MAMMA MIA! (2008-US/UK/Germany) 109m *** D: Phyllida Lloyd (THE IRON LADY). Meryl Streep, Pierce Brosnan, Amanda Seyfried, Stellan Skarsgård, Colin Firth, Julie Walters. Set against an azure sky and glittering sea on a picturesque Greek island, watching this infectious musical comedy is like going on a little vacation. Twenty-year-old Sophie (Seyfried), who has never known her dad's identity, invites three likely candidates Bill (Skarsgård), Sam (Brosnan) and Harry (Firth) to her wedding... and they all accept! What a shock for mom (Streep). This joyous ABBA songfest won 15 awards. Rated PG-13.

DISOBEDIENCE (2017-UK/Ireland/US) 115m *** D: Sebastián Lelio (A FANTASTIC WOMAN). Rachel Weisz, Rachel McAdams, Alessandro Nivola, Anton Lesser. Rabbi Kruschka (Lesser) dies while delivering a sermon in North London. His daughter Ronit (Weisz) flies home from New York to her old Orthodox community to pay her respects. Her return reignites her powerful mutual attraction with Esti (McAdams), who is married to Ronit's friend Dovid (Nivola). Their reunion causes deep emotional turmoil with each of the three. Nominated for 2 awards. Rated R.

ISLE OF DOGS (2018-Germany/US) 101m **** D: Wes Anderson (FANTASTIC MR. FOX). Voiced by Bryan Cranston, Koyu Rankin, Edward Norton, Bill Murray, Greta Gerwig, Scarlett Johansson, Yoko Ono. In this captivating stop-motion animation set in the Japan of the near future, 12-year-old Atari (Rankin) steals a plane and tries to rescue his beloved pet from Trash Island, where the crooked mayor of Megasaki City has exiled all dogs. Intricate in both visual and narrative detail, this delightful hero's journey won 5 awards so far, including Best Director (Wes Anderson) at Berlin. Rated PG-13.

HACHI: A DOG'S TALE (2009-US/UK) 93m *** ½ D: Lasse Hallström (MY LIFE AS A DOG). Richard Gere, Joan Allen, Cary-Hiroyuki Tagawa, Sarah Roemer, Jason Alexander. At the large, busy Shibuya Station in Tokyo, you'll see one exit has more young lovers waiting for their dates than any other. It's the exit that features a statue of Hachiko, the Akita dog who symbolizes undying loyalty. This is Hachiko's story, transported from Tokyo to Rhode Island. This touching tale is No. 210 on IMDb's Top Rated Movies list. Rated G.

AT THE END OF THE TUNNEL *aka Al final del túnel* (2016-Argen-tina/Spain) 120m *** ½ D: Rodrigo Grande (A MATTER OF PRINCIPLES). Leonardo Sbaraglia, Clara Lago, Pablo Echarri, Federico Luppi. Wheelchair-bound computer engineer Joaquín (Sbaraglia), in dire need of cash, rents out his upstairs room to exotic dancer Berta (Lago) and her six-year-old daughter. Meanwhile, he discovers that robbers are tunneling under his house to the bank next door. Joaquín decides to steal from the robbers, putting himself and his vulnerable tenants in grave peril. This nerve-shredding thriller won 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE FACE OF JIZO (2004-Japan) 99m *** ½ D: Kazuo Kuroki. Ric Miyazawa, Yoshio Harada, Tadanobu Asano. This touching adaptation of Hisashi Inoue's play "Chichi to kuraseba" takes place over 4 days in Hiroshima in the summer of 1948. Beautiful young librarian Mitsue (Miyazawa) is visited by her father Takezou's (Harada) ghost. Takezou's spirit has found out that Mitsue is in love. Tormented by feelings of guilt from surviving the atomic bomb, Mitsue is avoiding her feelings for shy researcher Kinoshita (Asano). With loving warmth and humor, her father's ghost encourages her to embrace life. Winner of 6 awards. For ages 12 and older.

NAGASAKI: MEMORIES OF MY SON *aka Haha to kuraseba* (2015-Japan) 130m *** D: Yôji Yamada (THE LITTLE HOUSE). Sayuri Yoshinaga, Kazunari Ninomiya, Haru Kuroki, Tadanobu Asano. In post-World War II Nagasaki, widow Nobuko (Yoshinaga) tries to make sense of the loss of her youngest son Koji (Ninomiya) who was killed by the atomic bomb on August 9, 1945. In this introspective, touching and gently upbeat film, jovial and talkative Koji returns home to visit his mother in the form of a ghost. Winner of 4 awards. For ages 12 and older.

GIANTS AND TOYS *aka Kyojin to gangu* (1958-Japan) 95m *** ½ D: Yasuzo Masumura (THE HOODLUM SOLDIER). Hiroshi Kawaguchi, Hitomi Nozoe, Hideo Takamatsu. Three candy companies engage in a cut-throat war for market share in this sharp (and shockingly up-to-date) satire. Slick ad-man Gôda (Takamatsu) of World Caramel forces his assistant Nishi (Kawaguchi) to look after his new teen spokes-model Kyôko (Nozoe). As Kyôko's popularity skyrockets (along with her ego), and the ad campaigns of rival companies Apollo and Giant reach a fever pitch, Nishi tries to hang on to his principles in this fabulously kitschy comedy. For ages 10 and older.

GOLDEN ORCHESTRA *aka Oke Rôjin!* (2016-Japan) 120m *** D: Tôru Hosokawa. Anne Watanabe (daughter of Ken), Takashi Sasano, Kentarô Sakaguchi, Tonpei Hidari, Philippe Aymard, Chizuru (Watanabe), a new teacher at Umeogaoka High School, attends a concert by the local symphony and is inspired to join as a violinist. When she's enthusiastically accepted into the Umeogaoka Symphony Orchestra without an audition she realizes her mistake—there are TWO orchestras in town, and she applied for the one full of old people who can barely play in tune! Not having the heart to disappoint the plucky elders, she stays and grows to love her new friends. For ages 10 and older.

HOTEL HIBISCUS (2002-Japan) 92m *** ½ D: Yuji Nakae (NAB-BIE'S LOVE). Honami Kurashita, Sôkô Wada, Kimiko Yo, Masao Teruya, Seijin Noborikawa, Tomi Taira. Rowdy little Mieko (Kurashita), the youngest daughter of a rainbow-colored Okinawan family, rescues Japanese heatstroke victim Notojima (Wada), and brings him to her family's run-down hotel. As Notojima gets adopted by Mieko's goofy clan, Mieko investigates the neighborhood crazy cat lady and hunts for the elusive *kijimuna*. This endearing comedy won 5 awards. For ages 10 and older.

TULLY (2018-US) 95m *** ½ D: Jason Reitman (JUNO). Mackenzie Davis, Charlize Theron, Mark Duplass. Stressed-out mom Marlo (Theron), upon giving birth to her third child, reluctantly accepts the gift of a "night nurse" from her wealthy brother (Duplass) in this funny and honest film about motherhood. The night nurse, Tully (Davis), a wise-beyond-her-years millennial who cares for the newborn while Marlo gets some sleep, challenges Marlo in unexpected ways. Brilliantly scripted by Diablo Cody (JUNO), this dramedy was nominated for 1 award. Rated R.

KAFOO: WAITING FOR HAPPINESS *aka Kafu o machiwabite* (2009-Japan) 121m *** D: Yu Nakai. Tetsuji Tamayama (HEAVEN'S BOOKSTORE), Maiko, Shogen. While visiting a Shinto shrine during Obon season, lonely young Okinawan shopkeeper Akio (Tamayama) writes his wish for a bride on a wooden tablet and offers it with a little prayer. A few days later, he receives a letter from Sachi (Maiko), who proposes to be his wife. When he meets her he discovers that she's beautiful, kind, and perhaps a little too perfect... why would she choose him? This charming romance about a guy and his dog features lovely vignettes of small town life in Okinawa. For ages 10 and older.

FINDING YOUR FEET (2017-UK) 111m *** D: Richard Loncraine (MY HOUSE IN UMBRIA). Imelda Staunton, Celia Imrie, Timothy Spall, Joanna Lumley. Snobbish society matron Lady Sandra (Staunton) leaves her philandering husband in a huff to stay with her estranged boho sister Bif (Imrie) in this delightful comedy. Sandra is racist and small-minded, but she gets a chance at redemption when she joins her sister's dance class and meets handyman Charlie (who knew Timothy Spall could be sexy?). This charmer won the Audience Award at the Palm Springs International Film Festival. Rated PG-13.

SAYONARA, KURO (2003-Japan) 109m *** D: Joji Matsuoka (MIDNIGHT DINER). Satoshi Tsumabuki, Ayumi Itô, Hirofumi Arai, Akira Emoto, Ryûta Satô, Hisashi Igawa. Based on a true story, this heartwarmer about Kuro, an abandoned dog turned school mascot, is set in 1960s Matsumoto, Nagano, Japan. When teenager Kimura (Tsumabuki) gives her part of his lunch, she follows him to his high school where she stays for 12 years, befriending 4,800 students. Like all great friends, she brings out the best in those she loves. Winner of 6 awards. For ages 10 and older.

THE LEISURE SEEKER (2017-Italy/France) 112m *** D: Paolo Virzì (LIKE CRAZY). Helen Mirren, Donald Sutherland, Christian McKay, Janet Moloney. Old married couple John (Sutherland) and Ella (Mirren) take a road trip in the rusty Winnebago they call 'The Leisure Seeker' from Boston to Key West in this romantic comedy. With John in the early stages of Alzheimer's, the pair grab their last opportunity to reignite their passion for life. Winner of 3 awards and nominated for a Golden Globe for Mirren's performance. Rated R.

ARROZY TARTANA (2003-Spain) 128m *** D: José Antonio Escrivá. Carmen Maura (VOLVER), Eloy Azorin, María Almodóvar. At the close of the 19th century in Valencia, beautiful widow Doña Manuela de Fora (Maura) has known better times. The treasures of her opulent home are being pawned off one by one as she keeps up appearances to attract wealthy suitors for her daughters. Meanwhile, to her dismay, her hardworking son Juanito (Azorin) falls in love with a humble seamstress (Almodóvar) and rescues a street urchin. This tale of class and greed is sumptuous with period detail. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 10 and older.

ELINA: AS IF I WASN'T THERE *aka Elina - Som om jag inte fanns* (2002-Sweden/Finland) 74m *** ½ D: Klaus Härö (THE FENCER). Natalie Minnevik, Bibi Andersson (PERSONA), Marjaana Maijala, Henrik Rafeelsen. In the early 1950s in rural Sweden, flinty little Finn Elina (Minnevik) returns to school after recovering from tuberculosis, the same sickness that killed her beloved father. She soon butts heads with headmistress Miss Holm (Andersson) who forbids her students from speaking Finnish. As stubborn as her dad (and proud of it), Elina turns her classroom upside-down in this charming tale. Winner of 13 awards. For ages 10 and older.

STARS ABOVE *aka Tähtitaivas talon yllä* (2012-Finland/Iceland) 105m *** D: Saara Cantell (HEART-BEATS). Elin Petersdottir, Meri Nenonen, Irina Björklund, Leo Honkonen. Women of three generations try to find their soulmates while living in a farmhouse in rural eastern Finland. During the Continuation War in the 1940s school teacher Saima (Björklund) faces discrimination as an educated woman. Her free-spirited daughter Tuulikki (Nenonen) starts a sheep farm in the 1970s, and Tuulikki's daughter Salla (Petersdottir), recently divorced, returns to the farmhouse to find her purpose in the 2010s. This engaging tale won 1 award. For ages 12 and older.

THOROUGHBREDS (2017-US) 92m *** D: Cory Finley (debut). Olivia Cooke (READY PLAYER ONE), Anya Taylor-Joy (SPLIT), Anton Yelchin (3/11/1989 - 6/19/2016), Paul Sparks. Teenage girls Amanda (Cooke) and Lily (Taylor-Joy), both from very wealthy families, hire aspiring drug dealer Tim (Yelchin) to help get rid of Lily's detested stepfather Mark (Sparks) in this blacker-than-black comedy. Set in suburban Connecticut, this uniquely unsettling study of friendship won an award at the Denver International Film Festival. Rated R.

ZERO FOCUS *aka Zero no shôten* (1961-Japan) 95m *** ½ D: Yoshitarô Nomura (THE CASTLE OF SAND). Yoshiko Kuga, Hizuru Takachio, Kôji Nanbara. Ad executive Kenichi Uhara (Nanbara) is promoted to the Tokyo head office, takes a trip to his old territory of Kanazawa, and disappears. Teiko (Kuga), his wife of one week, digs into her husband's background for clues, and discovers she knows next to nothing about Kenichi's past. This Hitchcockian thriller was scripted by Shinobu Hashimoto (4/18/1918 - 7/19/2018), who brought Japanese cinema to international fame by writing RASHOMON. For ages 12 and older.

10 PROMISES TO MY DOG *aka Inu to watashi no 10 no yakusoku* (2008-Japan) 117m *** ½ D: Katsuhide Motoki. Rena Tanaka, Etsushi Toyokawa, Ryo Kase, Reiko Takashima, Akira Fuse. Fourteen-year-old Akari spends a lot of time alone. Her sickly mother (Takashima) is often in the hospital, and her physician father (Toyokawa) is always working. When Akari adopts an adorable golden retriever puppy, her mother has Akari make 10 promises. Ten years later, Akari (Tanaka) is reminded of her promises to her now neglected pet. Is she too late? For ages 10 and older.

OUR LITTLE SISTER *aka Umimachi Diary* (2015-Japan) 128m *** ½ D: Hirokazu Koreeda (I WISH). Haruka Ayase, Masami Nagasawa, Kaho, Suzu Hirose, Ryo Kase. Three adult sisters live in their late grandmother's house in Kamakura, Japan. When their long-estranged father dies, the sisters discover they have a half-sister, Suzu (Hirose), the daughter of the woman who was responsible for their parents' breakup. The sisters impulsively invite Suzu to live with them in Kamakura in this compassionate and gentle comedy-drama. Winner of 12 awards. Rated PG.

DEADPOOL 2 (2018-US) 119m *** ½ D: David Leitch (ATOMIC BLONDE). Ryan Reynolds, Josh Brolin, Morena Baccarin, Julian Dennison, Zazie Beetz, Eddie Marsan. A dispirited Deadpool (Reynolds) finds new purpose by protecting teenage mutant Russell (Dennison), the adorable kid from HUNT FOR THE WILDERPEOPLE from time-traveling baddie Cable (Brolin). The jokes, pop-culture references and outrageous carnage keep coming at a dizzying pace in this surprisingly touching foul-mouthed adventure. Winner of 2 awards. Rated R.

BOOK CLUB (2018-US) 104m *** D: Bill Holderman (debut). Diane Keaton, Jane Fonda, Candice Bergen, Mary Steenburgen, Andy Garcia, Craig T. Nelson, Don Johnson, Alicia Silverstone, Richard Dreyfuss. Four mature ladies spice up their book club by reading "50 Shades of Grey" in this delightfully saucy comedy. Their book choice ends up inspiring some heart-palpitating action outside the club: judge Sharon (Bergen) dates online; recent widow Diane (Keaton) gets romanced by a younger man (Garcia); Carol (Steenburgen) tries to reignite her marriage; and Vivian (Fonda) encounters an old flame (Johnson). Rated PG-13.
