TOMORROW'S A NEW DAY *aka Domani è un altro giorno* (2019-Italy) 101m *** D: Simone Spada. Valerio Mastandrea, Marco Giallini, Anna Ferzetti. When Tommaso (Mastandrea) hears of the heartbreaking decision his longtime friend Giuliano (Giallini) is making, Tommaso overcomes his fear of flying and travels from Canada to Rome to be by Giuliano's side. In this very good Italian remake of TRUMAN, Giuliano, Tommaso and Giuliano's lovable dog Pato spend four bittersweet days together to say good-bye. Nominated for 3 awards. For ages 12 and older.

VILLON'S WIFE *aka Viyon no tsuma* (2009-Japan) 114m *** ½ D: Kichitarō Negishi (CRAZED FRUIT). Takako Matsu, Tadanobu Asano, Masato Ibu, Ryōko Hirosue, Satoshi Tsumabuki. In this drama set in post-WWII Tokyo, Sachi (Matsu), the wife of brilliant but self-destructive novelist Otani (Asano), ends up working at a pub to pay off her husband's debt. Finding she enjoys the work, Sachi gains a new sense of independence and the admiration of other men. Will her love for her philandering, drunkard husband prevail? Winner of 8 awards. For ages 12 and older.

JOURNEY TO THE SHORE *aka Kishibe no tabi* (2015-Japan/France) 128m *** D: Kiyoshi Kurosawa (WIFE OF A SPY). Eri Fukatsu, Tadanobu Asano, Masao Komatsu, Akira Emoto. After mourning her husband Yūsuke (Asano) for three years, Mizuki (Fukatsu) is visited by Yūsuke's ghost. Mizuki, who had been praying for his arrival, is hardly surprised. Yūsuke takes Mizuki on a journey retracing his steps to Toyama, where he died, in this meditative story where ghosts are anything but spectral beings. Winner of 4 awards, including one from Cannes. For ages 12 and older.

LETTERS TO FATHER JACOB *aka Postia pappi Jaakobille* (2009-Finland) 73m *** ½ D: Klaus Härö (THE FENCER). Kaarina Hazard, Heikki Nousiainen. Pardon after serving 12 years of a life sentence, convicted murderer Leila (Hazard) reluctantly agrees to work as an assistant to Father Jacob (Nousiainen), a blind priest in a rural rectory. Though she is full of contempt for her job of reading letters to the priest, when the letters stop coming, Father Jacob is devastated. Leila finds herself cast in a new role for the first time. Winner of 17 awards. For ages 10 and older.

GOURMET CLUB (2004-Finland) 63m *** ½ D: Juha Wuolijoki (CHRISTMAS STORY). Hannu-Pekka Björkman, Kari Ketonen. Five older gentlemen belong to an exclusive dining club. The members take turns providing the main course, wagering huge sums of money to guess the secret ingredient. When his turn comes up, physician Paavo (Björkman) chooses a truly shocking ingredient that no one can guess. But his good fortune changes when the mystery meal has miraculous effects on the diners in this tasty black comedy. Winner of 4 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE OUTFIT (2022-US) 105m *** ½ D: Graham Moore (feature debut). Mark Rylance, Zoey Deutch, Dylan O'Brien, Johnny Flynn, Simon Russell Beale. Savile Row tailor Leonard (Rylance) crafts beautiful suits in his corner shop in Chicago. The only people who can afford his clothes are gangsters: Leonard averts his eyes when they use his shop to drop off money and messages. One evening, killers Richie (O'Brien) and Francis (Flynn) barge in after a gunfight leaves a hole in Richie's stomach. Forced to stitch Richie up, Leonard must use his wits to survive the deadly evening. The snappy dialog is as beautifully tailored as the suits in this film noir. Rated R.

THE GUY IN THE GRAVE NEXT DOOR *aka Grabben i graven bredvid* (2002-Sweden/Norway) 90m *** D: Kjell Sundvall. Elisabet Carlsson, Michael Nyqvist (A HIDDEN LIFE), Anika Olsson. Recently widowed librarian Desirée (Carlsson) lives in Sweden's Norrbotten County, far from the city life she loves. One day when visiting her husband's grave, she meets Benny (Nyqvist), who's placing flowers on his parents' grave nearby. The two lonely souls meet and fall in love—but Benny is a farmer, and she aspires to be head librarian in Stockholm! This charming love story won 1 award. For ages 12 and older.

THE ETERNAL ROAD *aka Ikitie* (2017-Finland/Estonia/Sweden) 103m *** ½ D: Anti-Jussi Annila. Tommi Korpela, Sidsé Babet Knudsen, Hannu-Pekka Björkman. After the NY Stock Exchange crash in 1929, an estimated 6,000 Finnish Americans emigrated to the USSR to escape the Great Depression. Not all were there voluntarily. In this powerful drama, farmer Jussi Ketola (Korpela) is abducted in Finland by nationalist thugs and forced to walk to Stalin's Russia. After toiling six years on a collective farm staffed by American laborers, Ketola fights to return home in this epic. Winner of 7 awards. For ages 15 and older.

SINGLE-HANDED: THE STOLEN CHILD (2008-Ireland) 93m *** ½ D: Anthony Byrne. Owen McDonnell, Charlene McKenna, Caroline Catz, Ian McElhinney, Nick Lee. In this second in the series, Eilish Burke's (McKenna) two-year-old son Conal is abducted. Garda Sergeant Jack Driscoll's (McDonnell) superiors shrug and give up the child as dead. Eilish's family are Travellers, and unpopular in the community. Angry and frustrated with the police's lack of concern, Jack tracks down Eilish's drug-addict ex-husband Pdraig (Lee) in hope of finding the toddler. For ages 15 and older.

HAPPY IS THE BRIDE (1958-UK) 82m *** ½ D: Roy Boulting (THE FAMILY WAY). Ian Carmichael, Janette Scott, Cecil Parker, Terry-Thomas, Edith Sharpe, Joyce Grenfell, John Le Mesurier. A cozy village in Wiltshire, England is abuzz with the news: David (Carmichael) has proposed to his sweetheart Janet (Scott) at a cricket match. To the young couple's dismay, and Janet's father Arthur's (Parker) despair, the entire community is mobilized to organize the wedding. This delightful confection showcases literally dozens of Britain's finest comic talent. For all ages.

WALLANDER: THE COLLECTOR *aka Indrivaren* (2010-Sweden) 90m *** D: Katharine Windfeld. Krister Henriksson, Lena Endre, Sverrir Gudnason, Nina Zanjani, Emil Forselius. While investigating the murder of her friend Therese, who trained at the same mixed martial arts gym, Isabelle (Zanjani) encounters Patrik (Forselius), the violent boyfriend from her past. When Patrik is found dead from a bullet from Isabelle's gun, Pontus's (Gudnason) love and faith in Isabelle are put to the test in this gripping episode. For ages 15 and older.

CRIMSON BAT, THE BLIND SWORDSWOMAN *aka Mekura no Oichi monogatari: Makkana nagaredori* (1969-Japan) 88m *** D: Sadatsugu Matsuda. Yōko Matsuyama, Isamu Nagato (3 OUTLAW SAMURAI), Akitake Kōno, Chizuko Arai. Edo-period bounty hunter and all-around badass, Crimson Bat Oichi (Matsuyama) can dispatch an army of baddies without so much as musing her immaculate hair. Beautiful and poised, she's also blind. This entertaining first film in the series concerns how Oichi developed her unique fighting style by training with master swordsman Ukita (Nagato). For ages 10 and older.

INSPECTOR GEORGE GENTLY: THE LOST CHILD (2012-UK) 91m *** ½ D: Nicholas Renton. Martin Shaw, Lee Ingleby, Mark Gatiss, Helen Baxendale. In this mystery set in 1968 Durham, the recently adopted baby daughter of Stephen (Gatiss) and Frances (Baxendale) is abducted from her crib in broad daylight. Inspector George Gently (Shaw) and Sgt Bacchus (Ingleby) trace the baby back to the orphanage, but the clues lead nowhere. Only when Gently probes into the secrets of the couple's past does the truth emerge. For ages 15 and older.

JIGSAW (1962-UK) 108m *** ½ D: Val Guest (QUARTERMASS EXPERIMENT). Jack Warner, Ronald Lewis, Yolande Donlan, Michael Goodliffe, John LeMesurier, Moira Redmond. This engrossing police procedural begins with a puzzling break-in of a real estate office and leads to the discovery of a woman's remains in a beach house in the seaside town of Brighton. A patchwork of seemingly unrelated clues fit together to form the solution to this taut, ingeniously constructed mystery. For ages 12 and older.

CYRANO (2021-UK/Canada/US) 123m *** ½ D: Joe Wright (PRIDE & PREJUDICE). Peter Dinklage (Game of Thrones), Haley Bennett, Kelvin Harrison Jr., Ben Mendelsohn, Bashir Salahuddin. In this dazzling musical adaptation of Edmond Rostand's "Cyrano de Bergerac", Cyrano (Dinklage), convinced that his appearance makes him unworthy of his beloved Roxanne's (Bennett) affection, woos her through letters he ghost-writes for handsome but inarticulate Christian (Harrison). Winner of 8 awards. PG-13.

THE TRAVELLING CAT CHRONICLES *aka Tabineko ripōto* (2018-Japan) 119m *** D: Kōichirō Miki. Sōta Fukushi, Mitsuki Takahata, Alice Hirose. When circumstances prevent young Satoru (Fukushi) from keeping his beloved cat Nana (voiced by Takahata), the two go on a road trip to find Nana a new "catservant". Though Satoru is trying hard to find the best candidate to care for Nana, Nana has his own ideas in this charming crowd-pleaser. For ages 10 and older.

TRAPPED, THE CRIMSON BAT *aka Mekura no Oichi jigokuhada* (1969-Japan) 88m *** D: Sadatsugu Matsuda. Yōko Matsuyama, Kikko Matsuoka, Yasunori Irikawa, Tōru Abe. In this second film of the Crimson Bat series, Oichi (Matsuyama), now a hardened bounty hunter, gets in trouble with a Yakuza gang when she nabs a lucrative bounty on their turf. The gang leader Oen (Matsuoka) is especially fearsome, as she expertly wields a bullwhip with a razor tip. Look out, Crimson Bat! For ages 10 and older.

CASTLE OF OWLS *aka Ninja hichō fukurō no shiro* (1963-Japan) 91m *** D: Eiichi Kudō (THE GREAT KILLING). Ryūtarō Ōtomo, Minoru Ōki, Hizuru Takachiho, Chiyoko Honma, Chōchirō Kawarasaki. Juzo (Ōtomo), ninja of the Iga clan, swears he will kill Toyotomi Hideyoshi to avenge his family. His resolve strengthens when a wealthy merchant offers to fund the assassination. But there is much that stands in his way: his old friend Gohei (Ōki) joins forces with the rival Koga ninja, and lady ninja Kohagi (Takachiho), his beloved, begs him to leave the violent life behind. Will he complete his mission? Rarely seen in the West, this ninja movie is a classic of the genre. For ages 12 and older.

THE BATMAN (2022-US) 176m *** ½ D: Matt Reeves. Robert Pattinson, Zoë Kravitz, Jeffrey Wright, Colin Farrell, Paul Dano, John Turturro, Andy Serkis. In this dark and psychologically complex superhero movie, wealthy scion of Gotham City's upper crust Bruce Wayne (Pattinson) investigates a series of grisly murders as his alter-ego Batman. The murders, which appear to be politically motivated, force Batman/Bruce to question his family's involvement in Gotham City's hidden corruption. Winner of 2 awards. PG-13.

THE HAPPIEST DAY IN THE LIFE OF OLLI MAKI *aka Hymyilevä mies* (2016-Finland/Sweden/Germany) 93m *** ½ D: Juho Kuosmanen. Jarkko Lahti, Oona Airola, Eero Milonoff. In this true story, talented boxer Olli Mäki's (Lahti) small Finnish town is in an uproar over his 1962 World Featherweight title match to be held in Helsinki. A modest man, Olli would rather spend time alone with his sweetheart Raija (Airola) than be hailed as a national hero. This sensitive and thoughtful portrait of a boxer won 13 awards, including one from Cannes. For ages 12 and older.

DOG (2022-US) 101m *** D: Reid Carolin. Channing Tatum. Channing Tatum, Jane Adams, Nicole LaLiberte, Q'orianka Kilcher, Eric Urbiztondo. Back in Montana from military service in Afghanistan, former Army Ranger Jackson (Tatum) takes on the thankless task of transporting fellow Ranger Lulu, a homicidal Belgian Malinois, to Arizona for the funeral of Lulu's trainer Riley (Urbiztondo). In this wacky, touching and surprisingly thoughtful comedy, the battle-scarred warriors bond as they make their way across the country. Winner of 2 awards. PG-13.

WATCH OUT, CRIMSON BAT! *aka Mekura no Oichi midaregasa* (1969-Japan) 88m *** D: Hirokazu Ichimura. Yōko Matsuyama, Gorō Ibuki, Tamayo Mitsukawa, Mayumi Arai. In this third film of the Crimson Bat series, bounty hunter Oichi (Matsuyama) is given a secret scroll by a dying man who begs her to deliver it to a scientist named Murobuse. It turns out that the scroll contains the formula to a powerful new explosive, and every criminal and wicked government agent is out to kill her for it! For ages 12 and older.

CRIMSON BAT: WANTED, DEAD OR ALIVE *aka Mekura no Oichi inochi moraimasu* (1970-Japan) 87m *** D: Hirokazu Ichimura. Yōko Matsuyama, Yūki Meguro, Meichō Sogano, Jun Tazaki, Tetsurō Tanba, Shinji Hotta. In this thrilling conclusion to the Crimson Bat series, bounty hunter Oichi (Matsuyama) rescues a woman from the clutches of an evil magistrate. In retaliation, he puts a bounty of 100 ryo on her head, turning her from hunter into the hunted. This time, she must cross swords with master swordsman Sagara (the great Tetsurō Tanba)! For ages 12 and older.
