SAKURA OFFICIAL aka *Sakura hangan* (1962-Japan) 92m *** D: Shigehiro Ozawa. Chiezô Kataoka, Kôji Tsuruta, Yumiko Mihara. When Toyama no Kin-san (Kataoka) mingles with people on the streets of Edo, he looks like a tough-talking gangster. But he's actually an Edo magistrate, celebrated for his wisdom. This beloved character has been played by Kataoka in 18 films—this being his final and most challenging case. In 1841, during the Tokugawa Shogunate, Kin-san investigates a series of incidents involving a mendicant priest. When he uncovers a nefarious plot to kill the heir to the Hizen Shimabara domain, he is shocked to find his father is implicated. A colorful, stylish production. For ages 12 and older.

KNIVES OUT (2019-US) 131m **** D: Rian Johnson (BRICK). Daniel Craig, Chris Evans, Jamie Lee Curtis, Ana de Armas, Michael Shannon, Don Johnson, Toni Collette, Christopher Plummer. When best-selling crime novelist Harlan Thrombey (Plummer) is found dead with his throat cut shortly after his 85th birthday, Detective Benoit Blanc (Craig) finds that nearly everyone in Harlan's family and staff has a motive for murder. This hugely entertaining Agatha Christie-inspired whodunit with a 21st century twist won 43 awards and was nominated for a Best Original Screenplay Oscar. Rated PG-13.

PARASITE aka *Gisaengchun* (2019-South Korea) 132m **** D: Bong Joon Ho (OKJA). Kang-ho Song, Sun-kyun Lee, Yejo-jung Jo, Woo-sik Choi, So-dam Park, Hye-jin Jang, Ji-so Jung, Ki-taek Kim (Song), his wife (Jang) and his kids Ki-woo (Choi) and Ki-jung (Park) are barely scraping by in their squalid basement apartment. When son Ki-woo lands a gig as English tutor to the teenage daughter of tech millionaire Dong-ik Park (Lee), the Kims find a way to infiltrate the Parks' sumptuous household in this scathing class warfare satire. Winner of 207 awards including Oscars for Best International Feature, Director, Original Screenplay and Picture of the Year. Rated R.

MEN WHO SWIM (2010-UK/Sweden) 70m *** ½ D: Dylan Williams. After middle-aged Welsh film professional Dylan Williams moves to his wife's native Sweden, he finds himself isolated without a job or friends. As Dylan learns to speak Swedish, his job prospects improve—but his real breakthrough is social. This humorous and uplifting documentary recounts his adventures becoming a member of an all-male(!) synchronized swim team. Follow Dylan and his middle-aged Swedish buddies as they prepare for a competition in Italy. Winner of 1 award. Rated PG.

SAMURAI JUSTICE: MOTHER AND DAUGHTER aka *Kenkaku Shôbai Haha to Musume to* (2005-Japan) 96m *** ½ D: Yoshiki Onoda. Makoto Fujita, Makiya Yamaguchi, Isao Natsuyagi, Junji Shimada. While visiting his friend Dr. Ogawa (Shimada), master swordsman Kohei Akiyama (Fujita) meets a patient who arouses his deep sympathy. Former fencing instructor Muramatsu (Natsuyagi) is dying from liver cancer but is determined to stay alive to accomplish one last task. Muramatsu won't reveal what that is, and Kohei's decision to help him carries deadly consequences. A well-crafted tale written by novelist Shôtarô Ikenami. For ages 12 and up.

SAMURAI JUSTICE: ASSISTANCE IN A DUEL aka *Kenkaku Shôbai Sukekachi* (2004-Japan) 96m *** ½ D: Akira Inoue. Makiya Yamaguchi, Makoto Fujita. In this adaptation of Shôtarô Ikenami's novel, retired master swordsman Kohei Akiyama (Fujita) and his son Daijirô (Yamaguchi) are asked by a teenage boy to help avenge the death of his father. Moved by the boy's story, the Akiyamas agree. But when they discover the identity of the boy's father's murderer, they realize this task will take much more than skill with a sword. This brilliant and beautifully crafted tale of honor and friendship will keep you thinking long after you've seen it. For ages 12 and older.

GOYÔKIN (1969-Japan) 125m **** D: Hideo Goshô (HITOKIRI). Tatsuya Nakadai, Tetsurô Tanba, Yôko Tsukasa, Ruriko Asaoka, Isao Natsuyagi, Kinnosuke Nakamura. Tatsuya Nakadai stars as Magobei, a samurai who witnesses his clan's theft of the Shogun's gold and murder of innocent villagers. Out of shame, he lives in self-imposed exile in Edo, far from his snowy Tohoku domain of Sabai. When he hears that the Chief Retainer of Sabai (Tanba) plans to commit a similar massacre, he decides he must stop him, even if it means killing his brother-in-law. This samurai classic is among the best of the genre. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

UNCUT GEMS (2019-US) 135m *** ½ D: Benny Safdie, Josh Safdie, Adam Sandler (PUNCH DRUNK LOVE), Idina Menzel, Julia Fox, LaKeith Stanfield, Kevin Garnett, Judd Hirsch. New York City gem dealer Howard Ratner (Sandler) is addicted to the high-stakes deal. He can't resist a glittery prize, whether it's a rich jewel, a hot woman or a gambling jackpot. Careening like a pinball through Manhattan's arcade of temptations, Ratner's quest for a score reaches desperate, dangerous heights in this mind-blowing crime thriller. Winner of 24 awards. Rated R.

THE GOOD LIAR (2019-UK/US/Germany) 109m *** D: Bill Condon (GODS AND MONSTERS). Helen Mirren, Ian McKellen, Jim Carter, Russell Tovey. Recently widowed university lecturer Betty (Mirren) goes online in search of a date and meets army man Roy (McKellen) in this intriguing thriller set in London. Roy, who seems so courtly and quaintly charming, hides his real identity: veteran con artist. This adaptation of Nicholas Searle's novel was nominated for 3 awards. Rated R.

IN BRUGES (2008-UK/Belgium) 107m **** D: Martin McDonagh (THE BANSHEES OF INISHEER). Colin Farrell, Brendan Gleeson, Ralph Fiennes, Clémence Poésy, Eric Godon, Ciarán Hinds. Two Dublin hitmen are sent to the quaint medieval town of Bruges to hide out after a job goes wrong. Young hothead Ray (Farrell) bristles at the peace and quiet of his picturesque surroundings while his companion Ken (Gleeson) appreciates the history and culture. When their intense boss Harry (Fiennes) arrives, all hell breaks loose. This classic, a winner of 24 awards, was released three leap years ago. Happy St. Patrick's Day!

A DUEL TALE aka *Hatashiai* (2015-Japan) 95m *** ½ D: Shigemichi Sugita. Tatsuya Nakadai, Mieko Harada, Nanami Sakuraba, Ryûki Takahashi, Tomo Yanagishita. Elderly samurai Sanosuke (Nakadai) lives as a freeloader at his brother's home, not having found a wife. When his beloved grandniece Miya (Sakuraba) objects to an arranged marriage to odious (but wealthy) Tatsunosuke (Takahashi), Sanosuke is given a chance to redeem himself—by picking up his sword in a duel with a much younger man. For ages 12 and older.

JOJO RABBIT (2019-Czech Republic/New Zealand/US) 108m *** ½ D: Taika Waititi (WHAT WE DO IN THE SHADOWS). Roman Griffin Davis, Thomasin McKenzie, Scarlett Johansson, Taika Waititi, Archie Yates. This surprisingly touching satire concerns Jojo (Davis), a frightened little boy who's trying to be a good Nazi as World War II engulfs his German town. Jojo relies on his imaginary friend Hitler (Waititi) to help him fit in. Meanwhile, Jojo discovers that a mysterious stranger (McKenzie) is living in his house, and his Mom (Johansson) might have put her there! Winner of 32 awards including the Best Adapted Screenplay Oscar (Waititi). Rated PG-13.

THE YELLOW HANDKERCHIEF aka *Shiwase no kiirô hankachi* (1977-Japan) 108m *** D: Yoji Yamada (TOKYO FAMILY). Ken Takakura, Chieko Baishô, Kaori Momoi, Tetsuya Takeda. Three strangers travel Hokkaido by car, each with a difficult past. Kin'ya (Takeda) was just dumped by his girlfriend, Akemi's (Momoi) escaping problems at home, and mysterious Yûsaku (Takakura) harbors some deep heartache. Their stories are revealed along the way, with plenty of humor and humanity. This touching road movie won 27 awards, including 6 from the Japanese Academy. For ages 12 and older. Note: Ours is an extremely rare English subtitled screening.

VILLAIN aka *Akunin* (2010-Japan) 140m **** D: Sang-il Lee (HULA GIRLS). Satoshi Tsumabuki (TOKYO FAMILY), Eri Fukatsu, Akira Emoto, Hikari Mitsushima, Masaki Okada, Kirin Kiki, Hisashi Igawa. Construction worker Ryuichi (Tsumabuki) does little other than work and take his grandfather back and forth to the hospital. When an online hook-up with Yoshino (Mitsushima) goes horribly wrong, Ryuichi is suspected of her murder. On the run, he meets Mitsuyo (Fukatsu), a woman with whom he can unburden his heart. Villainy in all its disguises is revealed in this sharply observed and brilliantly acted critique of modern Japanese society. Winner of 13 awards. For ages 15 and older.

BOMBSHELL (2019-US/Canada) 109m *** D: Jay Roach (TRUMBO). Charlize Theron, Nicole Kidman, Margot Robbie, John Lithgow, Kate McKinnon. Fox News mogul Roger Ailes (Lithgow) presides over his network as if it's his private seraglio, blatantly pressuring women to provide sexual favors in exchange for career advancement. In this smart and funny docudrama, two courageous women take him down: TV host Gretchen Carlson (Kidman) and star anchor Megyn Kelly (Theron). Winner of 21 awards, including an Oscar for Makeup and Hairstyling. Rated R.

COLD CASE HAMMARSKJÖLD (2019-Denmark/Norway/Sweden/Belgium) 128m *** ½ D: Mads Brügger. In 1961, United Nations secretary-general Dag Hammarskjöld died in a plane crash in Africa. This documentary lays out compelling pieces of evidence to indicate that the crash was not an accident, but an assassination. A fascinating murder mystery that explores a conspiracy theory held for five decades; its revelations are as far-reaching as they are disturbing. Winner of 9 awards, including one at Sundance. For ages 12 and older.

SOOF (2013-Netherlands) 99m *** D: Antoinette Beumer (LOFT). Lies Visschedijk, Fedja van Huêt, Daniel Karaty. In this lighthearted comedy, things have gotten a little too routine for Soof (Visschedijk). She raises her three happy kids, runs her small catering company, and has run-of-the-mill sex with her sweet husband Kasper (van Huêt). One day, glamorous choreographer Jim (Karaty) hires Soof's catering company and suddenly she's catapulted into the posh A-list scene. Soof's life is turned upside-down! Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

SOOF 2 (2016-Netherlands) 94m *** D: Esmé Lammer. Lies Visschedijk, Fedja van Huêt, Achmed Akkabi, Daniel Karaty, Lobke de Boer. After 14 months of marriage counseling, Soof (Visschedijk) and her husband Kasper (van Huêt) decide to divorce in this funny and engaging comedy drama. Soof has mounting bills to pay and a home to divvy up—she's so distracted, her restaurant is going downhill. But when she hires new chef Bauke (Akkabi), her appetite for good food and her joy for life are re-ignited. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

HONEYLAND (2019-Republic of Macedonia) 89m **** D: Tamara Kotevska, Ljubomir Stefanov. Along a rocky cliff in Macedonia, beekeeper Hatidze pulls aside some stones to reveal a wild beehive. Using her bare hands and without hesitation, she plucks pieces of golden honeycomb, only as much as she needs. Hatidze says, "take half, leave half". But when a large Turkish family moves nearby, the careful balance she maintains with nature is disrupted. This visually gorgeous and thoughtful documentary won 32 awards from all over the world, including 3 at Sundance. For ages 10 and older.

RICHARD JEWELL (2019-US) 131m *** ½ D: Clint Eastwood (SULLY). Paul Walter Hauser, Sam Rockwell, Kathy Bates, Jon Hamm, Olivia Wilde. During the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta, security guard Richard Jewell (Hauser) saves hundreds of lives from a deadly bombing. But as the initial praise and thanks die down, the media and the FBI begin to scrutinize the would-be hero: an overweight mama's boy with a history of getting fired from security jobs due to overzealousness. This potent examination of American popular culture won 5 awards. Kathy Bates's performance as Jewell's mother Bobi was nominated for an Oscar. Rated R.

1917 (2019-US/UK/India/Spain/Canada) 119m **** D: Sam Mendes (SKYFALL). Dean-Charles Chapman, George MacKay, Colin Firth, Andrew Scott, Benedict Cumberbatch, Richard Madden. It's April 6, 1917 on the Hindenburg Line. Two British lance corporals, Blake (Chapman) and Schofield (MacKay), hurry on foot across enemy territory to deliver a message to another British division about to enter a German trap. At risk are 1600 men, including Blake's brother (Madden). Their harrowing journey is captured in one fluid take by DP Roger Deakins. Winner of 108 awards, including Oscars for Best Cinematography, Sound Mixing and Visual Effects. Rated R.

EVERY BLESSED DAY aka *Tutti i santi giorni* (2012-Italy) 97m *** D: Paolo Virzi (LIKE CRAZY). Luca Marinelli, Thony. Gentle ecclesiastical Latin scholar Guido (Marinelli) likes his undemanding hotel clerk job because it allows him time to think. Flighty singer/songwriter Antonia (Thony) loves Guido and the peace she finds in her life with him. They want to start a family, but up against fertility challenges their relationship begins to crumble in this thoughtful love story set in Rome. Winner of 8 awards. For ages 12 and older.
