THE FENCER *aka Miekkaailija* (2015-Finland/Estonia/Germany) 99m *** ½ D: Klaus Härö (LETTERS TO FATHER JACOB). Märt Avandi, Ursula Ratasepp, Liisa Koppel, Henrik Toompere Sr., Joonas Koff. This gripping true story set in 1950s Estonia (which was then part of the USSR) concerns young fencer Endel (Avandi) who is fleeing from the Russian secret police. While trying to keep a low profile, Endel teaches fencing to children in a small town. When his students are invited to compete in Leningrad, Endel must choose between endangering himself and disappointing his pupils. This engaging sports drama won 1 award and was nominated for a Golden Globe. For ages 12 and older.

THE NEW MAN *aka Den nya människan* (2007-Finland/Sweden) 104m *** D: Klaus Härö (THE FENCER). Lo Kauppi, Ellen Jelinek, Ann-Sofie Nurmi, Nadja Mirmiran, Christoffer Svensson. In 1951 Sweden, 17-year-old Gertrud (Kauppi) is sent against her will to an institution where girls from poor families are sterilized. She can gain her freedom if she submits to sterilization, but when she falls in love with Axel (Svensson), she is confronted with a life-changing decision. This drama based on real events won at the Shanghai International Film Festival. For ages 12 and older.

SMALL TOWN CRIME (2017-US) 91m *** D: Eshom Nelms, Ian Nelms. John Hawkes (WINTER'S BONE), Octavia Spencer, Anthony Anderson, Clifton Collins Jr., Robert Forster. John Hawkes stars as an incorrigible drunk who seeks redemption in SMALL TOWN CRIME, a funny film noir. When ex-cop Mike Kendall (Hawkes) comes across a young woman left for dead on the side of a road, he becomes obsessed with finding her assailant, unwittingly endangering his family. *Variety* calls this film "a seriously down-and-dirty crime story with a savage sense of humor". Rated R.

THOR: RAGNAROK (2017-US) 130m *** ½ D: Taika Waititi (WHAT WE DO IN THE SHADOWS). Chris Hemsworth, Tom Hiddleston, Cate Blanchett, Mark Ruffalo, Jeff Goldblum, Tessa Thompson, Taika Waititi. Sibling rivalry reaches catastrophic proportions in this rollicking Marvel Norse adventure. Good-hearted Thor (Hemsworth) loses his mighty hammer to his estranged sister Hela (Blanchett), Goddess of Death. Imprisoned on the planet Sakaar by his hateful sis, Thor must escape in time to save Asgard from her fury. Luckily Thor has good friends. This epic comedy adventure won 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

THE SHAPE OF WATER (2017-US) 123m **** D: Guillermo del Toro (PAN'S LABYRINTH). Sally Hawkins, Octavia Spencer, Michael Shannon, Richard Jenkins, Doug Jones. A romance between a mute janitor (Hawkins) and an aquatic humanoid monster (Jones) takes place in a top-secret government research facility in 1962. She has been orphaned as an infant. He has been dragged out of the Amazon River and imprisoned in a fish tank. Will they save each other? This richly imaginative Cold War era adult fairy tale won 103 awards, including Oscars for Best Picture, Director, Original Score (Alexandre Desplat) and Production Design. Rated R.

THREE BILLBOARDS OUTSIDE EBBING, MISSOURI (2017-UK/US) 115m **** D: Martin McDonagh (IN BRUGES). Frances McDormand, Woody Harrelson, Sam Rockwell. Frustrated with the inaction of the local police one year after the murder of her daughter, Mildred Hayes (McDormand) rents three billboards and uses them to shame police chief Willoughby (Harrelson), who is suffering from cancer. In the process she makes an enemy of many in her community, including Willoughby's second-in-command Dixon (Rockwell). This fierce black comedy won 101 awards including Oscars for McDormand and Rockwell. Rated R.

LADY BIRD (2017-US) 94m **** D: Greta Gerwig. Saoirse Ronan, Laurie Metcalf, Tracy Letts, Lucas Hedges, Timothée Chalamet, Beanie Feldstein. Seventeen-year-old Christine "Lady Bird" McPherson (Ronan) of Sacramento insists she belongs in a university on the East Coast "where there's culture... and writers live in the woods". This despite her parents' limited budget, her grades and her questionable work ethic. A familiar story expertly told with warmth, humor, and award-worthy cinematography by Sam Levy (FRANCES HA). Winner of 100 awards and nominated for 5 Oscars. Rated R.

MOLLY'S GAME (2017-China/US/Canada) 140m *** D: Aaron Sorkin (writer THE SOCIAL NETWORK). Jessica Chastain, Idris Elba, Kevin Costner, Michael Cera, Jeremy Strong. Based on the memoir of high-stakes poker impresario Molly Bloom (Chastain), this directorial debut by Oscar-winning writer Aaron Sorkin begins as Bloom tries to get attorney Jaffrey (Elba) to defend her against the Feds, who hope she will reveal the activities of her wealthy regulars. This fascinating character study won 3 awards and was nominated for an Oscar. Rated R.

VARG VEUM – AT NIGHT ALL WOLVES ARE GREY *aka I mørket er alle ulver grå* (2011-Norway) 87m *** D: Alexander Elk. Trond Espen Seim, Bjørn Floberg, Jon Øigarden, Lene Nystrom. Private detective Varg Veum's (Seim) good friend Even (Øigarden), a highly decorated ex-military officer, is accused of bombing Amarkon, a weapons manufacturer in Bergen. To try to clear Even's name, Varg travels to Amarkon's headquarters in Budapest to get some answers. Winner of 1 award. For ages 15 and older.

THE GREATEST SHOWMAN (2017-US) 105m *** D: Michael Gracey (feature debut). Hugh Jackman, Michelle Williams, Zac Efron, Zendaya, Rebecca Ferguson. If P. T. Barnum were alive today he would likely approve of this big sparkly Baz Luhrmann-esque musical inspired by his story. Phineas Taylor Barnum (Jackman) grew up poor, but through his imagination and instinct for pleasing an audience created the Greatest Show on Earth. Allow yourself to be a kid again and enjoy the spectacle in wide-eyed wonder. Winner of 6 awards and nominated for an Oscar for Best Original Song. Rated PG.

9-MONTH STRETCH *aka 9 mois ferme* (2013-France) 82m *** D: Albert Dupontel (THE VILLAIN). Albert Dupontel, Sandrine Kiberlain. Judge Ariane Felder (Kiberlain) is obsessively dedicated to her job. So when her co-workers see Ariane working during the office New Year's party, they ply her with drinks, and for once, she lets her hair down...*big time*. Six months later she finds she's pregnant. What's worse, a DNA test reveals the father is Robert Nolan (Dupontel), a man wanted for murder! When Robert appears on her doorstep wanting to prove his innocence, a comedy of bad manners ensues. Winner of 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

PHANTOM THREAD (2017-UK/US) 130m **** D: Paul Thomas Anderson (PUNCH-DRUNK LOVE). Daniel Day-Lewis, Vicky Krieps, Lesley Manville. Couturier Reynolds Woodcock (Day-Lewis) is a man so absorbed in his craft that designing beautiful clothes is his only way of fully expressing his feelings. In each exquisitely tailored creation he hides secret messages. When he meets immigrant waitress Alma (Krieps) he discovers his muse. She in turn must teach this artist that she is flesh and blood ... and spirit. This mysterious love story won 44 awards and the Best Costume Design Oscar (Mark Bridges). Rated R.

GREENERY WILL BLOOM AGAIN *aka Torneranno i prati* (2014-Italy) 73m *** ½ D: Ermanno Olmi (THE TREE OF WOODEN CLOS). Claudio Santamaria, Camillo Grassi, Niccolò Senni, Francesco Formichetti. In a snow-covered bunker on the Austrian border during World War I, Italian soldiers huddle in the bitter cold. Their captain (Formichetti) is delirious with fever. Many of the men are sick, all are exhausted. A major (Santamaria) arrives with impossible orders which the men attempt to fulfill, despite knowing their futility. This powerfully humanistic, intensely poetic anti-war film made by Olmi in tribute to his father may be his best. Winner of 4 awards.

ALL THE MONEY IN THE WORLD (2017-US) 132m *** D: Ridley Scott (THE MARTIAN). Michelle Williams, Christopher Plummer, Mark Wahlberg, Romain Duris, Charlie Plummer (LEAN ON PETE). In Rome in 1973, teenager John Paul Getty III (Charlie Plummer), grandson of billionaire oilman John Paul Getty (Christopher Plummer), is kidnapped for a \$17 million ransom. The grandfather is concerned that if he pays, his other grandchildren would be endangered. The father, JPG II, is strung-out in Morocco. JPG III's only hope is his penniless divorcee mom Gail (Williams). This thriller based on a true story was nominated for an Oscar. Rated R.

SURVIVAL FAMILY (2016-Japan) 118m *** D: Shinobu Yaguchi (WOOD JOB!). Fumiyo Kohinata, Eri Fukatsu, Yuki Izumisawa, Wakana Aoi, Akira Emoto. The Suzukis of Tokyo are like any other middle-class Japanese (or for that matter, American) family. Each family member interacts more with electronics (computers, TVs, appliances, smart phones) than they do each other. When a world-wide power outage sends everyone scrambling for survival, the Suzukis decide to travel hundreds of miles by bicycle to grandfather's Kagoshima farm in this thought-provoking comedy that is both funny and harrowing. For ages 10 and older.

THE GIRL OF YOUR DREAMS *aka La niña de tus ojos* (1998-Spain) 121m *** D: Fernando Trueba (BELLE EPOQUE). Penélope Cruz, Antonio Resines, Jorge Sanz, Santiago Segura. In this picaresque comedy, a Spanish film company decides to escape the Spanish Revolution by traveling to Nazi Germany to make a movie. Macarena (Cruz), the star of the film, attracts the attention of minister of propaganda Joseph Goebbels, causing the rest of the company to push her into fanning the flames so he would fund their projects. Winner of 14 awards. Rated R.

THE COMMUTER (2018-UK/France/US) 105m *** D: Jaume Collet-Serra (UNKNOWN). Liam Neeson, Vera Farmiga, Patrick Wilson, Sam Neill, Elizabeth McGovern. Hard-working insurance man Michael (Neeson) has been taking the same Metro-North train home from New York's Grand Central Station for 10 years. One evening on the train, while worrying about his kids' college tuition, he is approached by a mysterious woman (Farmiga) who offers him a hefty chunk of change to spot a non-commuter named Prynn...and by the way, if he doesn't, his family will die. *Movie Nation* calls this "a thriller with tension and style". Rated PG-13.

THE POST (2017-UK/US) 116m *** ½ D: Steven Spielberg (LINCOLN). Meryl Streep, Tom Hanks, Sarah Paulson, Bob Odenkirk, Tracy Letts, Matthew Rhys. In 1971, the publisher of the Washington Post, Kay Graham (Streep), is faced with a terrible dilemma. She has the opportunity to publish the Pentagon Papers, a top-secret government document leaked by analyst Daniel Ellsberg (Rhys) that discloses lies by the Johnson and Nixon administrations regarding the Vietnam War. If she proceeds, she and her staff may all be sent to prison. This rallying cry for the freedom of the press won 15 awards and was nominated for 2 Oscars. Rated PG-13.

THE QUEEN OF SPAIN *aka La reina de España* (2016-Spain) 128m *** D: Fernando Trueba. Penélope Cruz, Antonio Resines, Javier Cámara, Cary Elwes, Mandy Patinkin. In the 1950s, nearly two decades after the events of THE GIRL OF YOUR DREAMS, Hollywood movie star Macarena (Cruz) travels home to Spain to star in a lavish US-financed production as Isabella I of Castile. In Madrid she meets up with her old friends—and has to deal with another fascist regime, this time Francisco Franco's. Nominated for 7 awards. For ages 12 and older.

VARG VEUM – THE DEAD HAVE IT EASY *aka De døde har det godt* (2012-Norway) 86m *** D: Erik Richter Strand. Trond Espen Seim, Bjørn Floberg, Lene Nystrom, Bintu Sakor. Private investigator Varg Veum (Seim) tries to rescue a frightened girl lost in the woods but fails to prevent her death. Varg and his girlfriend Karin (Nystrom), a social worker, discover that the girl was a victim of a human trafficking ring. They shift their focus to the girl's friend Amina (Sakor), hoping to reveal the ring's operators before more young women are harmed. Winner of 1 award. For ages 15 and older.
