SELMA (2014-UK/US) 128m *** ½ D: Ava DuVernay. David Oyelowo, Carmen Ejogo, Oprah Winfrey, Tom Wilkinson, Giovanni Ribisi. This intelligent and psychologically nuanced portrait of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. focuses on his work leading to the epic voting rights marches from Selma to Montgomery in 1965. This soaring tribute to a great man is powered by a magnificent performance by Oyelowo as Dr. King. SELMA won an Oscar for the stirring anthem Glory. Rated PG-13.

SEA WITHOUT EXIT *Deguchi no nai umi* (2006-Japan) 121m *** ½ D: Kiyoshi Sasabe. Ebizû Ichikawa, Yûsuke Iseya (CASSHERN), Juri Ueno, Tomokazu Miura. This moving end-of-WWII drama portrays men in the Japanese navy's "kaiten" (human torpedo) program, who propel toward enemy ships in miniature submarines laden with TNT. College associate Namiki (Ichikawa), who loves baseball, and Kita (Iseya) who's a runner, end up volunteering for this mission. Dreams for the future and the love of friends and family are set aside as each prepares for the ultimate sacrifice. A well-acted, thoughtful and poetic film. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 13 and older.

BLACK OR WHITE (2014-US) 121m *** D: Mike Binder (REIGN OVER ME). Kevin Costner, Octavia Spencer, Jillian Estell, Anthony Mackie. Grieving the death of his wife, Los Angeles lawyer Elliot (Costner) fights over the custody of his daughter's child Eloise (Estell), whom he has raised from birth. Elliot's estimable opponent is entrepreneur "Grandma Wee Wee" (Spencer), Eloise's paternal grandmother. This thoughtful and unexpectedly humorous drama provides much needed dialogue on issues of race and class. Winner of 1 award. Rated PG-13.

BLACK SEA (2014-UK/US/Russia) 114m *** D: Kevin Macdonald (THE LAST KING OF SCOTLAND). Jude Law, Scoot McNairy, Ben Mendelsohn, David Threlfall, Jodie Whittaker, Grigoriy Dobrygin, Konstantin Khabenskiy. A team of ordinary British and Russian men, who have sacrificed their marriages, health and happiness for their jobs only to be laid off, search the Black Sea for a sunken Nazi submarine full of gold. This intense thriller recalls classics like THE TREASURE OF THE SIERRA MADRE. Rated R.

BOTTOM OF THE SEA *aka El fondo del mar* (2003-Argentina) 92m *** D: Damián Szifron (WILD TALES, ON PROBATION). Daniel Hendler, Gustavo Garzón, Dolores Fonzi, Ramiro Agüero. This quirky psychological thriller concerns Argentinian architecture student Toledo (Hendler), who is terribly possessive of his beautiful girlfriend, Ana (Fonzi). One evening, Toledo discovers a man's shoe under the bed. Unglued with jealousy, Toledo stalks Ana's unsuspecting lover (Garzón) over the course of one very humorous night. Winner of 12 awards. For ages 13 and older.

OWLS' CASTLE *aka Fukurou no shiro* (1999-Japan) 138m *** D: Masahiro Shinoda (MACARTHUR'S CHILDREN). Kiichi Nakai (WHEN THE LAST SWORD IS DRAWN), Mayu Tsuruta, Takaya Kamikawa, Toshiya Nagasawa, Mako. Threatened by their skill as assassins, warlord Oda Nobunaga wipes out a community of ninja in the village of Iga. Ten years later, Tszura Juzo (Nakai), an Iga survivor, is hired to assassinate the man who replaced Oda in the seat of power, Toyotomi Hideyoshi (Mako). This won't be easy, as Hideyoshi's new chief of police Gohei (Kamikawa) is an Iga ninja of legendary prowess. This fascinating 16th century tale of political intrigue and revenge filmed on location in Nara and Osaka. Winner of 3 major awards, including Best Art Direction for Yoshinobu Nishioka. For ages 13 and older.

ON PROBATION *aka Tiempo de valientes* (2005-Argentina) 112m *** ½ D: Damián Szifron (WILD TALES). Diego Peretti, Luis Luque, Óscar Ferreiro, Gabriela Isovich, Mariano Silverstein (Peretti), a high-strung Buenos Aires shrink, is on probation from causing an auto accident. For his community service, he's assigned to ride in a patrol car with hard-boiled cop Alfredo Díaz (Luque), who's depressed over his marriage. This mismatched pair becomes a crime-fighting dynamo in this hilarious action comedy. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 13 and older.

THE GOLDEN DREAM *aka La jaula de oro* (2013-Guatemala/Spain/Mexico) 108m *** ½ D: Diego Quemada-Díez (feature debut). Brandon López, Rodolfo Domínguez, Karen Martínez, Carlos Chajon. Teenagers Juan (López), Sara (Martínez) and Samuel (Chajon) decide to escape the slums of Guatemala by stealing rides on freight trains to the United States. In Chiapas, Mexico they meet Chauk (Domínguez), a Tzotzil Indian boy who joins their group (because Sara likes him). They encounter both exhilarating freedom and frightening cruelty on their journey. Will they all make it? Winner of 32 awards, including 2 at Cannes. For ages 13 and older.

MARIE KRØYER (2012-Denmark/Sweden) 98m *** D: Bille August (THE COLOR OF FREEDOM). Birgitte Hjort Sørensen, Søren Sætter-Lassen, Sverrir Gudnason. By all appearances, famed beauty Marie Krøyer (Sørensen) has the ideal life. She's married to portraitist and seascape artist P.S. Krøyer, who's in demand with the crowned heads of Europe. But despite all the luxury, parties and champagne, all is not well in the Krøyer household. This bleakly beautiful biographical drama set in early 20th century Denmark won an award. For ages 13 years old and older.

ANY QUESTIONS FOR BEN? (2012-Australia) 114m *** D: Rob Sitch (THE DISH). Josh Lawson, Rachael Taylor, Daniel Henshall, Felicity Ward, Christian Clark. Life is effortless for 27-year-old Ben (Lawson). He's a well-paid ad executive, he parties with friends and many girls... there is nothing to tie him down. But when he visits his old school with his fellow alumni to talk about his achievements, Ben's the only one not asked a question by the kids. Ben begins to ponder what his life means. Will Alex (Rachael Taylor), the gorgeous human rights lawyer, provide the answer? This funny rom-com features Melbourne's impressive cityscapes and hip night spots. For ages 15 and older.

LOVE, ROSIE (2014-UK/Germany) 102m *** ½ D: Christian Ditter (FRENCH FOR BEGINNERS). Lily Collins, Sam Claflin, Christian Cooke, Jaime Winstone, Suki Waterhouse. Best friends since they were five years old, Rosie (Collins) and Alex (Claflin) share a deep bond. But somehow, little mistakes and missed opportunities send them in opposite directions. Do we only get one shot at true love? Set in Dublin and Boston, this adaptation of Cecilia Ahern's best seller "Where Rainbows End" is winsome, funny and charming. Rated R.

THE BIRDER (2013-Canada) 85m *** ½ D: Ted Bezaire (feature debut). Tom Cavanagh, Graham Greene, Fred Willard, Jamie Spilchuk, Mark Rendall. Poor Ron (Cavanagh) is passed up for the Head of Ornithology position at the National Park in Ontario, Canada. He's been preparing for years, but this mild-mannered high school teacher isn't "cool" enough to attract young people to bird watching (or so people think!). Ron sets out to get revenge on the winner, Floyd (Spilchuk). This lovingly dorky comedy is a Canadian hit! For ages 13 and older.

HAPPINESS (2013-France/US/Finland) 80m *** ½ D: Thomas Balmès (BABIES). This fascinating documentary explores the last community in Bhutan to receive the "gift" of electricity, television and Internet: the remote village of Laya. Laya has 900 residents, mostly yak herders. Nine-year-old boy Peyangki lives and studies at the serene mountain monastery. When his uncle takes Peyangki to the thriving city of Thimphu to buy a television set, we see electric lights, toilets, cars and other amazing things through his eyes. Winner of 2 awards, one of them a cinematography award at Sundance. For ages 10 and older.

AMERICAN SNIPER (2014-US) 132m *** ½ D: Clint Eastwood (UNFORGIVEN). Bradley Cooper, Sienna Miller, Kyle Gallner. Texan Chris Kyle (Cooper) joins the Navy SEALs and becomes the most lethal sniper in US history. But with each of his four tours of duty in Iraq, a bit of Kyle's psyche is torn. This powerful story based on real events explores the divide between the public and private lives of the military hero. Winner of three Oscars including Best Picture and Best Actor for Cooper's sensitive performance. Rated R,

UNFORGIVEN *aka Yurusarezaru mono* (2013-Japan) 135m *** ½ D: Sang-il Lee (HULA GIRLS). Ken Watanabe (THE LAST SAMURAI), Kôichi Sato (THE MAGIC HOUR), Akira Emoto, Yûya Yagira. On the wild Hokkaido frontier in the 2nd year of the Meiji Era, widowed former samurai Jubei (Watanabe) raises his two children on a farm. When Jubei's friend Kingo (Emoto) asks him to collect a bounty on hoodlums that have injured a prostitute, Jubei hesitates, as he promised his late wife he'll never again draw his sword. But when Jubei encounters corrupt and brutal police chief Ichizo (Sato), all bets are off. This brilliant re-imagining of Clint Eastwood's classic western won 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

BASARA- THE PRINCESS GOH *aka Gô-hime* (1992-Japan) 142m *** ½ D: Hiroshi Teshigahara (WOMAN IN THE DUNES). Rie Miyazawa (TWILIGHT SAMURAI), Tatsuya Nakadai (RAN), Toshiya Nagasawa, Rentarô Mikuni, Kôshirô Matsumoto. This sumptuous and exciting historical drama is set after the death of tea master Sen no Rikyu, who was forced to commit suicide by the powerful warlord Toyotomi Hideyoshi. Chosen to succeed Rikyu, pottery artist Furuta Oribe (Nakadai) is understandably uneasy about his new political appointment. Oribe takes comfort in teaching pottery to Princess Goh (Miyazawa), Hideyoshi's tomboyish adopted daughter. As their world grows turbulent with political intrigue, the two artists defiantly embrace beauty and truth. Winner of 2 awards, including Best Art Direction for Yoshinobu Nishioka. This is famed artist Teshigahara's final film. For ages 13 and older. *Note: The English subtitles convey the dialogue accurately, but with occasional misspellings.*

WUNDERKINDER (2011-Germany) 94m *** ½ D: Markus Rosenmüller. Elin Kolev, Imogen Burrell, Mathilda Adamik, Gudrun Landgrebe. In 1941 Poltava, Ukraine, violinist Abrascha Kaplan (Kolev) and pianist Larissa Brodsky (Burrell) are celebrated child prodigies that play in the best Russian concert halls. Young violinist Hanna (Adamik), daughter of a German brewer, wants more than anything to be taught alongside the Russian "Wunderkinder". When Hanna gets her wish, the three children become close friends. Their friendship endures terrible strain when Hitler invades Russia. This extremely moving drama won 8 awards. For ages 13 and older.

LISCIO *aka The Ball* (2006-Italy) 77m *** D: Claudio Antonini. Laura Morante (THE SON'S ROOM), Umberto Morelli, Antonio Catania, Massimo Ciavarro, Giorgia Brunaccini. Twelve-year-old Raul (Morelli) can't help but notice his mother's (Morante) love life is in a shambles. Raul, thinking she's just been choosing the wrong kind of guy, decides to introduce her (mom's a respected singer) to his handsome music teacher Prof. Medri (Catania). In the process, Raul learns a valuable life lesson. This comedy won 2 awards. For ages 13 and older.

GODDESS (2013-Australia) 104m *** D: Mark Lamprell (MY MOTHER FRANK). Laura Michelle Kelly (SWEE-NEY TODD), Ronan Keating, Magda Szubanski. While her hubby James (Keating) is out at sea saving whales, aspiring singer Elspeth Dickens (Kelly) is stuck at home with twin hellions in a Tasmanian farmhouse. The webcam set up so she may talk to James can't reach him in the middle of the ocean, but her "sink songs" belted from her kitchen are reaching a worldwide audience! Musical theater star Laura Michelle Kelly performs delightful fantasy pieces that hilariously communicate the dreams of a frustrated housewife. Winner of an award. Rated PG.

KATHMANDU LULLABY *aka Katmandú, un espejo en el cielo* (2011-Spain) 104m *** D: Iciar Bollain (EVEN THE RAIN, TAKE MY EYES). Verónica Echegui, Sumyata Bhattarai, Norbu Tsering Gurung. This romantic drama based on a true story concerns Laia (Echegui), an idealistic young Catalan teacher who travels to Kathmandu in the early 1990s to volunteer at a local school. Frustrated by the rote teaching methods, the caste system, bureaucratic obstacles and corruption, she ends up marrying a local man (Gurung) so she may stay and open her own school. Winner of a Gaudi for Echegui's performance. For ages 13 and older. *Note: Multi-award winning writer/director Iciar Bollain is also a leading actress!*
