SUMMER HOURS aka L'heure d'été (2008-France) 103m *** D: Olivier Assayas. Juliette Binoche (winner, Cannes 2010), Charles Berling, Jérémie Renier, Edith Scob. When a person dies, what happens to the treasured artifacts and relationships gathered over a lifetime? This thoughtful drama addresses the poignant dismantling of a family's estate in the French countryside. Seventy five-year-old Helene (Scob) has carefully preserved the home of her uncle, a well-known painter. In it there are a number of valuable items. When Helene's children gather after her death—Frederic (Berling), the only child still living in France, Adrienne (Binoche) from New York and Jeremie (Renier) from Hong Kong—they discuss their mother's life and legacy. Winner of six international film awards. Suitable for ages 12 and older.

BRIDE FLIGHT (2008-Netherlands/Luxembourg) 130m *** D: Ben Sombogaart. Karina Smulders, Waldemar Torenstra, Anna Drijver, Elise Schaap, Rutger Hauer. Handsome adventurer Frank (Torenstra) and three very different women meet on the legendary KLM flight that won the London-Christchurch Air Race in 1953. On this "Bride Flight", so named because it carried ladies joining their fiancés in New Zealand, were outgoing fashion designer Esther (Drijver), shy farm girl Ada (Smulders) and staid Marjorie (Schaap). The women meet again in their 70s at the funeral of successful vintner Frank (Hauer) and secrets hidden over five decades are revealed. This memorable and beautifully shot romantic drama won a Golden Calf at the Nederlands Film Festival. Suitable for ages 17 and older.

HACHI: A DOG'S TALE (2009-US/UK) 93m *** ½ D: Lasse Hallström. Richard Gere, Joan Allen, Jason Alexander. At the large, busy Shibuya Station in Tokyo, you'll see one exit has more young lovers waiting for their dates than any other. It's the exit that features a statue of Hachiko, the Akita dog who symbolizes undying loyalty. This is Hachiko's story, transported from Tokyo to Rhode Island. IMDb users rated this film an astounding 8.0! Bring handkerchiefs. Rated G.

HOT ENOUGH FOR JUNE (1964-UK) 96m *** D: Ralph Thomas. Dirk Bogarde, Sylva Koscina, Robert Morley, Leo McKern, John Le Mesurier. One of the earliest and best Bond spoofs, this colorful comedy has failed writer Bogarde drafted by the British Secret Service for a dangerous mission in Soviet-occupied Czechoslovakia. There, the reluctant spy is seduced, pursued and utterly confused. Bogarde, terrific in this humorous role, is combined with gorgeous Koscina, and witty Morley, Le Mesurier and McKern. Based on the novel *Night of Wenceslas* by Lionel Davidson (*The Rose of Tibet*). Rated PG.

THE RED BARON aka Der rote Baron (2008-Germany/UK) 106m *** D: Nikolai Müllerschön. Matthias Schweighöfer, Maxim Mehmet, Lena Headey, Til Schweiger, Joseph Fiennes. Baron Manfred von Richtofen (Schweighöfer) was a legendary WWI fighter pilot who notched up 80 kills before being gunned down at age 25 in 1918. This biopic gives us a glimpse into his world, where aerial battle has a courtly code of honor, and war is considered a gentleman's sport. The electric Til Schweiger (INGLOURIOUS BASTERDS) co-stars as German ace Werner Voss and Joseph Fiennes is RAF rival Capt. Roy Brown in this well-produced, well-acted high flying adventure. Rated PG-13.

THE MESSENGER (2009) 113m **** D: Oren Moverman. Ben Foster, Woody Harrelson, Samantha Morton, Steve Buscemi, Jena Malone, Eamonn Walker. Wounded in Iraq, Army Staff Sergeant Will Montgomery (Foster) is spending the few months left in his tour of duty informing families of the death of their loved ones. Sqt. Montgomery is part of a casualty notification team, paired with stoic Captain Tony Stone (Harrelson) who's an old hand at the job. Even though he's been told he can't afford to care about those to whom he brings such bad news, Will is drawn to the young widow (Morton) of a recently fallen soldier. This empathetic and deeply human war drama/romance won eight international film awards, including two at Berlin, and was nominated for two Oscars, one for Harrelson and one for the screenplay. Rated R.

SHUTTER ISLAND (2010) 138m *** D: Martin Scorsese. Leonardo DiCaprio, Mark Ruffalo, Ben Kingsley, Max von Sydow, Michelle Williams, Emily Mortimer. Shutter Island is remote and craggy—a Civil War era fort there has been converted to an asylum for the criminally insane. It is 1954, and two US marshals Teddy (DiCaprio) and Chuck (Ruffalo) travel by boat under gloomy dark skies to the island to investigate the disappearance of a child murderer (Mortimer) who vanished from her cell while under 24 hour surveillance. This highly atmospheric *Val Lewton*-esque film noir slowly builds a sense of dread; then ratchets up the tension to unbearable heights. Rated R.

DANGEROUS CROSSING (1953) **75m** *** D: Joseph M. Newman. Jeanne Crain, Michael Rennie, Max Showalter, Carl Betz, Mary Anderson. Happy new bride Ruth (Crain) is delighted to set sail on the SS Monrovia for a transatlantic honeymoon with her charming new husband John (Betz). But when John suddenly vanishes, Ruth discovers that no one on the ship has any record of his existence. Terrified and confused, Ruth turns to the ship's physician Dr. Paul Manning (Rennie) for help. This fast-paced film noir, based on John Dickson Carr's radio play *Cabin B-13*, is highly recommended. For all ages. **Shown with:**

FOLLOW ME QUIETLY (1949) 60m *** D: Richard Fleischer (THE NARROW MARGIN). William Lundigan, Dorothy Patrick Jeff Corey. A killer who calls himself "Judge" is terrorizing the city. He strikes when it rains and strangles his victims from behind. Homicide detective Lt. Harry Grant (Lundigan) has many clues but no suspects, and has to deal with an attractive but troublesome lady reporter. This taut little thriller was scripted by film noir icon Anthony Mann (T-MEN).

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' (2007-Romania) 155m *** D: Cristian Nemescu. Armand Assante, Jamie Elman, Razvan Vasilescu, Ion Sapdaru, Maria Dinulescu. Talented writer-director Cristian Nemescu was killed in a Bucharest road accident in 2006 just before his debut feature was finished. Set in the summer of 1999, this complex and dark comedy concerns a NATO train escorted by a platoon of American marines led by Capt. Jones (Assante) which gets stopped in remote Capalnita by station manager Doiaru (Vasilescu). The Americans are trying to rush a radar system to the border with Serbia, but Doiaru and the mayor of the town (Sapdaru) have personal reasons to detain their reluctant guests. Armand Assante gives a career best performance. Winner of Un Certain Regard at Cannes and 8 other international film awards. Unrated.

OWL AND THE SPARROW (2007-Vietnam/US) 97m *** ½ D: Stephane Gauger. Cat Ly, The Lu Le, Han Thi Pham, Nguyen Hau, Teresa Michelle Lee, Hoang Long. Ten-year-old orphan Thuy (Pham) has run away from her stern uncle's (Han) factory to Saigon, where she tries to make a living selling flowers. There she befriends lovely flight attendant Lan (Ly), who is unhappily in love, and Hai (Le), a zookeeper whose beloved baby elephant is being sold off by the boss. If she matchmakes the two, will it be the makings of a family? This sweet story set in modern-day Saigon won seven international awards, including a Netpac Award from HIFF. Rated PG.

STONE OF DESTINY (2008-Canada/UK) 96m *** D: Charles Martin Smith. Charlie Cox, Kate Mara, Billy Boyd, Robert Carlyle (THE FULL MONTY), Ciaron Kelly. The Stone of Scone traditionally confirmed the mandate of whoever sat on it as the ruler of Scotland, but since 1296, it was installed under the Coronation Chair in Westminster Abbey, London. In 1950, an idealistic young Scottish university student, Ian Hamilton (Cox) decided to recruit a few strangers to do the impossible: return the stone to Glasgow. This engaging heist comedy won 3 international film awards and was nominated for a BAFTA Scotland Award. Rated PG.

COSAS INSIGNIFICANTES aka Insignificant Things (2008-Mexico/Spain) 98m *** ½ D: Andrea Martinez. Paulina Gaitan, Carmelo Gómez, Bianca Guerra, Lucia Jiménez, Fernando Luján. Pretty teenager Esmeralda (Gaitan) collects objects that people lose or leave behind. She arranges them in a special box under her bed. This insightful and absorbing drama tells the stories of three items in her box; each formerly held by a person who can't seem to connect to a loved one...yet the items' owners are all somehow linked. Set in present-day urban Mexico, this film explores the values of people isolated by modern life. Winner of an audience award at the Biarritz International Festival of Latin American Cinema. Guillermo del Toro was executive producer. Unrated.

BLISS aka Mutluluk (2007-Turkey/Greece) 105m **** D: Abdullah Oguz. Özgü Namal, Talat Bulut, Murat Han, Mustafa Avkiran, Emin Gursoy. In a small Turkish village, a young woman named Meryem (Namal), a sheepherder's daughter, is sexually assaulted. According to the traditions of her people, she is sentenced to die so that the stain on her family's honor would be removed. This scenario doesn't take place in the past—it happens in present day Turkey. A young man named Cemal (Han) is chosen to execute her, a task for which, initially, he has no stomach. The two go on the run, and as the ties that bind them to rural traditions are loosened, their beliefs are put to the test. This gorgeously shot, brilliant adaptation of Zülfü Livaneli's novel won 11 international film awards. Suitable for ages 13 and older.

THE MAID aka La nana (2009-Chile/Mexico) 94m **** D: Sebastián Silva. Catalina Saavedra, Claudia Celedón, Alejandro Goic, Andrea Garcia-Huidobro, Mariana Loyola. For 23 years, Raquel (Saavedra) has served a wealthy Chilean family, and over that time, her role as maid to that family has become her sole existence. But now at 41 she's suffering from migraines and fainting spells. When the lady of the house hires a second maid to help lighten her load, Raquel takes it as a threat to her livelihood and fights back. This insightful black comedy that defies stereotype and expectation won 24 international film awards, 11 of them won by the amazing actress Saavedra; and was nominated for a Golden Globe for Best Foreign Language Film. For ages 15 and older.

THE GOOD GUY (2009) 90m *** D: Julio DePietro. Alexis Bledel, Bryan Greenberg, Scott Porter, Anna Chlumsky, Andrew McCarthy, Aaron Yoo. Set in the time shortly before the worldwide financial meltdown, this Wall Street comedy-romance concerns bookish Daniel (Greenberg), who doesn't fit in with the wolf pack of fellow stock traders at his firm. But when alpha-male Tommy (Porter) decides to give Daniel a crash course in hard-ball deal making and picking up women, it's the student who gives the teacher a lesson. Ebert gave this entertaining riff on Ford Madox Ford's novel *The Good Soldier* three stars. Rated R.

REMEMBER ME (2010) 113m *** D: Allen Coulter. Emilie de Ravin, Robert Pattinson, Chris Cooper, Lena Olin, Pierce Brosnan, Tate Ellington, Caitlyn Rund. Two lovers, tormented by memories of the death of loved ones, try to find comfort and hope for the future in each other's arms. College student Tyler (Pattinson), whose parents have split after his brother's suicide, sullenly slouches through life and drinks too much. Ally (de Ravin) witnessed the senseless murder of her mother when she was young. Can the two find happiness together? Roger Ebert gave this film 3 stars, the users at his website gave it 3 1/2. Rated PG-13.
