GOLDA (2023-UK/US) 101m *** D: Guy Nattiv. Helen Mirren, Zed Josef, Rami Heuberger, Dvir Benedek, Lior Ashkenazi, Ed Stoppard, Camille Cottin, Liev Schreiber. Golda Meir (Mirren) served as an interim Prime Minister of Israel from 1969 to 1974. During that time she was not anticipating an armed conflict with Anwar Sadat's Egypt or Hafez Al-Assad's Syria, but both had suffered losses in the Six-Day War of 1967. Thus, on Yom Kippur, the holiest day of the Jewish calendar in 1973, Egyptian and Syrian forces launched a surprise attack on Israel. This is a chronicle of the high-stakes decisions Meir faced during the conflict. Nominated for 2 awards. Rated PG-13.

SCOTT & BAILEY Episodes 19 & 20 (2013-UK) 91m *** ½ D: Juliet May. Lesley Sharp, Suranne Jones, Amelia Bullmore, Sean Maguire, Nicola Walker, George Costigan, William Ash. Thanks to a tip by Helen Bartlett (Walker), a gruesome discovery is made in the Bevans' cellar. Gill (Bullmore) is concerned that one of her officers has leaked Helen's involvement to the press. Later, a mysterious death at a retirement home leads to an inquiry into its unusually high death rate. Rachel (Jones), wanting to avoid Sean (Maguire), is outstaying her welcome at Janet's (Sharp). For ages 15 and older.

THE STRANGER aka Lo straniero (1967-Italy/France/Algeria) 104m *** ½ D: Luchino Visconti (THE LEOPARD). Marcello Mastroianni, Anna Karina, Bernard Blier, Alfred Adam, Pierre Bertin. In this adaptation of Albert Camus's 1942 existentialist novel, an Algerian is killed on the beach, and Frenchman Arthur Meursault (Mastroianni) is arrested for the murder. The story's focus is not so much on the murder, but on the fact that Meursault appears not to care. Visconti cinematically builds an atmosphere in this drama which informs the character's moral and emotional quandaries. Nominated for 4 awards. For ages 15 and older. Note: This film was made 5 years after the Algerian War ended.

ALL OUT WAR aka Tutti contro tutti (2013-Italy) 93m *** D: Rolando Ravello (REMEMBER ME?). Rolando Ravello, Kasia Smutniak, Marco Giallini, Stefano Altieri, Ivano De Matteo. Financially strapped Agostino (Ravello) and his extended family go out to celebrate his son's First Communion. When they return to Agostino's modest Roman apartment, they find themselves locked out by squatters. Lacking a rental contract, Agostino and his brother-in-law Sergio (Giallini) concoct a wild plan to re-occupy the apartment in this wacky comedy. Winner of 2 awards. For ages 10 and older.

THE YEAR OF FURY aka El año de la furia (2020-Spain/Argentina/Uruguay) 101m *** D: Rafa Russo. Alberto Ammann, Joaquin Furriel, Daniel Grao, Martina Gusmán, Maribel Verdú. In this gripping drama set in the years before Uruguay's 1973 military coup, TV variety show writers Leonardo (Furriel) and Diego (Ammann) enjoy success with their political humor. As the Uruguayan government grows more repressive, the writers are pressured to tone down their satire. Novelist Leonardo is stultified, hotheaded Diego is angered—both of their lives intersect in unexpected ways with the coming dictatorship. Nominated for 2 awards. For adults 16 and older.

THE BROKENWOOD MYSTERIES: DOG DAY MORNING (2021-New Zealand) 93m *** ½ D: Mark Beesley. Neill Rea, Fern Sutherland, Jarod Rawiri, Tracy Lee Gray, Cristina Serban Ionda. Four identically dressed men, all the same height and wearing identical dog masks, attempt to rob the Brokenwood Savings Bank armed with paintball guns. New detective constable Chalmers (Rawiri) tries to help Mike (Rea) and Kristin (Sutherland) puzzle out a mystery: the bank manager is found dead at the scene of the crime—with a real bullet wound. Who did it? For ages 14 and older.

HANJIRO (2010-Japan) 121m *** D: Shô Igarashi. Takaaki Enoki, Miho Shiraishi, Yukiya Kitamura, Seiji Tanaka, Shinobu Sakagami. This thrilling jidaigeki follows the career of a fascinating historical figure from Kyushu, Nakamura Hanjirô, later known as Kirino Toshiaki. In 1862, farmer Hanjirô (Enoki) brings a gift of sweet potatoes to Satsuma Domain leader Saigô Takamori (Tanaka) and asks to join his command. Distinguishing himself in the Boshin War, Hanjirô rises to become Brigadier General in the new Imperial Army. Deeply loyal to Saigô, Hanjirô leaves the army to serve him in the devastating Satsuma Rebellion. For ages 12 and older.

EYES WIDE OPEN aka Einayim Pekukhoth (2009-Israel/Germany/France) 93m *** ½ D: Haim Tabakman. Zohar Strauss, Ran Khalil Danker, Tinkerbell, Tzahi Grad. Married butcher Aaron (Strauss) lives a peaceful life devoted to his faith and family in a strict Ultra-Orthodox Jewish community in Jerusalem. One rainy day, handsome young Ezri (Danker) arrives, looking for a job. Initially, Aaron thinks of his attraction to Ezri as a challenge to overcome. But as a bond grows between them, Aaron begins to question his relationship with his wife Rivka (Tinkerbell), his children, his community, and with God. Winner of 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

SCOTT & BAILEY Episodes 21 & 22 (2013-UK) 92m *** ½ D: Morag Fullerton. Suranne Jones, Lesley Sharp, Ben Batt, SeanMaguire, Amelia Bullmore, Nicola Walker, Pippa Haywood. Finally having had enough, Janet (Sharp) has a huge row with Rachel (Jones) and kicks her out of the house. Their shattered friendship causes problems at the police station. Gill (Bullmore) reveals the officer who's been leaking info to the press for money. Later, a drunken Helen Bartlett (Walker) abducts Gill at knifepoint in this edge-of-your-seat episode. For ages 15 and older.

AMSTERDAM (2022-US/Japan) 134m *** D: David O. Russell (THREE KINGS). Christian Bale, Margot Robbie, John David Washington, Rami Malek, Robert De Niro, Anya Taylor-Joy, Chris Rock. This visually striking and surreal tale concerns three close friends, doctor Burt (Bale), lawyer Harold (Washington) and artist Valerie (Robbie) who meet during WWI and live together in blissful artistic freedom in Amsterdam until real life intervenes. In 1930, the three are reunited by the death of Burt and Harold's commanding officer, which leads them to uncover a fascist conspiracy in this fascinating tale. Winner of 1 award. Rated R.

THIS TOWN (2020-New Zealand) 88m *** D: David White. David White, Alice May Connolly, Robyn Malcolm, Rima Te Wiata, Byron Coll. Lonely Sean (White) tries a dating app to find love in this quirky, touching comedy set in a small town in New Zealand. Life has been especially isolating in the five years since his family has been murdered. Pam (Malcolm), a former cop, is convinced Sean is guilty of killing his family, and though she's lost her job as a consequence, she won't give up. Luckily, Sean "swipes right" for Casey (Connolly), whose steadfast love and fondness for sweet sour pork helps Sean rebuild his life. Nominated for 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE BROKENWOOD MYSTERIES: SOMETHING NASTY IN THE MARKET (2021-New Zealand) 90m *** ½ D: Geoffrey Cawthorn. Neill Rea, Fern Sutherland, Jarod Rawiri, Claire Chitham, Rebecca Hobbs, Elizabeth McRae. Detective Kristin (Sutherland) and her boss Mike (Rea) visit the local farmers' market where they witness the market's owner Sophie (Chitham) staggering out of a barn, fatally impaled by a pitchfork. Upon examination, the team discovers a butcher's diagram has been drawn on Sophie's body as if she were a cow in this intriguing episode. For ages 14 and older.

THE GIFT aka Gaven (2008-Denmark) 94m *** D: Niels Gråbøl. Henning Jensen, Jakob Cedergren (THE GUILTY), Paw Henriksen. Artist Jens (Cedergren) is at his younger brother Simon's (Henriksen) 29th birthday party when their long-estranged father Mogens (Jensen) appears at the door. Mogens, who has been in and out of mental hospitals for years, announces that he bought Simon a car and causes a ruckus when no one offers to fetch it with him. Jens, in charge of taking Mogens back to the hospital, takes pity on his father and drives all around Copenhagen with him to look for the car in this touching comedy. Nominated for 1 award. For ages 12 and older.

9 SOULS (2003-Japan) 120m *** ½ D: Toshiaki Toyoda. Yoshio Harada, Kôji Chihara, Ryûhei Matsuda, Mame Yamada, Genta Dairaku, Jun Inoue, Jun Kunimura, Takako Matsu. Nine of society's detritus escape from prison in this wildly imaginative comedy-drama. After hijacking a strip club's van, the nine go on a search for a counterfeiter's hidden cache. Each of the convicts has a dream of fitting back into society, their desires made all the more poignant by the tragicomic consequences they encounter. Nominated for 1 award. For ages 15 and older.

MARLOWE (2022-Ireland/Spain/France/US) 110m *** D: Neil Jordan (THE CRYING GAME). Liam Neeson, Diane Kruger, Jessica Lange, Adewale Akinnuoye-Agbaje, Alan Cumming, Colm Meaney. In 1939 Los Angeles, private detective Philip Marlowe (Neeson) is hired by glamorous heiress Clare (Kruger) to find her missing lover Nico Peterson. The police tell Marlowe that Peterson is dead—he'd been run over by a car. Believing Peterson had faked his own death, Marlowe investigates further, getting entangled in a web of deceit and corruption. Nominated for 2 awards. Rated R.

LOVE IS IN THE AIR aka Amour & turbulences (2013-France) 93m *** D: Alexandre Castagnetti. Ludivine Sagnier, Nicolas Bedos, Jonathan Cohen, Arnaud Ducret. On a plane from New York to Paris, incorrigible womanizer and hedonist lawyer Antoine (Bedos) finds himself seated next to the girl-who-gotaway Julie (Sagnier) in this delicious romantic comedy. Over the seven-hour flight, Antoine tries to argue his case as the two flashback as to why they broke up three years ago. Sagnier sparkles with effortless charm in her role as a kooky sculptor. For ages 12 and older.

BARBIE (2023-US/UK) 114m **** D: Greta Gerwig (LADY BIRD). Margot Robbie, Ryan Gosling, Kate McKinnon, Issa Rae, Will Ferrell, Simu Liu, America Ferrera, Ariana Greenblatt. This big, hilarious, bright pink movie is very different from OPPENHEIMER, but like Nolan's blockbuster, BARBIE addresses big questions within its glittery confines. In the middle of a flawlessly choreographed party, Barbie (Robbie) suffers from a sudden existential crisis that could only be solved (gasp!) by a journey to the real world. With her boyfriend Ken (Gosling) in tow, she heads for Los Angeles to save Barbie Land. Winner of 2 awards so far. Rated PG-13.

THE BROKENWOOD MYSTERIES: EX-POSED TO THE LIGHT (2021-New Zealand) 22m *** ½ D: Aidee Walker. Neill Rea, Fern Sutherland, Jarod Rawiri, Cristina Serban Ionda, Roy Ward, John Glass. During a gala fundraiser for the historic Brokenwood Cinema, a fire breaks out. When the smoke clears, the body of the property's owner, Lyall Densem (Glass), is found strangled to death. Among the suspects are the drunken projectionist and, of all people, Rev. Lucas Greene (Ward), who is found unconscious with a clip of naughty film footage in his hand. For ages 14 and older.

THE INNOCENT aka L'innocent (2022-France) 98m *** D: Louis Garrel, Louis Garrel, Roschdy Zem, Noémie Merlant, Anouk Grinberg, Yanisse Kebbab. In this fun and fresh crime caper/romantic comedy, young widower Abel (Garrel) is panicking about his fun-loving mom Sylvie's (Grinberg) new boyfriend Michel (Zem). Sylvie teaches acting at the local penitentiary, and convicted thief Michel is her best student. When they get married and open a flower shop together, Abel tries to put his suspicions aside to support his mom in this winner of 4 awards. For ages 15 and older.

OPPENHEIMER (2023-US/UK) 180m ****
D: Christopher Nolan (INCEPTION). Cillian
Murphy, Emily Blunt, Robert Downey Jr., Matt
Damon, Kenneth Branagh, Florence Pugh,
Rami Malek. American theoretical physicist
Robert J. Oppenheimer (Murphy) helps develop the atom bomb and is among the very
few who understands and fears the terrible
consequences of his creation. This cinematic
tour-de-force combines director Nolan's mastery of visual expression with riveting performances by the best actors of this generation.
This masterpiece won 2 awards so far. Rated R.

SCOTT & BAILEY Episodes 23 & 24 (2014-UK) 91m *** ½ D: Simon Delaney. Suranne Jones, Lesley Sharp, Amelia Bullmore, Danny Miller, Ian Mercer. After both Janet (Sharp) and Rachel (Jones) pass their sergeant's exam, DCI Gill Murray (Bullmore) has the tough job of deciding between the two of them to replace DS Rob Waddington (Miller). While dredging a reservoir to find a body, Gill identifies another one found there as Mandy Sweeting, who disappeared two decades ago. Rob asks to be involved in the case as his father Frankie (Mercer) had worked on it, putting him in conflict with the new sergeant. For ages 15 and older.

SAMURAI HUSTLE aka Chô kôsoku! Sankin kôtai (2014-Japan) 119m *** D: Katsuhide Motoki. Kuranosuke Sasaki, Masahiko Nishimura, Kyoko Fukada, Takanori Jinnai. In this rollicking 18th century samurai comedy, Lord Naito (Sasaki), of a small fiefdom in Tohoku, receives an order from the shogunate to make a formal procession to Edo (a ten-day journey) in five days. Naito and his retainers have just returned from Edo and the expense of another procession will bankrupt them... which is exactly what official Nobutoki Matsudaira (Jinnai) wants. But he underestimates the fighting spirit of Tohoku: the challenge is on! Winner of 2 awards. For ages 10 and older.
