AMBUSH aka Rukajärven tie (1999-Finland) 117m \*\*\*
D: Olli Saarela. Peter Franzén, Irina Björklund, Kari
Heiskanen, Taisto Reimaluoto, Tommi Eronen. In the
summer of 1941, 14 Finnish soldiers bicycle deep into the
Karelian Forest to report on enemy positions and engage
the Russian military. This beautifully shot character
study of love, loss and honor provides a rare glimpse into
Finland's "Continuation War" of 1941-4. Winner of 11
awards. For ages 15 and older.

HEAR ME aka Ting shuo (2009-Taiwan) 109m \*\*\* D: Fen-fen Cheng, Eddie Peng, Ivy Yi-Han Chen, Michelle Chen, Mei-Hsiu Lin, Pei-An Lo. In this charming romantic comedy, a restaurant delivery boy falls for the sister of a young woman training to be a professional swimmer. The catch is both sisters are hearing impaired, and while the boy is skilled in sign language, his parents (who are his employers) are always riding him about filial obligations. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

MANCHESTER BY THE SEA (2016-US) 137m \*\*\*\* D: Kenneth Lonergan (YOU CAN COUNT ON ME). Casey Affleck, Michelle Williams, Kyle Chandler, Lucas Hedges. A family rocked by tragedy finds a way to come together in this New England drama. Casey Affleck is brilliant as Lee Chandler, a grieving Boston handyman who is made legal guardian to his teenage nephew Patrick (Hedges). Winner of 2 Academy Awards for Best Actor (Affleck) and Best Original Screenplay (Lonergan) and 104 more awards. Rated R.

MOONLIGHT (2016-US) 111m \*\*\*\* D: Barry Jenkins. Mahershala Ali, Naomie Harris, Alex Hibbert, Ashton Sanders, Trevante Rhodes, André Holland. A young man struggles with his identity and finds love in this brilliant drama. Nine-year-old Chiron (Hibbert) lives in a rough part of Miami with his single crack-addicted mother Paula (Harris). Bullied in school and neglected at home, Chiron suffers for being different. Strikingly lensed by James Laxton, this poetic journey of a black gay male won Best Picture, Best Supporting Actor (Ali) and Best Adapted Screenplay Oscars and 178 more awards. Rated R.

ALLIED (2016-UK/US) 124m \*\*\* D: Robert Zemeckis (BACK TO THE FUTURE). Brad Pitt, Marion Cotillard, Jared Harris, Simon McBurney, Matthew Goode. This gorgeous spy thriller set in Casablanca during World War II (are you sold yet?) has dashing Canadian spy Max (Pitt) posing as slinky French spy Marianne's (Cotillard) husband. The trouble starts when they decide to become a couple for real. This glamorous concoction was nominated for an Oscar. Rated R.

SONGS MY BROTHERS TAUGHT ME (2015-US) 93m \*\*\*\* ½ D: Chloé Zhao (feature debut). John Reddy, Jashaun St. John, Irene Bedard, Taysha Fuller. This drama shot and cast on location concerns a Lakota family living on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. High schooler Johnny (Reddy) and his 11-year-old sister Jashaun (St. John) live with their single mother Lisa (Bedard). The eldest son is in prison. Johnny wants to move to Los Angeles with his girlfriend (Fuller) but that would mean leaving his beloved sister. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 15 and up.

COSIMO E NICOLE (2012-Italy) 106m \*\*\* D: Francesco Amato. Riccardo Scamarcio, Clara Ponsot, Paolo Sassanelli, Souleymane Sow. At the 2001 Genoa G8 riots, Italian boy Cosimo (Scamarcio) and French girl Nicole (Ponsot) lock eyes and fall in love. They take up residence in Genoa in a little shack and find work with concert promoter Paolo (Sassanelli). Their happiness is interrupted when illegal immigrant Alioune (Sow) falls off the scaffolding and Paolo tries to cover up the incident. This fiery yet thoughtful romance won 6 awards. For ages 15 and older.

ROBO-G (2012-Japan) 111m \*\*\* ½ D: Shinobu Yaguchi (WATER BOYS). Gaku Hamada, Mickey Curtis, Chan Kawai, Junya Kawashima, Naoto Takenaka. When an accident causes the hard work of Kimura Electrical Co.'s robotics team to go out the window (literally), the three nerds of the research department (Kawai, Hamada and Kawashima) hatch a desperate plan: They hire retiree Suzuki (Curtis) to don a robot suit to fake a demo at the robotics expo. This charming comedy was nominated for an award. For ages 10 and older.

MOANA (2016-US) 107m \*\*\* ½ D: John Musker, Ron Clements (ALADDIN). Auli'i Cravalho, Dwayne Johnson, Rachel House, Temuera Morrsion, Jemaine Clement, Alan Tudyk. Hawaii teen Auli'i Cravalho voices and sings the title role of this gorgeously animated adventure. The chief (Morrison) of Motunui forbids Moana, his teenage daughter, to venture beyond the reef. But when her island is threatened, she disobeys her father and goes out to sea to save her people. Dwayne 'The Rock' Johnson is a delight as Maui (he also sings). Winner of 6 awards and nominated for 2 Oscars. PG

DOCTOR STRANGE (2016-US) 115m \*\*\* ½ D: Scott Derrickson. Benedict Cumberbatch, Tilda Swinton, Chiwetel Ejiofor, Rachel McAdams, Mads Mikkelsen, Benjamin Bratt, Benedict Wong, Scott Adkins. This splendidly trippy Marvel origin story (kudos to Steve Ditko who invented Dr. Strange) tells how arrogant neurosurgeon Stephen Strange (Cumberbatch) became the pointy-collared and goateed sorcerer Doctor Strange. It involves his getting punched in the third eye by Celto-Buddhist mystic The Ancient One (Swinton). By the Hoary Hosts of Hoggath, this is great fun! Winner of 5 awards and nominated for an Oscar, Rated PG-13.

RISKY BUSINESS aka Les risques du métier (1967-France) 95m \*\*\* ½ D: André Cayatte. Jacques Brel, Emmanuelle Riva 2/24/1927 – 1/27/2017 (AMOUR), René Dary, Delphine Desyeux. Celebrated Belgian singer Jacques Brel stars as a popular school teacher in a small town in Normandy. When he is falsely accused of rape by his star student Catherine (Desyeux), his and his wife Suzanne's (Riva) lives are forever changed in this surprisingly topical drama. Those who enjoyed THE HUNT (2012) should rush to see this. Nominated for 1 award. For ages 12 and older.

THE SYRIAN BRIDE (2004-France/Germany/Israel) 97m \*\*\* ½ D: Eran Riklis. Clara Khoury, Hiam Abbass, Makram Khoury, Ashraf Barhom. In a remote corner of the Golan Heights, Mona (Clara Khoury) is about to cross the border from Israel to Syria to get married. But what should be a momentous ceremony gets bogged down in red tape: she can't leave her village without an Israeli stamp on her passport, but the Syrians won't let her in Syria with an Israeli stamp on her passport. This comedy-drama won 8 awards from all over the world. For ages 12 and older.

FENCES (2016-US) 139m \*\*\* ½ D: Denzel Washington. Denzel Washington, Viola Davis, Stephen Henderson, Jovan Adepo. This highly anticipated adaptation of August Wilson's Pulitzer Prize-winning play concerns a sanitation worker named Troy (Washington) in 1950s Pittsburgh. Usually jolly, Troy conceals decades of hurt and frustration, poisoning his outlook on life and his family. Winner of the Best Supporting Actress Oscar (Viola Davis) and 44 more awards. PG-13.

PAVEE LACKEEN: THE TRAVELLER GIRL (2005-Ireland) 88m \*\*\* D: Perry Ogden. Winnie Maughan, Rose Maughan, Rosie Maughan. This rare look into the lives of Irish Travellers, a nomadic ethnic group, focuses on Winnie Maugham, a 10-year-old girl. Winnie has been sent home for a week from school for getting into fights. Meanwhile, her family's living situation is threatened as the authorities are forcing them to move their trailer to even rougher territory. This hybrid documentary and realist film won 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

JACKIE (2016-Chile/France/US) 100m \*\*\* ½ D: Pablo Larraín (NERUDA). Natalie Portman, Peter Sarsgaard, Greta Gerwig, Bill Crudup, John Hurt, Richard E. Grant. Natalie Portman delivers an extraordinary portrait of first lady Jacqueline Kennedy as she copes with shock and grief over her husband's assassination before the eyes of a stunned nation. Winner of 33 awards and nominated for 3 Oscars. Rated R.

IXCANUL aka Volcano (2015-Guatemala/France) 93m \*\*\*\* D: Jayro Bustamante (feature debut). María Mercedes Coroy, María Telón, Justo Lorenzo. On a farm on a slope of a Guatemalan volcano, Kaqchikel maiden María (Coroy) prepares to meet her future husband, Ignacio (Lorenzo). She knows nothing of his world: electricity, running water or cars. She will soon leave her village, but not in the way she imagines. This fascinating clash of culture and belief won 20 awards, including one from Berlin. For ages 12 and older.

HEART OF A LION aka Leijonasydän (2013-Finlan-Sweden) 99m \*\*\* ½ D: Dome Karukoski (LAPLAND ODYSSEY). Peter Franzén (AMBUSH), Laura Birn, Jasper Pääkkönen, Yusufa Sidibeh. A neo-Nazi skinhead (Franzén) falls head over heels in love with beautiful blonde Sari (Birn). He is forced to seriously reconsider his beliefs when he finds out she has a biracial son (Sidibeh). This provocative film tackles Finland's neo-Nazi issues with humor. Winner of 6 awards. For ages 15 and up.

A SECOND CHANCE aka En chance til (2014-Denmark/ Sweden) 98m \*\*\* D: Susanne Bier (AFTER THE WED-DING). Nikolaj Coster-Waldau (Game of Thrones), Nikolaj Lie Kaas (MURK), Ulrich Thomsen, Maria Bonnevie, May Andersen. A Danish police officer faces a moral crisis when he encounters a neglected baby his son's same age at the home of violent junkie Tristan (Kaas) and his abused partner Sanne (Andersen). What is his responsibility as a policeman? As a husband and father? As a human? This gripping drama won 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

FIRE AT SEA aka Fuocoammare (2016-Italy/France) 114m \*\*\* ½ D: Gianfranco Rosi. This mysterious and beautiful documentary uses fixed camera positions and no voiceover to capture the ongoing drama of life and death on the Sicilian island of Lampedusa. The everyday existence of a local family is contrasted against the constant flow of desperate migrants from the Middle East and Africa. This documentary won 12 awards and was nominated for an Oscar. For ages 12 and older.

MISS SLOANE (2016-France/US) 132m \*\*\* D: John Madden (SHAKESPEARE IN LOVE). Jessica Chastain, Gugu Mbatha-Raw, John Lithgow, Mark Strong, Jake Lacy, Sam Waterston. Jessica Chastain stars as Elizabeth Sloane, a take-no-prisoners Washington DC lobbyist who battles the gun industry in this highly topical thriller. At this intersection of big business and politics, no price is too high for victory, not even a human soul. Nominated for 5 awards, Rated R.

PARAÍSO (2013-Mexico) 102m \*\*\* D: Mariana Chenillo. Andrés Almeida, Daniela Rincón. Happily married couple Carmen (Rincón) and Alfredo (Almeida) move from their comfortable suburban home to Mexico City's financial center for Alfredo's new job. Their rotund figures make them the butt of jokes by their new "upscale" community, prompting Carmen to talk Alfredo into joining a weight loss program. As they both attempt to lose weight, new stresses appear in their marriage. This thoughtful comedy-drama was nominated for an award. For ages 15 and up.

ELJEREMÍAS (2015-Mexico) 95m \*\*\* ½ D: Anwar Safa (feature debut). Martín Castro, Karem Momo Ruiz, Paul Galindo. In this thoughtful comedy set in Sonora, Mexico, eight-year-old Jeremías can't seem to fit in at school or at home. When an IQ test reveals he is a genius, Jeremías enjoys some welcome attention, but also a genuine challenge: what will he do with his intellectual gifts? Will he choose to be like Albert Einstein or Jim Morrison? Touching on serious topics as well as light-hearted humor, this comedy won 6 awards. For ages 10 and older.

FANTASTIC BEASTS AND WHERE TO FIND THEM (2016-UK/US) 133m \*\*\* ½ D: David Yates. Eddie Redmayne, Katherine Waterston, Dan Fogler, Colin Farrell, Samantha Morton. In this delightful tale by Harry Potter author JK Rowling, absent-minded British "magizoologist" Newt Scamander (Redmayne) arrives in 1920s New York and causes a ruckus with the American wizarding community. This adventure-romance won the Best Costume Design Oscar and 6 more awards. Rated PG-13.

A MONSTER CALLS (2016-US/Spain/UK) 108m \*\*\* D: J.A. Bayona (THE ORPHANAGE). Lewis MacDougall, Felicity Jones, Sigourney Weaver, Toby Kebbell, Liam Neeson. British preteen Conor (MacDougall) has been suffering from terrible nightmares during his mother's long battle with cancer. Late one evening, an ancient yew tree uproots itself, rumbles to Conor's window and booms (in Liam Neeson's voice), "I have come to get you!" The tree monster is (like Groot) a good guy—how he helps Conor is the magic of this story. Winner of 26 awards. Ratted PG-13.
