MY WAY aka Mai wei (2011-South Korea) 137m *** D: Jekyu Kang, Dong-gun Jang, Jô Odagiri, Bingbing Fan. In this war epic inspired by a true story, Jun-shik (Jang) is in a ferocious rivalry with fellow marathon runner Tatsuo (Odagiri). Their stations in life could not be more different: Jun-shik works on the farm of Tatsuo's grandfather in Japanese-occupied Korea. When World War II breaks out, both young men are drawn into the Japanese army following very different paths. This film paints a vast canvas with scenes from Seoul, the Mongolian desert, the frozen Russian steppes and the beaches of Normandy on D-Day! This visually stunning and exciting drama was nominated for an award. Rated R.

CHOSIN (2010-US) 86m *** D: Brian Iglesias. In the winter of 1950, 15,000 US Army and Marine troops were surrounded by an overwhelming force of communist Chinese soldiers in the mountains of North Korea. Facing impossible odds, the American men fought 78 miles to freedom and saved the lives of 98,000 civilian refugees. This important documentary chronicles the Chosin River Campaign through the first-hand accounts of the survivors known as "The Chosin Few". Director Brian Iglesias, a former Marine combat veteran, uses historic black and white and color footage to create a powerful, emotionally charged cinematic experience. For ages 15 and older. VERY SPECIAL EVENT ON THURSDAY, JUNE 6: Movie Museum regular Retired Marine Colonel Jack Luckett will introduce CHOSIN at the 6:30pm show and relate his amazing Korean War experience as one of the honored "Chosin Few".

CRYING OUT LOVE IN THE CENTER OF THE WORLD aka Sekai no chûshin de, ai o sakebu (2004-Japan) 138m ****
½ D: Isao Yukisada. Takao Osawa, Ko Shibasaki, Masami Nagasawa, Mirai Moriyama, Tsutomu Yamazaki. While in high school on Shikoku Island, Japan, Sakutaro (Osawa) fell in love with beautiful, bright and athletic Aki (Nagasawa), a girl he thought was out of his league. They exchanged secrets and intimate thoughts by audio tape. Seventeen years later, when Sakutaro is about to marry Ritsuko (Shibasaki), he rediscovers the audio tapes, triggering bittersweet memories. This romantic weepie has become an iconic example of the Japanese "jun ai" or pure love movie, winning 10 awards and an international following. For ages 12 and older.

WARM BODIES (2013-US) 98m *** D: Jonathan Levine (50/50). Nicholas Hoult, Teresa Palmer, Analeigh Tipton, Rob Corddry, Dave Franco, John Malkovich. Wouldn't ya know it, zombies have feelings. R (Hoult), who doesn't know the rest of his name (he's dead, remember), protects live girl Julie (Palmer) from other zombies in a fit of humanity. Julie takes a look at R's still cute face (he's not too ripe, anyhow) and she feels something for him as well. This funny, inventive and gleefully gory romantic comedy was nominated for 2 awards. Rated PG-13.

MENTAL (2012-US/Australia) 116m *** D: P.J. Hogan (MURIEL'S WEDDING). Liev Schreiber, Toni Collette, Anthony LaPaglia, Caroline Goodall, Kerry Fox, Deborah Mailman, Rebecca Gibney. In this sublimely demented version of THE SOUND OF MUSIC set in a small Australian town, hitchhiker Shaz (Collette) is hired as nanny to the five young daughters of a lying, cheating local politician (Lapaglia). The matriarch of the Moochmores had suffered a nervous breakdown, but Shaz's methods are really crazy (but effective) when she takes over the household. This hilarious suburban black comedy won a Film Critics' Circle of Australia Award. For ages 15 and older.

MOSQUITA Y MARI (2012-US) 85m *** D: Aurora Guerrero (directorial debut). Fenessa Pineda, Venecia Troncoso, Joaquín Garrido, Laura Patalano. The fluctuating dynamics of a friendship between two 15-year-old girls is the subject of this fresh and charming indie set in Los Angeles's Huntington Park. Tough Mari (Troncoso) is paired up with straight-A student Yolanda (Pineda) as study partners at high school. Though Mari calls bookish Yolanda "Mosquita", a little something more than friendship is in the air. Nominated for 2 Independent Spirit Awards. Not Rated.

SILENT WEDDING aka Nunta muta (2008-Romania/Luxembourg/France) 90m *** ½ D: Horatiu Malaele (directorial debut). Meda Andreea Victor, Alexandru Potocean, Valentin Teodosiu, Alexandru Bindea, Ioana Anastasia Anton. Mara (Victor) and Iancu (Potocean) are about to get married in 1953 Romania. Their wedding is in full swing when the mayor of the village announces the death of Stalin. One week of national mourning must take place, effective immediately. The wedding and the reception are forbidden. Despite the risks, the happy couple and their community of family and friends decide to go on with the celebrations with a daring plan... This hilarious comedy-drama won 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

A LATE QUARTET (2012-US) 105m *** D: Yaron Zilberman. Catherine Keener, Christopher Walken, Philip Seymour Hoffman, Mark Ivanir, Imogen Poots, Madhur Jaffrey. After 25 years of success, a classical string quartet faces disaster when cellist Peter (Walken) announces he must retire because of Parkinson's disease. This bombshell reveals hidden issues long suppressed by the other members as they seek a solution. The quartet is preparing for a concert of Beethoven's String Quartet No. 14, Op. 131, a demanding piece comprised of seven movements played non-stop. While playing Opus 131, the musicians cannot stop to tune their instruments and must continually adjust: a metaphor for the four artists striving to sing with one unified voice. Rated R.

THE GIANTS aka Les géants (2011-Belgium) 84m *** D: Bouli Lanners. Paul Bartel, Zacharie Chasseriaud, Karim Leklou, Martin Nissen, Didier Toupy. Abandoned by their mother at their deceased grandfather's house in rural Belgium, teenage Seth (Nissen) and his younger brother Zak (Chasseriaud) are running out of money. They decide to rent the house to local drug dealer Boeuf (Toupy) and his henchman Angel (Leklou). Angel's younger brother Dany, who at 15 years old is the same age as Seth, is eager to tag along with him to escape volatile Angel. The three take charge of their destiny, riding Huck Finn-style down the river. This thoughtful teen drama, which won 3 awards (2 of them at Cannes), features excellent performances. For ages 15 and older.

THREE MEN AND A LEG aka Tre uomini e una gamba (1997-Italy) 100m *** Directed by and starring: Aldo Baglio, Giovanni Storti, Giacomo Poretti. Also with: Marina Massironi, Carlo Croccolo, Luciana Littizzetto. This hilarious road comedy concerns three petty criminals, Aldo, Giovanni and Giacomo, who travel from Milan to Gallipoli to deliver a priceless sculpture (which looks like a hideous wooden leg) to their boss. Boss Cecconi (Croccolo) will also be father-in-law to all three of them when Giacomo weds Cecconi's last unmarried daughter, who is waiting anxiously for her groom at the villa... or at least that's the plan. This delightful comedy (which parodies Italian cinema) won 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

DRØMMEN aka We Shall Overcome (2006-Denmark) 109m **** ½ D: Niels Arden Oplev. Bent Mejding, Anders W. Berthelsen, Janus Dissing Rathke, Jens Jørn Spottag. This uplifting family drama set in a small Danish town in 1969 centers on 13-year-old Frits (Rathke). Inspired by the speeches of Martin Luther King, Frits stands up to the ultra-conservative, tyrannical headmaster (Mejding) of the local middle school. When the community rallies behind his nemesis, Frits discovers that defending one's rights isn't easy. Fortunately, music teacher Freddie Svale (Bethelsen) encourages Frits's interest in free thinking. Winner of 17 awards. For ages 12 and older.

JACK THE GIANT SLAYER (2013-US) 114m *** D: Bryan Singer (THE USUAL SUSPECTS). Nicholas Hoult (WARM BODIES), Eleanor Tomlinson, Ewan McGregor, Stanley Tucci, Eddie Marsan, Ewen Bremner. Ian McShane. This dazzling re-imagining of the Jack and the Beanstalk fairy tale has Jack (Hoult) as a handsome and noble but poor young man who rescues feisty Princess Isabelle (Tomlinson) while at the market. He and she end up on the magical beanstalk that leads to the mythical land of giants—to spark a battle the kingdom of Cloister will never forget. This giant adventure won an award. Rated PG-13.

BE WITH YOU aka Ima, ai ni yukimasu (2004-Japan) 119m *** D: Nobuhiro Doi, Yûko Takeuchi, Shidô Nakamura, Akashi Takei, Mikako Ichikawa. Before 28-year-old Mio (Takeuchi) died, leaving husband Takumi (Nakamura) and 6-year-old son Yuji (Takei) to fend for themselves, she made a picture book for Yuji that promises she would return the next rainy season. When a dazed Mio appears mysteriously during a downpour, Takumi and Yuji are thrilled but bewildered, as Mio has no recollection of her husband and son. This romantic weepie was an enormous box office hit in Japan, and won an award. For ages 12 and older.

QUARTET (2012-UK) 98m *** D: Dustin Hoffman (directorial debut). Maggie Smith, Tom Courtenay, Billy Connolly, Pauline Collins, Michael Gambon, Gwyneth Jones. Sparkling with elegance and wit, this charming comedy of ego and old age takes place in a home for retired musicians. Former opera singers Cissy (Collins), Wilfred (Connolly) and Reggie (Courtenay) perform in a concert each year on October 10 to celebrate Verdi's birthday. When former diva (and Reggie's ex-wife) Jean (Smith) arrives, their snug little world is upended. Winner of three awards and nominated for a Golden Globe. Rated PG-13.

THE BRASS TEAPOT (2012-US) 101m *** D: Ramaa Mosley. Juno Temple, Michael Angarano, Alexis Bledel, Billy Magnussen, Alia Shawkat, Steve Park. A young newlywed small-town couple, John (Angarano) and Alice (Temple), are struggling to make ends meet in this black comedy set in the current Great Recession. A fender-bender near an antique store brings Alice into a fateful encounter with an ornate brass teapot with magical powers. Instead of a genie, what pops out of it is wads of cash. But instead of rubbing it, in order to get the payoff, someone needs to get hurt. Soon John and Alice are bashing each other and picking fights in bars for profit. Others also want the evil little pot, and mayhem ensues. Nominated for 2 awards. Rated R.

RETREAT, HELL! (1952-US) 95m *** D: Joseph H. Lewis (GUN CRAZY). Frank Lovejoy, Richard Carlson, Russ Tamblyn, Nedrick Young. Out of the Marines for 5 years, WWII war vet Capt. Paul Hansen (Carlson), a married man with children, is recalled to active duty. In Camp Pendleton he's given command of a company by no-nonsense battalion leader Lt. Col. Corbett (Lovejoy). Corbett pushes Hansen hard because he's afraid the family man would play it too safe. Tough Sgt. Novak (Young) whips the recruits into shape, including young Jimmy (Tamblyn), who wants to make his family of marines proud. The battalion lands in Inchon and in 1950, valiantly fights their way toward the Changjin (Chosin) Reservoir. This flag-raising rouser is an ode to heroism under fire. Rated G. VERY SPECIAL EVENT ON SUNDAY, JUNE 23: Movie Museum regular Ret. Marine Col. Jack Luckett will introduce RETREAT, HELL! at the 6:00pm show and relate his amazing Korean War experience as one of the honored "Chosin Few". Happy Birthday, Jack and Eulalia!

ANTHONY ZIMMER (2005-France) 89m *** D: Jérôme Salle. Sophie Marceau (FEMALE AGENTS), Yvan Attal (BON VOYAGE), Sami Frey, Gilles Lellouche, Daniel Olbrychski. Money launderer Anthony Zimmer is on the run in Nice, and the international police and the Russian Mafia both want to nab him. As Zimmer has had extensive plastic surgery, no one knows what he looks like. All eyes are on his lover Chiara (a volcanically hot Sophie Marceau), who sets up innocent tourist François (Attal) as a decoy for Zimmer's pursuers. This actioner, which was nominated for a César, is superior to its Hollywood remake, THE TOURIST. For ages 12 and older.

INTO THE WHITE aka Cross of Honor (2012-Norway/ Sweden) 100m *** D: Petter Næss (ELLING). Florian Lukas, David Kross, Stig Henrik Hoff, Lachlan Nieboer, Rupert Grint (HARRY POTTER). In 1940 a Nazi bomber piloted by Lt. Schopis (Lukas) crash lands in the snowy Norwegian mountains after shooting down a British plane. The three Germans, Schopis, Sgt. Strunk (Hoff) and junior officer Schwartz (Kross), seek shelter in an abandoned cabin. When British Capt. Davenport (Nieboer) and Gunner Smith (Grint) seek shelter in the same cabin, the Nazis take them captive. But while trying to survive the wintry wilderness, prejudices shift as an improbable friendship begins to form. This fascinating story based on true events was nominated for an Amanda. Rated R.

BORSALINO (1970-France/Italy) 125m *** D: Jacques Deray. Jean-Claude Belmondo, Alain Delon, Catherine Rouvel, Françoise Christophe. This classic French gangster flick (not to be confused with BORSALINO & CO) oozes period atmosphere. Screen icons Delon and Belmondo respectively play Roch Siffredi and François Capella, small time crooks who work their way up to the top of the 1930s Marseilles underworld. This original French language version with English subtitles is a Hawaii premiere! Note: The natty fedoras worn by the stars are still made by the Borsalino hat company. Nominated for a Golden Globe. Rated R.

AS LUCK WOULD HAVE IT aka La chispa de la vida (2011-Spain/France/US) 98m *** D: Álex de la Iglesia (LA COMUNIDAD). José Mota, Salma Hayek, Blanca Portillo, Juan Luis Galiardo, Fernando Tejero, Santiago Segura (TORRENTE). This Cartagena, Spain-set black comedy has jobless advertising man Roberto (Mota) happening upon a press junket celebrating the opening of a restored Roman amphitheater. Roberto trips and falls onto a reinforcing rod, which immobilizes him. His accident gets the immediate attention of the assembled press, and Roberto seizes the opportunity to sell his story to the highest bidder. This ACE IN THE HOLE update was nominated for 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.
