VENGEANCE FOR SALE *aka Sukedachi-ya Sukeroku* (2001-Japan) 88m *** D: Kihachi Okamoto (KILL!). Hiroyuki Sanada (Toranaga in 2024's *Shogun* series), Kyôka Suzuki, Takehiro Murata, Tatsuya Nakadai, Ittoku Kishibe, Keiju Kobayashi. Jolly young yakuza Sukeroku (Sanada) makes a decent living out of helping people exact formal revenge (*adauchi*). He isn't a swordsman—his sword is rusty from disuse, but he's great at noisily distracting people. Sukeroku returns to his hometown with some cash to buy a nice tombstone for his mother's grave and gets embroiled in a vendetta well beyond his pay grade in this terrific samurai-era comedy. Winner of 3 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE BROKENWOOD MYSTERIES: GOING TO THE DOGS (2023-New Zealand) 97m *** ½ D: Mike Smith. Neill Rea, Fern Sutherland, Jarod Rawiri, Karl Willetts, Michelle Langstone, Roimata Fox. A well-liked veterinary nurse is found dead, tied to a tree with a horse harness. Detectives Mike Shepherd (Rea) and Kristin Sims (Sutherland) find it difficult to discover a motive, until they uncover a feud between twin veterinarians Julianne and Bonnie Seymour (Langstone). As always, Frodo (Willetts) and his coffee cart feature in this tale—with a new friend. For ages 14 and older.

DETECTIVE MONTALBANO: TURNING POINT *aka Il giro di boa* (2005-Italy) 97m *** ½ D: Alberto Sironi. Luca Zingaretti, Cesare Bocci, Peppino Mazzotta, Isabella Söllman. After hearing yet again about corruption in the higher echelons of the police department, detective Montalbano (Zingaretti) has thoughts of quitting, until he is set straight by his deputy Mimi (Bocci). On his daily swim Montalbano runs into a corpse. Thinking it's the body of a drowned illegal immigrant, he investigates further and uncovers a human trafficking ring in this darkly fascinating episode. For ages 14 and older.

SCREAM OF STONE *aka Cerro Torre: Schrei aus Stein* (1991-Germany/France/Canada/Italy/Argentina/UK/South Africa) 102m *** D: Werner Herzog (AGUIRRE, THE WRATH OF GOD). Vittorio Mezzogiorno, Stefan Glowacz, Donald Sutherland, Brad Dourif, Werner Herzog. After experienced mountaineer Roccia (Mezzogiorno) tells champion indoor rock climber Martin (Glowacz) that he wouldn't survive a 'real' climbing expedition, they race each other to be the first to climb Patagonia's glassy and sheer Cerro Torre in this funny and thrilling adventure. The men's private bet becomes a lurid public spectacle in this winner of 3 awards. Original English language version, without subtitles. For ages 12 and older.

FREUD'S LAST SESSION (2023-Ireland/UK/US) 108m *** D: Matt Brown (THE MAN WHO KNEW INFINITY). Anthony Hopkins, Matthew Goode, Liv Lisa Fries, Jeremy Northam. It's September 3, 1939. Nazi Germany had invaded Poland, spurring Britain to declare war. In London, Sigmund Freud (Hopkins), who is suffering from advanced cancer, entertains author C.S. Lewis (Goode) at his home. Air raid sirens blare and Londoners head for the safety of the countryside as the two men debate the existence of God. Though closer to 'meeting his maker', Freud is staunchly atheist. Lewis is a Christian convert, who will go on to write "The Chronicles of Narnia". This fascinating fictional tale was nominated for one award. Rated PG-13.

LUNANA: AYAK IN THE CLASSROOM (2019-Bhutan/China) 110m *** ½ D: Pawo Choyning Dorji. Sherab Dorji, Ugyen Norbu Lhendup, Kelden Lhamo Gurung, Pem Zam. Young teacher Ugyen (Sherab Dorji) is assigned to the most remote school in Bhutan, in a Himalayan village called Lunana. Ugyen, who was planning to go to Australia to be a singer, finds himself cut off from all of his usual Western comforts after an arduous 8-day trek there. Ugyen uses his musical talent and creativity to teach (and learn from) his adorable new students in this heartwarming and thought-provoking Oscar-nominated film. Winner of 20 awards. For ages 10 and older.

WARRIOR OF THE WIND *aka Kaze no bushi* (1964-Japan) 95m *** D: Tai Katô. Hashizô Ôkawa, Hiroko Sakuramachi, Naoko Kubo, Minoru Ôki, Kôji Nanbara, Kô Nishimura. Born the second son of a samurai family, pretty boy Shinzo (Ôkawa) spends all his time either in the dojo or flirting with women. He has his eye on Chino (Sakuramachi), the lovely daughter of Shinzo's fencing master. But in swordplay and in love, he has a rival in Kôriki (Ôki), who also desires Chino. When Shinzo is hired on a mission by the government to find the secret village of Yasurai, his rivalry with Kôriki turns deadly in this first-rate ninja adventure. For ages 10 and older.

AFTER LIFE (2003-Scotland) 101m *** D: Alison Peebles. Lindsay Duncan, Kevin McKidd, Paula Sage, James Laurenson, Shirley Henderson, Fiona Bell. Ambitious young Glasgow journalist Kenny (McKidd) is close to landing a big story when he's called home to help his mother May (Duncan), who has sprained her ankle. Angry at having to care for his sister Roberta (Sage) who has Down Syndrome, Kenny has a change of heart when May makes a life-changing announcement. This honest, heartfelt family drama won 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE GREAT ESCAPER (2023-UK/France/Sweden) 97m *** ½ D: Oliver Parker (SWIMMING WITH MEN). Michael Caine, Glenda Jackson, Wolf Kahler, John Standing, Danielle Vitalis. Legendary British actors Michael Caine and Glenda Jackson star as Royal Navy vet Bernard Jordan and his wife Irene, who cause an uproar at their seaside care home in Hove, UK when Bernie sneaks away on a secret mission to attend the 70th anniversary celebration of the D-Day landings in Normandy. This delightful true story of Bernie's adventure and Irene's part in getting him there is told with great spunk and wit by the leads. For ages 12 and older.

THE VINTNER'S LUCK (2009-New Zealand/France) 126m *** D: Niki Caro (WHALE RIDER). Jérémie Renier, Keisha Castle-Hughes, Vera Farmiga, Gaspard Ulliel, Patrice Valota, François Beukelaers, Vania Vilers. In this lushly sensual fairy tale for adults set in the 1810s in France, peasant Sobran (Renier) grows grapes for the Comte de Vully's (Valota) estate. Sobran can taste his grapes' potential, and despairs when they are turned into indifferent wine by the estate winemaker. One drunken evening, he stumbles into a figure with long white wings (Ulliel) in his vineyard. The angel gives Sobran advice on love and viticulture in this cautionary tale of artistic inspiration. Winner of 3 awards. For ages 16 and older.

DRIVE MY CAR (2021-Japan) 179m **** D: Ryûsuke Hamaguchi (HAPPY HOUR). Hidetoshi Nishijima, Tôko Miura, Reika Kirishima, Masaki Okada, Park Yu-rim, Jin Dae-yeon. Stage actor and director Kafuku (Nishijima) uses time in his beloved car, a red Saab 900, practicing his lines with a cassette that his wife Oto (Kirishima) recorded for him. Still grieving two years after Oto's unexpected death, he's asked to direct a production of Chekhov's Uncle Vanya in Hiroshima—on the condition that he use a chauffeur. This road movie unlike no other delves deeply into its characters—Kafuku the passenger and Misaki (Miura) the driver—to explore the meaning of existence. Winner of the Best International Film Oscar and 95 more awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE PROMISED LAND *aka Bastarden* (2023-Denmark/Sweden/Norway/Germany) 127m *** ½ D: Nikolaj Arcel (A ROYAL AFFAIR). Mads Mikkelsen, Amanda Collin, Simon Bennebjerg, Melina Hagberg. Impoverished soldier Ludvig Kahlen (Mikkelsen) leaves the poorhouse to conquer the untamed wilderness of Jutland on behalf of King Frederick V in this historic epic set in 1755 Denmark. Each day, Ludvig battles the unforgiving heath, but the land isn't his worst adversary. Local judge Frederik de Schinkel (Bennebjerg), a jealous and vengeful man, seeks to destroy Ludvig's dreams in this atmospheric winner of 21 awards. Rated R.

THE CRIME IS MINE *aka Mon crime* (2023-France) 102m *** D: François Ozon (8 WOMEN). Nadia Terezskiewicz, Rebecca Marder, Isabelle Huppert, Fabrice Luchini, Dany Boon. In this chic Parisian screwball comedy set in 1934, penniless starlet Madeline (Terezskiewicz) narrowly escapes being raped by lascivious theater producer Montferand and then gets accused of killing him when the police find a revolver on her dresser. Though the ludicrously self-important magistrate (Luchini) is convinced of Madeline's guilt, Madeline and her lawyer roommate Pauline (Marder) turn the tables on all of Paris in this delightful romp. For ages 12 and older.

DETECTIVE MONTALBANO: EQUAL TIME *aka Par condicio* (2005-Italy) 96m *** ½ D: Alberto Sironi. Luca Zingaretti, Cesare Bocci, Angelo Russo, Peppino Mazzotta, Carmelinda Gentile, Francesco Sineri. A young woman on a moped is pursued by two men and successfully escapes, but then is reported as missing. Meanwhile, a man is found dead in an abandoned quarry, in what looks like a Mafia hit. After 10 years of peace, why would two feuding Mafia families set off a war? In this intricate mystery, goofy agent Catarella (Russo) proves central to the solving of this case. Filmed in Custonaci in western Sicily, this episode is especially picturesque. For ages 14 and older.

SILENTIUM (2004-Austria) 112m *** ½ D: Wolfgang Murnberger (THE BONE MAN). Josef Hader (THE BONE MAN), Simon Schwarz, Joachim Król, Maria Köstlinger, Rosie Alvarez. Scruffy Vienna gumshoe Brenner (Hader) is hired by Konstanze Dornhelm (Köstlinger), the widow of a man who fell from one of Salzburg's most picturesque landmarks. Though all the authorities say that Herr Dornhelm killed himself, Brenner and Konstanze know that Dornhelm accused a Catholic bishop of molesting him as a child and are convinced the Austrian clergy are guilty of foul play in this very funny, very dark black comedy. Winner of 1 award. For ages 15 and older.

ONE LIFE (2023-UK) 100m *** ½ D: James Hawes (Slow Horses). Anthony Hopkins, Lena Olin, Johnny Flynn, Helena Bonham Carter, Romola Garai. In this riveting true story, young London broker Nicholas Winton (Flynn) visits Prague in 1938 and finds Jewish families who fled Nazis in Germany and Austria living in desperate conditions. Realizing the children are under dire threat, he forms a team to rescue as many children as he can before the borders close and the Nazis invade. In 1988, though he had successfully saved 669 children, Winton (Hopkins) is still haunted by those he didn't save—until a BBC television show introduces him to some of the children (now adults) he rescued. This powerfully moving biopic won 3 awards. Rated PG.

THE TASTE OF THINGS *aka La passion de Dodin Bouffant* (2023-France/Belgium) 135m ***½ D: Anh Hung Tran (NORWEGIAN WOOD). Juliette Binoche, Benoît Magimel. This gorgeous culinary romance set in 19th century France follows the 20 plus year relationship of famous food writer Dodin Bouffant (Magimel) and his cook Eugénie (Binoche). Though they create dishes that dazzle the greatest of chefs, they cherish their artistic collaboration even more than they reverse their art. But as with all exquisite things, it can't last forever. Loosely based on the life of Jean Anthelme Brillat-Savarin, this cinematic feast won 7 awards. Rated PG-13.
