LA RAFLE aka The Round Up (2010-France/Germany/Hungary) 120m *** ½ D: Rose Bosch. Jean Reno, Mélanie Laurent, Gad Elmaleh, Raphaëlle Agogué, Hugo Leverdez. This true story depicts events of the summer of 1942 in occupied Paris, when 11-year-old Jo (Leverdez) and his family are "rounded up" in the Vélodrome D'Hiver along with 13,000 Jews. Jo and his family face contempt and cruelty, but also kindness and heroic sacrifice by gentile friends and neighbors. This deeply moving drama features great performances by Reno as a compassionate doctor and Laurent as his nurse. For ages 12 and older.

BAD FAITH aka Mauvaise foi (2006-Belgium-France) 84m *** D: Roschdy Zem. Cécile De France, Roschdy Zem, Pascal Elbe, Jean-Pierre Cassel. In this modern version of GUESS WHO'S COMING TO DINNER, Clara (De France) belongs to a Jewish family and her partner Ismael (Zem) to a Muslim family but neither practice a religion. They've been happily together for four years, but when Clara discovers she's pregnant, she and Ismael have to find a way to tell their very traditional parents. This comedy won a Best Actress Étoile d'Or for De France. For ages 12 and older.

OUR HAPPY LIVES aka Nos vies heureuses (1999-France) 140m *** D: Jacques Maillot. Marie Payen, Cécile Richard, Camille Japy, Sami Bouajila, Eric Bonicatto, Jean-Michel Portal. Six young adults living in Paris struggle with love and work while discovering themselves. Julie (Payen) is recovering from a suicide attempt. She loves Ali (Bouajila) who has visa problems. They are friends with Emilie (Japy) who's in the midst of a breakup. Emilie's friend Cécile (Richard) has a talent she's afraid to pursue, and Lucas (Portal) is single again and experimenting. This vivid portrayal of people in transition was nominated for a Palme d'Or at Cannes. For ages 15 and older.

TRAIN OF LIFE aka Train de vie (1998-France/Belgium/Netherlands/Israel/Romania) 103m *** D: Radu Mihaileanu (LIVE AND BECOME). Lionel Abelanski, Rufus, Clement Harari, Michel Muller, Agathe de La Fontaine. This tragicomic Holocaust fable set in a remote Romanian community in 1941 is about village idiot Shlomo's (Abelanski) plan to escape an imminent Nazi nightmare. The townsfolk build a fake deportation train complete with fake Nazis, with the goal of reaching Palestine. This funny and poignant movie won 10 awards, including an audience award from Sundance. Rated R.

SUMMER THINGS aka Embrassez qui vous voudrez (2002-France/UK/Italy) 99m **** D: Michel Blanc. Charlotte Rampling, Jacques Dutronc, Carole Bouquet, Michel Blanc, Karin Viard, Clotilde Courau. This witty sex farce has Elizabeth (Rampling), a housewife vacationing without her husband (Dutronc) at an upscale French seaside resort. For company, Elizabeth has her single mom pal Julie (Courau) who's on the make despite her squalling baby, and a family of hard-up neighbors who are making do in a trailer park. As the week unfolds, friendships blossom, passions inflame, and everyone learns something about love. Winner of two film awards. For ages 15 and elder.

SECRETS OF STATE aka Secret défense (2008-France) 100m *** D: Philippe Haïm. Gerard Lanvin, Vahina Giocante, Nicolas Duvauchelle, Mehdi Nebbou, Simon Abkarian. Young French pusher Pierre (Duvauchelle) is radicalized in prison and is sent to Afghanistan to become a martyr. Diane (Giocante), a college student of Arabic, is recruited to become a Secret Service operative. Both are pawns in the deadly game of terrorism versus counterterrorism, where the ideologies are opposite but the methods are identical. This complex and well-researched French spy thriller may be too intense for viewers younger

PROMETHEUS (2012-US/UK) 124m *** D: Ridley Scott (ALIEN). Noomi Rapace (THE GIRL WITH THE DRAGON TATTOO), Michael Fassbender, Charlize Theron, Idris Elba, Guy Pearce, Benedict Wong. This grand sci-fi epic seeks nothing less than to ponder the origin of human life. A group of humans in 2093 travel in a spaceship named Prometheus to a small moon orbiting a giant planet. They hope to solve a mystery hinted at in prehistoric cave paintings. Mind-blowing visuals power this imaginative film, which was nominated for 3 Teen Choice awards. Rated R.

X-MEN: FIRST CLASS (2011-US) 132m *** D: Matthew Vaughn. James McAvoy, Michael Fassbender, Kevin Bacon, Rose Byrne, Jennifer Lawrence, Jason Flemyng. This superhero adventure takes you to the beginning of the X-Men story, before Professor X, aka Charles Xavier (McAvoy) and Magneto, aka Erik Lensherr (Fassbender) were archenemies. Indeed, the two were close friends, and they recruited fellow mutants to help solve the Cuban Missile Crisis in 1962. This fun and exciting actioner won 5 awards. Rated PG-13.

MARGERY AND GLADYS (2003-UK) 98m *** D: Geoffrey Sax. Penelope Keith, June Brown, Adam Godley, Roger Lloyd-Pack. At her home in Kent, recently widowed society matron Margery (Keith) bashes a would-be burglar on the head with a Waterford crystal vase. Thinking he might be dead, Margery panics and flees her house with her cleaning lady Gladys (Brown), leaving her handbag behind. The two women try to reach Margery's son Graham (Godley) in Milton Keynes, but the trip turns into a wild comedy of disasters. This buddy movie is a droll British take on THELMAAND LOUISE. For ages 10 and older.

CONVERSATIONS WITH MY GARDENER (2007-France) 106m *** ½ D: Jean Becker (MY AFTERNOONS WITH MARGUERITTE). Daniel Auteuil, Jean-Pierre Darroussin. A successful painter (Auteuil), weary of life in Paris, returns to his childhood home upon the death of his parents. He hires a gardener to recreate his mother's vegetable garden and discovers the gardener (Darroussin) is an old childhood friend. As the two reacquaint themselves, the urban sophisticate and the rural pragmatist discover they have much to share in wisdom and humor. Suitable for ages 12 and older.

FEMALE AGENTS aka Les femmes de l'ombre (2008-France) 113m *** D: Jean-Paul Salomé. Sophie Marceau, Julie Depardieu, Marie Gillain, Déborah François, Moritz Bleibtreu, Maya Sansa. The secrets of a British geologist in a German hospital are in danger of falling into Nazi hands, jeopardizing the D-Day mission. Ace sniper Louise Desfontaine (Marceau) is assigned by the Special Operations Executive (SOE) to rescue him, and she recruits a team of women to do the job. This thrill ride of a WWII movie, based on real people and events, was nominated for a Best Costume Design César. Ages 15 and older.

MONSIEUR BATIGNOLE (2002-France) 100m ****1/2 D: Gérard Jugnot (THE CHORUS). Jules Sitruk, Gérard Jugnot, Michèle Garcia, Jean-Paul Rouve. In 1942, in Nazi-occupied Paris, butcher Edmond Batignole (Jugnot) feels forced to cater to the Germans to survive. When Edmond's future son-in-law Pierre-Jean (Rouve) causes the Jewish neighbors the Bernsteins to be deported, Edmond decides to take in and hide young Simon Bernstein (Sitruk), who had managed to escape the Nazis. Batignole, an apolitical and practical man, juggles an increasingly complex situation with humor and humanity. This touching serio-comedy won a César. For ages 15 and older.

A SELF-MADE HERO aka Un héros très discret (1996-France) 107m **** ½D: Jacques Audiard (RUST AND BONE). Mathieu Kassovitz (AMÉLIE), Anouk Grinberg, Sandrine Kiberlain, Jean-Louis Trintignant, Albert Dupontel. In 1944, at the end of a war he didn't fight, penniless Albert Dehousse (Kassovitz) reinvents himself as a hero of the French Resistance. This sly and witty indictment of French-Nazi collaboration won three awards, including Best Screenplay at Cannes. For ages 12 and elder.

MARCELLO MARCELLO (2008-Switzerland/Germany) 93m **** D: Denis Rabaglia. Francesco Mistichelli, Elena Cucci, Alfio Alessi, Luigi Petrazzuolo. This charming romantic comedy set in 1956 on the picturesque island of Amatrello tells the story of Marcello (Mistichelli), a fisherman's son, who falls in love with Elena (Cucci), the mayor's daughter. According to the custom of the island, a boy who courts a girl must provide a gift... for her father. Marcello is desperate to obtain the perfect gift, and in the process turns the town upside down. Winner at the St. Louis International Film Festival. For ages 12 and older.

MOONRISE KINGDOM (2012-US) 94m ***** D: Wes Anderson (RUSHMORE). Jared Gilman, Kara Hayward, Bruce Willis, Edward Norton, Bill Murray, Tilda Swinton, Frances McDormand. Misfit 12-year-olds Sam (Gilman) and Suzy (Hayward) fall in love and run away together in this wonderfully droll romantic comedy. It is 1965 in a windswept pocket of Rhode Island, where the grownups the kids are trying to escape are helplessly tethered to the time and place. Sparkling with references from vintage Americana to French New Wave, this gem has been nominated for 2 awards so far. Rated PG-13.

I'M NOT SCARED aka Io non ho paura (2003-Italy/ Spain/UK) 101m *** ½ D: Gabriele Salvatores (MEDITERRANEO). Giuseppe Cristiano, Dino Abbrescia, Aitana Sánchez-Gijón, Mattia Di Pierro. This terrific, beautifully shot thriller set in 1978 in a sunny rural community in southern Italy is about Michele (Cristiano), a 10-year-old boy who discovers a half-concealed pit where Filippo (Di Pierro), a boy his age is being held hostage. When Michele tries to help Filippo, the horrible truth about Filippo's kidnappers is revealed. Winner of 11 awards. Rated R.

THE RECIPE (2010-South Korea) 107m *** D: Anna Lee. Seung-Ryong Ryu, Yu-won Lee, Dong-Wook Lee, Seong-ha Ho, Yong-nyeo Lee. Kim Jong-gu, a dangerous fugitive the police have been pursuing for years, was defeated by a bowl of doenjang jigae (Korean fermented bean-paste stew). So unearthly was this stew that the criminal was brought to a state of helpless bliss, enabling the police to easily capture him. Intrigued by this story, TV producer Yoo-jin Choi (Ryu) decides to hunt down the recipe and its creator. Soon he's drawn into a mystery of love and the magical alchemy of good food. For ages 12 and older.

THE UNKNOWN WOMAN aka La sconosciuta (2006-Italy/France) 120m *** D: Giuseppe Tornatore (CIN-EMA PARADISO). Ksenia Rappoport, Michele Placido, Claudia Gerini, Piera Degli Esposti. This Hitchcockian nail-biter is about a Ukrainian woman named Irena (Rappoport) who insinuates herself into the life of an affluent northern Italian family. Dark and violent secrets from her past draw her close to fragile young Tea, the daughter. This intensely suspenseful thriller won 17 awards. Rated R.

THE SERPENT (2006-France) 116m *** ½ D: Eric Barbier. Yvan Attal, Clovis Cornillac, Pierre Richard, Minna Haapkylä, Simon Abkarian, Olga Kurylenko (the new Bond girl). In this stylish thriller co-written by Ted Lewis (GET CARTER), French fashion photographer Vincent (Attal) is about to divorce his wealthy German wife (Haapkylä). When psychopath Joseph Plender (Cornillac), an ex-friend from junior high school, reappears in his life, Vincent is framed for rape and murder. To prevent his life from spiraling down the drain Vincent must enter the Serpent's realm. For ages 15 and older.

HELLO GHOST aka Hellowoo goseuteu (2010-South Korea) 111m *** 1/2 D: Young-Tak Kim. Tae-hyun Cha (MY SASSY GIRL), Ye-won Kang, Moon-su Lee, Chang-Seok Ko, Young-nam Jang, Bo-geun Cheon. After a suicide attempt, Sang-man (Cha) wakes up in the hospital and discovers he can see ghosts (four ghosts, that is). They are: Smokey (Ko), Weepy (Jang), Greedy (Cheon) and Letch (Lee). Sang-man cannot evade them, and they follow him home, turning his formerly lonely life upside down. This funny, thoughtful and surprisingly moving comedy is suitable for ages 12 and older.

UNEARTHLY STRANGER (1964-UK) 78m *** ½D: John Krish (THE AVENGERS tv). John Neville (A STUDY IN TERROR), Philip Stone (THE SHINING), Gabriella Licudi, Patrick Newell, Jean Marsh. Friends Mark (Neville) and John (Stone) are scientists close to a revolutionary breakthrough in intergalactic travel. When a colleague working on the same project dies under frightening circumstances, the two friends join forces to find the cause. This taut and unique British sci-fi expertly ratchets up the paranoia. A gripping thriller-- and it's extremely rare too! For all ages.

LAKE OF THE DEAD aka De dødes tjern (1958-Norway) 74m *** ½ D: Kåre Bergstrøm. Henki Kolstad, André Bjerke, Bjorg Engh, Erling Lindahl, Henny Moan, Georg Richter. A group of intellectuals vacation in a cabin in a Norwegian forest. They were supposed to meet up with Bjørn, brother of one of the party, but he's nowhere to be found. Nearby is a mysterious lake with a frightening legend, and the group is beginning to find evidence that they're being hunted by a malevolent being. This beautifully crafted supernatural mystery is a Scandinavian favorite. For ages 12 and older.
