GOD WILLING *aka Se Dio vuole* (2015-Italy) 88m *** D: Edoardo Gassman, Marco Giallini, Alessandro Gassman, Laura Morante, Enrico Oetiker. Successful surgeon Tommaso (Giallini), a proud atheist, is totally taken aback when his medical student son Andrea (Oetiker) announces that he wants to become a Catholic priest. While on the surface he pretends to approve of his son's decision, Tommaso goes undercover to investigate the suspiciously charismatic priest his son admires, Don Pietro (Gassman). This charming comedy won 3 awards. For ages 12 and older.

KAMIKAZE (2014-Spain) 96m *** D: Álex Pina. Álex García, Eduardo Blanco, Verónica Echegui, Carmen Machi. Karadjistani terrorist Slatan (García) is forced to re-evaluate his priorities when his mission gets mired in bad weather in this delightfully life-affirming comedy set in Russia. Slatan is stranded at a hotel full of eccentric but endearing Spanish tourists who unwittingly complicate his mission. For ages 12 and older.

TURTLES ARE SURPRISINGLY FAST SWIMMERS *aka Kame wa igai to hayaku oyogu* (2005-Japan) 90m *** D: Satoshi Miki (ADRIFT IN TOKYO). Juri Ueno, Yû Aoi, Ryo Iwamatsu. Lately, Suzume (Ueno) has been feeling invisible. Her husband, away on business, only calls to ask if she's fed their pet turtle before abruptly hanging up. Hoping for some excitement, she answers a tiny ad advertising a job for a spy. Suddenly Suzume's life is full of intrigue, and her inconspicuousness is now a valued skill! This delightful absurdist comedy in the spirit of AMÉLIE is a real winner. For all ages.

LA TÊTE D'UN HOMME (1933-France) 93m *** ½ D: Julien Duvivier (PÉPÉ LE MOKO). Harry Baur, Valéry Inkijinoff, Alexandre Rignault. In this visually striking psychological thriller, Inspector Maigret (Baur) plays an intense game of cat and mouse with tubercular Czech medical student Radek (Inkijinoff, in a remarkable performance). Cinematographer Armand Thirard's images emerge from deep shadows and smoke, glowing with sinister beauty. For ages 12 and older.

PROFESSOR MARSTON AND THE WONDER WOMEN (2017-US) 108m *** ½ D: Angela Robinson. Luke Evans, Rebecca Hall, Bella Heathcote. If you've been curious about the inspiration for Wonder Woman, the Amazon superheroine, this movie will blow your mind. This fascinating film is about the character's creator, Harvard psychologist William Marston (Evans), who among other things, helped invent the modern lie detector test. His unconventional love life involves two women who inspire the creation of the 1941 comic. Nominated for 4 awards. Rated R.

MARSHALL (2017-US) 118m *** ½ D: Reginald Hudlin (feature debut). Chadwick Boseman, Josh Gad, Kate Hudson, Sterling K. Brown, James Cromwell, Dan Stevens, Keesha Sharp. In 1940, future Supreme Court justice Thurgood Marshall (Boseman) travels to Bridgeport, CT to defend a black chauffeur (Brown) accused of the rape and attempted murder of a white society woman (Hudson). Muzzled by the sitting judge (Cromwell), Marshall is forced to rely on his co-counsel Sam Friedman (Gad) to present his arguments. Winner of 3 awards and nominated for a 2018 Oscar for Best Original Song. Rated PG-13.

DAWSON CITY: FROZEN TIME (2016-US) 120m **** D: Bill Morrison. In the summer of 1978, a backhoe operator digging behind Diamond Tooth Gertie's casino in the tiny Gold Rush town of Dawson City discovered a mountainous trove of movie reels that had been buried for half a century. This exciting documentary is a head-spinning tour of the treasures found in this "King Tut's tomb" of the Yukon. News reels of the 1910s and 20s, serials, shorts and feature films that were thought to be lost forever are explored, interwoven with the history of the town. Endlessly fascinating and visually gorgeous, this film won 5 awards. For all ages.

THE SQUARE (2017-Sweden/Germany/France/Denmark) 142m *** ½ D: Ruben Östlund (FORCE MAJEURE). Claes Bang, Elisabeth Moss, Dominic West, Terry Notary. Smug art museum curator Christian (Bang) designs a performance art space called The Square, meant to be a sanctuary where all who enter must abide by the Golden Rule. But when Christian is tricked by a pickpocketing scam and robbed of his wallet and mobile phone, he descends into an emotional and professional meltdown in this surreal black comedy set in Sweden. Winner of 17 awards and nominated for a 2018 Best Foreign Language Film Oscar. Rated R.

BABY DRIVER (2017-UK/US) 112m **** D: Edgar Wright (SHAUN OF THE DEAD). Ansel Elgort, Jon Bernthal, Jon Hamm, Lily James, Jamie Foxx, Kevin Spacey. Baby (Elgort) is a peach-fuzzed tinnitus sufferer glued to his earphones. His soundtrack is what makes him a genius getaway driver—and what makes him valuable to crime boss Doc (Spacey). But just as Baby clears his way for a legit life with girlfriend Debora (James), Doc assigns Baby an impossibly dangerous job. This thrilling musical joyride won 19 awards and is nominated for three 2018 Oscars: Sound Mixing, Film Editing and Sound Editing. Rated R.

LAST FLAG FLYING (2017-US) 125m *** D: Richard Linklater (BERNIE). Bryan Cranston, Laurence Fishburne, Steve Carell. In this bittersweet road movie set in 2003, former Navy hospital corpsman 'Doc' Shepherd (Carell) looks up his Vietnam War buddies from 30 years ago, Sal (Cranston) and Mueller (Fishburne), to join him in burying his son, a Marine who died in the Iraq War. This adaptation of Darryl Poniscan's novel won 2 awards. Rated R.

LOVING VINCENT (2017-UK/Poland) 94m *** ½ D: Dorota Kobiela, Hugh Welchman. Voiced by Douglas Booth, Chris O'Dowd, Aidan Turner, Saoirse Ronan. Hand painted by 100 artists based on 130 of Vincent Van Gogh's paintings, this animation is mesmerizing to behold. In 1891, the year after the artist's death, young Armand (Booth) is tasked by his postman father (O'Dowd) to deliver a letter from Vincent to his brother Theo. Traveling from Arles to Auvers-sur-Oise, Armand retraces the artist's last days in this evocative mystery. Winner of 9 awards and nominated for a 2018 Oscar for Best Animated Feature. Rated PG-13.

A FLAT FOR THREE *aka Posti in piedi in paradiso* (2012-Italy) 115m *** D: Carlo Verdone. Carlo Verdone, Pierfrancesco Favino, Marco Giallini (BLAME FREUD), Micaela Ramazzotti (LIKE CRAZY). Three divorced fathers with cash flow problems decide to live together in one Roman apartment. Music lover Ulisse (Verdone) sells his precious vinyl to an unappreciative public, film critic Fulvio (Favino) is forced to write a gossip column and Domenico (Giallini) makes ends meet as a gigolo. Plenty of laughs are to be had as the three try to win love and avoid starvation. This comedy won 7 awards. For ages 13 and older.

MAIGRET SETS A TRAP *aka Maigret tend un piège* (1958-France/Italy) 118m *** D: Jean Delannoy. Jean Gabin, Annie Girardot, Olivier Hussenot. Belgian novelist Georges Simenon's world-weary police inspector Jules Maigret (Gabin) comes vividly to life in this sophisticated mystery. To catch a serial killer who stalks women in the seedy streets of Montmartre, Maigret makes a dangerous gamble to set up a trap. Winner of 1 award and nominated for 3 BAFTAs. For ages 12 and older.

THE NIGHT AFFAIR *aka Le désordre et la nuit* (1958-France) 90m *** D: Gilles Grangier. Jean Gabin, Danielle Darrieux, Hazel Scott, Nadja Tiller, Roger Hanin. Picture this: Jean Gabin, at the height of his powers, playing Inspector Georges Vallois, who's trying to protect tarnished innocent Lucky Fridel (Tiller), who's been accused of bumping off a nightclub owner (Hanin). Add to this music performed by sultry Hazel Scott and a rapier-sharp performance by Danielle Darrieux, all in a sparkling restoration by Pathé. For ages 12 and up.

TOUCH OF THE LIGHT *aka Ni guang fei xiang* (2012-Taiwan) 109m *** D: Jung-chi Chang. Yu-Siang Huang, Sandrine Pinna, Lih Lee. Blind piano prodigy Huang Yu-Siang stars as himself in this heartwarming true story about young artists. Yu-Siang, encouraged by his family, begins studies at a mainstream music college. Because he had attended schools for the visually impaired up to now, he's struggling with feelings of helplessness and isolation at his new school. When he meets dance prodigy Chieh (Pinna), a girl stifled by her layabout, spendthrift mother, the two spur each other to creative heights. Winner of 9 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE KID FROM THE BIG APPLE (2016-Malaysia/Hong Kong/Singapore) 120m *** D: Jess Teong. Lung Ti (A BETTER TOMORROW), Sarah Tan, Jessica Hester Hsuan, Jayson Tan. Born and raised in New York, 11-year-old Sarah (Sarah Tan) is more than a little miffed when she's made to stay in Kuala Lumpur with her mom's father (Lung Ti), a man she's never met. Her old-fashioned grandfather, an herbalist, annoyingly calls her "salah", which means "wrong" in Malay. But once Sarah explores the neighborhood and makes new friends, her view of the world changes forever. This charming tale won 4 awards. For ages 10 and older.

HERO (2007-Japan) 130m *** D: Masayuki Suzuki. Takuya Kimura, Takako Matsu, Hiroshi Abe, Teruyuki Kagawa, Kôshirô Matsumoto. Based on the wildly popular Fuji TV show about a team of public prosecutors, this stand-alone adventure starts with the return of delinquent-turned-prosecutor Kohei Kuryu (Kimura) to the Josai branch of the Tokyo office. He gets an icy reception from co-worker Maiko Amamiya (Matsu), who didn't hear from him during his 6-year absence. Kohei has his hands full solving a murder case with dire political implications AND trying to get his flirtation with Maiko back on track. Winner of 1 award. For ages 12 and older.

WONDER (2017-US/Hong Kong) 113m *** ½ D: Stephen Chbosky. Jacob Tremblay (ROOM), Owen Wilson, Julia Roberts, Izabela Vidovic. Auggie (Tremblay) is a smart 10-year-old who loves Star Wars and wants to travel to outer space. Due to a congenital face deformity, he has been home schooled up to now. When his mom (Roberts) and dad (Wilson) decide to enroll him in a mainstream middle school, everyone involved learns. This inspiring drama based on R.J. Palacio's novel won 2 awards and is nominated for a 2018 Oscar for Best Makeup and Hairstyling. Rated PG.

LUCKY (2017-US) 88m **** D: John Carroll Lynch (directorial debut). Harry Dean Stanton, David Lynch, Ron Livingston, Ed Begley Jr., Beth Grant, Tom Skeritt. Stubbornly independent nonagenarian atheist Lucky (Stanton) muses about life in this funny and thoughtful spiritual journey. Lucky lives in a tiny off-the-grid desert town. He's enjoyed good health all his life despite his pack-a-day smoking habit, but when he takes a fall and is reminded of his mortality, he realizes he's ill prepared to leave this mortal coil. This tour-de-force powered by the remarkable Harry Dean Stanton won 10 awards. For ages 12 and up.

BLAME FREUD *aka Tutta colpa di Freud* (2014-Italy) 125m *** D: Paolo Genovese. Marco Giallini (GOD WILLING), Vittoria Puccini, Anna Foglietta, Alessandro Gassman, Claudia Gerini, Laura Adriani. Psychoanalyst Francesco (Giallini) is helping three young women with their love lives. Marta (Puccini) is smitten with a thief who steals from her book shop; Sara (Foglietta) is gay but is willing to switch if it brings her love; and 18-year-old Emma (Adriani) loves a guy who's 50—and married (Gassman). Poor Francesco. The three women are his daughters! This delightful comedy won 3 awards. For ages 12 and older.

ONLY THE BRAVE (2017-US) 134m *** D: Joseph Kosinski. Josh Brolin, Miles Teller (WHIPLASH), Jeff Bridges, Jennifer Connelly. This flag-waving true story set in 2007 Prescott, Arizona details the birth of the Granite Mountain Hotshots, an elite team of frontline firefighters. The men fight fire with fire: a forest conflagration cannot be put out by water. Facing mortal danger at work and pressures at home, the men are all the more heroic for their flaws. Brilliantly lensed by Claudio Miranda, this awe-inspiring drama was nominated for an award. Rated PG-13.

GOD'S OWN COUNTRY (2017-UK) 104m **** D: Francis Lee (feature debut). Josh O'Connor, Alec Secareanu, Gemma Jones, Ian Hart. Young Yorkshire sheep farmer Johnny (O'Connor) lives a dreary routine. Ever since his father (Hart) has suffered a stroke, Johnny cares for the livestock alone, and spends his free time getting drunk. His world is suddenly broadened with the arrival of migrant worker Gheorghe (Secareanu), whose farming skills, friendly demeanor and good looks unsettle Johnny deeply. In this wild and beautiful place, magic happens—and it's up to Johnny to embrace it. This powerful love story won 18 awards. For ages 15 and older.

MAIGRET AND THE ST. FIACRE CASE *aka Maigret et l'affaire Saint-Fiacre* (1959-France/Italy) 101m *** D: Jean Delannoy. Jean Gabin, Michel Auclair, Valentine Tessier, Jacques Morel. Inspector Maigret (Gabin) travels to his home town to visit his friend the Duchess of Saint-Fiacre (Tessier), who has received a letter stating that she will soon die. When she perishes from a heart attack, Maigret suspects foul play. This intricate thriller culminates when Maigret crashes a dinner party full of suspects. For ages 12 and older.
