THE FACE OF JIZO (2004-Japan) 99m *** 1/2 D: Kazuo Kuroki. Rie Miyazawa, Yoshio Harada, Tadanobu Asano. This touching adaptation of Hisashi Inoue's play "Chichi to kuraseba" takes place over 4 days in Hiroshima in the summer of 1948. Beautiful young librarian Mitsue (Miyazawa) is visited by her father Takezou's (Harada) ghost. Somehow, Takezou's spirit has found out that Mitsue is in love. Tormented by feelings of guilt from surviving the bomb, Mitsue is avoiding her feelings for shy researcher Kinoshita (Asano). With loving warmth and humor, her father's ghost encourages her to embrace life. Winner of 6 awards. For ages 12 and older.

ME BEFORE YOU (2016-UK/US) 110m *** D: Thea Sharrock. Emilia Clarke (Game of Thrones), Sam Claflin (THE HUNGER GAMES), Vanessa Kirby, Charles Dance. When Lou Clark (Clarke) loses her job at The Buttered Bun tea shop, she finds a new job as a caretaker to London hotshot Will (Claflin), a wealthy young man paralyzed from the neck down from a motorcycle accident. Will Lou's small town pluck and cheer chase away Will's black clouds? Of course. But this film is so much more than that. Winner of the Truly Moving Picture Award at the Heartland Film Festival. Rated PG-13.

SUNSET SONG (2015-UK/Luxembourg) 135m *** 1/2 D: Terence Davies (THE HOUSE OF MIRTH). Peter Mullan (SUNSHINE ON LEITH), Agyness Deyn, Kevin Guthrie, Jack Greenless. This sweeping adaptation of Lewis Grassie Gibbon's novel set in northeast Scotland in the 1910s concerns farm girl Chris (Deyn). Life on the farm is back-breaking work, and women have few rights. But Chris has a deep love of the land—and through images of the highlands and lakes under broad skies, Scottish ballads that soar and the music of the author's prose, her country's beauty penetrates to the soul. This epic coming-of-age story won 2 awards. Rated R.

THE JUNGLE BOOK (2016-UK/US) 106m *** 1/2 D: Jon Favreau (IRON MAN). Neel Sethi, voiced by Bill Murray, Ben Kingsley, Idris Elba, Scarlett Johansson, Christopher Walken. This remake of Disney's beloved Rudyard Kipling story looks stunningly live-action, as though sassy man-cub Mowgli's (Sethi) jungle really is populated with talking animals. Slacker bear Baloo (Murray) and elegant panther Bagheera (Kingsley) are Mowgli's friends. But it's a jungle out there—fearsome tiger tyrant Shere Khan (Elba), gigantopithecus mob-boss King Louie (Walken) and seductive python Kaa (Johansson) are just a few of its baddies. Nominated for 3 awards. PG

CASTLE UNDER FIERY SKIES aka *Katen no shiro* (2009-Japan) 140m *** D: Mitsutoshi Tanaka. Toshiyuki Nishida, Shinobu Ôtake, Kippei Shiina. Like the master artisans who built the great cathedrals of Europe, the architects of Japanese castles are unsung heroes. In Atsuta (Nagoya) in 1576, the great warlord Oda Nobunaga (Shiina) visits Mataemon, a country carpenter. Cringing from his ferocious tiger-like presence, Mataemon agrees to build a five-story castle that will take up ALL of Mt. Azuchi. Mataemon's story is an inspiration for anyone who's tried the impossible. Nominated for a Japanese Academy Award. For ages 10 and up.

LOVE UNDER THE CRUCIFIX aka *Ogin-sama* (1962-Japan) 101m *** 1/2 D: Kinuyo Tanaka (LOVE LETTER). Ineko Arima, Tatsuya Nakadai, Ganjirô Nakamura, Mieko Takamine. This tragic romance set in 16th century Japan concerns the adopted daughter of great tea master Sen no Rikyû (Nakamura). Beautiful Ogin (Arima) falls in love with tea devotee Ukon Takayama (Nakadai) a married Christian lord. As the government cracks down on the Christian faith, and Rikyû's liberal beliefs cause a rift with Toyotomi Hideyoshi, Ogin and Ukon's fates become intertwined. This is the final film directed by legendary actress Tanaka. For ages 12 and up.

BASARA- THE PRINCESS GOH aka *Gô-hime* (1992-Japan) 142m *** 1/2 D: Hiroshi Teshigahara (RIKYU). Rie Miyazawa, Tatsuya Nakadai. This sumptuous historical drama is set after the death of tea master Sen no Rikyû, who was forced to commit suicide by the powerful warlord Toyotomi Hideyoshi. Chosen to succeed Rikyû, pottery artist Furuta Oribe (Nakadai) is understandably uneasy about his new political appointment. Oribe takes comfort in teaching pottery to Princess Goh (Miyazawa), Hideyoshi's tomboyish adopted daughter. As their world grows turbulent with political intrigue, the two artists defiantly embrace beauty and truth. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE SICILIAN CLAN aka *Le clan des Siciliens* (1969-France) 122m *** 1/2 D: Henri Verneuil (ANY NUMBER CAN WIN). This terrific actioner stars three of France's finest: Jean Gabin, Alain Delon and Lino Ventura. Delon plays career crook Roger Sartet, who escapes from jail thanks to the Sicilian mobster Vittorio Manalese (Gabin). They're collaborating on a huge jewel heist, which gets the attention of Inspector Le Goff (Ventura). This stylish and entertaining crime flick was nominated for an award. For ages 12 and older.

THE LIFE OF OHARU aka *Saikaku ichidai onna* (1952-Japan) 137m *** D: Kenji Mizoguchi (UGETSU). Kinuyo Tanaka, Ichirô Sugai, Toshiro Mifune, Toshiaki Kono. Oharu (Tanaka), a fifty-year-old prostitute, recounts her life. Scorned and accused of being immoral her entire existence, Oharu was only guilty of one thing: falling in love with a man (Mifune) below her station. The great Kinuyo Tanaka portrays Oharu's path of 30 years in this masterpiece of world cinema. Winner of 2 awards, one of them at Venice. (Note: Actress Kinuyo Tanaka went on to direct films, one of which is LOVE UNDER THE CRUCIFIX.)

NOW YOU SEE ME 2 (2016-US/China/UK/Canada) 129m *** D: Jon M. Chu. Jesse Eisenberg, Mark Ruffalo, Woody Harrelson, Dave Franco, Daniel Radcliffe, Lizzy Caplan, Morgan Freeman. In this thrillingly preposterous joyride, four illusionist/robbers (Eisenberg, Harrelson, Franco, Caplan) are forced by evil tech prodigy Walter Mabry (Radcliffe) to steal a powerful computer de-crypter from a heavily guarded vault. Luckily, the rogue magicians, who call themselves the Four Horsemen, have a few tricks up their sleeves. Nominated for 3 awards. PG-13.

MUSASHI MIYAMOTO TRILOGY *** D: Hiroshi Inagaki. Toshiro Mifune, Kurôemon Onoe, Kaoru Yachigusa, Kôji Tsuruta, Mariko Okada. This famous three-part film depicts the adventures of legendary swordsman Musashi Miyamoto. **SAMURAI I** (1954-Japan) 93m Musashi's (Mifune) turbulent early life. **SAMURAI II** (1955-Japan) 104m Musashi establishes himself as a great swordsman. **SAMURAI III** (1956-Japan) 103m Musashi duels the great swordsman Kojirô (Tsuruta).

TALE OF TALES (2015-Italy/France/UK) 133m *** 1/2 D: Matteo Garrone (GOMORRAH). Salma Hayek, Vincent Cassel, Toby Jones, John C. Reilly, Alba Rohrwacher. Inspired by the folk myths collected by 16th century poet Giambattista Basile, this sumptuous yet grotesque, erotic and utterly insane fantasy concerns three neighboring kingdoms. In Selvascura, a soothsayer tells the king (Reilly) and queen (Hayek), who are desperate to have children, to kill a lake monster. Roccaforte's sex-addicted king (Cassel) is enchanted by an old crone. In Altomonte, the monarch (Jones) has a pet flea the size of a Fiat Uno. This fabulous black comedy won 12 awards. Rated R.

PALE MOON aka *Kami no tsuki* (2014-Japan) 126m *** 1/2 D: Daihachi Yoshida. Rie Miyazawa (THE FACE OF JIZO), Sôuke Ikematsu, Satomi Kobayashi, Renji Ishibashi. In this tale of financial malfeasance set in 1994, bank employee Rika (Miyazawa) has a colorless life. She is mostly neglected by her husband, who is often away on business, and she has to scrape and save to fund her bland existence. One day, she quietly borrows some cash from a client's deposit, and gets what she wants. Her life will never be the same. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 12 and older.

CAPTAIN AMERICA: CIVIL WAR (2016-US/Germany) 147m *** 1/2 D: Anthony Russo, Joe Russo. Chris Evans, Robert Downey Jr., Scarlett Johansson, Sebastian Stan, Anthony Mackie, Don Cheadle, Chadwick Boseman, Paul Bettany. There's a lot of collateral damage when superheroes save the world. Buildings and cars blow up, mountains fall. It's no wonder why the United Nations wants to limit the Avengers' actions. Tony Stark, aka Iron Man (Downey) is for it—why shouldn't they be answerable to an authority? But Captain America (Evans) is dead against it, and all Avengers must take sides. Civil war has been declared. Rated PG-13.

MONEY MONSTER (2016-US) 98m *** D: Jodie Foster. George Clooney, Julia Roberts, Dominic West, Giancarlo Esposito, Jack O'Connell. George Clooney stars as TV personality Lee Gates, a Jim Cramer-like showman who doles out stock tips while backup dancers gyrate. Gates and his long-suffering producer Patty (Roberts) are mid-broadcast when an irate investor (O'Connell) storms the sound stage and forces Lee to wear a suicide vest. Patty instinctively captures the standoff onscreen while the viewing public holds its collective breath. It's on Lee to talk his way out of the mess... or will he help his captor find justice? Rated R

KNIGHTLY ADVICE aka *Tenka no goiken ban* (1962-Japan) 92m *** 1/2 D: Sadatsugu Matsuda. Ryunosuke Tsukigata, Chiezô Kataoka, Satomi Oka, Isao Yamagata, Hiroki Matsukata. This witty and highly entertaining tale is based on a real incident that took place on January 2, 1629 at Edo Castle. Daimyo Inaba, growing impatient waiting to pay Shogun Iemitsu his New Year's respects, cuts in line in front of Sir Samezu (Yamagata). Samezu promptly grabs Inaba's palanquin (with Inaba still in it) and dumps it single-handedly into the castle moat. This sets off a lively rivalry between the daimyos (who own castles) and the knights (employees of the Shogun). For ages 12 and older.

PRINCESS SEN AND HIDEYORI aka *Sen-hime to Hideyori* (1962-Japan) 85m *** D: Masahiro Makino. Hibari Misora, Kinnosuke Nakamura, Ken Takakura, Eijirô Tôno. Historical accuracy takes second place to grand entertainment in this colorful tale about the granddaughter of Ieyasu Tokugawa (Tôno), Princess Sen (Misora). Ieyasu marries her to Hideyori Toyotomi (Nakamura) to create an alliance between the Tokugawa and Toyotomi clans, but the alliance doesn't last long, as Osaka Castle is attacked and Princess Sen is caught in the middle. Ken Takakura has a rare samurai role. For ages 12 and older.

REMEMBER ME? aka *Ti ricordi di me?* (2014-Italy) 87m *** D: Rolando Ravello. Ambra Angiolini, Edoardo Leo, Paolo Calabresi, Ennio Fantastichini. This delightful love story concerns Roberto (Leo), a kleptomaniac writer of children's stories, and Bea (Angiolini), a narcoleptic school teacher. The two meet by chance at the door of their psychologist's clinic, and though it's definitely not love at first sight, the two learn that his crazy complements her crazy in the most wonderful way. This charming comedy was nominated for an award from the Italian National Syndicate of Film Journalists. For ages 10 and older.

FREE STATE OF JONES (2016-US) 139m *** D: Gary Ross (SEABISCUIT). Matthew McConaughey, Gugu Mbatha-Raw, Keri Russell, Mahershala Ali, Christopher Berry. This fascinating story based on true events is about Southern farmer Newton Knight (McConaughey), who leads a revolt during the Civil War against the Confederacy. Gathering other small farmers and local slaves, Knight declares Jones County, Mississippi a free state. This film provides a powerful and relevant narrative on class and race. Rated R.

LOVE & FRIENDSHIP (2016-Ireland/Netherlands/France/US/UK) 92m *** 1/2 D: Whit Stillman (METROPOLITAN). Kate Beckinsale, Morfydd Clark, Tom Bennett, Chloë Sevigny, Stephen Fry. Incorrigible manipulator Lady Susan Vernon (Beckinsale) has recently been widowed. Still young and pretty, Lady Susan decides to visit her in-law's estate to hunt for a husband for her daughter Frederica (Clark) and for herself. Hilarious mayhem ensues. This fast and funny adaptation of Jane Austen's comic novella Lady Susan was nominated for 2 awards. Rated PG.

TOUCHED WITH FIRE (2015-US) 106m *** D: Paul Dalio (feature debut). Katie Holmes, Luke Kirby, Christine Lahti, Griffin Dunne. Talented young writers Carla (Holmes) and Marco (Kirby) meet and fall in love. They both also happen to be manic-depressives. Eschewing their meds, they will experience celestial highs enhanced by new love... and like celestial bodies that get too close, burn everything in their path. This sensitive drama is written and directed by Paul Dalio, who draws from his own experience with bipolar disorder. Winner of two awards. Rated R.

THE SHOGUN'S SAMURAI aka *Yagyû ichizoku no inbô* (1978-Japan) 130m *** 1/2 D: Kinji Fukasaku. Kinnosuke Nakamura, Sonny Chiba, Hiroki Matsukata, Teruhiko Saigô, Toshiro Mifune, Tetsurô Tanba, Hiroyuki Sanada. Hidetada, the second Tokugawa shogun, dies before his successor is decided. The shogun's older son Iemitsu (Matsukata) has a big birthmark on his face, he stammers and is impetuous. His younger brother Tadanaga (Saigô) is handsome, wise and of good temperament. Tadanaga has more followers, but Iemitsu's followers, members of the Yagyû clan, are prepared to do anything to win the shogunate. Who cares if it's not accurate history, this star-studded epic is a classic! Ages 10 and older.
