THE FRIEND (2024-US) 119m *** D: Scott McGehee, David Siegel. Bill Murray, Naomi Watts, Carla Gugino, Constance Wu. Novelist Iris's (Watts) comfortable, solitary New York City life is thrown into chaos after her close friend and mentor Walter (Murray) commits suicide and leaves his Great Dane Apollo to her. The huge (yet soulful) beast creates all sorts of problems, from trashing the furniture in her apartment to eviction notices, but despite herself, Iris begins to bond with Apollo in this warm and human story of friendship. Winner of 1 award. Rated R.

FOYLE'S WAR: THE HIDE (2010-UK) 89m **** D: Stuart Orme. Michael Kitchen, Andrew Scott, Honeysuckle Weeks, Max Brown, Anthony Howell, David Yelland. DCS Foyle (Kitchen) is free at last from his job, but upon reading news about James Devereaux, a man accused of treason who joined the Nazi British Free Corps, he decides to investigate his case. Coincidentally, DI Paul Milner (Howell) is examining the death of Agnes Littleton, who was secretary to James's father, Sir Charles Devereaux (Yelland). Meanwhile, Sam (Weeks) and Adam (Brown) lose the support from their bank and must decide what to do with their boarding house. For ages 14 and older.

STATE OF PLAY Part 1 of 3 (2003-UK) 114m **** D: David Yates. John Simm, David Morrissey, Bill Nighy, Kelly Macdonald. Two seemingly unrelated deaths occur on the same day in London: Sonia Baker, research aide to politician Stephen Collins (Morrissey), falls under a train, and teenage petty criminal Kelvin Stagg is shot to death. At a press conference, Collins' emotional response to Sonia Baker's death causes a media firestorm. Seeking to help his friend, The Herald reporter Cal McCaffrey (Simm) shelters Collins at his home, only to receive shocking evidence that the two deaths are linked. For ages 15 and older.

THE RAILROAD MAN aka Il ferroviere (1956-Italy) 110m *** ½ D: Pietro Germi (DIVORCE ITALIAN STYLE). Pietro Germi, Luisa Della Noce, Sylva Koscina, Sario Urzi, Edoardo Gubina. In this Italian Neorealist classic, railroad engineer Andrea (Germi) has a simple and happy life, drinking wine and singing songs after work with his friends at his favorite pub. One day, a terrible accident at work turns Andrea's life upside down, ripping apart his family. His wife Sara (Della Noce) and his youngest son Sandrino (Gubina) save him through their unwavering devotion in this searing social commentary. Winner of 6 awards, including one from Cannes. For ages 10 and older.

THE OLD MAN & THE GUN (2018-US) 93m *** ½ D: David Lowery (PETE'S DRAGON). Robert Redford, Sissy Spacek, Casey Affleck, Danny Glover, Tom Waits. Robert Redford stars as charming 70-year-old bank robber Forrest Tucker in this delightful true tale set in the 1970s. Police officer John Hunt (Affleck) makes it his mission to catch Tucker and his partners Teddy (Glover) and Waller (Waits), but the closer he gets, the more he appreciates their dedication to their craft. Redford delivers the charisma Variety says is "what movie stars were once capable of" in this heist comedy. Rated PG-13.

THE YOUNG MONTALBANO: BACK TO BASICS aka Ritorno alle origini (2012-Italy) 109m ****½ D: Gianluca Maria Tavarelli. Michele Riondino, Alessio Vassallo, Sarah Felberbaum. Police commissioner Salvo Montalbano (Riondino) is assigned a deputy, slick womanizer Mimi Augello (Vassallo). Immediately mistrustful, Montalbano puts Augello on a seemingly trivial case—some stolen beer caps from a hoarder's collection. Later, a three-year-old child disappears, who is soon found unharmed several miles away. Mimi tries to find excuses to question a witness, beautiful Genoese architect Livia Burlando (Felberbaum). For ages 14 and older.

THE PRESIDENT'S WIFE aka Bernadette (2023-France/US/Belgium) 94m *** D: Léa Domenach (feature debut). Catherine Deneuve, Denis Podalydès, Michel Vuillemoz. In this playfully irreverent political satire, Bernadette Chirac (Deneuve), fed up with being sidelined by her husband President Jacques Chirac (Vuillemoz), gets an image makeover with the help of her chief of staff, Bernard (Podalydès). Bernadette flexes her own political strength as she maneuvers out from under her husband's foot in this clever comedy. Nominated for 3 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THREE DAYS TO LIVE aka Trois jours à vivre (1957-France) 86m *** D: Gilles Grangier. Daniel Gélin, Jeanne Moreau, Lino Ventura, Roland Armontel, Georges Flamant. Simon (Gélin) is an ambitious actor in a small touring company who is only cast in supporting roles. The troupe's aging matinee idol Bérinont (Armontel) always gets the best parts. One evening, when Simon witnesses a murder on a street in Paris, he milks his media notoriety for a chance to shine in the spotlight in this film noir. For ages 10 and older.

STATE OF PLAY Part 2 of 3 (2003-UK) 118m **** D: David Yates. John Simm, Philip Glenister, David Morrissey, Bill Nighy, Kelly Macdonald, Polly Walker, James McAvoy. Reporter McCaffrey (Simm) is arrested for withholding evidence from the police. McCaffrey's colleague Della Smith (Macdonald) brings in freelance journalist Dan Foster (McAvoy) to track down the last person Sonia Baker spoke to before she died. Kelvin Stagg's killer is shot dead by the police, against the orders of Chief Inspector Bell (Glenister). Barred from key information by his higher-ups, DCI Bell teams up with McCaffrey's crew to try to solve the case. For ages 15 and older.

HEY HANDSOME!! THE MOVIE (2024-Japan) 119m *** D: Masatoshi Yamaguchi. Kôtarô Yoshida, Haruka Kinami, Yui Sakuma, Rena Takeda, Ryubi Miyase, Tomoko Fujita. This foodie comedy based on the hit miniseries "Hey Handsome!!" concerns Tokyo-based urban planner Gentaro Ito (Yoshida) and his three adult daughters. Oldest daughter Yuka (Kinami) is successful at work but has a chaotic love life; divorced middle daughter Rika (Sakuma) reacquaints herself with Kyoto confectioner Takao (Miyase), her childhood friend; and youngest daughter Mika (Takeda), a manga artist, tries to get rid of her loser boyfriend. For ages 12 and older.

LOVE AND HONOR aka Bushi no ichibun (2006-Japan) 122m ****½ D: Yôji Yamada (TWILIGHT SAMURAI). Takuya Kimura, Rei Dan, Mitsugorô Bandô, Takashi Sasano, Kaori Momoi. Low-ranking samurai Shinnojô (Kimura) feels that his talent is being wasted as a lord's food taster. He tells his beautiful and loving wife Kayo (Dan) that he'd rather open a fencing dojo, but before he could act upon his dream, he eats poisonous shellfish on the job and goes blind. With her husband no longer able to work, Kayo goes out to secure their income and puts their family's honor in peril. This touching samurai-era love story won 12 awards. Rated PG-13.

THE BALLAD OF WALLIS ISLAND (2025-UK) 100m *** ½ D: James Griffiths (feature debut). Tim Key, Tom Basden, Carey Mulligan, Sian Clifford, Akemnji Ndirforyen. Two members of a former folk rock duo called McGwyer Mortimer are each invited to play a concert on a remote British island by an eccentric lottery winner (Key). Newly established as a solo artist, Herb McGwyer (Basden) has no clue that his former band member (and former girlfriend) Nell Mortimer (Mulligan) plans to perform at the concert, causing a number of funny and poignant complications in this heartwarming comedy. Nominated for 2 awards. Rated PG-13.

STATE OF PLAY Part 3 of 3 (2003-UK) 116m **** D: David Yates. John Simm, David Morrissey, Bill Nighy, Kelly Macdonald, Polly Walker, James McAvoy. As evidence of a conspiracy involving the government grows, The Herald editor Cameron Foster (Nighy) is put under pressure to kill the Sonia Baker story. Risking everything, Foster refuses. A new discovery suddenly sheds new light on Sonia Baker's murder, revealing the culprit in this explosive conclusion to the miniseries. Winner of 17 awards, including 3 BAFTAs. For ages 15 and older.

ULAM: MAIN DISH (2018-US) 79m *** D: Alexandra Cuervo. Filipino cuisine is famously bold and striking: the colors are vivid, the sharp flavors of vinegar and citrus accent pungent notes of fish sauce and garlic. But this is just the beginning: it is a cuisine born of a highly diverse people who speak thirteen languages. This fascinating documentary traces the journey of Filipino food on its way to the tables of America's top restaurants, with interviews of chefs such as Amy Besa and Romy Dorotan of Purple Yam in Brooklyn and Alvin Cailan, founder of Eggslut. For all ages.

WHO KILLED SANTA CLAUS? aka L'assassinat du Père Noël (1941-France) 104m *** ½ D: Christian-Jacque (FANFAN LA TULIPE). Harry Baur, Renée Faure, Marie-Hélène Dasté, Raymond Rouleau. Christmas is coming to a little village in the French Alps. Jovial old Cornusse (Baur), the globe maker, dresses as Santa Claus each year to the delight of the children, and the locals look forward to the festivities. But soon the mood turns to shock when a priceless jeweled St. Nicholas ring is stolen from the church, and Santa Claus is found dead in the snow! This atmospheric mystery is the first French film released under the Vichy government. For ages 10 and older.

THE WEDDING BANQUET (2025-US) 103m *** D: Andrew Ahn. Bowen Yang, Lily Gladstone, Kelly Marie Tran, Han Gi-Chan, Joan Chen, Youn Yuh-jung. In this delightful re-imagining of Ang Lee's 1993 THE WEDDING BANQUET, wealthy South Korean citizen Min's (Han) student visa is about to expire. Unwilling to go back to Korea and tired of waiting for his boyfriend Chris (Yang) to commit, Min makes a deal with his lesbian friend Angela (Tran): if she marries him (so he gets a green card) he'll pay for Angela's partner Lee's (Gladstone) fertilization treatments. Their plans go hilariously awry in this winner of 2 awards. Rated R.

SINNERS (2025-US/Australia/Canada) 137m **** D: Ryan Coogler (FRUITVALE STATION). Miles Caton, Michael B. Jordan, Delroy Lindo, Yao, Li Jun Li, Hailee Steinfeld, Jack O'Connell. There is music "so true it can conjure spirits from the past and the future". In this exhilarating horror musical set in 1932 Clarksdale Mississippi, guitar prodigy Sammie (Caton) is one who makes such music. When his cousins, twins Smoke and Stack (both Jordan) open a juke joint, everyone shows up. This stunning, hyperkinetic vampire party won 2 awards so far. Rated R.

TAIKOKI (1987-Japan) Part I: 120m, Part II: 100m * D: Kihachi Okamoto (THE SWORD OF DOOM). Kyohei Shibata, Hiroki Matsukata, Shin'ichi 'Sonny' Chiba, Keiko Matsuzaka. True rags-to-riches story of a peasant nicknamed Saru (Shibata) who rises to rule Japan as Toyotomi Hideyoshi (3/17/1537 – 9/18/1598). 'Saru' means monkey—he's so named because he is funny-looking and mischievous. But he's also quick-thinking and verbally agile, making himself indispensable to warlord Oda Nobunaga (Matsuzaka). This fun and fascinating chronicle is a must-see for Japanese history fans. For ages 10 and older.**

MISS FISHER'S MURDER MYSTERIES Episodes 11 & 12 (2012-Australia) 107m *** ½ D: Emma Freeman, Daina Reid. Essie Davis, Nathan Page, Ashleigh Cummings, Aaron Jeffery, Nicholas Bell, Miriam Margolyes. A murder at the circus has private detective Phryne Fisher (Davis) relive terrible memories of her sister Janey. Janey's kidnapper Murdoch Foyle (Bell) is at large, having escaped prison. Later, Phryne's snobbish Aunt Prudence (Margolyes) is shocked to find her chambermaid is found dead, floating in her pool, two days before her son Guy's engagement party. Phryne makes sure the party goes on in this episode. For ages 15 and older.
