SILVER LININGS PLAYBOOK (2012-US) 122m **** D: David O. Russell (THREE KINGS). Bradley Cooper, Jennifer Lawrence, Robert De Niro, Jacki Weaver, Chris Tucker. Pat (Cooper) and Tiffany (Lawrence), two obsessive, unstable people thrown together by chance in a Philadelphia suburb, try to find a "silver lining" to their crazy lives. Cooper and Lawrence (who won an Oscar) both deliver brilliant performances in this hilarious and surprisingly moving comedy. Winner of 58 awards. Rated R.

AFTER LIFE (1998-Japan) 118 minutes **** D: Hirokazu Kore-eda (I WISH). Arata, Erika Oda, Susumu Terajima, Takashi Naito, Taketoshi Naito. If you had to choose a memory to re-live forever, which one would you choose? In this wonderfully imaginative film, the recently deceased are asked to make this choice at a way station. At this rather institutional-looking place, happy memories are re-enacted and filmed in order to aid souls to pass into eternity. Funny, thought-provoking and compassionate, this unique drama won 8 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE HAPPIEST GIRL IN THE WORLD (2009-Romania/Netherlands/France/Japan) 99m *** D: Radu Jude (feature debut). Andreea Bosneag, Doru Catanescu, Alexandru Georgescu, Diana Gheorghian. In this sharp Romanian satire, teenager Delia (Bosneag) arrives in Bucharest with her parents to collect a prize she won in a contest. All Delia needs to do is smile and say a few words in front of a camera for a commercial, and she will receive a beautiful new car... but things start to go wrong. This absurdist comedy won 3 awards, including one at Berlin. Ages 12 and older.

HAPPY PEOPLE: A YEAR IN THE TAIGA (2010-Ger) 90m *** 1/2 D: Dmitry Vasyukov, Werner Herzog (CAVE OF FORGOTTEN DREAMS). Using transcendently beautiful photography by Russian videographer Dmitry Vasyukov, documentarian Werner Herzog creates an unforgettable portrait of the indigenous people of the village Bakhtia in the Siberian Taiga. Herzog captures the spirit of a people with "no rules, no taxes, no government, no laws, no bureaucracy, no phones, no radio, equipped only with their individual values and standard of conduct". This documentary won at the Tokyo International Film Festival. For ages 12 and older.

SAMURAI SAGA aka *Aru kengo no shogai* (1959-Japan) 111m *** D: Hiroshi Inagaki (CHUSHINGURA). Toshirō Mifune (THE RICKSHAW MAN), Yōko Tsukasa, Akira Takarada, Keiko Awaji, Seizaburō Kawazu. This delightful Japanese adaptation of Edmond Rostand's *Cyrano de Bergerac* has the great Toshirō Mifune playing Heihachiro Komaki, the hero with the outsize nose. Komaki has huge talent as a writer and swordsman, and a great big heart to match his nose, but these things don't seem to impress the love of his life, Lady Ochii (Tsukasa). Will she finally notice Komaki before it's too late? For all ages.

MEMORIES OF A MARRIAGE aka *Dansen med Regitze* (1989-Denmark) 90m *** 1/2 D: Kaspar Rostrup. Frits Helmuth, Mikael Helmuth, Ghita Nørby, Rikke Bendsen, Henning Moritzen. Karl-Aage (played by Frits Helmuth and Mikael Helmuth) and Regitze (played by Nørby and Bendsen) are ordinary Danes who have been married to each other over 50 years. Karl-Aage has always been the quiet one, led through life by his headstrong, energetic wife. He looks back over the years of his marriage during a summer garden party with friends and family. This beautifully acted drama won 11 awards and was nominated for an Oscar. For ages 12 and older.

STARLET (2012-US/UK) 103m *** D: Sean Baker. Dree Hemingway, Besedka Johnson, Boonee. In this tale of cross-generational friendship set in California's San Fernando Valley, friendly but aimless 21-year-old Jane (Hemingway) buys a thermos at elderly Sadie's (Johnson) yard sale. Later, when Jane discovers \$10,000 rolled up in the thermos, she tries to visit ornery Sadie, who slams the door in Jane's face. Thus begins this fascinating tale of mismatched humans and a Chihuahua named Starlet. STARLET won the Robert Altman award at the Independent Spirit Awards and two more awards. For adults 17 and older. *Note: Besedka Johnson, the late blooming, award-winning actress whose only film was STARLET, passed away on 4/4/2013. She was 87.*

UNDERTAKING BETTY (2002-UK/US/Germany) 88m *** D: Nick Hurran. Brenda Blethyn, Alfred Molina, Christopher Walken, Robert Pugh, Naomi Watts, Jerry Springer. Unhappily married to an unfaithful scoundrel in a little Welsh town, Betty (Blethyn) decides to fake her own death so she may be with local undertaker Boris (Molina), the man she really loves. Trouble comes in the form of flamboyant rival undertaker Frank (Walken), who's itching to give Betty a memorable send-off. This riotous black comedy won 2 Welsh BAFTAs. Rated PG-13

A LOVE TO HIDE aka *Un amour à taire* (2005-France) 102m *** 1/2 D: Christian Faure. Jérémie Renier, Louise Monot, Bruno Todeschini, Nicolas Gov, Charlotte de Turckheim. During the Nazi occupation of France, Jean (Renier), despite the risks, is sheltering young Jewish girl Sara (Monot). She's living in the apartment of Jean's lover Philippe (Todeschini), a relationship the men must also keep from being known. When Jean's black-marketeer brother Jacques (Gob) gets suspicious, the secrets of Jean and Philippe's household are in danger of being exposed. This emotionally wrenching drama won 3 awards. For adults 17 and older.

MUNDANE HISTORY aka *Jao nok krajok* (2009-Thailand) 82m *** D: Anocha Suwichakornpong (feature debut). Arkaney Charkam, Paramej Noiarn, Anchana Ponpitkhepkij, Phakpoom Surapongsanuruk. This Buddhist family drama explores the relationship between Ake (Surapongsanuruk), a wealthy young man, and male nurse Pun (Cherkam) who is hired to care for him. Ake has been in a recent accident that has paralyzed him from the waist down. Ake's mental, physical and metaphysical states slowly shift through time from bitterness to acceptance. Winner of 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

BACK TO 1942 (2012-China) 145m *** D: Xiaogang Feng, Adrien Brody, Tim Robbins, Daoming Chen, Fan Xu, Hanyu Zhang, Alec Su. This epic adaptation of Liu Zhenyun's memoir "Remembering 1942" depicts refugees living through famine in China's Henan province intensified by fighting between Japanese and nationalist Chinese forces. Three million people died in this terrible struggle from many causes, none of them dignified. A powerful statement against war and government corruption, this historical drama won 2 awards at the Rome Film Fest. For ages 17 and older.

THE RED AWN (2007-China) 101m *** 1/2 D: Shangjun Cai. Lu Huang, Yulai Lu, Anlian Yao. After five years away at work, Soonghai (Yao) returns home to find that his wife has died and his seventeen-year-old son Yongtao (Yu) has declared him deceased. Soonghai tries to reconcile with his deeply resentful son by traveling the countryside harvesting grain with him. This beautifully photographed story of modern pressures on Chinese rural life won 5 awards from around the world. For ages 12 and older.

NEIGHBORING SOUNDS aka *O som ao redor* (2012-Brazil) 131m **** D: Kleber Mendonça Filho (feature debut). Irma Brown, Sebastião Formiga, Gustavo Jahn, Maeva Jinkings, Dida Maia, W.J. Solha. A string of petty crimes causes a high-rise community in Recife, Pernambuco, Brazil to hire a private security firm, with unexpected results. This strikingly stylish urban thriller is propelled with sharp social observation and innovative sound design. With characters drawn from a rich mix of class, gender and race, director Filho's brilliant first feature won 10 awards. For adults 17 and older.

BALIBO (2009-Australia) 111m *** D: Robert Connolly, Anthony LaPaglia, Oscar Isaac, Damon Gameau, Gyton Grantley, Mark Leonard Winter, Thomas Wright. In November, 1975, Australian foreign correspondent Roger East (LaPaglia) is recruited by 25-year-old foreign minister for the "Democratic Republic of East Timor", José Ramos-Horta (Isaac), to run the East Timor News Agency. East agrees on the condition that he would be allowed to investigate the fate of five Australian journalists who disappeared during the Indonesian invasion 4 weeks earlier. This powerful film about war, journalism and human decency won 13 awards. For ages 15 and older.

SIDE EFFECTS (2013-US) 106m *** 1/2 D: Steven Soderbergh (CONTAGION). Rooney Mara (THE GIRL WITH THE DRAGON TATTOO), Channing Tatum, Jude Law, Catherine Zeta-Jones, Vladimi Versailles, Michelle Vergara Moore. This pacy neo-noir stars an intense Rooney Mara as Emily, a woman plagued with depression. She's given a prescription for a new anti-depressant called Ablixa by psychiatrist Dr. Banks (Law). The medication works well for a while, then suddenly, fiendishly, all hell breaks loose. This smart, well-acted thriller was nominated for a Golden Bear at Berlin. Rated R.

LASKAR PELANGI aka *The Rainbow Troops* (2008-Indonesia) 124m *** D: Riri Riza. Cut Mini Theo, Ikranagara, Tora Sudiro, Slamet Rahardjo, Mathias Muchus. This adaptation of Andrea Hirata's best seller concerns a decrepit primary school on the Sumatran island of Belitung. Teachers Bu Muslimah (Theo) and Pak Farfan (Ikranagara) are on pins and needles because their school will be shut down if they can't sign up 10 students. The impoverished but adorable kids who show up are christened *Laskar Pelangi* by Bu Muslimah. This touching film broke all box office records in Indonesia and won 2 awards. For all ages.

STAND UP GUYS (2012-US) 95m *** D: Fisher Stevens. Al Pacino, Christopher Walken, Alan Arkin, Julianna Margulies, Mark Margolis, Lucy Punch, Addison Timlin. Val (Pacino) is an old hood who has just been released from prison after 28 years. He knows the mob boss has been waiting to kill him all these years, so Val just wants to party till he dies. What Val doesn't realize is that his best friend Doc (Walken) has been hired to do the job. What results is a deliciously atmospheric crime buddy flick with two of the most watchable actors of Hollywood. Nominated for a Golden Globe. Rated R.

EMPIRE OF SILVER aka *Baiyin diguo* (2009-China/Taiwan/Hong Kong) 113m *** D: Christina Yao. Aaron Kwok, Tielin Zhang, Lei Hao, Jennifer Tilly. Based on historical events in China in 1899, this epic details the struggles of a banking family at the dawn of modernity. The patriarch Master Kang (Zhang) hands control of the family business to his third son (Kwok), who has no interest in the family. The Third Master resents his father for stealing the love of his life (Hao) and marrying her. Set against the background of the Boxer Rebellion and the crumbling Ching Dynasty, this sweeping period romance won 9 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE WAITING CITY (2009-Australia) 100m *** D: Claire McCarthy. Radha Mitchell, Joel Edgerton (WARRIOR), Samrat Chakrabarti. An outwardly happy Australian couple arrives in Kolkata, India to collect their adopted baby, but gets bogged down in lengthy paperwork. Lawyer Fiona (Mitchell) and musician Ben (Edgerton) react to the city in very different ways, revealing cracks in the foundation of their marriage. The colorful and mystical city of Kolkata adds an aura of spirituality to this beautifully lensed romantic drama. Winner of 3 awards. Rated R.

OKAY (2002-Denmark) 93m *** D: Jesper W. Nielsen. Paprika Steen (THE CELEBRATION), Troels Lyby, Ole Ernst, Nicolaj Kopernikus, Molly Blixt Egelind. Nete (Steen) is a thirty-something wife and mother who runs her household with brisk efficiency. When she finds out from her father's doctor that her cranky dad (Ernst) has only a few weeks left to live, she arranges for him to move into her home, sparking Nete's husband's (Lyby) and daughter's (Egelind) full rebellion. This engaging comedy-drama won 6 awards. For ages 15 and older.

LORE (2012-Germany/Australia/UK) 109m *** 1/2 D: Cate Shortland. Saskia Rosendahl, Nele Trebs, André Frid, Mika Seidel, Kai-Peter Malina, Nick Holaschke. In the spring of 1945, when the Allied forces sweep Germany and Hitler is defeated, 14-year-old Lore (Rosendahl) feels relieved. Her father, a high-ranking SS official, can now return home to Bavaria. But as soon as he returns, the family packs hastily and flees, hiding out at an isolated farm. Lore ends up in charge of her 4 siblings, while discovering the truth she was sheltered from for years. This powerful Holocaust story about the children of the Third Reich won 13 awards. For ages 15 and older.
