ONLY YESTERDAY *aka Omohide Poro Poro* (1991-Japan) 118m *** 1/2 D: Isao Takahata (THE TALE OF THE PRINCESS KAGUYA). Voiced by Miki Imai, Toshiro Yanagiba, Youko Honna. This beautiful and poetic Studio Ghibli animation is about a 27-year-old woman who, while on a trip to the countryside to visit relatives, recalls her life as a 10-year-old. A thoughtful meditation on childhood memories and how they shape an individual's adulthood, this film will take you on a journey of first love, safflower fields, crystalline lakes and rolling hills. Considered by Ghibli mavens to be among the best animations ever made. For ages 12 and older.

THE DINNER GUEST *aka L'invité* (2007-France) 86m *** D: Laurent Bouhnik. Daniel Auteuil, Valérie Lemercier, Thierry Lhermitte. Fifty years old and unemployed for three years, Gérard (Auteuil) is thrilled when he finally gets a job offer in Indonesia. Gérard decides to invite his new boss to dinner—a lovely gesture except for one thing: Gérard's wife Colette (Lemercier) is a terrible cook! Fortunately their PR guru neighbor Alexandre (Lhermitte) is coming to the rescue. This hilarious comedy of manners featuring the lead of THE DINNER GAME, Thierry Lhermitte, will have you laughing till you cry. For ages 12 and older.

YOUR NEXT LIFE *aka La vida que te espera* (2004-Spain) 100m *** D: Manuel Gutiérrez Aragón. Juan Diego, Luis Tosar, Marta Etura, Clara Lago. In the beautiful region of Cantabria, northern Spain, farmer Gildo (Diego) would love nothing more than to live like it's 1604. But it's 2004, and his daughters Genia (Lago) and Val (Etura) are as modern as can be. This wonderfully quirky story about young love, murder and a frisky cow named Vanessa won 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

CITIZENFOUR (2014-US/Germany/UK) 114m **** D: Laura Poitras (MY COUNTRY, MY COUNTRY). This film documents the perilous challenge of publicly exposing Edward Snowden's evidence of the US government's spying on its own citizens. Documentarist Poitras and journalist Glenn Greenwald meet with Snowden in a Hong Kong hotel for eight days, trying to decide how best to inform citizens on their betrayal by the National Security Agency without compromising national security. Watching this documentary, one witnesses history in real time. Winner of the Best Documentary Oscar and 43 more awards. Rated R.

HELLO CARTER (2013-UK) 80m *** D: Anthony Wilcox (feature debut). Charlie Cox, Jodie Whittaker, Judy Parfitt, Annabelle Wallis, Paul Schneider. In this London version of AFTER HOURS, Carter (Cox), a young Brit down on his luck, tries to get his American ex-girlfriend Kelly's (Wallis) phone number from her mercurial brother Aaron (Schneider). Because Carter wants desperately to get back together with Kelly, Aaron ends up sending the hapless fellow on a wildly funny ride through London. For ages 15 and older.

I'LL SEE YOU IN MY DREAMS (2015-US) 92m *** 1/2 D: Brett Haley (THE NEW YEAR). Blythe Danner, June Squibb, Rhea Perlman, Sam Elliott, Martin Starr. Gorgeous 70-something widow Carol (Danner) decides after 20 years of being single she'll try dating again. Urged by her friends, Carol tries speed dating, with hilarious results. But then two very different men appear in her life: Lloyd (Starr), the young guy who cleans her pool, and silver-haired Bill (Elliott), who she meets at a pharmacy. This beautifully nuanced comedy-drama was nominated for an award. Rated PG-13.

THE 100-YEAR-OLD MAN WHO CLIMBED OUT THE WINDOW AND DISAPPEARED (2013-Sweden/Russia/UK/France/Spain) 114m *** 1/2 D: Felix Herengren. Robert Gustafsson, Iwar Wiklander, David Wiberg, Mia Skäringer. This delightful comedy concerns Allan (Gustafsson), whose talent with explosives has gotten him in (and out of) trouble throughout his very long life. On his 100th birthday, Allan escapes the old folk's home and embarks on a great adventure involving an elephant and a suitcase full of cash. Winner of 6 awards from around the world. Rated R.

LITTLE BOY (2015-Mexico/US) 106m *** 1/2 D: Alejandro Monteverde (BELLA). Jakob Salvati, Emily Watson, Michael Rapaport, Cary-Hiroyuki Tagawa. This fairy tale set in a little northern California community during World War II concerns 8-year-old Pepper (Salvati). Pepper is tiny for his age, and everyone in town torments him by calling him Little Boy. But Pepper's love for his dad James (Rapaport) is huge enough to move mountains. When soldier James is captured by the Japanese, Little Boy does everything in his power to bring him back. Rated PG-13.

THE AGE OF ADALINE (2015-US) 112m *** 1/2 D: Lee Toland Krieger. Blake Lively, Michiel Huisman, Harrison Ford, Ellen Burstyn, Kathy Baker. Adaline (Lively) has not aged in 80 years. Ever since a fateful car accident in the 1930s, she has remained 29 years old. Now Adaline lives a secretive life, forever afraid of her secret being known. But when she meets philanthropist Ellis (Huisman), Adaline's life begins to change. This fascinating romance was nominated for 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

NIGHTFALL IN INDIA *aka Anochecer en la India* (2014-Spain/Romania/Sweden/Turkey/India) 95m *** D: Chema Rodríguez. Juan Diego, Clara Voda, Ken Appledorn, Javier Perreira, Linda Molin. Ricardo (Diego), a wheelchair-bound Spanish curmudgeon, decides to ditch his Romanian caregiver Dana (Voda) and travel across Europe, Turkey, Iran and Pakistan to India. This fascinating road movie won 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

TRICKS *aka Sztuczki* (2007-Poland) 95m *** 1/2 D: Andrzej Jakimowski (IMAGINE). Damian Ul, Ewelina Walendziak, Tomasz Sapryk, Iwona Fornalczyk. Six-year-old Stefek (Ul) and his teenage older sister Elka (Walendziak) live with their mother (Fornalczyk) in a small Polish town. The siblings play a game they call "bribing fate" to see if small actions will lead to outcomes they predict. What will attract customers to a lonely apple vendor? What will induce someone to pick up a piece of trash? The two become adept at "tricks" to bend fate. Stefek faces his ultimate challenge when he spots a man he thinks is his father. Winner of 20 awards, For ages 13 and older.

INEVITABLE (2013-Argentina/Spain) 95m *** D: Jorge Algora. Darío Grandinetti, Carolina Pelleritti, Antonella Costa, Federico Luppi. Are we fated to fall inevitably in love with one very special person? This question is at the heart of this Argentinian romance. Fabián (Grandinetti) is a successful banker whose orderly life begins to unravel upon the death of a colleague. No longer able to relate to his family or his job, Fabián finds a confidant in an elderly writer (Luppi) he meets on a park bench, and embarks on a romance with a young artist (Costa). For ages 15 and older.

JİYŪ REN'AI *aka Bluestockings* (2005-Japan) 117m *** 1/2 D: Masato Harada (CHRONICLE OF MY MOTHER). Kyoko Hasegawa, Yoshino Kimura, Etsushi Toyokawa. While at university, Akiko (Hasegawa) and Kiyoko (Kimura) believed that they would marry for love and pursue careers. But life after graduation in Taisho Era Japan proves to be quite different from their dreams. Akiko is in a traditional marriage to businessman Yuichiro (Toyokawa), and Kiyoko is back to living with her father after her divorce. When Akiko tries to help Kiyoko find a job at Yuichiro's company, the three end up in a complex love triangle in this fabulously stylish drama. For ages 15 and older.

LOVE & MERCY (2014-US) 121m **** D: Bill Pohlad. Elizabeth Banks, John Cusack, Paul Dano, Paul Giamatti. This bio-pic illustrates two key episodes in the life of Beach Boys co-founder Brian Wilson. In 1965-68, Wilson (Dano) is creating the album Pet Sounds while slowly losing his grip on reality. In the 1980s, Wilson (Cusack) is a sick man, virtually imprisoned in his beachfront mansion by therapist Eugene Landy (Giamatti). When Wilson and Melinda Ledbetter (Banks) meet and fall in love, Melinda seeks to emancipate Brian from his therapist. This moving true story about the healing power of love won 1 award so far. Rated PG-13. *Yikes! In the '90s, Landy frequented the Movie Museum.*

CINDERELLA (2015-US/UK) 105m *** 1/2 D: Kenneth Branagh (MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING). Lily James, Cate Blanchett, Richard Madden, Helena Bonham Carter, Ben Chaplin. This sumptuous grand spectacle is true to the classic fairy tale: a virtuous girl in a household of evil women manages to go to The Ball. Ella's (James) troubles begin when her widowed dad (Chaplin) marries Lady Tremaine (Blanchett). This movie will no doubt inspire a generation of girls to be brave and kind—while wearing Blanchett's femme fatale clothes. Meeting a prince as gorgeous as Charming (Madden)? Fuhgeddaboutit. Winner of one award. PG.

FOR A HANDFUL OF KISSES *aka Por un puñado de besos* (2014-Spain/Venezuela) 98m *** D: David Menkes (I WILL SURVIVE). Ana de Armas, Martiño Rivas, Joel Bosqued, Jan Cornet, Andrea Duro. A girl named Sol (de Armas) puts out a personal ad. A boy named Dani (Rivas) answers it. Both have painful secrets they must reveal in order to find true love. This strikingly honest love story portrays both the intoxicating thrill and the feelings of uncertainty and vulnerability that new romance brings. Nominated for a Goya. For ages 15 and older.

LIBERI *aka Break Free* (2003-Italy) 113m *** D: Gianluca Maria Tavarelli. Elio Germano, Luigi Maria Burruano, Nicole Grimaudo, Myriam Catania. When Enzo (Burruano) loses his job in a small mountain village, he falls into a deep depression. Enzo's wife leaves him, and his son Vince (Germano) decides to look for work in the tourist town of Pescara. Vince's life begins to brighten: he's hired as a cook and falls in love with Genny (Grimaudo). But will his family reunite again? This engrossing drama won an award at Venice for Burruano's performance. For ages 15 and older.

PITCH PERFECT 2 (2015-US) 115m *** 1/2 D: Elizabeth Banks (feature debut). Anna Kendrick, Rebel Wilson, Hailee Steinfeld, Skylar Astin, Adam Devine. When Barden College's champion all-girl a cappella group the Bellas' performance for the President of the United States goes disastrously (and hilariously) wrong, the Bellas are stripped of their title and barred from performing in the college circuit. In order to clear their name, the Bellas enter an international competition in Copenhagen no American team has ever won. This screamingly funny musical comedy was nominated for 9 awards, and will certainly win a few in 2016. Rated PG-13.

IN THE NAME OF MY DAUGHTER *aka L'homme qu'on aimait trop* (2014-France) 116m *** D: André Téchiné (WILD REEDS). Catherine Deneuve, Guillaume Canet, Adèle Haenel. Based on a true story, this courtroom drama delves into the fortunes of glamorous casino owner Renée Le Roux (Deneuve) in 1970s French Riviera. Renée's daughter Agnès (Haenel) has little interest in her mother's business despite her large monetary stake. When Agnès falls in love with Renée's slimy attorney Maurice Agnelet (Canet), Renée must defend her casino against her own daughter. This engrossing drama was nominated for 2 awards. Rated R.

NEGOTIATOR: MASHITA MASAYOSHI (2005-Japan) 127m *** D: Katsuyuki Motohiro (BAYSIDE SHAKEDOWN). Yūsuke Santamaria, Susumu Terajima, Jun Kunimura, Miki Mizuno. A crazy bomber hijacks a high-tech prototype subway train and terrorizes Tokyo. Japan's No. 1 negotiator Mashita Masayoshi (Santamaria) is called in to investigate, but this time his opponent is out to get him personally. This fast-paced actioner was nominated for 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.
