ASUMMER TALE aka Den bästa sommaren (2000-Sweden) 87m *** D: Ulf Malmros. Kjell Bergqvist, Anastasios Soulis, Rebecca Scheja, Cecilia Nilsson, Brasse Brännström. A pair of young orphans, Mårten (Soulis) and Annika (Scheja), journey to a small Swedish village during the summer of 1958 to stay with crusty middle-aged Yngve (Bergqvist), an undertaker who owns a farm. The kids decide to find the grumpy cuss a girlfriend. This warm comedy won 6 film awards. For all ages.

THOSE HAPPY YEARS aka Anni felici (2013-Italy/ France) 106m *** D: Daniele Luchetti (MY BROTHER IS AN ONLY CHILD). Kim Rossi Stuart, Micaela Ramazzotti, Martina Gedeck, Samuel Garofalo. The summer of 1974 is remembered by young Dario (Garofalo), the son of Rome-based artist Guido (Stuart), a womanizing narcissist who lives to shock his audience, and his long-suffering mother Serena (Ramazzotti). When Serena decides to take Dario and his brother on vacation to France without their dad, the power dynamics start to shift in this memorable film. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 15 and older.

APPLAUS (2009-Denmark) 83m *** ½ D: Martin Zandvliet. Paprika Steen (OKAY), Michael Falch, Sara-Marie Maltha, Shanti Roney, Malou Reymann. On stage, actress Thea Barfoed (Steen) is applauded for her role as Martha, a raging alcoholic, in *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?* Off stage, Thea is a boozer too, and trying to get sober to gain access to her two young sons is a much harder role—one without applause. This engrossing character study won 8 awards, 5 of them for Paprika Steen's brilliant performance. Rated R.

THE YELLOW HANDKERCHIEF aka Shiawase no kiiroi hankachi (1977-Japan) 108m *** D: Yoji Yamada (TOKYO FAMILY). Ken Takakura, Chieko Baishô, Kaori Momoi, Tetsuya Takeda. Three strangers travel Hokkaido by car, each with a difficult past. Kin'ya (Takeda) was just dumped by his girlfriend, Akemi's (Momoi) escaping problems at home, and mysterious Yûsaku (Takakura) harbors some deep heartache. Their stories are revealed along the way, with plenty of humor and humanity. This touching road movie won 27 awards, including 6 from the Japanese Academy. For ages 12 and older. Note: Ours is an extremely rare English subtitled screening.

ELSA Y FRED (2005-Argentina/Spain) 106m *** ½ D: Marcos Carnevale. Manuel Alexandre, China Zorrilla (CONVERSATIONS WITH MOTHER), Blanca Portillo. This enchanting love story concerns Fred (Alexandre), a 77-year-old hypochondriac and Elsa (Zorrilla), a recklessly joyous 82-year-old. On the wall of Elsa's apartment is a framed still of Anita Ekberg in the Trevi fountain, taken from LA DOLCE VITA. In Elsa's mind, she's Anita, and she refuses to let reality intrude on her dream. This movie about love and movies won 9 awards. Rated PG.

BACK TO BURGUNDY aka Ce qui nous lie (2017-France) 114m *** D: Cédric Klapisch (L'AUBERGE ESPAGNOLE). Pio Marmaï, Ana Girardot, François Civil. In this comedy-drama set in the vineyards of Burgundy, three siblings inherit their family's winery. Jean (Marmaï) is a hotshot winemaker in Australia and is only reluctantly there to assist his brother and sister. Juliette (Girardot) is thrust into a leadership position for which she's not quite ready. Youngest sibling Jérémie (Civil) is struggling to become his own man, overshadowed by his wealthy father-inlaw. This film is rich and complex with just the right amount of sweetness. For ages 12 and older.

PLATO'S ACADEMY aka Akadimia Platonos (2009-Greece/Germany) 103m *** D: Filippos Tsitos. Antonis Kafetzopoulos, Anastasis Kozdine, Titika Sarigouli. Athens shopkeeper Stavros (Kafetzopoulos) spends most of his day with his layabout friends watching hardworking Albanian laborers erect a monument. Stavros's wife has left him and his mom (Sarigouli) has suffered a stroke, so his only consolation is that he's Greek and not Albanian. One day, an Albanian immigrant (Kozdine) greets Stavros's mother, and she replies...in Albanian! This delightful comedy won 5 awards from around the world. For ages 12 and older.

THE NEPHEW (1998-Ireland) 100m *** D: Eugene Brady. Hill Harper, Donal McCann, Pierce Brosnan, Sinéad Cusack, Aislin McGuckin, Phelim Drew, Luke Griffin, Niall Toibin. Friendly Chad (Harper), a 17-year-old New Yorker, arrives in a small Irish island town to visit his estranged uncle Tony (McCann), a grumpy and narrow-minded farmer. The little town is abuzz about the handsome dreadlocked stranger, unlocking closets full of skeletons in this breezy romantic comedy-drama. A delightful Celtic soundtrack and gorgeous scenery make this film a treat for eyes and ears. PG-13.

ACCUSED (2012-UK) 120m *** ½ Mo's Story D: David Blair. Anne-Marie Duff, Olivia Colman, Thomas Brodie-Sangster. In a community riven by gang violence, Mo (Duff) struggles to operate her hair salon with her best friend Sue (Colman). When Sue's teenage son Sean is shot dead, Mo and Sue's friendship faces a crisis in this beautifully acted crime drama. Tracie's Story D: Ashley Pearce. Sean Bean, Stephen Graham, Rachel Leskovac. English teacher Simon's (Bean) alter ego Tracie, who frequents nightclubs in a blonde wig and makeup, gets embroiled in a love triangle that leads to a crime of passion in this engrossing character study/mystery. For ages 15 and older.

AGATHA RAISIN: THE QUICHE OF DEATH (2014-UK) 94m *** D: Geoffrey Sax. Ashley Jensen, Matthew Horne, Katy Wix, Matt McCooey, Robert Bathurst, Jamie Glover. Fulfilling a childhood dream, Agatha Raisin (Jensen) sells her successful London PR firm and relocates to a quaint village in the Cotswolds in this funny and charming mystery. To ingratiate herself with the natives, Agatha enters a quiche baking contest and makes a killing (literally). Now a suspect, Agatha launches her career as an amateur sleuth. For ages 12 and older.

WALLANDER: THE THIEF aka Tjuven (2010-Sweden) 90m *** D: Stephan Apelgren. Krister Henriksson, Lena Endre, Fredrik Gunnarsson. Three angry neighbors band together to form a neighborhood watch in response to a spate of burglaries in their Ystad community. Meanwhile, a Polish illegal immigrant disappears, leaving a distraught wife and children. Detective Wallander (Henriksson) comes to believe the two are linked in this engrossing mystery. For ages 15 and older.

THE OATH aka Eiðurinn (2016-Iceland/UK/Germany) 100m *** D: Baltasar Kormákur (EVEREST). Baltasar Kormákur, Hera Hilmar, Gísli Örn Garðarsson. Talented Reykjavik surgeon Finnur (Kormákur) is happily married with a young child. His only troubles come from his daughter from a previous marriage, Anna (Hilmar), an unemployed dropout who's 'madly in love' with slick drug dealer Óttar (Garðarsson). Desperate to remove Óttar's influence on his daughter, the good doctor takes increasingly extreme measures to save Anna in this taut thriller. Winner of 6 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE FATHER (2020-UK/France) 97m **** D: Florian Zeller (feature debut). Anthony Hopkins, Olivia Colman, Mark Gatiss, Olivia Williams, Imogen Poots, Rufus Sewell. A proud old man (Hopkins) begins to lose touch with reality as his dementia grows worse. His exasperated daughter (Colman) struggles to find ways to help her father and still maintain her freedom in this brilliant film adaptation of Florian Zeller's play. Anthony Hopkins won the Best Actor Oscar for this film, making him the oldest to win an acting award at age 83. Winner of 26 awards total. Rated PG-13.

THE FORGIVENESS OF BLOOD (2011-US/Albania/Denmark/Italy/UK) 105m *** D: Joshua Marston (MARIA FULL OF GRACE). Tristan Halilaj, Refet Abazi, Sindi Lacej. A dispute between neighbors turns deadly, forcing the head of one family, Mark (Abazi), to go into hiding, and for his teenage children Nik (Halilaj) and Rudina (Lacej) to be confined at home. Although they live in the era of cell phones in Albania, Mark's family barely scrapes by selling bread from a horse-drawn cart. Because a man was killed, they now live under the ancient code of Kanun that demands blood for blood. This harrowing tale won 4 awards, 2 of them at Berlin. For ages 12 and older.

WALLANDER: THE SNIPER aka Skytten (2010-Sweden) 93m *** D: Agneta Fagerström-Olsson. Krister Henriksson, Sverrir Gudnason, Nina Zanjani. A jewel thief is found dead in his car, a victim of a sniper with extraordinary skill. When the jewel thief's ex-girlfriend is brought in for questioning, rookie cop Pontus (Gudnason) becomes the sniper's target in this heart-pounding thriller. For ages 15 and older.

CHASING SHADOWS: ONLY CONNECT (2014-UK) 90m *** D: Christopher Menaul. Reece Shearsmith, Alex Kingston, Letitia Wright. Brilliant but socially clueless detective Sean Stone (Shearsmith) is kicked out of the homicide department and is demoted to working with kindly divorcee Ruth Hattersley (Kingston) in Missing Persons. When 16-year-old Taylor Davis (Wright) goes missing, Stone is convinced she's in danger even though she is a known runaway. Tracking Taylor's online activities reveals a series of teen disappearances in this fascinating thriller. For ages 12 and older.

SUNNY: TSUYOI KIMOCHI TSUYOI AI (2018-Japan) 119m *** D: Hitoshi Ône. Ryôko Shinohara (BENTO HARRASSMENT), Suzu Hirose, Yuka Itaya, Maika Yamamoto, Naomi Watanabe, Elaiza Ikeda, Lily Franky. While at the hospital, middle-aged mom Nami (Shinohara) runs into Serika (Itaya), a friend from high school. As teenagers, transfer student Nami (Hirose) was befriended by Serika (Yamamoto), leader of a merry posse of rowdy girls called "Sunny". Given only a month more to live, Serika asks Nami to find Sunny's other members in this heartfelt and energetic remake of the 2011 Korean hit SUNNY. Nominated for 1 award. For ages 12 and older.

CHASING SHADOWS: OFF RADAR (2014-UK) 90m *** ½ D: Jim O'Hanlon. Reece Shearsmith, Alex Kingston, Paul Ritter, Mensah Bediako, Roger Jean Nsengiyumva, Noel Clarke, Alfie Field. Detective Sean Stone traces the last journey of missing attorney Steve Eli (Bediako) to a spot where two other men were killed by Leonard Vance (Ritter), a patient at a mental institution. Despite the misgivings of their boss, Inspector Prior (Clarke), Sean and his partner Ruth (Kingston) decide to interview Vance in this twisty whodunit. For ages 12 and older.

TSUKIJI WONDERLAND (2016-Japan) 111m *** ½ D: Naotarô Endô. The dish celebrated at the very pinnacle of Japanese cuisine is also among the simplest: raw seafood. Glistening slices of toro or abalone or amaebi might be given a dash of soy sauce, a drop of lemon juice, or a sprinkle of roasted sea salt, nothing more. And to experience this, the simplest of foods, people will pay hundreds of dollars. This doc explores the origins of this cuisine through Tsukiji market and its centuries of food culture. Nominated for 1 award. For foodies aged 10 and older. Since October 11 2018, Tsukiji's fish auction has relocated to Toyosu Market, in large part due to the Tokyo 2020 Summer Olympics. The Tsukiji retail market remains at its traditional location.

HERE TODAY (2021-US) 117m *** D: Billy Crystal (FORGET PARIS). Billy Crystal, Tiffany Haddish. Highly accomplished comedy writer Charlie Burnz (Crystal) strikes up an unlikely friendship with street singer Emma Payge (Haddish) in this warm and funny comedy-drama. As Charlie's memory begins to fail, brash and fearless Emma steps in to reconnect him with his family. Chicago Sun-Times says "The laughs come at a rapid-fire pace." Rated PG-13.

NERO WOLFE: THE DOORBELL RANG (2001-US) 94m **** D: Timothy Hutton. Maury Chaykin, Timothy Hutton, Debra Monk, Bill Smitrovich, Francie Swift. Claiming she's being harassed by J. Edgar Hoover's FBI agents, wealthy Mrs. Bruner (Monk) offers brilliant armchair detective Nero Wolfe (Chaykin) \$100,000 to get them off her back. As a result, Wolfe's dapper partner Archie Goodwin (Hutton) must evade a horde of spying G-men on the streets of New York to gather information in this witty cloak-and-dagger tale set in the 1950s. For ages 12 and older.

HEAT OF THE SUN: PRIVATE LIVES (1998-UK) 101m *** ½ D: Adrian Shergold. Trevor Eve, Susannah Harker, James Callis, Michael Byrne, Freddie Annobil-Dodoo. In this nifty mystery set in 1930s Kenya, disgraced detective Albert Tybrun (Eve) is sent from Scotland Yard to head the criminal division in Nairobi. Despite his superiors' insistence that she was killed by a lion, Tyburn investigates the death of Lady Daphne Ellesmere as a murder. This provokes the ire of Nairobi's racist elites. Fortunately, Tyburn has the support of Lady Daphne's aviatrix sister, Emma (Harker), who has no interest in social one-upmanship. For ages 12 and older.
