EVERYTHING, EVERYTHING (2017-US) 96m *** D: Stella Meghie (JEAN OF THE JONESES). Amandla Stenberg, Nick Robinson, Anika Noni Rose, Ana de la Reguera. Seventeen-year-old Maddy (Stenberg) never leaves her house. She has a rare disease that so weakens her immune system that stepping outdoors incurs catastrophic risk. But when cute new neighbor Olly (Robinson) reaches out to befriend her, taking that risk becomes irresistible. This love story was nominated for 3 Teen Choice awards. Rated PG-13.

THE OLIVE TREE aka El Olivo (2016-Spain/Germany) 100m *** D: Icíar Bollaín (TAKE MY EYES). Anna Castillo, Javier Gutiérrez, Pep Ambròs, Manuel Cucala, Miguel Angel Aladren. Alma (Castillo) is the youngest in her farming family. She's especially close to her grandfather (Cucala) who has gone silent ever since Alma's dad (Aladren) sold the family olive tree, a magnificent 2000-year-old specimen. Alma embarks on a journey to track down the tree and return it to her grandpa. This family drama won 3 awards. For ages 12 and older.

BEAUTY AND THE BEAST (2017-US/UK) 129m *** ½ D: Bill Condon (DREAMGIRLS). Emma Watson, Dan Stevens, Luke Evans, Kevin Kline, Ewan McGregor, Emma Thompson, Ian McKellen. The 1991 animated Disney classic is adapted to exuberant live action in this gorgeous fantasy film. Belle (Watson) is a nerd in a pretty girl's body, which doesn't matter to handsome but villainous Gaston (Evans), who wants to marry her for her looks. Belle, on the other hand, finds beauty in a Beast (Stevens)—see the movie to find out why. Winner of 5 awards. Rated PG.

THE WEDDING PLAN aka Laavor et hakir (2016-Israel) 110m *** D: Rama Burshtein (FILL THE VOID). Noa Koler, Dafi Shoshana Alpern. When 32-year-old Orthodox Jew Michal (Koler) is dumped by her fiancé, she decides to stick to her planned wedding date and find a groom in three weeks. This comedy is propelled not just by Michal's quest for a good man, but her faith that God will provide her with one by her deadline: the last night of Hanukkah. Winner of 4 awards. PG.

SONNY BOY (2011-Netherlands) 140m *** D: Maria Peters. Ricky Koole, Sergio Hasselbaink, Marcel Hensema, Micha Hulshof, Frits Lambrechts. This epic true love story set in The Hague concerns Waldemar Nods (Hasselbaink), a dark-skinned 19-year-old university student from Suriname, and Rika van der Lans (Koole), a white 40-something Dutch mother of four, spanning the turbulent period between 1920 and 1945. Their relationship prevails through prejudice and war as the couple shelters Jews during the Holocaust. Winner of 3 awards. For ages 12 and older.

VARG VEUM – YOURS UNTIL DEATH (2008-Norway/Denmark) 87m *** D: Eric Richter Strand. Trond Espen Seim, Bjørn Floberg, Kathrine Fagerland, Sølje Bergmann. While searching for a client's car, private detective Varg Veum (Seim) falls for the client's estranged wife Wenche (Bergmann). When the client is found dead and Wenche becomes the cops' prime suspect, Varg sets out to prove her innocence. For ages 15 and older.

A PIERROT aka Jûryoku piero (2009-Japan) 120m *** D: Jun'ichi Mori. Ryo Kase (LETTERS FROM IWO JIMA), Masaki Okada, Fumiyo Kohinata, Kyôka Suzuki, Yuriko Yoshitaka. A series of arson attacks in Sendai, Japan seem to coincide with cryptic graffiti art in this intriguing mystery/touching family drama. The key to the solution concerns brothers Haru (Okada) and Izumi's (Kase) past. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 15 and older.

WALLANDER: FIREWALL aka Brandvägg (2007-Sweden/Germany) 163m *** D: Lisa Siwe. Rolf Lassgård (A MAN CALLED OVE), Marie Richardson, Lars Melin, Kajsa Ernst, Pia Örjansdotter. Inspector Wallander (Lassgård) goes up against a shadowy terrorist group that has hacked a major financial network in this exciting techno-thriller. Wallander is in bad shape: he's been diagnosed with diabetes and criticized for hiring hacker Robin (Örjansdotter). At least his nurse (Kajsa) is really nice... For ages 15 and older.

THE HUNTERS aka Jägarna (1996-Sweden) 113m *** ½ D: Kjell Sundvall. Rolf Lassgård (WALLANDER series), Lennart Jähkel, Jarmo Mäkinen. Big city cop Erik Bäckström (Lassgård) returns to his small hometown in the north of Sweden for the funeral of his father. Erik is delighted to be reunited with his brother Leif (Jähkel), until Erik discovers Leif might be involved in a local crime. This well-written Nordic noir won 2 Guldbagge Awards. For adults 17 and older.

SECRET PASSAGE aka Passagem Secreta (2004-Italy/Luxembourg/Portugal) 91m *** ½ D: Ademir Kenovic. Tara Fitzgerald, Katherine Borowitz, John Turturro. Set during the Spanish Inquisition of 1492, this lushly beautiful and suspenseful drama follows Jewish refugee sisters Isabel (Borowitz) and Clara (Fitzgerald) as they make their way to Italy. In Venice, the sisters, forcibly baptized as Catholics, live in luxurious captivity. Older sister Isabel tries to arrange for their passage to Constantinople and religious freedom, but Clara falls in love with Venetian noble Paolo (Turturro). Exquisite period detail makes this a must-see. For ages 12 and up.

DEAN (2016-US) 94m *** D: Demetri Martin. Demetri Martin, Kevin Kline, Gillian Jacobs, Mary Steenburgen. Stand-up comedian Demetri Martin writes, directs and stars in this insightful comedy-drama about New York cartoonist Dean (Martin), who, grieving from the death of his mother, escapes to Los Angeles. Dean's dad Robert (Kline) begins to date delightful Carol (Steenburgen), though his heart is still his late wife's. Illustrated with witty line drawings, this film finds humor in overcoming tragedy. Winner of Best US Narrative Feature at Tribeca. Rated PG-13.

GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY VOL. 2 (2017-US/New Zealand/Canada) 136m *** ½ D: James Gunn. Chris Pratt, Zoe Saldana, Dave Bautista, Kurt Russell, Vin Diesel, Bradley Cooper, Karen Gillan. Our favorite rag-tag band of universe saviors is back! Peter Quill (Pratt), Gamora (Saldana), Rocket (Cooper) and Drax (Bautista) are a lot like a family, especially when they take turns looking after adorable Baby Groot (Diesel). Family issues are key in this sequel: Peter meets his long-lost dad (Russell) and Gamora (Saldana) dukes it out with sister Nebula (Gillan), all while dealing with yet another threat to the universe. Winner of 4 awards. Rated PG-13.

MEGAN LEAVEY (2017-US) 116m *** ½ D: Gabriela Cowperthwaite (BLACKFISH). Kate Mara, Common, Tom Felton, Edie Falco. This moving true story is about a pair of heroes who saved many lives over the course of 100+ missions in Iraq: a Marine and her dog. Both Megan Leavey (Mara) and Rex don't get along with people, but the pair meet and bond in the K-9 unit, finding their purpose in detecting IEDs. When Leavey gets separated from Rex after an IED explosion, she moves heaven and earth to find him again. Winner of 1 award. Rated PG-13.

THE BRIDE WORE BLACK aka La mariée était en noir (1968-France/Italy) 108m *** ½ D: François Truffaut (DAY FOR NIGHT). Jeanne Moreau (1/23/1928-7/31/2017), Michel Bouquet, Jean-Claude Brialy, Charles Denner, Claude Rich. An homage to Alfred Hitchcock, this enigmatic thriller by François Truffaut is about young bride Julie (Moreau), who is widowed at the steps of the church on her wedding day. Adapted from the William Irish (Cornell Woolrich) novel. Winner of an award from the National Board of Review. For ages 12 and older.

FALSE TRAIL aka Jägarna 2 (2011-Sweden) 129m *** D: Kjell Sundvall. Rolf Lassgård (WALLANDER series), Peter Stormare (FARGO), Annika Nordin. In this sequel to THE HUNTERS, Stockholm cop Erik Bäckström, now the National Murder Commission's best interrogator, reluctantly returns to his hometown after 15 years away to solve a brutal murder. His presence is not viewed kindly by local cop Torsten (Stormare), who has other ideas on solving the crime. This richly layered murder mystery features excellent performances by the two leads, leading to an explosive conclusion. For ages 15 and older.

FORBIDDEN FRUIT aka Kielletty hedelmä (2009-Finland/ Sweden) 104m *** D: Dome Karukoski (BEAUTY AND THE BASTARD). Marjut Maristo, Amanda Pilke, Joel Mäkinen. Two 18-year-old girls from a conservative religious community in Finland go to Helsinki alone in this coming-of-age film. When headstrong Maria (Pilke) runs off, her best friend Raakel (Maristo) is given the difficult task of coaxing her home. The girls, exposed to many forbidden things—cosmetics, booze, a boy's kiss, movies (gasp!) and dancing—think through their own choices in this excellent drama. Winner of 6 awards. For ages 15 and up. WONDER WOMAN (2017-US/China/Hong Kong/ UK/Italy/Canada/New Zealand) 141m *** ½ D: Patty Jenkins (MONSTER). Gal Gadot, Chris Pine, Connie Nielsen, Robin Wright. Beloved DC Comics Amazon Wonder Woman (Gadot) comes to vivid life in this rousing origin story. Born on a magical island invisible to the outside world, Diana abruptly comes face to face with the world of men when American spy Steve Trevor (Pine) crash lands near the beach. Innocent and pure of heart, she seeks to end World War I by killing Ares, the God of War. Winner of 3 awards. PG-13.

THE HERO (2017-US) 93m *** ½ D: Brett Haley (I'LL SEE YOU IN MY DREAMS). Sam Elliott, Laura Prepon, Nick Offerman, Krysten Riter, Katharine Ross. Iconic Western star Sam Elliott (he of the great mustache) stars as aging actor Lee who was just diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. When his stagnant career is suddenly jump-started by stand-up comedienne Charlotte (Prepon), Lee tries to reconcile with his life, career and family. Winner of 1 award. Rated R.

MY SKINNY SISTER aka Min lilla syster (2015-Sweden/Germany) 91m *** D: Sanna Lenken. Rebecka Josephson, Amy Deasismont, Henrik Norlén, Annika Hallin. Pudgy and awkward, 12-year-old Stella (Josephson) both admires and resents her glamorous older sister Katja (Deasismont). Katja is slim and beautiful, and a champion figure skater. But when Stella discovers that Katja has an eating disorder, her life is turned upside down in this insightful family drama. Winner of 8 awards, including 2 from Berlin. For ages 15 and older.

WALLANDER: THE MAN WHO SMILED aka Mannen som log (2003-Sweden/Germany/Denmark/Norway) 128m *** D: Leif Lindblom. Rolf Lassgård (AFTER THE WEDDING), Marie Richardson, Claes Månsson. Soon after assuring a friend that the car crash that killed his father didn't involve foul play, Inspector Kurt Wallander (Lassgård) is shocked to find that friend brutally murdered. Wallander's investigation leads to the discovery of a sinister international network in this superior thriller adapted from Henning Mankell's novel. For ages 15 and older.

THE BIG SICK (2017-US) 120m **** D: Michael Showalter (HELLO, MY NAME IS DORIS). Kumail Nanjiani, Zoe Kazan, Holly Hunter, Ray Romano, Anupam Kher. Pakistan-born Chicagoan Kumail (Nanjiani) would like nothing better than to please his loving but strict Muslim parents. Whenever he comes home to visit, single (mom-approved) women just happen to drop by for dinner. But stand-up comedian Kumail is in love with Emily (Kazan), though loving her is sure to get him disowned. When Emily falls ill, the stakes rise even higher. This funny, deep and moving comedy-drama won 4 awards. Rated R.

THE HEART OF THE MATTER (1953-UK) 100m **** ½ D: George More O'Ferrall. Trevor Howard (THE THIRD MAN), Elizabeth Allan, Maria Schell, Denholm Elliott, Gérard Oury, Peter Finch. This compelling character study set in 1942 Sierra Leone concerns British policeman Harry Scobie (Howard), whose unhappy marriage to Louise (Allan) erodes his previously sterling moral standards. Adapted from the novel by Graham Greene, who was born on October 2, 1904. This drama filmed on location in Freetown won 4 BAFTA awards.

SHE DOES NOT DRINK, SMOKE OR FLIRT BUT...SHE TALKS (1970-France) 80m *** D: Michel Audiard (writer, INSPECTOR MAIGRET). Annie Girardot, Mireille Darc (5/15/1938 – 8/28/2017), Bernard Blier, Sim. Housemaid Germaine (Girardot) is faultless except for one thing: she talks too much. As it happens, her three clients, TV psychologist Francine (Darc), bank cashier Liethard (Blier) and priest-educator Phalempin (Sim) have plenty of embarrassing secrets for Germaine to (accidentally?) exploit in this delightfully naughty comedy. For ages 12 and older.
