40 YEARS OF SILENCE: AN INDONESIAN TRAGEDY (2009-US) 86m *** D: Robert Lemelson. In 1965, an estimated 500,000 to 1,000,000 people were secretly killed under General Suharto's authoritarian rule in Indonesia. In this deeply moving documentary, four individuals and their families from Central Java and Bali break the silence and discuss their experiences as survivors of the purge. This documentary acts as a companion piece to the brilliant *THE ACT OF KILLING* recently in theaters. For ages 13 and older.

TWO LIVES PLUS ONE aka Deux vies...plus une (2007-France) 86m *** D: Idit Cebula (feature debut). Emmanuelle Devos (*THE OTHER SON*), Gérard Darmon (*DIVA*), Jocelyn Quivrin, Michel Jonasz. In this charming comedy, Jewish mother Eliane (Devos) alarms her family when she steps out of her role to write a memoir. Eliane is delighted when publisher David (Quivrin) takes interest in her book, though her husband Sylvain (Darmon) is less than pleased... David is a bit too young and handsome. For ages 12 and older.

MODIGLIANI OF MONTPARNASSE aka Les amants de Montparnasse (1958-France/Italy) 104m *** ½ D: Jacques Becker (*LE TROU*). Gérard Philipe (*BEAUTY AND THE DEVIL*), Lilli Palmer (*BODY AND SOUL*), Gérard Séty, Lino Ventura, Anouk Aimée (*A MAN AND A WOMAN*). This rare, gorgeous film set in 1919 Paris chronicles painter Amadeo Modigliani's (Philipe) last year of life. Young, handsome and broke, Modigliani is also almost always drunk. Alcohol fuels his art and taints his relationships with women—until the day he meets elegant Jeanne (Aimée). While portraying a dying man Philipe was also seriously ill, making his performance extraordinarily poignant. For ages 13 and older.

BALIBO (2009-Australia) 111m *** D: Robert Connolly (*THE BANK*). Anthony LaPaglia (*LANTANA*), Oscar Isaac (*DRIVE*). In November, 1975, Australian foreign correspondent Roger East (LaPaglia) is recruited by 25-year-old foreign minister for the "Democratic Republic of East Timor", José Ramos-Horta (Isaac), to run the East Timor News Agency. East agrees on the condition that he be allowed to investigate the disappearance of five Australian journalists during the Indonesian invasion four weeks earlier. This powerful film won 13 awards. For ages 15 and older.

STORIES WE TELL (2012-Canada) 108m **** D: Sarah Polley (*AWAY FROM HER*). In this documentary, filmmaker/actress Sarah Polley investigates a mystery from within her own family. The youngest child of Canadian theatrical parents, Polley was 11 years old when her mother Diane died of cancer in 1990. During an interview, Sarah is told, "... your father might be someone that Mum had acted with in a play". Searching for clues from playful (and often contradictory) recollections, Sarah Polley learns how she *literally* came into being. Winner of 3 awards. PG-13.

THE WOMAN IN THE RUMOR aka Uwasa no onna (1954-Japan) 84m *** ½ D: Kenji Mizoguchi (*UGETSU*). Kinuyo Tanaka (*BALLAD OF NARAYAMA*), Tomoemon Otani, Yoshiko Kuga, Eitarō Shindō. The woman in the rumor is Hatsuho (Tanaka), the aging madam of a famous house of high-class courtesans. When Hatsuho's respectable daughter Yukiko (Kuga) returns home from Tokyo, trouble erupts when she romances her mother's beau, young Dr. Matoba (Otani). Come see this sumptuous, newly restored romantic drama set in 1950s Kyoto. For ages 12 and older.

THE DREAMER aka Sang pemimpi (2009-Indonesia) 122m *** D: Riri Riza (*LASKAR PELANGI*). Vikri Septiawan, Rendy Ahmad, Lukman Sardi, Ariel Peterpan, Azwi Fitrianto. This humorous and touching sequel to *LASKAR PELANGI* focuses on Ikal (Septiawan) who is now a high schooler in the 1980s. Ikal is constantly in trouble thanks to his adopted brother Arai's (Ahmad) crazy adventures. Along with their pal Jimbron (Fitrianto), Arai and Ikal rely on each other to travel the rocky path to manhood. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

LASKAR PELANGI aka The Rainbow Troops (2008-Indonesia) 124m *** D: Riri Riza. Cut Mini Theo, Ikranagara, Tora Sudiro, Slamet Rahardjo, Mathias Muchus. This adaptation of Andrea Hirata's best seller concerns a decrepit primary school on the Sumatran island of Belitung. Teachers Bu Muslimah (Theo) and Pak Farfan (Ikranagara) worry because their school will be shut down if they can't sign up 10 students. The adorable kids who show up are christened *Laskar Pelangi* (rainbow troops). This film broke Indonesian box office records and won 2 awards. All ages.

MITSUKO DELIVERS aka Hara ga kore nande (2011-Japan) 109m *** D: Yūya Ishii (*SAWAKO DECIDES*). Riisa Naka, Aoi Nakamura, Ryo Ishibashi, Miyoko Inagawa. Thirty-something Mitsuko (Naka) is single, nine months pregnant and broke. But she's not discouraged—she has a life philosophy based on the Edo-period word "iki" (effortlessly impressive—translated in the film as "cool"). No matter what life hands her, Mitsuko is never defeated, and instead helps people around her *whether they like it or not*. This film, like Mitsuko, is funny, quirky yet full of humanity. For ages 12 and older.

ONE SUMMER OF HAPPINESS aka Hon dansade en sommar (1951-Sweden) 103m *** D: Arne Mattsson. Ulla Jacobsson, Folke Sundquist, Edvin Adolphson, John Elfström. After graduating from high school, 19-year-old city boy Göran (Sundquist) visits his Uncle Anders's (Adolphson) farm for the summer. Love blossoms between Göran and lovely 17-year-old farm girl Kerstin (Jacobsson) in this famous banned-in-the-US romance. Winner at Berlin and Cannes. For ages 13 and older (brief nude scene).

A SPOT OF BOTHER aka Une petite zone de turbulences (2009-France) 108m *** D: Alfred Lot. Michel Blanc (*MONSIEUR HIRE*), Miou-Miou, Mélanie Doutey, Gilles Lellouche (*ANTHONY ZIMMER*). Recently retired, Jean-Paul (Blanc) has way too much time on his hands. He's become such a hypochondriac he's convinced a spot of eczema on his hip is terminal cancer. Jean-Paul's anxiety throws his entire family off balance, and soon his wife (Miou-Miou) is cheating on him, his son has announced he's gay and everything is in an uproar. This comedy is for ages 13 and older.

THE HOUSE OF BRANCHING LOVE (2009-Finland) 102m *** D: Mika Kaurismäki (*THREE WISE MEN*). Elina Knihtilä, Hannu-Pekka Björkman, Antti Reini, Anna Easteden. This outrageous sex comedy has 30-something Juhani (Björkman) and his wife Tuula (Knihtilä) in an escalating war of vindictive hanky-panky upon their divorce. A top grosser at the Finnish box office, this film was nominated for 3 Jussi Awards. For mature audiences 17 and older.

STAR TREK INTO DARKNESS (2013-US) 132m **** D: J.J. Abrams (*STAR TREK*). Chris Pine, Zachary Quinto, Zoe Saldana, Karl Urban, Simon Pegg, John Cho, Benedict Cumberbatch ("Sherlock"). This follow-up of director Abrams's rousing 2009 *STAR TREK* has maverick Captain James T. Kirk (Pine) and his crew hunting down terrorist John Harrison (Cumberbatch). With plucky engineer Scotty (Pegg) shouting from the sidelines, the Enterprise hurtles through the cosmos bringing first-rate adventure, action and laughs. Winner of an award. Rated PG-13.

OEROEG (1993-Indonesia/Belgium/Netherlands) 114m *** D: Hans Hylkema. Jeroen Krabbé, Rik Launspach, Martin Schwab, Peter Faber, José Rizal Manua. In this thought-provoking drama set during the Indonesian war for independence, close childhood friends grow up to be Dutch engineer Johan (Launspach) and Indonesian guerrilla Oeroeg (Schwab) on opposing sides of the conflict. This deeply insightful drama based on Hella S. Haasse's novel won a Best Actor award for Launspach at the Netherlands Film Festival. For ages 12 and older.

BLOOD OF EAGLES aka Darah Garuda (2010-Indonesia) 101m *** D: Conor Allyn, Yadi Sugandi. Donny Alamsyah, Ario Bayu, Lukman Sardi (*THE DREAMER*), Rahayu Saraswati, T. Rifnu Wikana. This rousing actioner set in 1947 during Indonesia's War of Independence concerns four men and one determined woman of different backgrounds who form a band of guerrilla fighters. The adventures of the heroic young Indonesians are produced with Hollywood panache by the team behind *SAVING PRIVATE RYAN* and *BLACKHAWK DOWN*. For ages 15 and older.

FOUR STEPS IN THE CLOUDS aka Quattro passi fra le nuvole (1942-Italy) 88m *** ½ D: Alessandro Blasetti (*TOO BAD SHE'S BAD*). Gino Cervi (*BECKET*), Adriana Benetti, Carlo Romano. Traveling salesman Paolo (Cervi) takes pity on young unwed mother-to-be Maria (Benetti) and agrees to help her. What he thought would be a simple favor snowballs into a comical disaster. Director Blasetti intersperses delightful interactions between the main characters and people they meet while traveling from northern to southern Italy. This funny and touching film written by celebrated screenwriter Cesare Zavattini (*BICYCLE THIEVES*) was nominated for a BAFTA. For ages 10 and older. *Remade as A WALK IN THE CLOUDS with Keanu Reeves in 1995.*

THE LAST TYCOON aka Da Shang Hai (2012-Hong Kong/China) 107m *** D: Jing Wong (*GOD OF GAMBLERS*). Chow Yun-Fat (*HARD BOILED*), Xiaoming Hunag, Sammo Hung Kam-Bo. This sweeping epic inspired by the real-life exploits of Du Yueheng, crime kingpin of 1930s Shanghai, follows the rise of Cheng Daiqi from fruit stall employee (Huang) in the 1910s to top gangster boss (Chow) in the 1930s. Brimming with eye candy and paced with verve, this actioner won 2 Hong Kong Film Awards. For ages 15 and older.

DISCONNECT (2012-US) 115m *** ½ D: Henry Alex Rubin (*MURDERBALL*). Jason Bateman (*JUNO*), Hope Davis, Frank Grillo (*THE GREY*), Jonah Bobo, Paula Patton, Andrea Riseborough (*OBLIVION*). In this powerful thriller, three sets of people fall in love, exploit each other and even commit felonies without meeting face to face. When Cindy's (Patton) identity is stolen, she seeks the help of former cop Mike (Grillo). Mike doesn't know his son is cyber-bullying his classmate Ben (Bobo). Ben's attorney father (Bateman) is too absorbed in his BlackBerry to notice. Meanwhile, TV reporter Nina (Riseborough) starts a webcam conversation with a teenage sex model. Rated R.

BEHIND THE CANDELABRA (2013-US) 118m *** ½ D: Steven Soderbergh (*SIDE EFFECTS*). Michael Douglas (*WALL STREET*), Matt Damon (*INVICTUS*), Scott Bakula, Debbie Reynolds, Rob Lowe. This masterfully acted biographical drama recounts the tempestuous relationship between flamboyant entertainer Liberace (Douglas) and his much younger lover Scott Thorson (Damon). Based on Thorson's book, this film peers behind the glitter and po-made to the wounded humanity of two troubled souls. Winner of an award. For mature audiences 17 and older.

THE BLING RING (2013-US/UK/France/Germany/Japan) 90m *** D: Sofia Coppola (*LOST IN TRANSLATION*). Emma Watson (*HARRY POTTER*), Katie Chang (*A BIRDER'S GUIDE TO EVERYTHING*), Israel Broussard, Claire Julien, Taissa Farmiga. This acerbic crime drama based on a true story concerns a pack of LA teenagers who, in 2008, broke into the homes of their celebrity idols to steal their clothes, jewelry and shoes. An eyebrow-raising view into American teen culture gone berserk, this film skewers both fame-seeking youth and the lifestyle that brainwashes them. Winner of an award. Rated R.

IN THE HOUSE aka Dans la maison (2012-France) 105m *** ½ D: François Ozon (*SWIMMING POOL*). Fabrice Luchini (*PARIS*), Ernst Umhauer, Kristin Scott Thomas (*SARAH'S KEY*), Emmanuelle Seigner, Bastien Ughetto. Disillusioned high school literature teacher M. Germain (Luchini) is inspired when he reads the work of 16-year-old Claude (Umhauer). Germain decides to give his talented student extra attention to develop his gift. Claude writes a series of stories about the ultimate "normal" family based on his classmate Rapha (Ughetto), with unsettling consequences. This cleverly constructed thriller won 6 international film festival awards. Rated R.

BLESS ME, ULTIMA (2013-US) 106m *** D: Carl Franklin (*DEVIL IN A BLUE DRESS*). Luke Galanor, Miriam Colon, Benito Martinez, Dolores Heredia, Castulo Guerra. This beautiful adaptation of the magical realist novel by Rudolfo Anaya concerns Antonio (Galanor), a young boy who lives in a New Mexico town in 1944. With his brothers fighting in World War II, his parents invite elderly relative Ultima (Colon) to live with them. Ultima is a *curandera*, a medicine woman in touch with the spiritual world. She and Antonio share a close bond, though the villagers soon become frightened of Ultima's healing powers. Nominated for 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

THE KINGS OF SUMMER (2013-US) 95m *** ½ D: Jordan Vogt-Roberts (feature debut). Nick Robinson, Gabriel Basso, Moises Arias, Nick Offerman, Erin Moriarty. Ever since his mom died and his sister moved away, 14-year-old Joe (Robinson) has been under the thumb of his strict father (Offerman). Joe's best friend Patrick (Basso) is being smothered by his nerdy parents, so the friends decide to build their own home in the woods. Joe and Patrick are joined by their weird classmate Biaggio (Arias) who just shows up one day. This humorous adventure won an award. Rated R.

UNFINISHED SONG (2012-UK/Germany) 93m *** D: Paul Andrew Williams (*LONDON TO BRIGHTON*). Terence Stamp (*THE LIMEY*), Vanessa Redgrave (*CORIOLANUS*), Gemma Arterton, Barry Martin. British luminaries Terence Stamp and Vanessa Redgrave are at the top of their game in this life-affirming comedy. Grumpy Arthur (Stamp) thinks it's a huge bother to accompany his wife Marion (Redgrave), who's dying of cancer, to choir practice. When he's made to join the choir, he begins a journey of musical self-discovery. Winner of an award. Rated PG-13.
