LOVE AND LEMONS *aka Små citroner gula* (2013-Sweden) 94m *** D: Teresa Fabik. Rakel Wärmländer, Sverrir Gudnason, Eric Ericson, Dan Ekborg. When waitress Agnes (Wärmländer) has the bad luck of losing her job and her boyfriend on the same day, her chef friend Kalle (Ericson) asks her to partner with him to open a new restaurant. Gambling all her and her parents' money, Agnes plunges into the deeper waters of the restaurant business... and romance. This sunny gastrocomedy was nominated for an award. For ages 10 and older.

AU PETIT MARGUERY (1995-France) 95m *** D: Laurent Bénégui. Stéphane Audran (THE DISCREET CHARM OFTHE BOURGEOISIE), MichelAumont (LES COMPÈRES), Alain Beigel, Marie Bunel, Thomas Chabrol. After thirty years of heartfelt cooking, it's the farewell dinner at Le Petit Marguery, a Paris bistro. Fifteen of the restaurant's habitués, mostly family and friends, have come to banter, sup, and reminisce in honor of the retiring proprietors, a husband and wife team (Aumont and Audran). A film to honor all those hardworking chefs this Thanksgiving month! Suitable for ages 15 and older.

A FIVE STAR LIFE *aka Viaggio sola* (2013-Italy) 85m *** D: Maria Sole Tognazzi (PAST PERFECT). Margherita Buy (MANUAL OF LOVE), Stefano Accorsi, Fabrizia Sacchi, Lesley Manville. Forty-something Irene (Buy) has what many women would consider an ideal job: she inspects 5-star hotels as a "mystery guest". She dines on wonderful food, is pampered in posh spas and gazes at gorgeous scenery from her luxurious room. It's the ideal life... or is it? Join this sumptuous tour from Paris to Marrakech to Shanghai and see what you think. Winner of 3 awards, including a David di Donatello for Buy's beautifully understated performance. For ages 12 and older.

WISH I WAS HERE (2014-US) 106m *** D: Zach Braff (GARDEN STATE). Zach Braff, Pierce Gagnon, Kate Hudson, Mandy Patinkin, Josh Gad. In this sharply observed comedy, struggling actor Aidan (Braff) is faced with a tough situation when his dad (Patinkin) announces he can no longer pay for Aidan's kids' yeshiva fees. RogerEbert.com calls this film "sincere, funny, thoughtful and spiritual". Rated R.

AMOST WANTED MAN (2014-UK/US/Germany) 122m ***1/2 D: Anton Corbijn (CONTROL). Philip Seymour Hoffman, Grigoriy Dobrygin, Robin Wright, Rachel McAdams. In Hamburg, Germany, where the 9/11 attacks were planned, Interpol, the CIA and German law enforcement keep a close watch on the Islamic community. When half-Chechen, half-Russian Karpov (Dobrygin) escapes from Russian prison to shelter in Hamburg, German intelligence operative Bachmann (Hoffman) tails Karpov to determine if he's a victim or a criminal. This brilliant spy thriller written by John Le Carré is considered Hoffman's swan song. Rated R.

EMPIRE OF SILVER *aka Baiyin diguo* (2009-China/ Taiwan/Hong Kong) 113m *** D: Christina Yao. Aaron Kwok, Tielin Zhang, Lei Hao, Jennifer Tilly. Based on historical events in China in 1899, this epic details the struggles of a banking family at the dawn of modernity. The patriarch Master Kang (Zhang) hands control of the family business to his third son (Kwok), who has no interest in the family. The Third Master resents his father for stealing the love of his life (Hao) and marrying her. Set against the background of the Boxer Rebellion and the crumbling Ching Dynasty, this sweeping period romance won 9 awards. For ages 15 and older. FRONTERA (2014-US) 103m *** D: Michael Berry (feature debut). Ed Harris, Michael Peña, Eva Longoria, Amy Madigan, Aden Young. Olivia (Madigan) likes to go horseback riding to get away from her grouchy husband Roy (Harris), a retired Arizona sheriff. When she's killed on one of these outings, a Mexican man (Peña) is blamed for her murder. The current sheriff (Young) and Roy, his predecessor, search for answers-- and lives are changed. This beautifully acted drama illustrates the plight of illegal immigrants at the *frontera* (border). Rated PG-13.

LIFE OF CRIME (2013-US) 98m *** D: Daniel Schechter (SUPPORTING CHARACTERS). Jennifer Aniston, Tim Robbins, Mos Def, Isla Fisher, John Hawkes, Will Forte. In this good adaptation of Elmore Leonard's *The Switch*, smalltime crooks Ordell (Def) and Louis (Hawkes) kidnap Mickey (Aniston), the trophy wife of Detroit developer Frank Dawson (Robbins). The problem is, Frank has already filed for divorce and is pleased with the prospect of not paying alimony. This treat has great performances and groovy 1970s-style dialogue. Rated R.

DRIFTING CLOUDS (1996-Finland) 96m **** D: Aki Kaurismäki (LE HAVRE). Kati Outinen, Kari Väänänen, Elina Salo, Sakari Kuosmanen, Markku Peltola, Matti Pellonpää, Pietari. This droll and deadpan comedy concerns 40-ish married Helsinki couple Ilona (Outinen) and Lauri (Väänänen) and their struggles with employment. When their situation looks bleak, she opens a restaurant! Winner of 10 awards, including one at Cannes. For ages 12 and older.

JERSEY BOYS (2014-US) 134m ***^{1/2} D: Clint Eastwood (GRAN TORINO). Vincent Piazza, John Lloyd Young, Steve Schirripa, Christopher Walken, Michael Lomenda, Kathrine Narducci, Lou Volpe, Johnny Cannizzaro. Adapted from the hit Broadway musical, JERSEY BOYS tells the story of the tough street kids who became the Four Seasons in 1950s New Jersey. From petty crime to prison to the birth of hits like "Sherry and "Big Girls Don't Cry", this compelling bio-pic will make you want to stand up and cheer. Rated R.

BEGIN AGAIN (2013-US) 104m *** ½ D: John Carney (ONCE). Keira Knightley, Mark Ruffalo, Adam Levine, Hailee Steinfeld, Mos Def, Catherine Keener. This lovely film about the transformative power of music centers on two wounded souls who are about to give up on their dreams: songwriter Gretta (Knightley) and record producer Dan (Ruffalo). She's come to New York with her boyfriend (Levine), who's dumped and abandoned her. Dan's been in a slump for years. Making art is hard work—but that work has the power to heal. Rated R.

THE ONE I LOVE (2014-US) 91m *** ^{1/2} D: Charlie McDowell (feature debut). Mark Duplass, Elisabeth Moss, Ted Danson. On the advice of their marriage therapist (Danson), Ethan (Duplass) and Sophie (Moss) move into a secluded vacation home for the weekend to find their better selves. Something mysterious and surreal is at work in this house and the two are forced to face the realities of their relationship. This highly original, witty and well-acted romance won an award. Rated R.

THE DISCOVERERS (2012-US) 104m *** D: Justin Schwarz (feature debut). Griffin Dunne (ROB THE MOB), Madeleine Martin, Devon Graye, Stuart Margolin, John C. McGinley, Dreama Walker, Cara Buono. Recently widowed Stanley Birch (Margolin) has been assuming the identity of explorer William Clark. Stanley's son Lewis (Dunne) and Lewis's teenage kids Zoe (Martin) and Jack (Graye) end up joining Stanley on a Lewis and Clark re-enactment trek leading them all to discover...themselves. Perfect for the holidays, this quirky and intelligent indie comedy won 8 awards and a nice review from the New York Times. PG-13. IF I STAY (2014-US) 107m *** ^{1/2} D: R.J. Cutler (feature debut). Chloë Grace Moretz (HUGO), Mireille Enos, Jamie Blackley, Joshua Leonard, Stacy Keach. This adaptation of Gayle Forman's novel centers on Mia Hall (Moretz), a gifted teenage cellist from Portland OR who suffers a terrible car accident. Venturing out of her comatose body to see her loved ones, Mia explores her options: live or die? Bring a box of tissues for this one. Rated PG-13.

EDEN (2006-Germany/Switzerland) 98m *** ½ D: Michael Hofmann. Josef Ostenforf, Wioletta Breskic, Charlotte Roche, Uta Zech, Devid Striesow, Leonie Stepp. Bulky, brilliant chef Gregor's (Ostendorf) greatest passion is creating beautiful food. Obsessed with every aspect of cuisine, he has so far kept away from romance. When he meets unhappily married waitress Eden (Roche), he finds a muse. As Gregor serves up his love in edible form, Eden falls in love... with his cooking. Funny and poetic, this foodie film is a tasteful delight. Suitable for ages 12 and older.

KINAMAND aka Chinaman (2005-Denmark/ China) 88m *** D: Henrik Ruben Genz. Bjarne Henriksen, Vivian Wu, Lun Kun Wu, Charlotte Fich. When Danish plumber Keld's (Henriksen) wife (Fich) leaves him, he is so dispirited that he closes his business and sells off his furniture. Each night Keld ambles over to the Chinese take-out to have a lonely supper. When the restaurant's owner (Lin Kun Wu) offers Keld money to marry his sister Ling (Vivian Wu) so she may stay in Denmark, penniless Keld accepts in order to pay for his divorce. Slowly and mysteriously, a bond forms between Keld and Ling that changes everything. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

SEAGULL DINER aka Kamome shokudô (2006-Japan) 102m *** D: Naoko Ogigami (GLASSES). Satomi Kobayashi, Hairi Katagiri, Masako Motai, Jarkko Niemi, Tarja Markus, Markku Peltola. Leaving her home in Japan, Sachie opens a restaurant in Finland to serve "Japanese soul food" in the land of the midnight sun. A charming tale that celebrates work, friendship and community, SEAGULL DINER will bring a smile to your face. Suitable for ages 10 and older.

THE NOVEMBER MAN (2014-US) 108m *** D: Roger Donaldson (THE WORLD'S FASTEST IN-DIAN). Pierce Brosnan (THE LOVE PUNCH), Luke Bracey, Olga Kurylenko. This sleek actioner has Pierce Brosnan as ex-CIA operative Devereaux nicknamed "November man" because after he passes through, nothing lives (not a good Thanksgiving guest). Devereaux is brought back into the game by his old boss to retrieve an agent from Moscow. Devereaux's assignment quickly becomes personal when he finds himself battling his protégé Mason (Bracey), a deadly CIA hitman. Rated R.

COPENHAGEN (2014-Canada/US/Denmark) 98m ***1/2 D: Mark Raso (debut). Gethin Anthony, Frederikke Dahl Hansen, Sebastian Armesto. Twenty eight-year old William (Anthony) travels from New York to Copenhagen to locate a grandfather he never met. When William gets hotel intern Effy (Hansen) to help him locate his grandfather, he doesn't realize she's half his age. It turns out that Effy has a thing or two to teach the rude American about maturity in this gorgeous, candid and thoughtful romance. Winner of 5 awards. Unrated.
