ABOUT LOVE (2005-Taiwan/China/Japan) 100m ***
D: Ten Shimoyama, Chih-yen Yee, Yibai Zhang, Bolin Chen (**BLUE GATE CROSSING**), Misaki Itô (**JU-ON: THE GRUDGE**), Mavis Fan, Ryô Kase (**LETTERS FROM IWO JIMA**), Xiaolu Li (**XIU XIU: THE SENT-DOWN GIRL**), Takashi Tsukamoto. Three tales set in the cities of Tokyo, Taipei and Shanghai explore cross-cultural love in this charming romance. Each story provides a little taste of life in the featured city; and each is gorgeously shot and imaginatively directed. For ages 13 and older.

YOUNG & BEAUTIFUL *aka Jeune & jolie* (2013-France) 93m *** D: François Ozon (**IN THE HOUSE**). Marine Vacth, Géraldine Pailhas, Frédéric Pierrot, Fantin Ravat, Charlotte Rampling. Upon losing her virginity, seventeen-year-old Isabelle decides to explore the power of her sexuality by secretly becoming a call girl. This provocative erotic drama set in the French Riviera won 3 awards and was nominated for the Palme d'Or at Cannes. For adults 17 and older only.

BELLE (2013-UK) 104m *** ½ D: Amma Asante. Gugu Mbatha-Raw, Matthew Goode, Tom Wilkinson, Emily Watson, Penelope Wilton, Tom Felton, James Norton, Miranda Richardson. This sumptuous 18th century romance set in England, inspired by the life of Dido Elizabeth Belle, concerns the daughter of a Royal Navy captain (Goode) and a slave woman. The captain brings Dido to live with his aunt (Watson) and uncle (Wilkinson), who is no less than Lord Chief Justice of the King's Bench. When Dido blossoms into a beautiful and highly intelligent young woman (Mbatha-Raw), she can't help but question her position in life. Winner of 2 awards. Rated PG.

THEY CAME TOGETHER (2014-US) 83m *** D: David Wain (**ROLE MODELS**). Paul Rudd, Amy Poehler, Ken Marino, Jack McBrayer, Kenan Thompson. Big studio romantic comedies get the wrecking ball in this brisk parody. Molly (Poehler) owns a cute little candy shop in Manhattan. Joel (Rudd) works for a candy mega-corporation out to get Molly's shop out of business. Will they fall in love (duh)? This sweet comedy has a sharp bite. Fans of classic romantic comedy, you have been warned. Rated R.

THE LOVE PUNCH (2013-France) 94m *** D: Joel Hopkins. Pierce Brosnan, Emma Thompson, Timothy Spall, Celia Imrie. Emma Thompson and Pierce Brosnan are an amicably divorced couple in this cheerful heist comedy. Robbed of their pension funds, they track down the Frenchman responsible and infiltrate his wedding on the Cote d'Azur to rob a \$10-million diamond necklace from his bride-to-be. With pals Celia Imrie and Timothy Spall along for the adventure, **THE LOVE PUNCH** delivers a pleasant buzz. Fans of romantic comedy unite. Rated PG-13.

HORSES OF GOD *aka Les chevaux de Dieu* (2012-Morocco/Tunisia/Belgium/France) 115m *** ½ D: Nabil Ayouch (**ALI ZAOUA: PRINCE OF THE STREETS**). Abdelhakim Rachid, Abdelilah Rachid, Hamza Souidek. Based on real events, this powerful drama offers insight into some of the many causes of terrorism in the Arab world. Set in the early 1990s in the Moroccan shantytown of Sidi Moumen, four boys run wild in a brutal world of drug dealers, prostitutes and corrupt cops. Through a series of events, the boys are absorbed into the Islamist movement, receiving food, employment and a sense of belonging. This unsettling film won 6 awards, including 2 at Cannes. For ages 15 and older.

THE BIG SLEEP (1946-US) 114m **** D: Howard Hawks (**TO HAVE AND HAVE NOT**). Humphrey Bogart, Lauren Bacall (9/16/1924 – 8/12/2014), Martha Vickers, John Ridgely, Charles Waldron. This celebrated Hollywood film noir follows private eye Philip Marlowe (Bogart) on his investigation of the blackmailers, pornographers and killers that have attached themselves to wealthy General Sternwood (Waldron) and his foxy daughters Vivian (Bacall) and Carmen (Vickers). Much has been written and said about the deliberately confusing plot—Roger Ebert simplified it thus: “‘The Big Sleep’ is a lust story with a plot about a lot of other things,” the main point remains Bacall (what a dame!). Rated PG.

THE SHOOTIST (1976-US) 100m *** ½ D: Don Siegel (**DIRTY HARRY**). John Wayne (his final film), Lauren Bacall (9/16/1924 – 8/12/2014), Ron Howard, James Stewart, Richard Boone. It's 1901 and notorious gunfighter JB Books (Wayne) is dying—not from a gunshot, but from cancer. JB arrives in Carson City to settle his affairs. He rents a room from Widow Rogers (Bacall), and prepares to die. But the old gunslinger knows no one wants him dying peacefully in bed, except for her. **THE SHOOTIST** is on the National Board of Review's Top 10. Rated PG.

THE GREAT ESCAPE (1963-US) 172m **** D: John Sturges (**THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN**). Richard Attenborough (8/29/1923 – 8/24/2014) James Garner (4/7/1928 – 7/19/2014), Steve McQueen, James Coburn, Charles Bronson, Donald Pleasence. This beloved adventure based on a true event in 1942 is set in a German maximum security POW camp designed to house the craftiest Allied officer escape artists. Though the Germans have “all the rotten eggs in one basket”, they've also put together a breakout dream team. Captain of the team is Big X (Attenborough), who assembles experts Scrounger (Garner), Tunnel King (Bronson), Forger (Pleasence) and Manufacturer (Coburn). The team's wild card is Cooler King (McQueen), so named because his escape attempts constantly land him in solitary. Game on. Winner of 4 awards. Rated PG.

THE FISHER KING (1991-US) 137m *** ½ D: Terry Gilliam (**BRAZIL**). Robin Williams (7/21/1951 – 8/11/2014), Jeff Bridges, Mercedes Ruehl, Amanda Plummer. Shock radio DJ Jack (Bridges) is deeply depressed: a deranged man went on a killing rampage at a swanky New York restaurant after listening to his broadcast. Jack starts to pull his life together when he meets a witty and insanely quixotic homeless man (Williams) who sets Jack on a quest for a “holy grail”. Conveniently, the Grail is somewhere in Manhattan. This buddy comedy/romance/modern epic won an Oscar and 18 more awards. *The late, brilliant, Robin Williams is here in top form. It's one of his best.*

WORDS AND PICTURES (2013-US) 111m *** ½ D: Fred Schepisi (**ROXANNE**). Clive Owen, Juliette Binoche, Valerie Tian. In this witty romantic comedy, Clive Owen plays Jack, a rumpel, disorderly English teacher and Juliette Binoche plays cranky art teacher Dina at the same exclusive New England school. Their rivalry sparks a school-wide debate on literature vs art. Though they are dedicated teachers, Jack and Dina are both struggling to complete their own creative projects. Smart and edgy, yet funny, **WORDS AND PICTURES** was nominated for an award. Rated PG-13.

A LESS BAD WORLD *aka Un mundo menos peor* (2004-Argentina) 90m *** ½ D: Alejandro Agresti (**THE LAKE HOUSE**). Carlos Roffé, Mónica, Julieta Cardinali, Mex Urtizberea, Ulises Dumont, Rodrigo Noya (**VALENTIN**). Isabel (Galán) was forcibly separated from her husband Cholo (Roffé) in the early 1980s when she was pregnant with her daughter Sonia. Cholo “disappeared” in Argentina's Dirty War and was presumed dead. Twenty years later, hearing Cholo is alive, Isabel arrives in a seacoast town (Mar de Ajó) with Sonia (Cardinali), hoping to reunite with her husband. This touching, funny and deeply human family drama won 4 awards, including Best Film at Venice. For ages 12 and older.

THREE MANY WEDDINGS *aka Tres bodas de más* (2013-Catalonia/Spain) 94m *** D: Javier Ruiz Caldera. Inma Cuesta, Martiño Rivas, Quim Gutiérrez, Pazo León, Rossy de Palma. This hilariously vulgar comedy concerns unlucky in love scientist Ruth (Cuesta, who's terrific). Ruth's been invited to the weddings of three (count 'em!) ex-boyfriends. Partly to show a brave face (and partly to find other men) she decides to attend all of them. She drags along her intern Dani (Rivas) so she doesn't have to go alone. This gut-buster won 6 awards. Rated R. *Note: THREE MANY WEDDINGS was filmed in Barcelona, Catalonia. Interestingly, Catalonia's National Day is September 11.*

SUNSHINE ON LEITH (2013-Scotland) 100m *** D: Dexter Fletcher. Peter Mullan (**WAR HORSE**), Jane Horrocks (**LITTLE VOICE**), George MacKay, Kevin Guthrie, Jason Flemyng, Antonia Thomas, Freya Mavor. Buddies Davy (MacKay) and Ally (Guthrie) return home to Edinburgh after fighting in Afghanistan, looking forward to the embrace of family and friends... and perhaps love. This rousing adaptation of the hit musical by Stephen Greenhorn soars with the music of The Proclaimers. As exhilarating as a shot of single malt, this delightful Scottish gem was nominated for 5 awards. For ages 10 and older.

NOT ANOTHER HAPPY ENDING (2013-Scotland) 102m *** D: John McKay. Karen Gillan (**GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY**), Stanley Weber, Iain De Caestecker, Freya Mavor (**SUNSHINE ON LEITH**), Amy Manson. Struggling publisher Tom (Weber) is waiting impatiently for his star novelist Jane (Gillan) to finish writing her second book. The problem is, she's too happy. Jane needs to be miserable in order to write, so Tom tries to make her as unhappy as possible—and realizes his growing feelings for her. This charming romantic comedy set in Glasgow was nominated for a Scottish BAFTA. For ages 12 and older.

WE ARE NORTHERN LIGHTS (2013-Scotland) 95m *** ½ D: Nick Higgins, David Graham Scott. For this extraordinary documentary 50,000 ordinary Scots submitted a total of 300 hours of footage which was then painstakingly edited into a composite portrait of Scotland. From the Borders to the Highlands to the Western and Northern Isles, the funny, friendly, down-to-earth Scottish personality pervades this inspiring film. Nominated for a BAFTA Audience Award. For ages 12 and older.

THE LAST SHEPHERD *aka L'ultimo pastore* (2012-Italy) 76m **** D: Marco Bonfanti (feature debut). This fascinating documentary explores the challenges of the last shepherd in Milan, Renato Zucchelli. Milan is a great Italian city, the center for international finance and fashion. Renato herds his flock of hundreds of wooly sheep *right into* this metropolis to teach children about their agricultural heritage. Humorous and thought-provoking, this documentary won an award. For ages 10 and older.

NEIGHBORS (2014-US) 97m *** D: Nicholas Stoller (**FORGETTING SARAH MARSHALL**). Seth Rogen, Rose Byrne, Zac Efron, Dave Franco. Kelly (Byrne) and Mac (Rogen) are living in a quiet neighborhood with their newborn daughter when a group of frat brothers move into the house next door. Mac and Kelly are young enough to care about their “cool” factor, but the parties next door are so loud, they set off an increasingly hilarious battle between the neighbors. Winner of 2 awards. Rated R.

TANDOORI LOVE (2008-Switzerland/Germany/Austria) 90m *** D: Oliver Paulus. Lavinia Wilson, Vijay Raaz, Martin Schick, Shweta Agarwal. In this wildly inventive comedy, Raja (Raaz), personal chef to Bollywood diva Priya (Agarwal), falls in love with local girl Sonja (Wilson) at a supermarket while on location in Switzerland. Raja ditches Priya to work at Sonja's very Swiss restaurant to try to win her heart (through her stomach). Playful Bollywood music, bright colors, and tantalizing Indian dishes heighten this absurd film's pleasure. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

ROUND ABOUT MIDNIGHT *aka Mayonaka made* (1999-Japan) 110m *** D: Makoto Wada. Hiroyuki Sanada (**TWILIGHT SAMURAI**), Michelle Reis (**FALLEN ANGELS**), Akira Emoto, Toshiaki Karasawa, Masako Motai, Shinobu Ôtake. While taking a cigarette break between sets, Tokyo jazz trumpeter Koji (Sanada) witnesses a murder and ends up protecting Linda (Reis), who is fleeing from the killers. Koji must return by midnight to the jazz club to play before a top talent agent, but when Koji and Linda are identified as prime suspects—they must run from the mobsters and the police! This lighthearted, exciting neo-noir thriller (set in real time) is peppered with Japanese celebrity cameos and classic jazz standards! For ages 12 and older.

DEAR DOCTOR (2009-Japan) 127m *** ½ D: Miwa Nishikawa (**SWAY**). Tsurube Shôfukutei (**KABE: OUR MOTHER**), Eita, Teruyuki Kagawa, Kimiko Yo, Kaoru Yachigusa. A small rural Japanese community is in an uproar when well-loved Dr. Osamu Ino (Shôfukutei) mysteriously disappears. Two city detectives arrive to solve the case and discover that everyone in the village hides a little secret. This fascinating drama won 21 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE ROVER (2014-Australia/US) 103m *** ½ D: David Michôd (**ANIMAL KINGDOM**). Guy Pearce, Robert Pattinson, Scoot McNairy. Ten years after the collapse of the world economy, drifter Eric (Pearce) pursues the men who stole his last important possession, his car. Set in the parched Australian outback, this neo-noir is spiked with the blackest of humor. A soon-to-be cult classic, **THE ROVER** was nominated for Best Film at the Sydney Film Festival. Rated R.
