**THE DANCER** *aka La danseuse* (2016-France/Belgium/Czech Republic) 108m \*\*\* ½ D: Stéphanie Di Giusto. Soko, Gaspard Ulliel, Mélanie Thierry, Lily-Rose Depp, Louis-Do de Lencquesaing. At the turn of the 20th century, when Art Nouveau is actually new, a young American woman named Marie-Louise Fuller (Soko) reinvents herself as dancer Loïe Fuller, star of the Folies Bergère in Paris. This thrilling biopic of an artist at work explores Fuller's complicated relationship with dancer Isadora Duncan (Depp) while evoking France's Belle Époque. Winner of 1 César Award. For ages 15 and older.

**UZUMASA LIMELIGHT** (2014-Japan) 104m \*\*\* D: Ken Ochiai. Seizō Fukumoto, Chihiro Yamamoto, Shogen, Hiroki Matsukata. In the Kyoto neighborhood of Uzumasa, a cottage industry of 'kirare yaku' stuntmen thrived in the 20th century. These specialists, now rare, are skilled at performing spectacular deaths by samurai swordplay. When young Satsuki (Yamamoto) takes an interest in kirare yaku Kamiyama's (Fukumoto) work, he coaches her, only to see her career take off as his prospects dry up in this touching drama. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 12 and older.

**WALLANDER: THE CASTLE RUINS** *aka Luftlottet* (2006-Sweden) 87m \*\*\* D: Anders Engström. Krister Henriksson, Johanna Sällström, Ola Rapace, Malin Berghagen, Regina Lund. An old man and his dogs are found poisoned to death in a hovel close to a posh oceanfront condominium. As soon as detectives Kurt (Henriksson) and Linda (Sällström) Wallander of the Ystad police interview the neighbors, witnesses and suspects die of poisoning in this suspenseful whodunit. For ages 15 and older.

**THE HIDDEN BLADE** *aka Kakushi ken oni no tsume* (2004-Japan) 132m \*\*\* ½ D: Yōji Yamada (TWILIGHT SAMURAI). Masatoshi Nagase, Takako Matsu, Hidetaka Yoshioka, Yukiyoshi Ozawa, Ken Ogata. Soft-spoken samurai Munezō (Nagase) doesn't much care about gaining riches or fame, but he is fiercely loyal to those he loves. That's what's putting him in plenty of trouble: he secretly loves Kie (Matsu), a lower caste kitchen maid, and he's under pressure to rat on old friend Hazama (Ozawa) who's rebelling against the Shogunate. The quiet warrior plans a rebellion of his own in this beautifully crafted Shūhei Fujisawa tale set in 1861. Winner of 3 awards. Rated R.

**RUNNING OUT OF TIME** *aka Am zin* (1999-Hong Kong) 93m \*\*\* ½ D: Johnnie To (P.T.U.). Andy Lau (INFERNAL AFFAIRS), Ching Wan Lau, YoYo Mung, Waise Lee, Shiu Hung Hui. Criminal mastermind Cheung (Andy Lau) has been told by his doctor he has only 4 weeks left to live. No longer afraid to die, Cheung engages expert hostage negotiator Inspector Ho (Ching Wan Lau) in a deadly game to take down their mutual enemy, triad boss Baldy (Waise Lee). This smart and funny cop and robber buddy movie is a Hong Kong action classic. Winner of 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

**FINDING YOU** (2021-US) 120m \*\*\* D: Brian Baugh. Rose Reid, Jediaiah Goodacre, Vanessa Redgrave, Patrick Bergin. After botching an audition, level-headed New York violinist Finley (Reid) spends a semester in Ireland in this refreshing rom-com. Focused only on composing a new audition piece, she is annoyed when arrogant movie star Beckett (Goodacre), who's staying at the same B&B, invites her to tour picturesque Carlingford with him. But when he introduces her to the local music scene, her tune changes in this Celtic charmer. Nominated for 1 award. Rated PG.

**ONLY THE CAT KNOWS** *aka Hatsukoi: Otōsan, Chibi ga inaku narimashita* (2019-Japan) 105m \*\*\* D: Shōtarō Kobayashi. Chieko Baishō (TORA-SAN Series), Tatsuya Fuji, Yuriko Hoshi, Mikako Ichikawa. For 50 years, Yukiko (Baishō) has devoted her life to caring for her uncommunicative husband Masaru (Fuji). When her beloved cat Chibi disappears, it sparks a marital crisis in this charming late life love story. For ages 12 and older.

**BROKEN SWORDS** *aka Hiken yaburi* (1969-Japan) 90m \*\*\* D: Kazuo Ikehiro. Hiroki Matsukata, Kōjirō Hongō, Tomomi Iwai. Three great historical legends come together in this stirring samurai tale. In 1694, masterless samurai (ronin) Yasubei (Hongō) rises to fame in a duel at Takada no Baba and ends up one of the 47 ronin of the Chūshingura legend. An equally honorable man who happens to be Yasubei's rival in love, Tenzen Tange (Matsukata), joins the Uesugi clan—the rival clan to Yasubei's Asano clan. Fated to be Yasubei's adversary, Tange's fate is also to become legendary as Tange Sazen. Don't miss this excellent remake of the wildly popular SAMURAI VENDETTA (1959). For ages 12 and older.

**THE SWEET AND THE BITTER** *aka Il dolce e l'amaro* (2007-Italy) 97m \*\*\* D: Andrea Porporati (writer of LAMERICA). Luigi Lo Cascio, Donatella Finocchiaro, Fabrizio Gifuni, Gaetano Bruno, Linda Messerklinger. This tale set in Palermo, Sicily follows the rise and fall of gangster Saro (Lo Cascio), whose life's course is determined by the Cosa Nostra in ways he cannot anticipate. He is wealthy and well-respected, but he cannot marry the girl he loves (Finocchiaro) or question the demands of his superiors. This stylish crime drama won 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

**WALLANDER: THE GUILT** *aka Skulden* (2010-Sweden) 92m \*\*\* D: Leif Magnusson. Krister Henriksson, Lena Endre, Douglas Johansson, Jan Mybrand, Wallis Grahn. When a young boy disappears from his pre-school, the entire Ystad community's anger begins to focus on a pedophile (Mybrand) that has recently returned to the neighborhood from prison in this thriller. Chief detective Kurt Wallander (Henriksson) must keep his own team's prejudices in check to uncover the shocking truth. For ages 15 and older.

**SUNSHINE ON LEITH** (2013-Scotland) 100m \*\*\* D: Dexter Fletcher. Peter Mullan, Jane Horrocks, George MacKay, Kevin Guthrie, Jason Fleming, Antonia Thomas, Freya Mavor. Buddies Davy (MacKay) and Ally (Guthrie) return home to Edinburgh after fighting in Afghanistan, looking forward to the embrace of family and friends... and perhaps love. This rousing adaptation of Stephen Greenhorn's hit musical soars to the tunes of The Proclaimers. This delightful Scottish gem was nominated for 5 awards. For ages 10 and older.

**SWORDS OF VENGEANCE** *aka Akō-jō danzetsu* (1978-Japan) 160m \*\*\* ½ D: Kinji Fukasaku (CREST OF BETRAYAL). Shin'ichi "Sonny" Chiba (1/22/1939 - 8/19/2021), Kinnosuke Nakamura, Tetsurō Tanba, Teruhiko Saigō, Nobuo Kaneko, Toshirō Mifune, Hiroki Matsukata. In the shogun's Edo palace in 1701, Lord Kira (Kaneko) mercilessly insults visiting Lord Asano (Saigō) until he flies into a rage. Asano draws his sword in the palace—a grave crime—and is made to commit seppuku the same day. In this most stylish and thrilling rendition of the Chūshingura legend, 47 ronin stake their lives on avenging Lord Asano. For ages 12 and older.

**4 LATAS** (2019-Spain) 101m \*\*\* D: Gerardo Olivares. Jean Reno, Hovik Keuchkerian, Susana Abaitua, Juan Dos Santos, Enrique San Francisco. When Basque security guard Tocho (Keuchkerian) receives a letter informing him that his old friend Joseba (San Francisco) is about to die, he ditches his job, packs bottles of gin, and convinces his old pal Jean Pierre (Reno) in France to join him on a trip to Timbuktu to see Joseba. Their Sahara Desert(!) transportation: a rebuilt 1982 Renault 4L. This entertaining road comedy-drama is for ages 15 and older.

**THE PATRIOTS** *aka Les patriotes* (1994-France) 146m \*\*\* ½ D: Eric Rochant. Yvan Attal, Richard Masur, Sandrine Kiberlain, Yossi Banai, Nancy Allen, Emmanuelle Devos. Just after his eighteenth birthday Ariel Brenner (Attal) leaves his family and friends in Paris to join the Mossad in Tel Aviv in this spy thriller set in the 1980s. Completing the tough psychological training with cool precision, Ariel is recruited into Unit 238, a team known for not playing by the rules. As the assignments become more dangerous and lives are jeopardized, Ariel begins to question whether his job's means are worth its ends. Nominated for 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

**THE SHOGUN'S SAMURAI** *aka Yagyū ichizoku no inbō* (1978-Japan) 130m \*\*\* ½ D: Kinji Fukasaku. Kinnosuke Nakamura, Sonny Chiba (as Yagyū Jūbei), Hiroki Matsukata, Teruhiko Saigō, Toshirō Mifune, Tetsurō Tanba, Hiroyuki Sanada. Hidetada, the second Tokugawa shogun, dies before his successor is decided. The shogun's older son Iemitsu (Matsukata) has a big birthmark on his face, he stammers and is impetuous. His younger brother Tadanaga (Saigō) is handsome, wise and of good temperament. Tadanaga has more followers, but Iemitsu's followers, members of the Yagyū clan, are prepared to do anything to win the shogunate. A classic star-studded epic! Ages 10 and older.

**IN THE HEIGHTS** (2021-US) 143m \*\*\* ½ D: Jon M. Chu (CRAZY RICH ASIANS). Anthony Ramos, Melissa Barrera, Leslie Grace, Corey Hawkins, Lin-Manuel Miranda. In this joyous adaptation of Lin-Manuel Miranda's Tony-winning musical, young Latinx residents of New York's gritty Washington Heights dream, sing and dance of a better future. Usnavi (Ramos), who runs a little bodega and hopes to return to the Dominican Republic, is visited by his friend Nina (Grace), who's back in the heights from studying at Stanford. Winner of 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

**GOLIAT** (2018-Sweden) 85m \*\*\* ½ D: Peter Grönlund. Sebastian Ljungblad, Joakim Sällquist, Cornelia Andersson, Sampo Sarkola. Seventeen-year-old Kim (Ljungblad) has gotten into another fight defending his family's name. There's not much he can defend. His father Roland (Sällquist) is going to prison for dealing drugs. Set in a small industrial town in Sweden, this powerful coming-of-age drama portrays a young man at the crossroads of adulthood—he's forced to make decisions that will impact his lifetime. Winner of 4 awards. For ages 15 years and older.

**GET UP!** *aka Geroppa!* (2003-Japan) 113m \*\*\* D: Kazuyuki Izutsu. Toshiyuki Nishida (GHOST OF A CHANCE), Takako Tokiwa, Taro Yamamoto, Ittoku Kishibe, Willie Raynor. Yakuza boss Daisuke (Nishida) is enjoying his last few days of freedom before his prison sentence in this wildly entertaining crime comedy. His second-in-command Kanezuma (Kishibe) decides to help Daisuke fulfill his bucket list: find Kaori (Tokiwa), Daisuke's long lost daughter, and meet soul legend James Brown. To do this, a little bit of kidnapping might be involved... Winner of 6 awards. For ages 15 and older. *Liam turns 3 on 9/23!*

**LE GRAND BAL** (2018-France) 86m \*\*\* D: Laetitia Carton. Each summer, in the little rural village of Gennettes in France, several thousand people gather to folk dance for eight straight days. This documentary allows the viewer to mingle in the crowd, as happy revelers camp out, eat under the stars and dance all night. The typical participant in this festival also attends dance workshops during the day, so there's very little sleep as the dancers compulsively waltz, mazurka or bourée. This joyous doc was nominated for an award. For all ages.

**CASH TRUCK** *aka Le convoyeur* (2004-France) 93m \*\*\* D: Nicolas Boukhrief (MADE IN FRANCE). Albert Dupontel, François Berléand, Jean Dujardin, Claude Perron, Julien Bosselier. At Vigilante, a small cash transport company, employees are given firearms training. Nevertheless, they've been violently robbed three times in the past year. A mysterious new hire named Alexandre (Dupontel) joins the rogues' gallery of employees. He's rumored to be rich—why is he taking this risky job for so little pay? This suspenseful thriller is for ages 15 and older.

**SNABBA CASH** *aka Easy Money* (2010-Sweden/Germany/Denmark/France) 125m \*\*\* D: Daniel Espinosa. Joel Kinnaman, Matias Varela, Dragomir Mrsic, Lisa Henni. Swedish business student JW (Kinnaman) is smart, looks like a model for GQ, and he's convinced heiress Sophie (Henni) that he's the wealthy son of a diplomat. The truth is that he just scrapes by as a Stockholm cabbie. When he decides to finance his upscale lifestyle by laundering some drug money, he gets embroiled in the Serbian mafia in this heart-pounding thriller. Winner of 4 awards. Rated R.

**NERO WOLFE: PRISONER'S BASE** (2001-US) 92m \*\*\* ½ D: Neil Fearnley. Timothy Hutton, Maury Chaykin, Shauna Black. A beautiful young heiress (Black) handsomely pays sleuth Nero Wolfe's assistant Archie Goodwin (Hutton) to stay at Wolfe's house for a week. When she refuses to reveal her identity or her reasons, Nero Wolfe (Chaykin) has her booted out, after which she meets a bad end. Horrified, Archie promptly investigates the murder but is hauled in by the police. It's now up to Nero Wolfe to represent Archie and bring a solution to this twisty mystery. For ages 13 and older.

**DRÔLE DE DRAME** *aka Bizarre, Bizarre* (1937-France) 99m \*\*\* ½ D: Marcel Carné (CHILDREN OF PARADISE). Françoise Rosay, Michel Simon, Louis Jouvet, Jean-Pierre Aumont, Jean-Louis Barrault. Poor Professor Molyneux (Simon)! To finance their upper-crust lifestyle in Victorian London, his socially ambitious wife Margaret (Rosay) has been forcing him to write crime novels under the pseudonym of Felix Chapel. Now the Anglican Bishop of Bedford (Jouvet), who's crusading against Chapel's impious novels, is coming to dinner! When Mme. Molyneux decides to fake her own disappearance, all hell breaks loose in Jacques Prévert's blackly comic script, which gleefully sends up Hercule Poirot and British detective fiction. Notable characters include a lovesick milkman (Aumont) and a vegetarian murderer (Barrault) of butchers. For ages 12 and older.
