HAPPINESS NEVER COMES ALONE aka Un bonheur n'arrive jamais seul (2012-France) 110m *** D: James Huth. Gad Elmaleh (THE VALET), Sophie Marceau (ANTHONY ZIMMER), François Berléand. Musician Sacha (Elmaleh) loves to party and hates kids. When Charlotte (Marceau) literally falls at his feet, Sacha's life changes forever. This sunny romantic comedy creatively combines music, art and rambunctious children. For ages 12 and older

LIFE BEGINS TODAY aka La vida empieza hoy (2012-Spain) 90m *** ½ D: Laura Mañá (COM-PASSIONATE SEX). Pilar Bardem, Maria Barranco, Sonsoles Benedicto, Osvaldo Santoro. A group of senior citizens in Barcelona takes a class on sex and ends up rediscovering the zest for life in this joyous comedy. Winner of 4 awards. For ages 15 and older—and the more mature the better.

HACHI-KO (1987-Japan) 108m *** D: Seijirô Kôyama. Kaoru Yachigusa, Mako Ishino, Masumi Harukawa, Taiji Tonoyama, Yoshi Katô. This is the moving true story of the undying love of a dog for his master that inspired the famous statue at Shibuya train station in Tokyo. In the 1920s, Hachiko, an Akita dog, accompanied his beloved owner Prof. Ueno to the train station each morning and greeted him there each evening for the walk home. He kept coming to the station daily even 10 years after Prof. Ueno's death. Bring handkerchiefs. For all ages.

BEHIND THE CANDELABRA (2013-US) 118m **** ½ D: Steven Soderbergh (SIDE EFFECTS). Michael Douglas, Matt Damon, Scott Bakula, Debbie Reynolds, Rob Lowe. This drama recounts the tempestuous relationship between entertainer Liberace (Douglas) and his much younger lover Scott Thorson (Damon). This film reveals the humanity behind the glitter and pomade. Winner of 4 awards, including 3 Emmys. For ages 17 and older.

DECEPTIVE PRACTICE: The Mysteries and Mentors of Ricky Jay (2012-US) 89m *** D: Molly Bernstein. Recognizable character actor Ricky Jay is a magician, and one so brilliant that even people right next to him can't see how he performs his miracles. Kenneth Turan of the Los Angeles Times says, "This documentary provides an elegant, enthralling peek behind the curtain and into the youwon't-trust-your-eyes world of this celebrated contemporary conjurer." For ages 10 and older.

DOG NAIL CLIPPER aka Koirankynnen leikkaaja (2004-Finland) 105m *** D: Markku Pölönen. Peter Franzén (AMBUSH), Taisto Reimaluoto, Ahti Kuoppala, Ville Virtanen, Risto Salmi. In 1941, bright young soldier Mertsi (Franzén) heads off to fight the Russians. The battle is a disaster, and Mertsi is disabled from being shot in the head. When he returns to civilian life, his friends Ville (Kuoppala) and Ectvi (Reimaluoto) try to help Mertsi find suitable work. This beautiful and richly human tale won 8 awards. For ages 12 and older.

ROMAN DE GARE (2007-France) 103m *** ½D: Claude Lelouch (A MANAND A WOMAN). Dominique Pinon (AMÉLIE), Fanny Ardant (RIDICULE), Audrey Dana. The fates of Judith the successful novelist (Ardant), single mom Huguette (Dana) and a man with a squinched face named Pierre (Pinon) collide in this intricate thriller in which no one is exactly as he or she seems. The National Board of Review rated ROMAN DE GARE among the Top Five Foreign Films in 2008. Rated R.

1 LITRE OF TEARS aka Ichi rittoru no namida (2005-Japan) 98m *** D: Riki Okamura (feature film debut). Asae Ônishi (HEAVENLY FOREST), Kazuko Kato, Yoshimi Ashikawa, Mitsuo Hamada. Fourteen-year-old Aya Kitô (Ônishi) is diagnosed with a serious disease after taking a fall at school. This touching drama is based on the true story of a courageous young woman's battle with spino-cerebellar ataxia. This film inspired a popular Fuji TV series starring Erika Sawajiri as Aya. Bring handkerchiefs. For ages 10 and older.

KINAMAND aka Chinaman (2005-Denmark/China) 88m ***
D: Henrik Ruben Genz. Bjarne Henriksen, Vivian Wu, Lun Kun Wu, Charlotte Fich. When Danish plumber Keld's (Henriksen) wife (Fich) leaves him, he dispiritedly ambles over to the Chinese take-out each night to have a lonely supper. When the restaurant's owner (Lin Kun Wu) offers Keld money to marry his sister Ling (Vivian Wu), penniless Keld accepts in order to pay for his divorce. Slowly and mysteriously, a bond forms between Keld and Ling that changes everything. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

IHIREDA CONTRACT KILLER (1990-Finland/UK/Germany/ Sweden/France) 79m *** ½ D: Aki Kaurismäki (LE HAVRE). Jean-Pierre Léaud (THE 400 BLOWS), Margi Clarke, Kenneth Colley. Recently unemployed, depressed Henri (Léaud) decides to end it all and hires a hit man (Colley) at a seedy London bar to do the job. Soon afterwards, Henri meets the girl of his dreams (Clarke) and wants to cancel the hit—but can't locate his would-be killer. This quirky comedy won a Jussi for Best Cinematography (Timo Salminen). For ages 15 and older.

LACKAWANNA BLUES (2005-US) 95m **** D: George C. Wolfe. S. Epatha Merkerson (*Law & Order*), Marcus Carl Franklin, Mos Def, Louis Gossett Jr., Terrence Howard, Delroy Lindo, Rosie Perez, Jimmy Smits, Liev Schreiber. This heartwarming true story is about Ruben Santiago-Hudson's (Franklin) upbringing in a small boarding house in Lackawanna, New York in the 1950s and 60s. Left to his own devices by his parents, Ruben is cared for by the boarding house's kindly owner, Rachel "Nanny" Crosby (Merkerson). This toe-tapping celebration of a black community won 27 awards including a Golden Globe for S. Epatha Merkeson. Rated PG-13

JACK IRISH: BAD DEBTS (2012-Australia) 99m *** D: Jeffrey Walker. Guy Pearce (MEMENTO), Marta Dusseldorp, Aaron Pedersen, Roy Billing, Colin Friels. Former criminal lawyer Jack Irish (Pearce) is trying to get his life back together after his wife's death when a former client leaves him a panicky phone message. When the ex-client turns up dead, Jack is drawn into an intricate web of underhanded property deals, crooked ex-cops and murder. This smart and funny adaptation of Peter Temple's mystery novel won 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

JACK IRISH: BLACK TIDE (2012-Australia) 93m *** D: Jeffrey Walker. Guy Pearce (*Mildred Pierce*), Marta Dusseldorp, Aaron Pedersen, Roy Billing, Don Hany. When Jack Irish (Pearce) is asked by his late father's close friend to locate his missing son, Jack thinks he's doing a simple favor. But instead Jack gets embroiled in a dangerous world of drug smuggling and corruption while trying to discover the truth. This adaptation of the second of Peter Temple's Jack Irish novels has lots of delightful Melbourne local color. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 15 and older.

STILL MINE (2012-Canada) 102m *** D: Michael McGowan (SAINT RALPH). James Cromwell (THE QUEEN), Genevieve Bujold (ANNE OF THE THOUSAND DAYS), Chuck Shamata. All farmer Craig (Cromwell) wants to do is build a little house on his plot of land in New Brunswick, Canada. He wants a more navigable home for his beloved wife, Irene (Bujold), who's beginning to show signs of dementia, but he keeps running into roadblock after roadblock. This uplifting tribute to marital devotion won 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

WE'RE THE MILLERS (2013-US) 110m *** D: Rawson Marshall Thurber. Jennifer Aniston, Jason Sudeikis, Emma Roberts, Will Poulter, Ed Helms. Pot dealer David (Sudeikis) is in debt to his ruthless boss (Helms) and has to transport a huge shipment of pot across the Mexican border. He decides he'd be safer if he brings along stripper Rose (Aniston), neighbor kid Kenny (Poulter) and homeless teen Casey (Roberts), and they pretend to be a family. The *Daily Telegraph* says, "This is a fine collection of cheap and sleazy jokes, well-told". Rated R.

THE WORLD'S END (2013-UK) 109m *** D: Edgar Wright (SHAUN OF THE DEAD). Simon Pegg (HOT FUZZ), Nick Frost, Martin Freeman, Rosamund Pike, Eddie Marsan, Paddy Considine. Slacker Gary (Pegg) wants to re-live the glory days of his youth by re-enacting an epic pub crawl with his four buddies. But 20 years have passed since that last pub crawl, and Gary's friends, unlike Gary, have grown up to be responsible adults. Nonetheless, the five go drinking and become mankind's only hope for survival in this wildly imaginative comedy. Rated R.

DUE PARTITE aka The Ladies Get Their Say (2009-Italy) 94m *** D: Enzo Monteleone (writer, MEDITERRANEO). Margherita Buy (THE MANUAL OF LOVE), Isabella Ferrari, Marina Massironi, Paola Cortellesi, Alba Rohrwacher (IAM LOVE). Every Thursday, four women gather for a game of cards while their daughters play in the next room. Thirty years later in 1996, the daughters get together to discuss their and their mothers' lives. This thoughtful adaptation of Cristina Comencini's play was nominated for 6 awards, For ages 15 and older.

GLASSES aka Megane (2007-Japan) 106m *** D: Naoko Ogigami (SEAGULL DINER). Satomi Kobayashi, Mikako Ichikawa (RENTANEKO), Masako Motai. Stressed out professor Taeko (Kobayashi) arrives on an isolated Okinawan island for a muchneeded break. The eccentric people she meets present her with no tourist activities, but instead advise her to "twilight" (the denizens of the island are all masters of "twilighting"). Taeko has no patience for this sort of idleness until she comes to a wonderful realization. Winner at Berlin. For ages 10 and older.

THE WOODSMAN AND THE RAIN aka Kitsutsuki to Ame (2011-Japan) 129m *** D: Shûichi Okita. Kôji Yakusho (SHALL WE DANSU), Shun Oguri, Tsutomu Yamazaki. In a mountain forest, 60-year-old lumberjack Katsuhiko (Yakusho) is cutting down a tree. As it crashes noisily down, a man nervously approaches, telling Katsuhiko to be quiet. Puzzled, Katsuhiko discovers that the man is working on a zombie movie being filmed nearby. The woodsman becomes an unlikely director's assistant in this charming comedy. Winner of 4 awards. For ages 12 and older.

BAKUMATSU TAIYÔDEN aka A Sun-Tribe Myth from the Bakumatsu Era (1957-Japan) 110m **** D: Yûzô Kawashima. Frankie Sakai (SHOGUN), Sachiko Hidari (SHE AND HE), Yoko Minamida, Yûjirô Ishihara (SHADOW HUNTERS). This terrific social satire set in the final years of the Tokugawa shogunate concerns ne'er-do-well Saheiji (Sakai) who is forced work off his debt to a high-class Shinagawa brothel. Penniless but quick-witted, Saheiji cleverly solves the problems of the bordello's courtesans, guests and staff. Co-scripted by Shohei Imamura (THE EEL) and starring comedian Frankie Sakai (who won 2 of the film's 3 awards) this newly restored, rarely seen classic is a must-see.
