WELCOME TO THE RILEYS (2010-UK/US) 110m *** ½ D: Jake Scott. James Gandolfini (9/18/1961 – 6/19/2013), Kristen Stewart, Melissa Leo, Joe Chrest, Ally Sheedy. Indiana businessman Doug Riley (Gandolfini, in a beautifully sensitive performance) endures a dreary marriage with Lois (Leo). When Doug travels to New Orleans for a plumbing supply conference, he meets 16-year-old stripper/prostitute Mallory (Stewart) and takes a paternal interest in her. Doug sets into motion changes that will affect him, his wife and Mallory for the rest of their lives. This uncompromisingly truthful drama won at the Milan International Film Festival. Rated R.

ZERO DARK THIRTY (2012-US) 157m **** D: Kathryn Bigelow. Jessica Chastain, Mark Strong, Joel Edgerton, Jason Clarke, James Gandolfini, Stephen Dillane. This meticulously crafted dramatization of the hunt for Osama bin Laden works both as a heart-racing thriller and gripping reportage. At the heart is the story of the CIA operative who masterminded the mission, Maya (Chastain). Maya's thought processes illuminate a path through the treacherous territory of code names and suicide bombers. Brought to the screen by the director (Bigelow) and writer (Mark Boal) team behind *THE HURT LOCKER*, this knock-out won an Oscar and another 57 awards. Rated R.

TWICE UPON A TIME aka *Désaccord parfait* (2006-France/UK/Romania) 92m *** D: Antoine de Caunes. Charlotte Rampling (SWIMMING POOL), Jean Rochefort (THE TALL BLOND MAN WITH ONE BLACK SHOE), Ian Richardson. Celebrated London actress Alice d'Abanville (Rampling) and French director Louis Ruinard (Rochefort) were the most glamorous power couple of the 1970s. But after a highly publicized breakup in 1975, the two haven't seen each other for 30 years. Now, in London, she's railroaded into presenting him with an achievement award. Will their romance spark and smolder again or just fizzle out? This romantic comedy wittily clashes the French and English languages to earn laughs. Nominated for a César. For ages 13 and older.

ETERNAL FIRST LOVE aka *Koisuru Napolitan* (2010-Japan) 106m *** D: Yoshinori Muratani. Saki Aibu, Daisuke Maki, Takashi Tsukamoto, Tomohiro Ichikawa, Tomoki Okayama. Tokyo foodies Ruri (Aibu) and Takeshi (Tsukamoto) have been very close since childhood. Takeshi is a chef at an Italian restaurant, and Ruri writes for a food magazine. On the day Ruri gets engaged to rival Chef Mizusawa, Takeshi urgently runs to tell her his feelings—but a divine event intervenes revealing the fathomless mysteries of love. Come enjoy this amazing tale of love, friendship and *zuppa del pescatore*. For ages 10 and older.

DANCE OF THE WIND (1997-India) 85m *** D: Rajan Khosa. Kitu Gidwani, Roshan Bano, Kapila Vatsyayan, B.C. Sanyal, Bhaven Gosain. Pallavi (Gidwani), a successful singer in the classical Indian tradition, loses her voice when her mother and teacher Karuna Devi (Vatsyayan) dies. Grief-stricken at the loss of her guru, Pallavi begins to recover her art when she meets a street urchin named Tara (Bano). This meditative film elevated with beautiful images and music won 5 awards from around the world. For ages 10 and older.

KNOCKIN' ON HEAVEN'S DOOR (1997-Germany) 87m *** ½ D: Thomas Jahn. Til Schweiger (INGLOURIOUS BASTERDS), Jan Josef Liefers. Thierry van Werveke, Moritz Bleibtreu (IN JULY). Martin (Schweiger) and Rudi (Liefers) have both been diagnosed with terminal cancer and share a room in a hospital. After swigging some tequila, the two 20-somethings decide to steal a car and go on a rampage. The Mercedes they steal is a sweet ride, to be sure, but it belongs to dangerous mobsters, who are soon on their tail. What ensues is a wild and comical chase across Germany to the ocean. Winner of 8 awards from around the world. For ages 13 and older.

THE TALL BLOND MAN WITH ONE BLACK SHOE (1972-France) 90m *** ½ D: Yves Robert. Pierre Richard, Bernard Blier, Jean Rochefort (TWICE UPON A TIME), Mireille Darc, Colette Castel. Hapless violin player François Perrin (Richard) is targeted by an espionage chief to be a decoy for a rival group of spies. Soon all sorts of alarming events occur, but Perrin is oblivious to all the intrigue around him, earning the respect of the spies for his cool professionalism. This wacky comedy classic won 3 awards including one from Berlin and another from the National Board of Review. Rated PG.

SPRING BREAKERS (2012-US) 94m *** D: Harmony Korine. James Franco, Selena Gomez, Vanessa Hudgens, Ashley Benson, Rachel Korine. This wildly subversive version of the teen hormone flick has four college girls Brit (Benson), Faith (Gomez), Candy (Hudgens) and Cotty (Rachel Korine) going way off the rails in order to afford an unforgettable spring break. They land in jail and are bailed out by gangsta rapper Alien (Franco) who's about 10% rapper and 90% gangsta. This ferocious satire won 2 awards, one of them at Venice. Rated R.

GOODBYE BAFANA aka *The Color of Freedom* (2007-Germany/France/Belgium/South Africa/Italy/UK/Luxembourg) 119m *** D: Bille August (PELLE THE CONQUEROR). Joseph Fiennes, Dennis Haysbeert, Diane Kruger, Patrick Lyster. Based on the autobiography of James Gregory, this drama is about a South African racist (Fiennes) whose attitudes were profoundly altered by a black prisoner he guarded for twenty years. The prisoner was *Nelson Mandela* (Haysbert)! This touching and inspirational film won two film awards, one of them at the Berlin International Film Festival. Rated R.

LE VILAIN aka *The Villain* (2009-France) 86m *** D: Albert Dupontel. Catherine Frot (THE PAGE TURNER), Albert Dupontel, Bouli Lanners, Nicolas Marié, Christine Murillo. Bank robber Sidney (Dupontel) decides to hide out at his mother's home. The thing is, he hasn't bothered to keep in touch with his mom (Frot) for 20 years, and she has problems of her own. But when she discovers how her son has been making a living, she decides to put him on the straight and narrow. Soon there's a battle of wills as a son's criminal smarts are pitted against his mother's! This delightfully inventive comedy features terrific performances by the leads. For ages 13 and older.

OUR PRECIOUS CHILDREN aka *Nos enfants chéris* (2009-France) 86m *** D: Benoît Cohen. Mathieu Demy, Laurence Côté, Romane Bohringer, Mathias Mlekuz, Fabio Zenoni, Eleonore Pourriat, Julien Boisselier. When Martin (Demy) runs into his ex-girlfriend Constance (Bohringer) at the supermarket, he's delighted to catch up on her life. Both are married and have children. Impulsive Constance invites herself and her family to Martin's spacious country home in the Aubrac. Together with a few others, they enjoy delicious food, good wine and everyone's on vacation. But under the surface, passions are set ablaze in this romantic comedy. For ages 13 and older.

HOME FROM HOME aka *Endstation der Sehnsüchte* (2009-Germany/South Korea) 99m *** D: Sung Hyung Cho. This fascinating documentary tells the story of three Korean women, all with German husbands, who, after 30 years in Europe, return to the land of their birth. All three women discover that Korea no longer feels like home, and retreat to the comforts of a German expat village in Korea that has, among other things, red tile roofs and sausage vendors. Humorous and thought-provoking, this study of three couples seeking cultural harmony provides insight into universal human values. For ages 10 and older.

SHUN LI AND THE POET aka *Io sono Li* (2011-Italy/France) 98m *** ½ D: Andrea Segre. Tao Zhao, Rade Serbedzija (FUGITIVE PIECES), Marco Paolini, Roberto Citran, Giuseppe Battiston. Far from the tourist attractions in the lagoon of Venice lies the island fishing village of Chioggia. Fisherman Bepi (Serbedzija) hangs out at the tavern where Shun Li (Zhao) has just gotten a job as a bartender. He's close to retirement and she's in her 30s, but they form a bond over their mutual appreciation of poetry. This gorgeously shot (by Luca Bigazzi) drama of two kindred spirits won 9 awards from all over Europe. For ages 15 and older.

BEYOND aka *Svinalängorna* (2010-Sweden/Denmark/Finland/Norway) 99m *** D: Pernilla August. Noomi Rapace (THE GIRL IN THE DRAGON TATTOO), Ola Rapace, Outi Mäenpää, Tehilla Blad. Well-adjusted and happily married, Leena (Noomi Rapace) is about to celebrate Christmas with her husband Johan (Ola Rapace) and their children when she receives a call from a hospital in Ystad. Painful memories of her childhood with alcoholic parents flood back, and Leena tries to ignore the call. Urged by her husband, Leena and her family trek 600 km to Ystad to visit Leena's mother (Mäenpää) and reconcile with the past. This powerful drama won 10 awards. For ages 15 and older.

42 (2013-US) 128m *** ½ D: Brian Helgeland (Writer MYSTIC RIVER). Chadwick Boseman, Harrison Ford, Nicole Beharie, Christopher Meloni, Ryan Merriman, Lucas Black, Andre Holland, Alan Tudyk. This soaring tribute to baseball legend Jackie Robinson (Boseman) chronicles his first season with the Brooklyn Dodgers in 1947, when, for the first time in history, baseball's color line is broken. Robinson will suffer racist attacks from all sides, and Dodgers general manager Branch Rickey (Ford) knows this. Rickey says, "I want a player who has the guts NOT to fight back." This moving biopic will no doubt be in the shortlist for Awards Season. Rated PG-13.

KOKOWÄÄH (2011-Germany) 123m *** D: Til Schweiger (BAREFOOT). Til Schweiger, Emma Schweiger, Jasmin Gerat, Samuel Finzi, Meret Becker. Just when he's scored the job of adapting beautiful Katharina's (Gerat) novel, womanizing screenwriter Henry (Til Schweiger) gets a surprise in the form of 8-year-old Magdalena (Emma Schweiger) bearing a letter stating she's Henry's daughter. The title of this comedy is Magdalena's pronunciation of the kid-inappropriate dish coq au vin. This charmer won 2 awards. For ages 10 and older.

DOWN THE SHORE (2011-US) 93m *** D: Harold Guskin. James Gandolfini (9/18/1961 – 6/19/2013), Famke Janssen, John Magaro, Joe Pope, Edoardo Costa, Maria Dizzia. Set in a tattered amusement park on the New Jersey coast, this thoughtful indie concerns three childhood friends. Bailey (Gandolfini) works at the amusement park owned by his friend Wiley (Pope) who married the woman (Janssen) Bailey loved. When Jacques (Costa) arrives from France with news of Bailey's long-lost sister Susan (Dizzia), Jacques forces the three friends to face long-buried secrets. Rated R.

LA BUENA VIDA aka *The Good Life* (2008-Chile/Argentina/Spain/UK/France) 108m *** ½ D: Andrés Wood. Aline Küppenheim, Roberto Fariás, Eduardo Paxeco, Paula Sotelo. Four people in the city of Santiago, Chile struggle to better their lives. Teresa (Küppenheim) is a therapist dedicated to helping sex workers. Edmundo (Fariás), a beautician for an upscale salon, is trying to get a loan for a car. Mario (Paxeco) is a talented clarinetist whose dream is to perform in a major orchestra. Patricia (Sotelo) is just trying to survive. The stories of the four characters intersect and take unexpected turns in this engrossing drama. Winner of 6 awards. For ages 13 and older.

LOVE LIKE POISON aka *Un poison violent* (2010-France) 92m *** D: Katell Quillévéré. Clara Audarade, Lio, Michel Galabru, Thierry Neuvic, Youen Le Boulanger-Gourvil. A week away from her confirmation, Anna (Augarde) returns from boarding school to discover that her parents have separated, and her father has a new woman in his life. Her lusty, irreverent grandfather (Galabru) is dying, and her best friend is leaving on vacation. If all of this upheaval isn't enough to test Anna's faith, there's the increasingly awkward attraction to the choir boy (Le Boulanger-Gourvil). What's a girl to believe? This gorgeously-shot drama won a Jean Vigo Award. For ages 15 and older.

NEW WORLD (2013-South Korea) 134m *** ½ D: Hoon-jung Park. Min-sik Choi, Jeong-jae Lee, Jeong-min Hwang. In this elegantly crafted crime thriller, cop Ja-seong (Lee) has been working undercover in the multi-tentacled Goldmoon crime organization as a valuable right-hand man. When Goldmoon's head Seok dies in a car accident, spurring a succession battle, police chief Kang (Choi) mobilizes Ja-seong to bring down Seok's top lieutenants. Ja-seong struggles between his obligations as law protector and lawbreaker in this hard-hitting thriller. Nominated for 2 Baek Sang Art Awards. For ages 17 and older.

ROMANCE & CIGARETTES (2005-US) 105m *** D: John Turturro. James Gandolfini (9/18/1961 – 6/19/2013), Susan Sarandon, Kate Winslet, Steve Buscemi, Bobby Cannavale, Christopher Walken. This down-and-dirty musical romantic comedy set in working class New York tells the story of ironworker Nick (Gandolfini) who carries on a torrid affair with Tula (Winslet), even though he loves his beleaguered wife Kitty (Sarandon). The characters burst into song joined by chorus lines of garbagemen, diners at the deli and the NYPD. Outrageously original and performed with truckloads ofchutzpah, this film was nominated for an award at Venice. Rated R.

IN JULY aka *Im Juli* (2000-Germany) 99m *** ½ D: Fatih Akin. Moritz Bleibtreu (RÜN LOLA RUN), Christiane Paul, Mehmet Kurtulus, İdil Üner, Branka Katic. Stodgy science teacher Daniel (Bleibtreu) meets Hamburg street vendor Juli (Paul) who tells him that his true love will wear the sign of the sun. Before Juli could wear a sunburst and "accidentally" run into him, lovely Turkish tourist Melek (Üner) inadvertently beats Juli to the punch, and Daniel drives off to Istanbul to declare his love. On the way, he picks up a hitchhiker—none other than Juli! Hilarious adventures ensue as they make their way through Eastern Europe. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 13 and older.
