HATTIE (2011-UK) 85m *** D: Dan Zeff. Ruth Jones, Robert Bathurst, Aidan Turner (Poldark). A favorite character on the CARRY ON movie series, popular comedic actress Hattie Jacques (Jones) seemed (to the British public) blissfully married to John Le Mesurier (Bathurst). The truth was much spicier. Hattie's turbulent love life is chronicled in this biopic set in the 1960s. Nominated for 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

EL REINO aka The Candidate (2018-Spain/France) 131m *** ½ D: Rodrigo Sorogoyen. Antonio de la Torre, Mónica López, Josep Maria Pou, Bárbara Lennie, Nacho Fresneda. In this political thriller set in 2007 Spain, up-and-coming politician Manuel (de la Torre) is living high off the hog with other members of the ruling party, siphoning funds from foreign aid and crooked contracts. When a tape is leaked incriminating Manuel for money laundering, he must outmaneuver the law, the press and his own party to survive. Winner of 32 awards. For ages 15 and older.

ALI (2012-Spain) 87m *** D: Paco R. Baños. Nadia de Santiago, Verónica Forqué, Adrián Lamana, Lluís Marco, Julián Villagrán. Spanish 18-year-old Ali is afraid to drive. She is afraid to fall in love, especially with her cute co-worker, Julio (Lamana). But most of all, she's afraid to leave her mercurial mother Alicia's (Forqué) side. Saddled for years with caring for her mentally unstable mom, Ali is caught in an unfamiliar situation when Alicia meets charming dancer Antonio (Marco) and falls in love. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 15 and older.

NYNNE (2005-Denmark) 92m *** D: Jonas Elmer. Mille Dinesen, Lars Kaalund, Claes Bang, Ole Lemmeke, Jimmy Jørgensen. When 30-something journalist Nynne (Dinesen) is dumped by her boyfriend Henrik (Bang) (she was so convinced he was going to propose!) she launches herself back into the humiliating singles market, with hilarious results. Luckily, she knows how to self-medicate with chic gourmet treats, designer clothes, and therapeutic benders with her friend Martin (Kaalund). This romantic comedy was nominated for 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

MINARI (2020-US) 115m **** D: Lee Isaac Chung. Steven Yeun, Yuh-jung Youn, Yeri Han, Alan S. Kim, Noel Cho, Will Patton. In this touching story set in the 1980s, a Korean American family moves to rural Arkansas to grow Korean fruits and vegetables. Their lives are seen through the eyes of 6-year-old David (Kim), who isn't sure what to make of his grandmother Soonja (Youn) who's come to live with them. She smells like Korea and doesn't bake cookies as grandmothers should. Winner of 108 awards, including the Best Supporting Actress Oscar for Yuh-jung Youn. Rated PG-13.

COME ON, HAPPINESS aka Shiawase Kamon (2012-Japan) 118m *** D: Daisuke Nakamura (debut). Yûma Ishigaki, Sawa Suzuki, Masayuki Imai, Masaki Miura. In this touching adaptation of singer-songwriter Tetsuya Matsumoto's autobiography, young Tetsuya (Ishigaki) navigates his difficult relationship with his troubled mother (Suzuki) and his Yakuza father (Imai) in 1970s Iwate Prefecture. In addition to performing the music, Matsumoto composed the score and theme song of this memorable film. For ages 15 and older.

THE SIXTH OF JUNE AT DAWN aka Le 6 juin à l'aube (1946-France) 54m *** ½ D: Jean Grémillon (PATTES BLANCHES). Having just taken part in the liberation of Paris in August 1944, filmmaker Jean Grémillon departs with his cameraman to his native Normandy to record the aftermath of the Allied landings and the Battle of Normandy. This eye-opening short documentary is the result: a striking portrayal of the devastation of a once peaceful land and its people. This rarely seen short contains footage not found in heritage institutions such as the Bayeux D-Day Museum or the Caen Memorial. For ages 10 and older.

BLIND LOVES aka Slepé lásky (2008-Slovakia) 74m *** ½ D: Juraj Lehotsky. In this imaginative and lyrical documentary, four love stories of blind people present a different way of experiencing life. Peter plays the piano and teaches music; Marko is a Gypsy in love with partially sighted Monika, a non-Gypsy; Elena is a housewife soon to give birth; and Zuzana is a pretty teenager who wonders if her online beau will mind that she's blind. The subjects go about their daily lives, experiencing beauty and sharing dreams. Winner of 12 awards. For ages 12 and older.

ITALIAN RACE aka Veloce come il vento (2016-Italy) 118m *** ½ D: Matteo Rovere. Stefano Accorsi, Matilda De Angelis. When her father suddenly dies, 17-year-old Italian GT racer Giulia (De Angelis) is left with no money for the mortgage or the care of her little brother. Her mother left years ago. Determined to win her next race so she could keep a roof over their heads, Giulia is forced to get help from her older brother Loris (Accorsi), a former champ, and current drug addict. This high velocity family drama won 12 awards. For ages 15 and older.

NERO WOLFE: THE GOLDEN SPIDERS (2000-US) 93m *** ½ D: Bill Duke. Maury Chaykin, Timothy Hutton, Bill Smitrovich, Mimi Kuzyk, Colin Fox. In this masterful adaptation of Rex Stout's mystery, a street kid interrupts reclusive New York City sleuth Nero Wolfe's (Chaykin) dinner with an eyewitness account of a kidnapping. The next day, Wolfe finds out that the boy has been run over by the same car the boy described in his account of the kidnapping. Compelled to find the child's killer, Wolfe sends his streetwise assistant Archie Goodwin (Hutton) to comb Manhattan for clues. For ages 12 and older.

THE FLOATING CASTLE aka Nobô no shiro (2012-Japan) 145m *** D: Shinji Higuchi, Isshin Inudô (LA MAISON DE HIMIKO). Mansai Nomura, Kôichi Sato, Takehiro Hira, Hiroki Narimiya, Nana Eikura, Masahiko Nishimura, Tomomitsu Yamaguchi. In 1590, in the land of Bushu (now Saitama), Oshi castle is attacked by the forces of warlord Toyotomi Hideyoshi in his campaign to unify Japan. Much to his surprise, the castle, defended only by a force of 500, holds out against Toyotomi's 20,000. Oshi castle's forces are led not by a famous military hero, but by Lord Narita Nagachika (Nomura), considered by samurai and farmers alike to be a frivolous fool. This thrilling star-studded samurai adventure won 1 award. For ages 12 and older.

EL DESCONOCIDO aka Retribution (2015-Spain) 100m *** D: Dani de la Torre. Luis Tosar, Javier Gutiérrez, Fernando Cayo, Goya Toledo. On an ordinary morning, bank executive Carlos (Tosar) drives his two kids to school on his way to work. They've only traveled a short distance when Carlos gets a phone call from a stranger with a shocking demand: Carlos must transfer a large sum of money to a bank account or the bomb under his seat will explode. This thriller expertly ratchets up the tension with each plot twist. Winner of 14 awards. For ages 12 and older.

JUDAS AND THE BLACK MESSIAH (2021-US) 126m **** ½ D: Shaka King. Daniel Kaluuya, LaKeith Stanfield, Jesse Plemons, Dominique Fishback, Ashton Sanders. Intent on taking down the Black Panther Party, the FBI offers petty criminal William O'Neal (Stanfield) a way to keep out of prison: infiltrate the Illinois chapter and get intel on its charismatic chairman, Fred Hampton (Kaluuya). This vivid biopic set in late-1960s Chicago tells a tragic tale of betrayal. Winner of 37 awards including 2 Oscars: Best Supporting Actor (Kaluuya) and Best Original Song. Rated R.

HOPE GAP (2019-UK) 100m *** D: William Nicholson (FIRELIGHT). Annette Bening, Bill Nighy, Josh O'Connor. After 29 years of a seemingly peaceful marriage, Edward (Nighy) decides to leave his wife Grace (Bening). Edward's decision comes as a shock to their son Jamie (O'Connor), visiting for the weekend from London. What's worse, Jamie must witness his mother receiving this bombshell. This brilliantly acted drama won Best Film at the Cabourg Romantic Film Festival. Rated PG-13.

CHEZ NOUS (2013-Netherlands/Belgium) 97m *** D: Tim Oliehoek. Alex Klaasen, Achmed Akkabi, Peter Faber, Frederik Brom, Tina de Bruin, Thomas Acda, John Leddy. When Adje (Leddy), the proprietor of drag show nightclub Chez Nous collapses from a heart attack, his star Bertie (Klaasen), barkeep Babette (de Bruin) and regulars Peter Jan (Brom), Rachid (Akkabi) and Gijs (Acda) come up with a preposterous plan to save their beloved second home from financial ruin. Two highlights in this feel-good comedy: it's set during Amsterdam's outrageous Gay Pride canal parade, and Alex Klaasen sashays and belts out the hits by Dutch songstress Anita Meyer. For ages 12 and older.

TURKISH GAMBIT aka Turetskiy gambit (2005-Russia/ Bulgaria) 124m *** ½ D: Dzhanik Fayziev. Egor Beroev, Olga Krasko, Vladimir Ilin, Yuriy Kutsenko, Didien Bienaimé. In this sweeping epic adventure set during the 1877 war between Russia and the Ottoman Empire, master sleuth Erast Fandorin (Beroev) escapes from the Turks and hurries to deliver military secrets to the Russian command. Along the way he meets beautiful Yarvara Suvorova (Krasko), who is hoping to meet with her fiancé in the Russian camp. The two join forces as they try to uncover a treacherous spy. This adaptation of Boris Akunin's novel won 4 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE NEPHEW (1998-Ireland) 100m *** D: Eugene Brady. Hill Harper, Donal McCann, Pierce Brosnan, Sinéad Cusack, Aislin McGuckin, Phelim Drew, Luke Griffin, Niall Toibin. Friendly Chad (Harper), a 17-year-old New Yorker, arrives in a small Irish island town to visit his estranged uncle Tony (McCann), a grumpy and narrow-minded farmer. The little town is abuzz about the handsome dreadlocked stranger, unlocking closets full of skeletons in this breezy romantic comedy-drama. A delightful Celtic soundtrack and gorgeous scenery make this film a treat for eyes and ears. PG-13. Screened with English subtitles.

THE COURIER (2020-UK/US) 112m *** ½ D: Dominic Cooke. Benedict Cumberbatch, Merab Ninidze, Rachel Brosnahan, Jessie Buckley. In this nifty Cold War Era spy tale inspired by real events, London businessman Greville Wynne (Cumberbatch) regularly travels to Eastern Europe for work. He is recruited by CIA operative Donovan (Brosnahan) to transport secrets from Russian mole Oleg Penkovsky (Ninidze). What starts out as a jolly adventure becomes deadly serious in this engaging thriller. Nominated for I award. Rated PG-13.

LAND (2021-US) 89m *** D: Robin Wright (feature directorial debut). Robin Wright, Demián Bichir. Bereaved by the loss of her husband and son, Edee (Wright) buys a cabin on a mountainside in Wyoming and shuts herself off from society in this beautiful tale of healing. It's not an easy life alone on the mountain but she welcomes the work. There are wolves and bears yet also magnificent sunrises. As her spirit reconnects to the past, she begins to look toward the future. Winner of 2 awards. Rated PG-13.

COMING OF AGE aka Anfang 80 (2011-Austria) 90m *** ½ D: Gerhard Ertl, Sabine Hiebler. Christine Ostermayer, Karl Merkatz, Erni Mangold. Two 80-somethings fall in love in this beautifully nuanced romance set in Austria. Fiercely independent Rosa (Ostermayer) is alarmed at how invisible she has become to society and is chafing at having to live in a retirement home against her will. After he meets lovely Rosa, Bruno (Merkatz) is no longer satisfied with his comfortable but stifling routine with his wife Herta (Mangold). This life affirming yet truthful drama won 6 awards. For ages 12 and older.

CAMPEONES aka Champions (2018-Spain) 124m *** ½ Javier Fesser. Javier Gutiérrez, Athenea Mata, Juan Margallo, José de Luna, Gloria Ramos. Arrogant assistant basketball coach Marco (Gutiérrez) isn't having a good day. He's separated from his wife (Mata), he's just lost his job, and worst of all, he's been put in the slammer for driving drunk and hitting a police car. To complete his community service, Marco is now the basketball coach for a team of intellectually disabled 20-somethings. But as he spends time with his new team, he finds that he has a lot to learn from them in this feel-good comedy. Winner of 13 awards. For ages 12 and older.

NERO WOLFE: CHAMPAGNE FOR ONE (2001-US) 93m *** ½ D: Timothy Hutton. Maury Chaykin, Timothy Hutton, Bill Smitrovich, Marian Seldes, Kari Matchett. Super sleuth Nero Wolfe's assistant Archie Goodwin (Hutton) is standing in for a friend at a charity dance for unwed mothers when one of the young mothers collapses and dies, evidently of cyanide poisoning. The woman had talked often about suicide, but no one saw her take poison. Is it murder? Timothy Hutton directs this episode which allows him to show off his ballroom dance chops. For ages 12 and older.

BRONZE MAGICIAN aka Yôsô (1963-Japan) 98m *** ½ D: Teinosuke Kinugasa (GATE OF HELL). Raizô Ichikawa, Yukiko Fuji, Miyako Endô, Tomisaburô Wakayama. In this otherworldly tale of imperial intrigue in 8th century Japan, Buddhist monk Dôkyô (Ichikawa) emerges from a cave after meditating for 10 years, acquiring immense magical powers. News of his ability to heal reaches sickly Empress Kôken (Fuji), who has him visit the palace. Dôkyô, not interested in power or wealth, cures her simply because it's the right thing to do, making him a threat to the ambitious prime minister (Wakayama). A uniquely artistic film experience for ages 12 and older.
