MONSIEUR BATIGNOLE (2002-France) 100m *** ½ D: Gérard Jugnot (THE CHORUS). Jules Sitruk, Gérard Jugnot, Jean-Paul Rouve. In 1942, in Nazi-occupied Paris, butcher Edmond Batignole (Jugnot) feels forced to cater to the Germans to survive. When Edmond's future son-in-law Pierre-Jean causes the Jewish neighbors, the Bernsteins, to be deported, Edmond decides to take in and hide young Simon Bernstein (Sitruk), who had managed to escape the Nazis. This funny and touching serio-comedy won a César for Jean-Paul Rouve's performance as Pierre-Jean. Suitable for ages 15 and older.

WAR OF THE ARROWS (2011-South Korea) 122m *** D: Hanmin Kim. Hae-il Park, Seung-yong Ryoo, Moon Chae-Won, Gi-woong Park. Set in 17th century Korea, this epic actioner concerns an orphan boy named Nam Yi (Hae-il Park) and his sister Ja In (Moon). On Ja In's wedding day, their village is attacked by Manchurian Prince Doreukon (Gi-woong Park) and his forces, and Ja In and many others are captured as slaves. Ignoring the law that bans citizens from entering enemy territory, Nam Yi, a masterful archer, heads out alone to rescue Ja In, pursued by Doreukon's formidable head archer Jyu Shin-Ta (Ryoo) and his men. A huge hit in South Korea, this intense period thriller won 4 Korean film awards. Rated R for violence, not nudity.

HUGO (2011) 126m **** D: Martin Scorsese. Ben Kingsley, Sacha Baron Cohen, Asa Butterfield, Chloë Grace Moretz, Christopher Lee, Jude Law. When his beloved clockmaker father (Law) dies in a fire, young Hugo (Butterfield) decides to avoid the orphanage by living in the hidden passageways of a train station in 1930s Paris. The one thing Hugo has left of his father is a mysterious automaton, whose purpose is unknown. When Hugo befriends book-loving Isabelle (Moretz), the two begin to piece together a remarkable story full of magic and wonder. Scorsese's love letter to movies dazzles with visual flair. Nominated for 11 Oscars, HUGO appears to have bested the similarly themed MIDNIGHT IN PARIS. Rated PG.

SAWAKO DECIDES aka Kawa no Soko Kara Konnichi-wa (2010-Japan) 112m *** D: Yûya Ishii. Hikari Mitsushima, Kotaro Shiga, Ryô Iwamatsu, Masashi Endô. It's been five years since Sawako (Mitsushima) left her home town for Tokyo. Things haven't worked out—she's had five dead-end jobs, and she's on her fifth disappointing relationship. Now she is home to help out with the family clampacking business because her dad is dying. The only thing she says to those who accuse her of being a failure is "Shoganai" or "It can't be helped". Is she defeated? Anything but! Here is a heroine relevant to our times. This quirky comedy was a huge hit in Japan. For ages 12 and older.

HÔTEL DU NORD (1938-France) 92m *** ½ D: Marcel Carné (DAY-BREAK). Annabella, Jean-Pierre Aumont, Louis Jouvet, Arletty (CHILDREN OF PARADISE), Paulette Dubost. This deliciously atmospheric example of "réalisme poétique" chronicles the passionate stories of two couples who visit the Hôtel du Nord, a family-run hotel on the Canal Saint-Martin in Paris. Pierre (Aumont) and Renée (Annabella) are planning a double suicide; their fate gets intertwined with that of another couple, pimp Edmond (Jouvet) and prostitute Raymonde (Arletty). Inspired by the 1928 book by Eugene Dabit (whose parents owned the real Hôtel du Nord), this rarely-seen classic is a must for lovers of French cinema. For ages 12 and older.

TOWER HEIST (2011) 104m *** D: Brett Ratner. Ben Stiller, Eddie Murphy, Casey Affleck, Alan Alda, Matthew Broderick, Gabourey Sidibe (PRECIOUS), Michael Peña. This outrageously entertaining heist comedy centers on a posh residential building in New York. Josh (Stiller), the manager, takes pride in taking good care of his tenants, especially financier Arthur Shaw (Alda). When Shaw is arrested by the FBI for fraud, Josh is horrified to discover the building's employees' pension fund that Shaw has been handling has disappeared. Josh and his pals recruit street criminal Slide (Murphy, in top form) to try to steal their money back. Rated PG-13.

A GENTLE BREEZE IN THE VILLAGE aka Tennen Kokekkô (2007-Japan) 121m *** D: Nobuhiro Yamashita (LINDA LINDA LINDA). Kaho, Masaki Okada, Kôichi Satô. This coming-of-age drama is sein a remote area of Shimane Prefecture, where young people are increasingly difficult to find. The few youngsters attend a combined primary and junior high is school, and the only student in her second year of junior high is Soyo (Kaho). A classmate arrives, Hiromi Osawa (Okada), a transfer student from Tokyo. He's rangy and cute, and is immediately made a celebrity by the kids in the school. But despite his big city cool, Soyo's not quite charmed by him... at first. This teen romance, beautifully lensed amid the picturesque splendor of rural Japan, won six film awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE CHINA SYNDROME (1979) 122m *** D: James Bridges. Jane Fonda, Jack Lemmon, Michael Douglas, Scott Brady, James Hampton. Based on actual occurrences at nuclear plants, this beautifully crafted thriller raises unsettling questions. Jack Godell (Lemmon) is a shift supervisor at a Southern California nuclear plant. He's a great believer in nuclear energy, but when an earthquake rattles his plant, he becomes convinced that something's terribly wrong. Meanwhile, a reporter (Fonda) and a cameraman (Douglas) get wind of the story, but they are rebuffed at every turn when they try to air it. Made 33 years ago, this film spookily predicted the Three Mile Island disaster. This screening marks the first anniversary of the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear meltdown. Rated PG.

LITTLE NICHOLAS aka Le petit Nicolas (2009-France/ Belgium) 91m *** D: Laurent Tirard. Maxime Godart, Valerie Lemercier, Kad Merad, Sandrine Kiberlain. Schoolboy Nicolas (Godart) is petit but his imagination is grand. When he hears his parents talking about what can only be the arrival of a new baby in the family, Nicolas is terrified his mom and dad will abandon him in the forest (after all, that's what happened to Tom Thumb!). Nicolas enlists help from his friends so he can get rid of the kid, leading to all sorts of comic escapades. This beloved children's story based on the comic by Jean-Jacques Sempé was nominated for 3 awards. Rated G.

LE SILENCE DE LA MER (1949-France) 84m *** ½ D: Jean-Pierre Melville (feature debut). Howard Vernon, Nicole Stéphane, Jean-Marie Robain. In a small town in occupied France in 1941, German officer Werner von Ebrennac (Vernon) is billeted in the house of an old man (Robain) and his niece (Stéphane). Upset by this imposition, the uncle and niece refuse to speak to their guest and do their best to act as though the officer isn't there. But each night, von Ebrennac regales them with tales that betray his deep love for French culture, unsettling and confusing them. Von Ebrennac is the enemy, he belongs to the Nazis' dehumanizing military machine—but is he a monster? This strikingly beautiful work adapted from the secretly published 1942 novel by Vercors was the first film for both Melville (who was Jewish and a member of the Resistance) and ground-breaking cinematographer Henri Decaë (THE 400 BLOWS). A very rare screening. For ages 12 and older.

MICKYBO AND ME (2004-UK) 95m *** D: Terry Loane. John Joe McNeill, Niall Wright, Julie Walters, Ciarán Hinds. Set in Belfast in 1970, at the start of the "troubles", this story concerns two 10-year-old boys, Micky Boyle or 'Mickybo', from a large Catholic family, and his friend 'Jonjo' (Wright), an only son whose Protestant parents' marriage is failing. After sneaking off to see BUTCH CASSIDY AND THE SUNDANCE KID, the two are inspired to run off to Australia. This funny and poignant film won an Irish Film and Television Award. Rated R.

A SHINE OF RAINBOWS (2009-Canada/Ireland) 101m *** D: Vic Sarin. Connie Nielsen, Aidan Quinn, John Bell, Jack Gleeson, Tara Alice Scully. Poor Tomas (Bell) was the punching bag of bullies at the orphanage until he was rescued by Maire O'Donnell (Nielsen). Loving and joyful, Maire is the ideal adoptive mother, who shares the delights of her home on remote Corrie Island off the coast of Ireland. Maire idn't choose a sturdier child. Events lead Tomas to face challenges as he adapts to his new family. This tender and uplifting family drama won 3 film awards. Rated PG.

MY WEEK WITH MARILYN (2011-UK/US) 99m *** D: Simon Curtis. Michelle Williams, Eddie Redmayne, Julia Ormond, Kenneth Branagh, Judi Dench, Emma Watson. In 1956, the hottest movie star in the world, Marilyn Monroe (Williams), traveled to London to film THE PRINCE AND THE SHOWGIRL with the greatest living actor, Laurence Olivier (Branagh), who directed the film. Their clashes were legendary. Acting as a liaison between the Monroe and Olivier camps was 23-year-old Colin Clark (Redmayne), who became Monroe's confidant. Based on Clark's memoirs, this backstage drama puts you in the presence of these legends and the intoxicating glamour of the era. Nominated for 2 Oscars, this film won 13 awards so far. Rated R.

THE ADVENTURES OF TINTIN (2011-US/New Zealand) 107m *** ½ D: Steven Spielberg. Voiced by Jamie Bell, Andy Serkis, Daniel Craig, Nick Frost, Simon Pegg. Tintin (Bell), the wonder-boy reporter and his equally wondrous dog Snowy are off to another terrific adventure. This time, they are given the glamour treatment through the animation magic produced by Peter Jackson (Lord of the Rings). In this visually dazzling tour-de-force, Tintin and Snowy uncover the secrets of the sunken ship The Unicorn with Capt. Haddock (Serkis) while battling the sinister Mr. Sakharine (Craig). Nominated for an Oscar, this rip-roaring tale won 10 awards so far. Rated PG.

THE OLD GUN aka Le vieux fusil (1975-France/West Germany) 103m **** \(^1\)2 D: Robert Enrico. Philippe Noiret (CINEMA PARADISO), Romy Schneider, Jean Bouise, Joachim Hansen, Robert Hoffmann. Set in 1944, during the last months of the German occupation of France, this war drama concerns Julien Dandieu (Noiret), a surgeon at the hospital of Montauban. Dandieu is a family man, so his activities with the Resistance involves little risk. With liberation near, Dr. Dandieu has his wife and daughter driven to the family castle he has been restoring. When he visits one week later, he discovers the Nazis have arrived at the village and castle. He responds to the situation by retrieving the long-stashed shotgun of his childhood. Movie Museum presents a rare screening of this deeply moving revenge thriller. Winner of 4 film awards. Rated R.

PATAGONIA (2010-Argentina/UK) 118m *** D: Marc Evans. Matthew Gravelle, Nia Roberts, Nahuel Pérez Biscayart. In 1885, a group of Welsh farmers emigrated to Patagonia, setting up a Welsh-speaking community. In the present day, one of the residents, elderly Cerys, tricks her young neighbor Alejandro (Biscayart) to travel with her back to Wales to find her grandparents' farm. Traveling in the opposite direction, photographer Rhys (Gravelle)is joined by his girlfriend Gwen (Roberts) on a work trip to Patagonia, where they will discover if they are meant to be together. UK's *The Mirror* calls this "A sparkling gem of a film". For ages 15 and older.

THE WOMEN ON THE 6TH FLOOR aka Les femmes du 6ème étage (2010-France) 104m *** D: Philippe Le Guay, Fabrice Luchini, Sandrine Kiberlain, Natalia Verbeke, Carmen Maura, Lola Dueñas. In 1962 Paris, on the sixth floor of an elegant building, six Spanish maids scrape out a living. Several floors below, conservative married couple Jean Louis (Luchini) and Suzanne (Kiberlain) Joubert lead very ordered and routine lives. Vibrant young Maria (Verbeke) decides to join her aunt Conception (Maura) on the sixth floor just when the Jouberts need to hire someone. Little do they know that once they have Maria in their home, nothing will be the same! This sunny comedy won an Audience Award at the Aspen Filmfest. For ages 12 and older.

TINKER TAILOR SOLDIER SPY (2011-France/UK/ Germany) 127m **** \(^1\)2 D: Tomas Alfredson. Gary Oldman, John Hurt, Toby Jones, Colin Firth, Ciarán Hinds, Benedict Cumberbatch, Mark Strong, Tom Hardy. In this intricate adaptation of John le Carré's espionage novel, MI-6 veteran George Smiley (Oldman) is pulled out of retirement to investigate a mole in the highest levels of British intelligence during the Cold War era. Who is the Soviet double agent? There's Tinker, ambitious Percy Alleline (Jones); Tailor, natty Bill Haydon (Firth); Soldier, formidable Roy Bland (Hinds) and Poor Man, seedy Toby Esterhase (Dencik). This beautifully crafted chess game of a movie is nominated for 3 Oscars, and has won 11 awards so far. Rated R.

YES, BUT... aka Oui, mais... (2001-France) 104m ***
D: Yves Lavandier. Émilie Dequenne, Gérard Jugnot, Alix
de Konopka, Cyrille Thouvenin, Patrick Bonnel. Seventeen-year-old Eglantine (Dequenne) feels like she's fallen
in a cesspit and can't get out. Her philandering dad
(Bonnel) confines his parenting to giving her money when
she gets good grades. Her mom (de Konopka) threatens
to go on a bender each time Eglantine wants to go out
with a boy. And speaking of boys, it would be so nice if
Sébastien (Thouvenin) would stop mistaking sex for love.
With the help of wise and funny therapist Erwann
Moenner (Jugnot), Eglantine finds her way out of the
cesspit and into a nice cleansing shower. This thoughtful comedy won 4 film awards. For ages 15 and older.

MOST PROMISING YOUNG ACTRESS aka Meilleur espoir féminin (2000-France) 100m *** D: Gérard Jugnot. Gérard Jugnot, Bérénice Bejo (THE ARTIST), Sabine Haudepin. Elegant Yvon Rance (Jugnot) reigns in his hair salon in Brittany serving a clientele of little old ladies. He has lovingly brought up Laetitia (Bejo), his daughter, in the hope she will operate a cutting-edge salon of her own. When he discovers that Laetitia has auditioned for a part in a movie, and has landed a major role, he thinks it's a major catastrophe. This delightful comedy was nominated for (of course) Most Promising Actress for Bérénice Bejo. Suitable for ages 12 and older.

THE GIRL WITH THE DRAGON TATTOO (2011-US/ Sweden/UK/Germany) 158m *** ½ D: David Fincher. Daniel Craig, Rooney Mara, Christopher Plummer, Stellan Skarsgård, Robin Wright. This English language adaptation of Stieg Larsson's novel plunges into its sordid subject with the fevered eye of a voyeur. Disgraced journalist Mikael Blomkvist (Craig) is hired to investigate the disappearance of a wealthy patriarch's niece that happened 40 years ago. Blomkvist is aided by pierced, tattooed young hacker Lisbeth Salander (Mara). Together they work through the suspects, a corrupt, dangerous and deviant nest of snakes in human form. This darkly fascinating thriller is nominated for 5 Oscars, and has won 6 film awards so far. Rated R.

THE CHORUS aka Les Choristes (2004-French/Swiss/German) 97m *** D: Christophe Barratier. Gérard Jugnot, François Berléand, Kad Merad, Jean-Baptiste Maunier. In 1949 France, the new teacher at a harshly disciplinarian boy's boarding school works to spark his students' interest in music against the wishes of the school's overbearing headmaster. Full of glorious music, this uplifting, inspirational entertainment was nominated for a Best Foreign Language Film Oscar in 2005 and won several international awards. PG-13.
