SEDUCING DOCTOR LEWIS aka La grande séduction (2003-Canada) 109m *** ½ D: Jean-François Pouliot. Raymond Bouchard, David Boutin, Benoît Brière, Pierre Collin, Lucie Laurier (THE AUCTION). In this warm-hearted comedy reminiscent of WAKING NED DEVINE, a tiny Canadian fishing village of just 118 souls is seeing a terrible slump in fishing stocks. Salvation in the form of a new factory is promised, but only if the village can attract a permanent local physician. The entire community comes together to lure a candidate, with hilarious results. This comedy won 15 awards including one at Sundance. For ages 13 and older.

ON MY WAY aka Elle s'en va (2013-France) 116m *** D: Emmanuelle Bercot. Catherine Deneuve, Nemo Schiffman, Gérard Garouste, Camille. Catherine Deneuve stars as a romantically disappointed grandmother named Bettie who decides to ditch her failing restaurant and go on a road trip across France. Bettie reluctantly takes her embittered 10-year-old grandson Charly (Schiffman) along for the ride. This charming French road movie with lots of local color and personality won an award. For ages 13 and older.

THE FRINGE DWELLERS (1986-Australia) 98m ***
D: Bruce Beresford (TENDER MERCIES). Kristina Nehm, Justine Saunders, Bob Maza, Kylie Belling, Denis Walker. Teenager Trilby (Nehm) lives in an aborigine shantytown in Australia surrounded by a big, boisterous family. A quietly ambitious girl, Trilby convinces her parents to buy a home in a white housing development. To her dismay, her entire extended family moves in with them. This powerful commentary on a people treated as outsiders in their own land won Best Screenplay at the Australian Film Institute. Rated PG.

NIGHT OF SILENCE aka Lal gece (2012-Turkey) 92m *** D: Reis Çelik. Ilyas Salman, Dilan Aksüt, Sabri Tutal, Mayseker Yucel. A thirteen-year-old bride (Aksüt), forced into marriage, dreads her upcoming encounter with her 60-year-old ex-convict groom (Salman) in the nuptial chamber. With stories and questions, she begins to turn the tables on her new husband. Winner of 8 awards, including the Crystal Bear at Berlin. For ages 15 and older.

THE HANDSOME SUIT aka Hansamu sûtsu (2008-Japan) 115m *** D: Tsutomu Hanabusa. Shôsuke Tanihara, Muga Tsukaji, Keiko Kitagawa, Mayumi Sada, Miyuki Ohshima. Porky chef Takuro (Tsukaji) transforms into his ultra-handsome alter ego Annin Hikariyama (Tanihara) whenever he puts on a specially designed miracle suit. Takuro used to be shunned by women, but now he's got Raika (Sada), the hottest supermodel in town, eating out of his hand. Will he get away with it? This sweet and funny comedy won an award. For ages 13 and older.

WHAT THE DAY OWES THE NIGHT aka Ce que le jour doit à la nuit (2012-France) 155m *** D: Alexandre Arcady. Nora Arnezeder, Fu'ad Aït Aattou, Mohamed Fellag, Anne Parillaud, Vincent Perez. This rapturously beautiful love story adapted from Yasmina Khadra's best seller concerns an Algerian farmer's son, Younès, who as a child in 1939 is sent to live with his affluent Uncle Mohamed (Fellag) in Oran. Younès, renamed Jonas (Aït Aattou), lives a westernized life with a diverse assortment of friends, whose friendship is threatened during the Algerian War. Among his friends is Émilie (Arnezeder), the source of Jonas's heartache. For ages 12 and older.

PAISITO aka Small Country (2008-Uruguay/Spain/Argentina) 84m *** D: Ana Díez. Mauricio Dayub, Emilio Gutierrez Caba, Nicolas Pauls, Maria Botto. Young Xavi and Rosana are the closest of friends in Montevideo, Uruguay during the early 1970s. Separated by the military coup of 1973, Xavi (Pauls) and Rosana (Botto) find each other in Spain more than 20 years later. Their love is complicated by the social upheaval their families experienced decades in the past. This gripping drama was nominated for 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE RAILWAY MAN (2013-Australia/UK/Switzerland) 116m **** D: Jonathan Teplitzky (BURNING MAN). Colin Firth, Nicole Kidman, Tanroh Ishida, Stellan Skarsgård, Jeremy Irvine, Hiroyuki Sanada. Eric Lomax (Irvine) was one of many Allied prisoners of war forced to work on the "death railway" from Thailand to Burma during WWII. When Lomax was caught building a secret radio, he was tortured by Japanese officer Nagase (Ishida). Many years later, Lomax (Firth) discovers that his tormentor Nagase (Sanada) is still alive and decides to confront him. This powerful true story won 2 awards. Rated R.

CHONMAGE PURIN aka A Boy and His Samurai (2010-Japan) 108m *** D: Yoshihiro Nakamura (FISH STORY). Ryô Nishikido, Fuku Suzuki, Rie Tomosaka, Jun Inoue. This time travel tale concerns earnest young samurai Yasube (Nishikido) who lands in present-day Tokyo. The disoriented Yasube is taken in by overworked single mom Hiroko (Tomosaka). Grateful to be off the streets, Yasube takes on Hiroko's housework and care for her adorable son Tomoya (Suzuki). While performing his house-husband duties (sans sex), Yasube develops a passion for baking. WARNING: This delightful comedy will make you hungry for dessert. For ages 10 and older.

LOCKE (2013-UK/US) 85m **** D: Steven Knight (writer EAST-ERN PROMISES). Tom Hardy (INCEPTION). While driving to London the night before the biggest challenge of his career as a construction manager, Ivan Locke (Hardy) receives a life-changing phone call. All the things he holds dear-- his family, his job and his reputation-- are at risk. This storytelling tour-de-force won a British Independent Film Award for Best Screenplay for director Steven Knight. Rated R.

ALLAROUND US aka Gururi no koto (2008-Japan) 140m *** ½ D: Ryosuke Hashiguchi (LIKE GRAINS OF SAND). Rirî Furankî (LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON), Tae Kimura, Akira Emoto. Husband Kanao (Furankî) is laid back. Wife Shoko (Kimura) is highly regimented. They met and fell in love as art students. This beautifully acted drama details eight years of a marriage that overcomes challenges both superficial and profound. Furankî, an illustrator in real life, adds authenticity to his role as courtroom illustrator. Winner of 7 awards. For ages 13 and older

DOG IN A SIDECAR aka Saido-kâ ni inu (2007-Japan) 94m *** D: Kichitaro Negishi (WHAT THE SNOW BRINGS). Yûko Takeuchi, Arata Furuta, Kana Matsumoto. Nine-year-old Kaoru (Matsumoto) watches her mother walk out on her family. Considering her feckless dad's (Furuta) behavior, Kaoru isn't surprised. Kaoru is instead astonished by a new arrival in the family, free-spirited Yoko (Takeuchi), her dad's new girlfriend. Yoko is impulsive and uncouth, and everything Kaoru's respectable mom is not. But for Kaoru, Yoko throws open a door to a wider world. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 13 and older.

NAYAK: THE HERO (1966-India) 121m **** D: Satyajit Ray (PATHER PANCHALI). Uttam Kumar, Sharmila Tagore, Bireswar Sen. Bengali movie star Arindam (Kumar) is traveling to Delhi to receive an award. On the train he is interviewed by Aditi (Tagore), a young female journalist rather unimpressed by his egotism and fame. In the course of their conversation, Arindam unmasks the real person behind the glossy façade—leading him to question the choices he's made. This classic won 3 awards, 2 of them at Berlin. Rated PG.

KOKO NI IRUKOTO aka Being Here (2001-Japan) 115m *** D: Masahiko Nagasawa (feature debut). Machiko Kochi, Masato Sakai (KEY OF LIFE). Frustrated career-woman Shino (Kochi) has been handed a wad of money by her lover's wife. Shino not only has to end her illicit affair with her company's manager, she's being transferred from Tokyo headquarters to the decidedly less glamorous Osaka branch. She's about to quit when she meets eccentric co-worker Maeno (Sakai) who humorously changes her outlook. Winner of 7 awards. For ages 13 and older.

BEARS (2014-US) 78m *** ½ D: Alastair Fothergill, Keith Scholey. Narrated by John C. Reilly (WRECK-IT RALPH). Through the magical lens of Disney comes a delightful documentary on the adventures of a bear family. Courageous mother bear Sky and her rambunctious cubs Scout and Amber hunt and play in the Alaskan wilderness. Gorgeous nature photography and an endearing story make for fine family entertainment. Nominated for an award. Rated G.

ON PROBATION aka Tiempo de valientes (2005-Argentina) 112m *** ½ D: Damián Szifron (THE BOTTOM OF THE SEA). Diego Peretti, Luis Luque, Óscar Ferreiro, Gabriela Iscovich. Mariano Silverstein (Peretti), a high-strung Buenos Aires shrink, is on probation from causing an auto accident. For his community service, he's assigned to ride in a patrol car with hard-boiled cop Alfredo Díaz (Luque), who's depressed over his marriage. This mismatched pair becomes a crime-fighting dynamo in this hilarious action comedy. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 13 and older.

GOOD OLD DAZE aka Le Péril Jeune (1994-France) 101m *** ½ D: Cédric Klapisch (L'AUBERGE ESPAGNOLE). Romain Duris, Vincent Elbaz, Nicolas Koretzky, Julien Lambroschini, Joachim Lombard, Julie-Anne Roth. Four men who were close friends in a Paris high school reunite in the mid-1980s to await the birth of a child fathered by their recently deceased buddy. They recall their senior year in 1975, when politics, girls and drugs were a potently hedonistic brew. This comedy-drama won 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

RIVALS aka Les liens du sang (2008-France) 104m *** D: Jacques Maillot. Guillaume Canet (FARE-WELL), François Cluzet (TELL NO ONE), Clotilde Hesme, Marie Denarnaud, Mehdi Nebbou. This terrific crime drama set in 1979 Lyon concerns two brothers on opposite sides of the law. Cop François (Canet) tries to help his older brother Gabriel (Cluzet) go straight after his release from prison. But François has a problem—he's the lover of the wife of the man he's put behind bars, and that man is about to be released. For ages 15 and older.

THE AUCTION aka Le démantèlement (2013-Canada) 111m *** D: Sébastien Pilote. Gabriel Arcand, Gilles Renaud, Lucie Laurier, Sophie Desmarais. In this bucolic Quebecois take on King Lear, sheep farmer Gaby (Arcand) is asked by his daughter Marie (Laurier) for a large sum of money in order to keep from losing her Montreal home. Gaby, who has always treated his daughters like princesses, tries to find a way to raise the money to help Marie. This poignant drama won 3 awards, including one at Cannes. Rated PG.
