FORT MCCOY (2011-US) 101m * D:** Kate Connor, Michael Worth, Eric Stoltz (MASK), Kate Connor, Lyndsy Fonseca, Andy Hirsch. This moving drama based on real events concerns a family that moves to Fort McCoy in Wisconsin in 1944. Frank (Stoltz), the family's father, works as a barber at the American Army POW camp. One of the POWs, a Nazi officer, stalks Frank's wife Ruby (Connor). Director Connor, who plays her real-life grandmother Ruby, also wrote the script for this labor of love. Winner of 11 awards. Rated R.

THE GOD OF COOKERY aka Sik san (1996-Hong Kong) 95m * D:** Stephen Chow (KUNG FU HUSTLE). Stephen Chow, Karen Mok, Nancy Sit, Man Tat Ng. This outrageous foodie-kung fu-comedy has Hong Kong comedian Stephen Chow as the despicable God of Cookery. When he loses his title because of his arrogance, the humbled chef faces an uphill battle to regain his reputation. This hilarious culinary showdown was nominated for 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

CHEF (2014-US) 116m * ½ D:** Jon Favreau (IRON MAN). Jon Favreau, John Leguizamo, Bobby Cannavale, Scarlett Johansen, Dustin Hoffman, Sofia Vergara, Robert Downey Jr. In this warm-hearted comedy, chef Carl (Favreau) decides to ditch his job at a swanky Los Angeles restaurant to open a food truck and drive it across the country. The most important things for happiness: Freedom, Friendship, Family and Food are epitomized by Carl's gastronomical road adventure. Prepare to get hungry. Rated R.

A TALE OF SAMURAI COOKING: A TRUE LOVE STORY (2013-Japan) 122m * D:** Yûzô Asahara, Aya Ueto, Kenjo Kôra, Toshiyuki Nishida (A GHOST OF A CHANCE), Kimiko Yo. Since his older brother's unexpected death, Yasunobu (Kôra) is being groomed to become chef to the Kaga daimyo in Edo-period Japan. This is an exalted position—and hereditary in his samurai class family. But Yasunobu had his heart set on being a warrior: he can't bear trading his sword for a cooking knife. His father (Nishida) has a solution. He's found the perfect foodie bride (Ueto) to inspire his son! Nominated for 2 awards. For ages 10 and older.

THE RABBI'S CAT aka Le chat de rabbin (2011-France) 89m * ½ D:** Antoine Delesvaux, Joann Sfar. Voiced by Mathieu Amalric, François Morel, Maurice Bénichou, Hafsia Herzi, Mohamed Fellag. In this beautiful animation of Joann Sfar's comic, a rabbi's cat (Morel) eats a parrot and gains the power of speech in 1920s Algiers. The feline is a sarcastic loudmouth, but he's devoted to the rabbi (Bénichou) and his voluptuous daughter (Herzi). The cat and the rabbi embark on an epic journey. Highly entertaining! Winner of 3 awards, including a Best Animated Film César. For ages 12 and older.

THREE STARS (2010-Germany) 90m * D:** Lutz Hachmeister (THE GOEBBELS EXPERIMENT). This fascinating documentary delves into the intricate workings of the world of Michelin three-star restaurants. In this rarified milieu, ephemera such as an ingredient's quality on a given day, the humidity of a kitchen or the whim of a critic can make the difference of a star. Is the prestige of three stars an honor or a burden? This mouth-watering tour of nine top restaurants from three continents offers rare insight. For ages 12 and older.

A COFFEE IN BERLIN (2012-Germany) 88m * ½ D:** Jan Ole Gerster (feature debut). Tom Schilling, Marc Hosemann, Friederike Kemper, Justus von Dohnányi. This witty black and white tragicomedy is a day in the life of twenty-something Niko. He's dropped out of law school but hasn't told his dad—who's still thinks he's funding Niko's education. Niko is walking around Berlin trying to get a cup of coffee, meeting all sorts of people nuttier than even he is. This HIFF award nominee won 25 awards from all over the world. For ages 15 and older.

A GHOST OF A CHANCE aka Sutekina kanashibari (2011-Japan) 143m * D:** Kôki Mitani (THE MAGIC HOUR). Toshiyuki Nishida, Eri Fukatsu, Hiroshi Abe, Tadanobu Asano (THOR), Kîchi Nakai. Bumbling lawyer Emi Hoshô (Fukatsu) convinces the 400-year-old ghost of samurai Rokubei Sarashina (Nishida) to appear in court as the only witness to a crime. The problem is, only a select few can see or hear Rokubei. This highly inventive supernatural comedy won a Nikkan Sports Film Award for Nishida's blustering/kindly performance. For ages 10 and older.

EDGE OF TOMORROW (2014-US/Australia) 113m * ½ D:** Doug Liman (THE BOURNE IDENTITY). Tom Cruise, Emily Blunt, Bill Paxton, Brendan Gleason (CALVARY). In this hugely entertaining humans vs aliens version of GROUNDHOG DAY, slick PR man Cage (Cruise) is forced to repeat a day of battle with a ferocious alien race until he gets it right. The battle scenes are epic, the script clever and the stars incandescent. This first class action adventure was nominated for 2 awards. Rated PG-13.

MAGNIFICA PRESENZA (2012-Italy) 102m * D:** Ferzan Ozpetek (FACING WINDOWS). Elio Germano (MY BROTHER IS AN ONLY CHILD), Paola Minaccioni, Margherita Buy, Beppe Fiorello, Andrea Bosca. In this charming comedy set in Rome, gay aspiring actor Pietro (Germano) rents a large house for surprisingly little money. Turns out his new home is haunted. Luckily for Pietro, the ghosts belong to a theatrical troupe that specializes in musicals. This not-so-scary ghost story won 7 awards, including three Italian Golden Globes. For ages 15 and older.

THE DOOR aka Die Tür (2009-Germany) 99m * D:** Anno Saul, Mads Mikkelsen (THE HUNT), Jessica Schwarz, Valeria Eisenbart, Thomas Thieme. Devastated after his daughter's death, successful artist David (Mikkelsen) is offered an unexpected second chance in this spooky and ingenious thriller. This adaptation of Akif Pirincci's *Die Damalstuer* won 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

TO BE TAKEI (2014-US) 94m * ½ D:** Jennifer M. Kroot (IT CAME FROM KUCCHAR). Known to Star Trek fans as Mr. Sulu, actor/activist/social media personality George Takei at 77 years old is even more of a star now than he was in the 1960s. This documentary traces Takei's life from his childhood imprisoned in internment camps to his acting career to his emergence from the closet to the present—happily married to Brad Takei (born Brad Altman). Included: a priceless scene in which George tells off the notoriously insufferable William Shatner. For ages 15 and older.

CHINESE PUZZLE aka Casse-tête chinois (2013-France/US/Belgium) 117m * ½ D:** Cédric Klapisch (L'AUBERGE ESPAGNOLE). Romain Duris, Audrey Tautou, Cécile De France, Kelly Reilly, Xavier (Duris) and his friends from L'AUBERGE ESPAGNOLE are about to turn 40, and growing up is still a work in progress. Xavier is off to New York to try to reunite with Wendy (Reilly) who's run away with their two kids. While there he meets up with ex-girlfriend Martine (Tautou) and his lesbian buddy Isabelle (De France) leading to humorous complications aplenty. This light-hearted comedy won an award. Rated R.

THE EXTRAORDINARY TALE OF WILLIAM BUCKLEY (2010-Australia) 53m * D:** Malcolm McDonald, Michael Cathcart, Jean-Marc Russ. In 1835, a white man with long wild hair and beard emerged from the Australian bush dressed in skins and carrying spears. He was the escaped convict William Buckley, who was long presumed dead. This docudrama presented by historian Michael Cathcart re-enacts Buckley's amazing story that spans 32 years in an aboriginal tribe in southern Victoria. For ages 12 and older.

BABAKIUIERIA (1986-Australia) 29m ** D:** Don Featherstone, Michelle Torres, Bob Maza, Kevin Smith. In this brilliant comedy short, an Australian aboriginal force descends on the white natives of the land of Babakiuieria. A reporter (Torres) embeds herself in a family living in the white ghetto to document their plight. For ages 12 and older.

MYSTERY ROAD (2013-Australia) 112m * D:** Ivan Sen (BENEATH CLOUDS). Aaron Pedersen (JACK IRISH: DEAD POINT), Hugo Weaving, Ryan Kwanten, Jack Thompson. Indigenous detective Jay Swan (Pedersen) returns to his small Queensland home town after many years in the city to investigate the death of an aboriginal girl. Seen as an outsider by both the aboriginal community and the mostly white police force, Jay must unravel the mystery on his own. This gripping crime thriller won 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

TASTING MENU aka Menú degustació (2013-Spain/Ireland) 85m * D:** Roger Gual (SMOKING ROOM). Jan Cornet, Claudia Bassols, Vicenta N'Dongo, Stephen Rea, Togo Igawa. As a world-class Catalan restaurant opens its doors for its final evening, Rachel (Bassols) and Marc (Cornet), a couple in the midst of a divorce who'd reserved their table a year ago, reunite for a once-in-a-lifetime meal. The chef, the brigade in the kitchen and the lucky diners prepare themselves for the theater of fine dining—and the warm fellowship that great food brings. Nominated for an award at HIFF. Rated PG-13.

SNOWPIERCER (2013-South Korea/Czech Republic/US/France) 126m * ½ D:** Joon-ho Bong (THE HOST). Chris Evans, Kang-ho Song, Ed Harris, John Hurt, Tilda Swinton, Jamie Bell, Octavia Spencer, Ah-sung Ko. In this electrifying sci-fi spectacle based on French graphic novel "Le Transperceneige", a group of humans survives devastating climate change by being aboard the Snowpiercer—a train built by mysterious transport magnate Willford (Harris). The passengers in the first class cabin are protected from the slum-like second class... but not for long. Winner of 5 awards. Rated R.

CANOPY (2013-Australia/Singapore) 84m * D:** Aaron Wilson (feature debut). Khan Chittenden, Tzu-yi Mo, Robert Menzies, Edwina Wren. Australian fighter pilot Jim (Chittenden) is shot down over Singapore during the Japanese invasion of 1942. When he regains consciousness, he finds himself suspended in the canopy of a dense rainforest. Jim stumbles onto Seng (Mo), a Singaporean Chinese resistance fighter who, like Jim, is being hunted by the Japanese. The two form an alliance to survive. This visceral war drama is beautifully filmed in Singapore's jungles and mangrove swamps. PG-13.

TODAY'S SPECIAL (2009-US) 99m * D:** David Kaplan. Aasif Mandvi (MILLION DOLLAR ARM), Naseeruddin Shah, Jess Wexler, Madhur Jaffrey. Samir (Mandvi) is sous-chef at a swanky French restaurant in Manhattan. When he doesn't get his expected promotion, he quits in a huff and makes plans for Paris. But when Samir's dad has a heart attack, Samir is forced to stay in Queens to run his father's greasy spoon, Tandoori Palace. Problem is, Samir knows nothing of Indian food. Luckily, he meets a mystical cabbie (Shah) who changes everything. This charming foodie comedy features the first lady of Indian cuisine, Madhur Jaffrey, as Samir's mom. Rated R.

MURK aka Mørke (2005-Denmark/UK) 124m * D:** Jannik Johansen (WHITE NIGHT). Nikolaj Lie Kaas (BROTHERS), Nicolas Bro (DARK HORSE), Laura Drasbæk, Lotte Bergström, Lærke Winther Andersen. In this psychological thriller, Copenhagen-based ex-journalist Jacob (Lie Kaas) is surprised to find his handicapped sister Julie (Bergström) will be marrying her Internet acquaintance Anker (Bro). On their wedding night, his suspicion will turn to terror. This atmospheric mystery builds tension and will keep you guessing. Nominated for 7 awards. For ages 15 and older.

SIDDHARTH (2013-Canada/India) 97m * ½ D:** Richie Mehta (AMAL). Rajesh Tailang, Tannishtha Chatterjee, Anurag Arora, Irfan Khan, Geeta Agrawal Sharma. This moving tale set in Delhi centers on Mahendra, a poor man who makes his living repairing zippers. Hearing of a job opportunity for his 12-year-old son Siddharth (Khan), Mahendra puts him on a bus to Punjab. When Siddharth doesn't return for the Diwali holiday, Mahendra begins to worry something terrible has happened. This complex and unsettling drama won 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

THE BONE MAN aka Der Knochenmann (2009-Austria) 121m * ½ D:** Wolfgang Murnberger (SILENTIUM). Joseph Hader, Josef Bierbichler, Birgit Minichmayr. Equal parts gritty crime thriller, hilarious black comedy and sweet romance, THE BONE MAN concerns haggard big-city repo man Brenner (Hader) who is sent to an Austrian country inn to retrieve a Volkswagen. Expecting an easy job, Brenner (a former cop) finds instead an escalating series of deaths... and a promising romance. Winner of 1 award. For adults 17 years and older only. *Happily Halloween!*

TAMPOPO (1985-Japan) 114m ** D:** Juzo Itami. Tsutomu Yamazaki, Nobuko Miyamoto, Ken Watanabe, Koji Yakusho (SHALL WE DANSU), Rikiya Yasuoka. Trucker Goro (Yamazaki) and his sidekick Gun (Watanabe) ride into Tokyo like gun-slingers on a mission. The little lady they hope to rescue is Tampopo (Miyamoto), a widow struggling to run her late husband's noodle shop. Goro and Gun decide they will transform Tampopo into Japan's best ramen chef. This wildly hedonistic, laugh-out-loud foodie comedy classic won 4 awards. Rated R.

LE CHEF aka Comme un chef (2012-France/Spain) 84m * ½ D:** Daniel Cohen. Jean Reno (LES VISITEURS), Michaël Youn, Raphaëlle Agogué, Julien Boisselier. Three-starred French chef Alexandre Lagarde (Reno) is in trouble with the snotty CEO (Boisselier) of his restaurant. Accused of being stuck in the past, disciplined classicist Lagarde reluctantly teams up with madly creative wannabe chef Jacky (Youn) to save his restaurant's stars. This delightful comedy has just the right ingredients to satisfy your appetite for entertainment. Rated PG-13.
