainers in Yenan Province. With each featured girl the documentary introduces a range of issues other than martial arts education such as the cultural divide between rich and poor, the one child policy and the national bias for boys over girls. Visually enthralling with many scenes of synchronized exercise and dance, this fascinating doc was nominated for 3 awards. For ages 10 and older.

ECHOES OF THE RAINBOW *aka Sui Yuet San Tau* (2010-Hong Kong) 118m *** D: Alex Law (THE SOONG SISTERS). Sandra Ng Kwan Yue, Simon Yam, Aarif Lee, Buzz Chung, Paul Chun, Evelyn Choi. This heartwarming story of a working class family lovingly re-creates the texture and rhythms of life in 1960s Hong Kong. The head of the household, Mr. Law (Yam), is a cobbler. His wife (Ng Kwan Yue) dedicates her life to their two sons, mischievous Big Ears (Chung) and his older brother Desmond (Lee), a star athlete at school. Nicely nuanced acting and art direction distinguish this comedy-drama, which won the Crystal Bear at Berlin. For ages 13 and older.

THE GRAND BUDAPEST HOTEL (2014-US/Germany) 100m **** D: Wes Anderson (MOONRISE KINGDOM). Ralph Fiennes (IN BRUGES), F. Murray Abraham, Mathieu Amalric, Tilda Swinton, Adrien Brody, Willem Dafoe. In 1932, in a big pink hotel perched on a middle-European mountain, meticulous concierge Gustave (Fiennes) is embroiled in the contested will of an eminent guest, Mme. Céline Villeneuve Desgoffe und Taxis (Swinton). This fabulous confection of Ernst Lubitsch-esque farce and Wes Anderson whimsy won 65 awards and is nominated for 9 Oscars. Rated R.

THE THEORY OF EVERYTHING (2014-UK) 123m **** D: James Marsh (MAN ON WIRE). Eddie Redmayne (LES MISÉRABLES), Felicity Jones, Harry Lloyd, David Thewlis, Emily Watson. This uplifting, deeply personal story of physicist Stephen Hawking's (Redmayne) marriage to Jane Wilde (Jones) illustrates a life of brilliant achievement attained despite great hardship. Diagnosed with motor neuron disease while still at university, Hawking defies the odds by becoming the world's greatest living physicist. Winner of 19 awards and nominated for 5 Oscars, with Redmayne on the short list for Best Actor. Rated PG-13.

WATCHERS OF THE SKY (2014-US/Netherlands/France/Chad/Rwanda) 120m **** D: Edet Belzberg (THE RECRUITER). This documentary explores the world's legal response to the mass killing of civilians, and the man who made it his life's work: Raphael Lemkin. Lemkin, a Polish lawyer who lost his family to the Nazis, coined the term *genocide* and was instrumental in crafting the UN Convention for the Prevention and Punishment of Genocide. Events in the 20th and 21st century have shown that genocide is an evil that persists despite international condemnation. Using archival footage and striking animation, four stories of courage illustrate the ongoing battle for global human rights. Winner of 3 awards, 2 of them from Sundance. For ages 13 and older.

VAJONT – LA DIGA DEL DISONORE (2001-France/Italy) 111m *** D: Renzo Martinelli. Michel Serrault, Daniel Auteuil, Laura Merlin, Jorge Perugorria, Anita Caprioli, Leo Gullotta. On October 9, 1963 in northern Italy, 260 million cubic meters of rock cleaved off Mount Toc into the artificial lake formed by the Vajont dam, creating a wave that devastated the town of Longarone, killing an estimated 2000 people. The events leading up to this disaster (realistically re-created with impressive special effects) are outlined with excellent character development in this well-told, suspenseful and moving big-budget drama. Winner of 3 awards: an Italian Golden Globe for director Renzo Martinelli and two major Italian film awards for Leo Gullotta for Best Supporting Actor. For ages 10 and older.

ST. VINCENT (2014-US) 102m *** ½ D: Theodore Melfi (feature debut). Bill Murray, Melissa McCarthy, Naomi Watts, Chris O'Dowd, Terrence Howard, Jaeden Lieberher. Newly divorced Maggie (McCarthy) needs a babysitter for her 12-year-old son Oliver (Lieberher). Maggie's neighbor Vincent (Murray) is a drunken, self-indulgent Vietnam vet whose lifestyle of barhopping and gambling has left him penniless. Vincent as Oliver's babysitter? It's a match made in heaven. This refreshingly irreverent comedy won 5 awards. Rated PG-13.

THE HOMESMAN (2014-France/US) 122m *** D: Tommy Lee Jones (THE THREE BURIALS OF MELQUIADES ESTRADA). Tommy Lee Jones, Hilary Swank, Grace Gummer, Miranda Otto, Sonja Richter. "Three crazy women for five weeks is a lot more than I bargained for!" cries George Briggs (Jones). George is hanging from a noose when homesteader Mary Bee Cuddy (Swank) rescues him—but only after she makes him promise he'll work for her. Pious Mary Bee and amoral drifter George head east from Nebraska in a covered wagon transporting three frontier women who have gone mad. This unique western won 2 awards. Rated R.
